## **Integrated Studies**

The Performing Arts Program at California State University Channel Islands offers a broad, integrated undergraduate experience in music, theatre, and dance, with attention to the relatively new fields of audience and performance studies. The program stresses the interdisciplinary and multicultural, global perspectives that are the hallmarks of CSUCI.

In addition to gaining expertise and experience in their chosen fields of Dance, Music, or Theater, students gain interdisciplinary experience in the performing arts, with education and experience in the intersections between the fields. The core courses provide the base necessary for building an educational and professional career in the performing arts, and the capstone course offers students the opportunity to intern with professional companies and organizations.

Core courses offer an integrated experience through each of the three major areas of the performing arts:
Introduction to the Performing Arts
Integrating Dance, Music and Theatre
Business and the Performing Arts
Audience and Performance Studies
Musical Theatre
Physics of the Performing Arts

In addition to the core courses, students choose an emphasis to follow:


- The Dance emphasis (PADA)

  provides concentrated study in


  collaborative dance performance

- The Theatre emphasis (PATH) provides concentrated study in acting, directing, musical theatre, and collaborative performance production.
