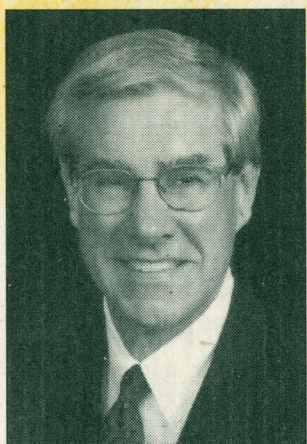

Welcome!

I am pleased to welcome each of you to Cal Poly's annual Fall Conference. This year we are delighted that Dr. Karl S. Pister, former vice president for educational outreach for the University of California, chancellor emeritus of the

University of California, Santa Cruz, and former dean of the University of California, Berkeley, College of Engineering, will be the keynote speaker at our General Session.

In his sixth decade of distinguished service to higher education, Karl Pister currently chairs the governing board of the California Council on Science and Technology (CCST). CCST is implementing, with Hewlett Foundation support, a critical-path analysis of the role played by the state's schools, colleges and universities in the development of California's science and technology workforce. This study will provide insight into the factors that influence and control student participation and success in science and technology educational programs. In his remarks, Dr. Pister will discuss "Higher Education in California: 2000 and Beyond."

Dr. Pister's visit comes at a time when Cal Poly is engaged in a number of interrelated initiatives critical to our future. The final, very positive report of the WASC 2000 visiting team, with its recognition of Cal Poly's distinctive mission and hard-earned reputation for excellence, provides much to celebrate. It also invites us to expand our efforts in a number of areas – including our development of a culture of inquiry with respect to student learning, our pursuit of student-friendly campus policies and practices, our attention to student retention and graduation rates, and our commitment to achieve and sustain a diverse population of


