# SEXUALITY AND THE MALE

The high rate of unwanted pregnancies among young women in Santa Clara County and a growing trend towards involving the male in effective contraceptive usage is part of the rationale behind the establishment of the Male's Place, an education center.

The Male's Place was designed to meet the needs of men in exploring their feelings on sexuality and their role in family planning. Most men are capable and willing, given the opportunity, to share in birth control decisions and responsibilies; unfortunately, they have few resources.

Located at the Park Alameda Health Facility, 976 Lenzen Ave., in San Jose, the Male's Place provides men, especially young men, with information and education in the areas of birth control, VD, how male and female bodies work, and other related health concerns through a staffed telephone healthline 294-3279. In addition to being a family planning information, resource, and referral

center. The Male's Place is beginning to conduct teen male discussion groups in schools and community centers.

Unfortunately, men have been socialized to believe that birth control is a woman's responsibility, states Nancy Kong, Project Coordinator. Hopefully, this program will be a starting point for opening opportunities for men to share in birth control decisions and responsibilities, adds Ms. Kong.

The Male's Place will be sponsoring a workshop, "The Male's Role in Family Planning 1977," on Tuesday and Wednesday, June 28 and 29 at the Santa Clara County Office of Education, 100 Skyport Drive in San Jose.

Speakers will include Kristin Luker, PHD, author of "Taking Chances" and Herbert Goldberg, author of "Hazards of Being Male." For more information about the conference contact the Male's Place, 976 Lenzen Ave., San Jose, 294-3146.

Latino pride comes in many forms. We can look at great social movements as well as beautiful cultural movements. One of the cultural parts of the Latino nation which has become more and more visible to the American eye is that of Latino music. I will be discussing different forms of Latin music within this column and also about new album releases as well as different Latino artists. Latin music spans from the Carribean salsa sunlight to the rocky nortenos, to polkas from Tejas and here in our own back yard. We will look at the Indo-hispanic music as well as the Santerisima of Afro-Cuban sounds. We will go back into history and look at greats like El Siego Malaquies and Arsenio Rodriguez as well as todays greats. For the first column I would like to recommend a few albums in the different styles of Latin Music.

Latin Soul, I Can See, Ralfi Pagan; Latin Disco, Salsa, Louie Ramirez; Salsa, Distito, Justo Betancourt; Mexican, Vol. 18, Antonio Aguilar; Tex-Mex, Má-

quina, Brown Express.

These albums will give you a basic knowledge of Latino music, it's styles and sounds. Starting next column I will be doing a write-up on a album the first being SALSA AT WOODSTOCK by Bobby Rodriguez a La Campañia.

#### CHILE and SALSA


This will be my opinion I invite you to write and let me know yours.

Latin music took another step toward national recognition with two new releases from major American recording companies. This shows the newest trend in Major Latin recording. Capitol Records released Mexican bass player JJohnny "Chano" Martinez and his Salsa Machine. Based in Los Angeles, the famed Salsa band leader ogininally from Jalisco, Mexico, has created a Salsa bridge which could very easily crossover to an American market. The album features the vocals of Freddie Delgado who handles Baila La Salsa, Los Jovencitos, and Los Manos leaving you with impressions of tropical breezes and Caribbean nights. In my opinion Capitol Records must be commended for releasing this album. Johnny Martinez has been a long time favorite of Chicano Salseros as well as other Latinos throughout the United States and Latin America. So check out Johnny "Chano" Martinez and his Salsa Machine.

On the Columbia record front one of America's giant recording companies has just released a follow up album to the first Fania All-Star Album. The first release, 7

Delicate & Jumpy, was a moderate success but the new All-Star album has the markings of a Latin Rock Smash if Columbia handles the promotion right. From the opening song (Ella Fue) to the closing number (Juan Pachanga) the All-Stars have you dancing from Disco to Salsa. If one of these songs doesn't have you dancin' your probably a hopeless case. The Best Salsa/Jazz tune features the latest Panamanian sensation, Ruben Blades on vocals, Juan Pachanga being the best combination to the two music styles in a long time. For the Latin Rock fans Ella Fue is a must. Released in a Santana Mold, Ella Fue is probably the most AM commercial cut on the album. The album's strong point is the All-Star horn section. Made up of Luis "Perico" Ortiz, Hector "Bomberito" Zarzuela on trumpets and Barry Rodgers and Reynoldo Jorge on trombones, merit special recognition. Cuban Conga King Mongo Santamaria also does a fantastic job on the album. The weak point from the standpoint of a Tipico Salsero is the lack of more driving Salsa beats. But we must understand that the All-Stars are trying to produce a crossover album.

I must also mention one of the best pianists in the Salsa busi-



ness, this being Larry Harlow. Harlow has again released a great album (on Fania Records) "El Jardinero Del Amor" it never ceases to amaze me what this man con do on vinal. Lead vocals again by Jr. Gonzalez, one of the best young singers to come out. He was also Harlow's singer on Salsa, Live in Quad, El Judio Maravilloso, and Hommy. Gonzalez can make it big as long as PR man, for Fania, Alex Masucci, handles him correctly.

Also a good luck to former Gran Combo head singer Andy Montanez who will be with El Dimenscion Latina of Venezuela.

This week on El Barrio Nuevo (KKUP FM 91.5) will be the Fania All-Stars.



# San Juan Bautista, California, June 24, 1977 marks the 180th

anniversary of the Mission San Juan Bautista. In honor of this event "ROSE OF THE RAN-CHO", a play originally produced successfully on Broadway in 1906 will be first performed by El Teatro Campesino on Saturday the 25th and Sunday the 26th of June. "ROSE" was first performed by this internationally renowned company in 1971; it is now back by popular demand. LEONEL CASTILLO, Commissioner, United States Immigration and Naturalization Service, Washington D.C., will be the featured speaker at the 1977 California GI Forum State Convention Banquet on FRIDAY, JULY 1 at the LeBaron Hotel.

Appointed by President Carter on May 13, 1977, he is the highest ranking Mexican American in the U.S. Government.

Expected to address a capacity crowd in the 600-seat main ballroom of the hotel, Castillo will be making his first major speech on the west coast.

Guest of Honor at the function will be Santa Clara County Superior Court Judge FRED LUCERO who will be honored for his contributions to the community.

Also honored will be San Jose City Councilman Alfredo Garza Jr.

Another special guest at the Official Banquet will be Rev. Monsignor Erwin Juraschek, Pastor of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church, Czestochowa, Texas, who will deliver the Keynote Speech at the Convention business sessions on Friday morning.

Castillo's pending appearance in San Jose has created lots of interest in the Mexican American community, particularly from those anxious to hear his views on the highly controversial Rodino Bill, the subject of illegal aliens, and what Mexico and the U.S. are doing about the problem.

Director Elliot Silverstein, working from a screenplay by Dennis Shyrack, Michael Butler and Lane Slate, has assembled a camp classic every bit as scary-funny as "It Came From Beneath The Sea," "Tarantula," and "Then" or "The Blob."

We've been taking our monster movies terribly seriously in the past few years. "THE CAR" steers us back to the good old days of high imagination and low humor. 18 This time the monster is a run-

In the first issue, the new for Latinos Nuestro magazine points out that a new era for Latines has begun.

The magazine says that throughout the United States, more and more signs announce that an intangible American tradition is again underway.

It is the endless renewal and change that comes when another immigrant group finally takes new roots, boldly begins to make the American dream its own.

The more than 12 million Latinos in the United States have become the newest emerging American minority. Mexicans. Puerto Ricans, Cubans, and others from Latin America are starting to discover a surer sense of their common identity, their shared strengths.

At the same time, the United States society is increasingly reflecting indications of a new Latin influence.

The article says to note how 20 closely the signs follow the pattern

other minority that brought groups their part of the American success story. First Latinos began to hit the top in those fields where talent counts the most.

Imagine the poverty of American sports without Latinos. No Tony Perez, fingers curled around the thick handle of a bat; no Luis Tiant, almost turning his back in disdain on the batter before twirling and hurling the ball plateward; no Angel Cordero or Lafitt Pincay bunched high over the saddle; no Lee Trevino cracking shots (and jokes) down the fairway.

Neither of the Panchos, Gonzales or Segura, training tomorrow's tennis stars: no Willie Benitez or Carlos Palomino in the ring; probably no soccer or jai alai at all, since those burgeoning sports rely heavily on Latinos both on the field and in the stands.

In music, Latino stars influence everything from grand opera (Martina Arroyo, Placido Domingo) to great rock (Santana, Grateful Dead's Jerry Garcia). Some few of those in between include classical pianist Claudio Arrau, jazzman Gato Barbieri, pop vocalist Vikki Carr and country-western singer Johnny Rodriquez. And of course, salsa and the hustle are full-blown expressions of Latinismo.

Elsewhere in the arts, the roll call is equally long. The return of the public mural - street art raised to epic proportions—comes directly from the Chicanos of California and the Southwest. In literature, some of the freshest

works are flowing from writers like Piri Thomas, Miguel Pinero

and Raymond Barrios.

In movies and on the stage, more and more of the top talents are Latinos (Hector Elizondo, Raul Julia, Rita Moreno, Anthony Quinn). And on TV, top shows have starred Tony Orlando, newsman Geraldo Rivera. Jose Perez, and of course, the late Freddie Prinze.

Latinos are also distinguishing themselves in other fields that depend on individual ability: Luis W. Alvarez, who won the 1968 Nobel Prize in physics, Dr. Antonio Gasset, who developed a breakthrough treatment for blindness caused by corneal disease.

Federal Judge Harold Medina, whose distguished judicial career has spanned 30 years; Navy pilot Everett Alvarez, who endured nearly nine years as a POW after being the first American captured

in North Vietnam.

The trend toward such achievements began in earlier years—remember Gilbert Roland's classy portrayal of Latinos as early as the Forties? But the second phase of Latino advancement is just now gaining momentum: The gathering of clout that expresses itself at the ballot box and in the marketplace.

Jimmy Carter might not be President but for his almost-solid Latino support. Arizona and New Mexico both have Latino governors — Raul Castro and Jerry Apodaca. Miami's mayor is Maurice Ferre. Virtually every city and state with a sizeable Latino population has at least one elected

Latinos have emerged as a definable market with at least as much spending power per family as Blacks and just as many preferences: coffee, beer, cosmetics, cigarettes, clothes, records, stereos, radio, and TV sets. "We have an overall tendency to be big spenders," says Miami banker Jose Manuel Casanova.

One example is the heavy buying a big-ticket item like cars and houses. Advertisers are reaching out not only to Latinos, but are also using such leading personalities as Ricardo Montalban and Jose Ferrer — complete with well-known accents—to promote products and travel in commercials directed at all Americans.




