Arthur H. Peters had the title of Administrative Time-keeper Records of the earnings of all individuals working in the center were maintained ~~by~~ by this department.

M. E. Johnson was Cashier and headed the payroll and script issuance office.

Clarence N. Johnson served as Postmaster for the Center Post Office which provided the same services as any Post Office in the city of Fresno. This included money orders registers, C.O.D, insurance, stamps even war bonds and defense stamps.

Frank Hoblisch headed the Supply Section, a small bespectacled man with a firm jaw, easily identified because he was seldom seen without a cap. His responsibility was the requisitioning, receiving and inspection of all materials, supplies and equipment and the
