Assembly Speaker Jesse M. Unruh today announced the appointment of 154 California men and women as alternates on the state's delegation to the Democratic National Convention.

Under the convention's rules, California is entitled to 174 delegates and 172 alternates. The additional 18 alternates will be appointed within the next several days, Unruh said.

Unruh, the delegation's chairman, also announced that Mrs. Gladys Danielson has resigned as a delegate in favor of her husband, State Senator George Danielson of Los Angeles, and that Mrs. Sara J. Hannaford has similarly resigned as a delegate in favor of her husband, Mayor Mark W. Hannaford of Lakewood.
