### Drought forces wily coyotes into Village

Leisure Village is bordered by a beautiful wilderness area. As the drought continues, coyotes are leaving this natural habitat and roaming the Village in search of food and water. Many residents have reported seeing the "German Shepherd-like" wild dogs strolling down their streets and pacing near patios and front doors. Such behaviors are signs that the coyotes are not only becoming more numerous, but also more aggressive.

We learned this disturbing fact on Oct. 13 when representatives from California's Department of Fish and Wildlife addressed the Pet Club. Warden Dennis Rosenberg, Environmental

Scientist Christine Thompson, and Scientific Aide Colbi Ogata gave a comprehensive presentation on the increasing danger of coyotes and what we can do about it.

Usually coyotes avoid and fear humans. But this fear is

abating as the thirsty, hungry coyotes deplete their usual food sources of bunnies, rats, squirrels, possums and birds.

Although they usually appear at dawn and dusk, coyotes are now seen at all times of the day or night.

Sadly, they can jump our fences. One resident has lost her cat. Coyotes will prey on cats and small dogs, as well as larger dogs that are older and slower.

The first thing we must do is to cut off their supply of food and water. Wildlife experts gave specific tips on how to do so — and made it clear that all residents, even those without pets, must do their part.

- Keep trash cans tightly covered.
- Keep your garage door closed.
- Don't leave pet food in the garage or any place where a coyote can smell it. Even an empty food dish will attract coyotes.

It's a familiar question in a Villager's social moment: "Where did you live before you came here?

For many of us, the answer is simple — from the Valley or Back East or Northern California, etc. Now ask Villager Tom Mailheau, a soft-spoken, even-tempered 65-year-old who still works full-time in Oxnard and tends a bountiful garden with his wife Renee. His answer: "Everywhere!" And he's telling the truth!

Tom sailed the world aboard his 47-foot sloop for 10 years. He surfed alone off undiscovered beaches in Fiji. He built a catamaran in Australia, followed by a stint sailing in the Caribbean. He came to California as a boat captain and moved into Leisure Village in 2004.

Tom's childhood on a cattle ranch in Monterey was unconventional.

"I was a cowboy, I surfed a lot, I was self-sufficient, I learned to fly and became a crop duster," he recalls.

As he turned 20, he bought a plane — an open cockpit biplane. His business boomed. It was dangerous work.



### What's escrow all about?

What happens in escrow?

An escrow holder is a neutral, third party for both the buyer and seller who works closely with the Realtors and lender to fit all the "jigsaw pieces" of the transaction, assuring that the instructions are complied with in the time period called for.

The escrow officer will order a title report to assure that the property can be conveyed with clear title (no liens) and will prepare the deeds and documents related to the transfer.

The escrow officer also orders the payoff information from the current lender and homeowner association documents.

Included too are the delivery and signing of buyer's loan documents,

ordering of insurance and receipt of buyer's down payment. Once the buyer's loan documents are signed and sent back to the lender, escrow will request that loan funds be released.

When closing funds are received, escrow does a final audit of the file to make sure all is in order and then instructs the title company to set up the recording.

Finally, closing statements are issued with distribution of funds. The seller receives the funds, and the buyer has ownership of the house!

- Never leave pets unattended.
- Shut doggie doors at night and during the day if you are not there.
- Get rid of bird feeders droppings and birds attract coyotes.
- Do not leave water out for birds.
- Call the Association Office to report broken sprinklers or puddles of water.
- Fallen fruit from trees must be removed.
- Do not walk pets at dawn or dusk.
- Walk in groups whenever possible.
- Use a short leash instead of an extendable leash.
   Carry a whistle or noisemaker.

Seeing a coyote at a distance is no cause for alarm. But "wildlife is unpredictable," said Thompson. If a coyote threatens you or your pet— back slowly away. You should

never run away, as this could trigger a natural "chase" instinct.

When you see a coyote, here is a list of actions that will help reinstill their natural fear of humans and let them know they are not welcome here.

- Shout, wave your arms and stamp your feet.
  - · Make eye contact.
- Make a racket with your voice, whistles, air horns, bells, pots, pan lids, or shaker cans (soda cans filled with pennies wrapped with aluminum foil.)
- Turn a garden hose on the coyote.





• Shake a stick, cane — or even a walker!

Can coyotes be trapped or "eradicated" from the Village? Rosenberg cautioned that this extreme and costly measure will not completely solve the problem. Inevitably the coyotes will return, perhaps with even more assertive behavior.

This problem really does take a Village.

failures, but I was never hurt badly," he smiles. "And I was loaded, making \$1,000 a night in my late 20s."

So Tom Mailheau bought a boat, and that changed everything. The sloop docked in Ventura Harbor was his hobby at first. Until one summer he said to his (then) wife, "It would be cool to sail to Hawaii."

So they did and had a great time.

"I was 29, we had no debt. We said 'Why not keep sailing?"

That was 1979.

For the next 10 years, Tom and his wife sailed wherever they wanted with no communication devices, just a sextant for direction. Their sloop, the Mirage, was fast (they could average 200 miles a day), wet (water splashed up all the time) and stable.

"Everywhere we went was the best place I've ever been," Tom laughs: across the Pacific, Samoa, Australia, the Indian Ocean.

When he docked for supplies, they bought anything with preservatives. Cheerios and canned fruit were particularly welcome.

"I was the master of my domain; we could see from horizon to horizon," he adds.

Of course, there were storms, but only once in the

entire decade did the weather surprise him.

In 1989, his sister asked him to build a boat for her. So Tom pulled into Brisbane, Australia, rented an apartment, and, over 18 months, constructed a 55-foot luxury catamaran. He sold the Mirage and delivered the new boat to Antigua in the Caribbean.

Life had changed. He went to Florida, worked as a dive master and a professional skipper, and got divorced. Eventually, he came back to California for a stint as a crew boat captain servicing oil rigs in Santa Barbara Channel.

In 2000, the world traveler was learning the computer in Carpinteria. He clicked on a high school classmates site, and there was his senior year prom date, Renee Allie. It didn't take long for them to reunite. Renee's parents lived in Leisure Village, which helped the couple choose a place to settle down.

"Of course I miss the adventure. But I'm probably not going to go around the world again," Tom says. "And I like Leisure Village: the security, the amenities, the quiet."

Before you imagine Tom Mailheau in a recliner, consider this: On weekends, he and Renee ride hundreds of miles — on their Harley-Davidson motorcycles.







### ... construction equipment?

Finally! The skip loaders, the dump trucks, the pedestrian barriers, the mountains of dirt — all of it points to the goal. LV's Fitness Center is on its way. Arrival time: February 2015 (approximately).

The heavy equipment began rumbling around the swimming pool in the first week of October. Down came the west wall adjacent to the pool, and digging began — the first step toward the new exercise center.

"The crew built a base of compacted dirt that is more than three feet higher than the ground level we were used to in that area," explains General Manager Bob Scheaffer. "That should satisfy the federal government's concern by moving the building out of the flood plain."

More than 300 cubic yards of soil was trucked in to build the elevation.

The next step is a familiar one: waiting. Waiting for LOMAR — a Letter of Map Revision — which indicates that the building will be out of the flood plain. That is expected to take about six weeks, clearing the way for an approved Camarillo building permit.

"As soon as we have a building permit, construction will begin, including work on remodeling the men's and women's locker rooms and bathrooms," says Scheaffer. "The men's side will be done first."

The completed Fitness Center will be 2,000 square feet. That is about the size of the Santa Rosa Room in the Clubhouse.

### ... the Village's water message to everyone who passes by?

Have you noticed the Village's water message to Camarillo?

Three large banners now hang prominently outside each entrance to Leisure Village. They read, "Leisure Village irrigates with non-potable water." It's a message to our Camarillo neighbors: We neither waste water nor break the rules in this time of drought. Villagers already know that.

The announcement resulted from a drive-by mistake. A man traveling down Santa Rosa Road saw sprinklers running outside LV's main gate during the day. He was familiar with



Camarillo community water rules: landscape sprinkling only in the early

morning or late evening and then only two days a week. The observant driver also is a member of the board of a neighboring water district. So he complained to our water authority, the Camrosa Water District, which set the record straight for him and all those who pass by Leisure Village

Water usage and water waste is a crucial issue for the entire community. Camrosa and Leisure Village wanted to make our position clear. The water district paid for the banners; the Village posted them proudly.

### ... the new security cameras on the Village's gate houses?

The tipping point occurred because a resident on her daily bike ride from gate to gate in the Village had a close call. She approached the East Gate house, saw that the incoming gate was down, and began to make a U-turn. Suddenly, the

entrance gate went up; a car moved forward. There was no collision, but it was clear that it was a close call. The guard inside could not see the cyclist behind the building and thought the road was clear. That got the security ball rolling. Now cameras have been installed at all four corners of LV's East and West gate houses; the Main Gate will get them shortly. They transmit a 360-degree view of incoming and outgoing traffic — auto, truck, bike and foot traffic — on a screen inside

the gate houses to those on duty. License plates are also projected inside.

Gate officers report they appreciate this new level of observation. It's like eyes in the backs of their heads.

### ... the new signs? What's your opinion?

Residents and visitors may soon be directed by new signs throughout our Village. After decades of the green street and information signs positioned along the streets and at the entrances, a different look may be on the way.

The initiative for change began in the Safety and Security Committee. Residents expressed concerns about existing signage: They can't be seen easily at night; they are too high; they look old-fashioned; and one member called them ugly.

Those complaints got action.

The first candidate for a

new look has been posted (excuse the pun) at the corner of Village 13.

Eventually all the signs in the Village will be updated. The sample at Village 13 has a plastic post, which is more durable than the current wooden ones. The numbers on the No. 13 sample are two inches taller than the existing signs, a component that LV Security officers have endorsed.

When the Safety and Security Committee saw the sample sign, the reaction was mixed. It was described as "very pretty" in the daylight, but too dark at night and too short. What's your opinion?

"We are looking for input from residents," says General Manager Bob Scheaffer. "Write to the Association Office and tell us what you think. We want to come up with a style that will be contemporary, attractive and highly visible."

We are well into the first half of the 2014-2015 season, and the spread between the top teams and the rest of the pack is growing. 
