In brief, the work of the spring term is moving along satisfactorily. Plans for the ninth annual farmers' picnic at the school are well under way. The picnic will be held either May 17th or 24th, exact date to be announced next week. A class of twenty-five will be graduated from the three year courses Thursday, June 13th.

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## PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO BY-LAWS.

At the last regular meeting of the Board the amendment proposing to change the number necessary for a quorum from four to three was laid on the table for consideration at this meeting.

#### WATER SYSTEM.

July first next \$2,000.00 will become available for further improvements in our water system. I have asked Vice-Director F. E. Edwards to present to you today some of the plans we have had in mind. While this fund is under the control of the State Department of Engineering, I sincerely hope that the Department will not insist on sending an outside man here this summer to take charge of this small piece of work. Our Mr. R. W. Ryder can handle this work perfectly well and it will be easier for us than having a stranger step into the work who is entirely unfamiliar with the whole scheme of our plan.

#### THE INSTRUCTING STAFF.

- C. W. Rubel, Head of the Agricultural Department and instructor in animal husbandry and farm manager, \$1800.00.

Miss May Secrest, Head of the Household Arts Department and instructor in domestic science, \$1560.00.

- O. L. Heald, instructor in machine shop practice and forge, \$1500.00.
- A. D. King, instructor in mathematics, \$1500.00.
- R. W. Ryder, instructor in physics, electricity and surveying, \$1500.00.
  - E. B. Smith, instructor in history and English, \$1450.00.
  - J. M. Johnston, instructor in carpentry, \$1400.00.
- R. S. Middleton, instructor in dairying, \$1440.00. This is an increase of \$90.00 per year over Mr. Middleton's present salary.

Miss Belle Williams, instructor in drawing and applied design, \$1200.00.

The salaries recommended herewith total \$17,700 for the next fiscal year. The Salaries' appropriation for the year is \$30,000.00,

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leaving a balance of \$12,300.00 for salaries of Director, new appointments, pointees, office force, and employees. These other appointments, several of which stand during the pleasure of the Board, can be taken up by the Board or a committee a few weeks later.

### GIRLS' DORMITORY BUILDING.

Various circumstances and needs compel consideration of changes in the use of the building now serving as a girls' dormitory. More class rooms are urgently needed and will be a necessity another school year. This building is most suitably located for a class room building. I have asked Mr. J. M. Johnston, our instructor in carpentry, to submit a report and estimate on changes necessary to convert the building into class rooms. The Director can submit a detailed report of this matter in the near future, and I would suggest that a committee of the Board be appointed to consider the subject with the Director.

If special reports are desired on any particular features of the school's work they will be cheerfully prepared upon the request of the Board. A more extended report will be presented before the close of my service with the school.
