




California Roster for 1972-1973

(24) COORDINATING COUNCIL FOR HIGHER EDUCATION

Created by the Donahoe Higher Education Act of 1960, Coordinating Council for Higher Education is a state agency designed to advise the Governor, the Legislature, appropriate state officials, and the governing boards of the three systems of public higher education in California on matters of delineation of functions, finance, program development and new campus development. The council is also the California State Commission for Higher Education. The council is a direct result of the recommendations contained in the Master Plan for Higher Education, 1960-1975.

(25) DEPARTMENT OF CORPORATIONS

CORPORATE SECURITIES LAW OF 1968 (qualification of the sale of securities; regulation of agents, broker-dealers and investment advisers); **SECURITY OWNERS PROTECTION LAW; RETIREMENT SYSTEMS DISCLOSURE LAW; BUCKET SHOP LAW; LIMITED DIVIDEND PAYMENT LAW; HOUSING CORPORATION LAW; COMMUNITY LAW; CHECK SELLERS AND CASHERS LAW; CALIFORNIA CREDIT UNION LAW; ESCROW LAW; INDUSTRIAL LOAN LAW; PERSONAL PROPERTY BROKERS LAW; CALIFORNIA SMALL LOAN LAW; TRADING STAMP LAW; MUTUAL FUNDS; COMMUNITY ADVISERS LAW; FRANCHISE INVESTMENT LAW.**

26) BOARD OF CORRECTIONS

Office: 714 P St., Room 540, Sacramento 95814

Correlates **CORRECTIONAL SERVICES**; studies **CRIME** including causes, possible methods of prevention, methods of detection, apprehension and prosecution; reviews plans for local **DETENTION FACILITIES**; on request studies detention needs of local government and makes recommendations; establishes minimum standards and conducts inspections for city and county jails and other local correctional facilities for adults.

27) DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

Office: 714 P St., Sacramento 95814

The Department of Corrections meets the need for the provision of facilities and programs for the control and treatment of convicted felons and narcotic addicts in order to execute the sentences prescribed by the courts and parole boards in this portion of the total criminal justice effort of public protection. Approves establishment after public hearings of agricultural industrial enterprises in prisons with a gross annual production of \$25,000 or more.

The department is responsible for more than 43,400 men and women, including approximately 19,500 in correctional institutions and camps, 1,900 narcotic addicts in a rehabilitation center, and 22,000 parolees and ex-addicts under supervision in California communities.

To accomplish its objectives, the department operates 12 major institutions, 22 conservation camps, 4 community correctional centers and more than 50 parole offices. A central office in Sacramento also is maintained for administration and coordination necessary in the decentralized operating system.

28) DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

The California State Department of Education is the agency of state government responsible for the regulation and control of that part of the California public school system that is composed of elementary schools, high schools and the special schools created by the state for blind, deaf, and neurologically handicapped children. The Department, which is administered by the Superintendent of Public Instruction, meets this responsibility by directing its efforts in accordance with policy established by the State Board of Education.

Although the responsibilities of the Department of Education prescribed by law, the Department does not function primarily as a law enforcement agency. Instead, the Department exerts its major effort to the provision of professional direction and leadership that will keep the California school system abreast of the times, outstandingly strong, and economically sound.

State Board of Education

The major duties of this Board are to establish policy for the State Department of Education; propose legislation to improve the public schools; establish minimum standards of instruction; adopt textbooks for grades one through eight; accredit teacher training institutions; approve licensing standards for teachers and other certificated personnel set by the Commission for Teacher Preparation and licensing; take action against the credentials of teaching personnel who demonstrate unfitness; review school district reorganization plans; and allocate federal funds for such purposes as compensatory and vocational education.

State Library

Office: Library and Courts Bldg., Sacramento 95814

The California State Library contains over three-quarters of a million volumes including California Section with materials on history, description, industries; Administrative-Legislative Reference Service for State administrative agencies and legislators; Government Publications Section contains official documents of city, county, state, federal and foreign governments; Law Library offers statutes and court reports of other American states, Great Britain, Canada, Australia; Reference Section

provides public interest materials; history, economics, technical fields, literature; sociology, current events. The Library Consultant Services provides advice and assistance on the development and improvement of public libraries in California. The State Library maintains a branch in San Francisco, the Sutro Library, containing 100,000 volumes.

Educational Advisory Bodies

There are five commissions which are educational policy bodies to the State Board of Education. Each is composed of professional and lay members. The commissions were established to advise the State Board of Education within the general policy areas to which they are charged. The Superintendent of Public Instruction or his representative shall serve as executive secretary to each educational policy advisory commission.

The Governor, the Senate Rules Committee, and the Speaker of the House each appoint one member of the public to each advisory commission. Each commission also has a senator appointed by the Senate Rules Committee and an assemblyman appointed by the Speaker of the House as members.

The majority of the members of each commission are appointed by the State Board of Education. The total number of members on each commission varies.

The names of the commissions and the total number of members for each follow: Advisory Commission on Special Education, 14; Curriculum Development and Supplemental Materials Commission, 18; Education Innovation and Planning Commission, 20; Educational Management and Evaluation Commission, 14; and Equal Educational Opportunities Commission, 15.

(29) CALIFORNIA EMERGENCY COUNCIL

Acts as an advisory body to the Governor in times of emergency and with reference thereto. Considers and recommends for approval by the Governor, rules, regulations or orders pertaining to **EMERGENCIES**; boundaries of mutual aid regions; creation of advisory committees; expenditures of monies appropriated for purposes of the **CALIFORNIA EMERGENCY SERVICES ACT**; **A STATE EMERGENCY PLAN**; and assignment of any service or activity relative to emergency operations or planning to a state agency having duties related to such service or activity. It encourages the development and maintenance by local agencies of government of emergency plans based on mutual aid. It evaluates and reports to the Governor on state communications systems, with particular regard to their adequacy in case of emergency.

Office of Emergency Services

Fiscal and administration; planning and operations; fire and rescue; law enforcement; emergency assistance programs.

(30) PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM

Information concerning membership in and **RETIREMENT OF STATE AND CONTRACTING PUBLIC AGENCY EMPLOYEES**; **OLD-AGE, SURVIVORS AND DISABILITY INSURANCE**, coverage for State and Public Agency Employees in California; **LEGISLATORS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM**; **RETIREMENT SYSTEM INVESTMENTS**; **MEYERS-GEDDES STATE EMPLOYEES' MEDICAL AND HOSPITAL CARE ACT**.

(31) STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION

Office: 1020 N Street, Sacramento 95814

Administers **MAJOR TAX LAWS, STATE AND LOCAL SALES AND USE, CIGARETTE, ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE, MOTOR VEHICLE FUEL, USE FUEL, MOTOR**

VEHICLE TRANSPORTATION, INSURANCE GROSS PREMIUMS, PRIVATE CAR; values **STATE ASSESSED PROPERTY** for local taxation; determines the levels of **PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENTS** in the several counties and guides and directs their equalization; assists county assessors and prescribes rules and regulations for those assessors and county boards of equalization; hears appeals of assessors in intercounty equalization; hears appeals from the **FRANCHISE TAX BOARD**.

(32) DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE

Office: 1145 State Capitol, Sacramento 95814

State **FISCAL** policies; program **ANALYSIS** and **EVALUATION**; **BUDGET** development and presentation; financial **AUDIT** and program **COMPLIANCE**.

(33) STATE FIRE MARSHAL

Office: 1215 O Street, Room A-101, Sacramento 95814

Minimum **FIRE AND PANIC SAFETY STANDARDS** are adopted and enforced (public assembly, educational and institutional occupancies, dry cleaning plants, and state-owned buildings). **APPROVAL** and **LISTING SERVICE** (building materials and equipment).

SAFETY STANDARDS are established and enforced through **CLASSIFICATION, LICENSURE, CERTIFICATION, OR REGISTRATION** (fireworks, explosives, servicing of fire extinguishers, flammable fabrics, flame retardants and applicators, and flammable liquid cargo tanks). **TRAINING** (institutional facilities and state fire safety regulations for local authorities).

(34) DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME

Office: 1416 Ninth Street, Sacramento 95814

Has responsibility for protection, preservation, propagation, and enhancement of California's **WILDLIFE RESOURCES** (birds, fish, mammals, mollusks, crustaceans, and amphibia). Enforces laws and regulations and issues licenses relative thereto.

Cooperates with and aids local and other governmental agencies in acquiring and developing projects for **RECREATION** and for **CONSERVATION OF WILDLIFE**.

Fish and Game Commission

The commission establishes policies for the guidance of the department; prescribes the terms and conditions under which permits or licenses may be issued by the department; promulgates regulations establishing open and closed seasons, bag and possession limits, and methods of, and areas for the taking of sports fish and game; regulates the following aspects of commercial fishing: fish reduction, the ocean shrimp fishery, kelp leases, oyster allotments and shellfish cultivation, and abalone regulations, and lobster regulations; controls the acquisition of lands by the department; may control the department's budget but has no powers in relation to the administration of the department.

(35) FRANCHISE TAX BOARD

Office: 1025 P Street, Sacramento 95814

Administers the **BANK AND CORPORATION TAX LAW, PERSONAL INCOME TAX LAW** and **SENIOR CITIZENS PROPERTY TAX ASSISTANCE LAW**, which provide for income and franchise taxes imposed on banks, corporations, individuals, estates and trusts; fixes the rate of tax paid by financial corporations; exempts qualified nonprofit corporations; and provides property tax assistance for California residents who are over 62 years of age and qualify.

(36) DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES

Office: 915 Capitol Mall, Sacramento 95814

Administers the central service and business management activities of state government including: **FACILITIES PLANNING, SPACE UTILIZATION, and LEASING; REAL PROPERTY ACQUISITION and DISPOSAL; BUILDINGS**

and **GROUND MAINTENANCE; ARCHITECTURAL and ENGINEERING** services and **CONSTRUCTION** supervision; local government **ALLOCATIONS** for **SCHOOL** plans, site buildings, and equipment; **HEARING OFFICER** services; **codification** of state agency **RULES and REGULATIONS; INSURANCE and PUBLIC OFFICIAL BOND**; central **DUPLICATING, MAIL and MESSENGER** service and **OFFICE MACHINE REPAIR**; central **RECORDS STORAGE and DISPOSAL; STATE POLICE; COMMUNICATIONS ENGINEERING and MAINTENANCE; SYSTEM ANALYSIS**; Legislative, departmental, and textbook **PRINTING; PURCHASING, PROCUREMENT, and DISPOSAL of MATERIAL; TRANSPORTATION SERVICE**.

In addition, staffs of the following boards and committees are included in the departmental organization: California **EMPLOYMENT and FAIR** executive committee; **STATE ALLIANCE BOARD; BUILDING STANDARDS COMMISSION; STATE COMMUNICATIONS ADVISORY BOARD; STATE PUBLIC WORKS BOARD**.

(37) COMMISSION ON CALIFORNIA STATE GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATION AND ECONOMY

Office: 11th & L Building, Suite 550, Sacramento 95814

The Commission on California State Government Organization and Economy was created by the Legislature as a permanent, independent board of review over activities relating to organization and economical operation of the executive branch of the state government. It has responsibility for submitting reports of its findings and recommendations to both the Legislature and to the Governor.

(38) GOVERNOR

Office: State Capitol, Sacramento 95814

Chief executive of California state government. Responsible for planning, organizing and directing most state departments and agencies within the Executive Branch. Responsible for developing executive policy and programs. Services as Commander-in-Chief of California National Guard. Responsible for declaring states of extreme emergency and disaster and for mobilizing directing state resources during emergency situations.

Appoints most department heads and members of boards and commissions.

Presents annual messages and state budget to Legislature may propose legislation. Approves or vetoes legislative enactments.

Has power to exercise executive clemency in criminal matters through the granting of pardons, reprieves and commutation sentence. Approves or denies extradition in criminal cases involving interstate rendition of prisoners.

(39) BOARD OF HARBOR COMMISSIONERS FOR HUMBOLDT BAY

Office: P. O. Box A, Eureka 95501

Regulates laying of **SUBMARINE CABLES** in Humboldt Bay. Maintains records of **VESSELS** entering and leaving port. Issues construction permits for **BOOMS, BULKHEADS AND WHARFS**.

(40) DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CARE SERVICES

Office: 714 P Street, Sacramento 95814

Administers the California Medical Assistance Program which provides basic and extended health care and remedial or preventive services to recipients of public assistance and to medically needy, aged, and other persons, including related social services as are necessary.

Coordinates and supervises all aspects of the California Medical Assistance Program and affords policy determination, and management control, program planning and review, including assistance and, in addition, provides liaison with Federal programs.

Health Care Commission

The Health Care Commission, created by the 1971 Medi-Cal reform Act, advises the Department of Health Care Services its budget, rates paid to providers of services, and program regulations.

The Commission also is to advise on prepaid health plans proposals before the Department, study their quality of care, enrollment, and provide other program guidance.

Medical Therapeutics and Drug Advisory Committee

Reviews drugs on the Medi-Cal Drug Formulary and makes written recommendations to the Director as to the addition of a drug to or the deletion of any drug from said formulary; reviews and reports in writing to the Director as to the comparative therapeutic effect of drugs; advises the Director as to whether a drug is vital to the program.

1) CALIFORNIA HERITAGE PRESERVATION COMMISSION

Office: State Archives, 1020 O Street, Sacramento 95814

The Commission shall prepare a plan for the restoration, preservation and display in the State Capitol and elsewhere in the State of California of the historic documents of the State of California on deposit with the Secretary of State. The plans for the displays shall be directed to the instruction and inspiration of all California citizens, particularly students.

2) CALIFORNIA HIGHWAY COMMISSION

Office: 1120 N Street, Sacramento 95814

Adopts official **HIGHWAY ROUTES**; allocates **HIGHWAY FUNDS**; designates **FREEWAYS**; adopts resolutions covering **CONDEMNATION, ABANDONMENT and RELINQUISHMENT OF RIGHTS OF WAY**; and authorizes **SALES OF EXCESS PROPERTY**.

3) DEPARTMENT OF CALIFORNIA HIGHWAY PATROL

Office: 2611 26th Street, Sacramento 95818

The California Highway Patrol performs those services which assure the safe, lawful, rapid, and economical use of the State's highways. These services include: enforcement of laws related to the use of highways, traffic control, assistance to highway users, and other services.

The California Highway Patrol investigates vehicle accidents; coordinates auto theft investigations; compiles and publishes information pertaining to vehicle collisions; and conducts highway safety education program for the public. It also operates an Academy where California Highway Patrol personnel and other law enforcement officials receive professional training.

The Department inspects passenger vehicles, commercial vehicles, farm labor vehicles, school buses, and motor carrier trailers; regulates the safe loading and transportation of specific materials, including hazardous commodities; provides automotive engineering services and develops standards for equipment; enforces laws for the reduction of motor vehicle noise; and issues permits and licenses for the operation of specialized and agency vehicles.

4) CALIFORNIA HORSE RACING BOARD

Office: 205 S. Broadway, Room 417, Los Angeles 90012

Administers laws governing **HORSE RACING** with **PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING ON THEIR RESULTS**. Licenses **HORSE OWNERS, JOCKEYS, TRAINERS, APPRENTICES, GROOMS, EXERCISE BOYS, PARI-MUTUEL EMPLOYEES**, etc.

5) COMMISSION OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Office: 1121 O St., Rm. 3344, Sacramento 95814

The Commission of Housing and Community Development publishes the policies for the Department of Housing and

Community Development and promulgates regulations pursuant to the **Factory-Built Housing Law**, **State Housing Law**, the **Mobilehomes and Mobilehome Park Law**, the **Employee Housing Act**, and other related laws.

(46) DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Office: 1121 O St., Rm. 3344, Sacramento 95814

The Department assists local governmental agencies and private enterprise on housing and community development matters, establishes and administers minimum standards for all types of housing; conducts a housing research and statistics program; makes recommendations to the Governor for changes in State and Federal Laws relating to housing and community development; and encourages planning and all other activities intended to increase the supply of housing.

Division of Codes and Standards

Administers and enforces state building and housing standards applicable to factory-built housing, apartment houses, hotels, motels, dwellings, employee housing (labor camps), and mobilehome parks promulgated by the Commission of Housing and Community Development; also buildings subject to the **Earthquake Protection Law**; administers and enforces state structural standards for plumbing, heat-producing and electrical equipment and installations in all types of mobile homes, commercial coaches and recreational vehicles, and issues insignia of approval to all those sold or offered for sale in California; furnishes consultative and technical assistance to local officials, architects, builders, and interested persons in the development and enforcement of building and housing codes, regarding the above occupancies investigation of substandard housing conditions, and organization of local code enforcement.

Division of Research and Assistance

Advises and assists governmental agencies, non-profit organizations, and private enterprise regarding the nature and availability of federal assistance for housing development, community development, and urban renewal and regarding the development of new and used housing for farm laborers and their families, low-income persons, the elderly, students, and persons displaced by governmental actions; responsible for development and implementation of the **STATEWIDE HOUSING ELEMENT**; provides guidelines and consultative information for city and county housing elements of general plans; dissemination of data and information affecting housing and community development; and, if federal funds are available, conducts demonstration projects designed to meet special needs of agricultural workers and persons displaced by State and local action; provides leadership training for programs for low-income home management courses; provides training for local government officials in Grantsmanship and development of local housing plans.

(47) HUMAN RELATIONS AGENCY

Office: State Office Bldg. No. 1, Sacramento 95814

Organizationally, the secretary represents the Governor in the broad functional area of Human Relations and serves as the Governor's principal advisor in the formulation and implementation of policies in his field of responsibility.

The Secretary for Human Relations is responsible for general direction of the Departments of Corrections, Human Resources Development, Mental Hygiene, Public Health, Rehabilitation, Social Welfare, Youth Authority, Health Care Services, and other related boards and commissions.

The secretary also has direct responsibility for the direction and operation of the California Medical Assistance Program.

(48) DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT

Office: 800 Capitol Mall, Sacramento 95814

EMPLOYER REGISTRATION, REPORTING AND AUDIT; UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE BENEFITS; DISABILITY INSURANCE and HOSPITAL BENEFITS;

EMPLOYMENT SERVICE; RURAL MANPOWER SERVICES; MANPOWER TRAINING; WORK INCENTIVE.

Inquires regarding employer registration, employer status, contribution or wage reports, direct to nearest Employment Tax Office; employment service, job information, manpower training, work incentive, or unemployment insurance to nearest HRD office; disability insurance to nearest disability insurance office or nearest HRD office; farm placement to nearest Rural Manpower Services office or HRD office.

The Office of Economic Opportunity provides technical assistance to community action agencies and other anti-poverty organizations funded under the Economic Opportunity Act. It coordinates anti-poverty resources of federal, state and local levels, including resources of the private sector.

The California Commission on Aging advises the Governor and the Legislature on the needs and problems of the senior citizens of California. Holds hearings and conducts studies on all aspects of the problems of aging; acts as a clearing house and information center on all aspects of aging.

The California Unemployment Insurance Appeals Board hears and adjudicates appeals from employers and employees concerning unemployment insurance matters.

(49) DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS

Office: 455 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco 94102

SELF-INSURANCE under WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION LAW.

State Conciliation Service

CONCILIATION and MEDIATION of labor-management disputes; conciliation of disputes in the public sector under the **MEYERS-MILIAS-BROWN ACT**, **WINTON ACT** and various sections of the **PUBLIC UTILITIES CODE** concerning Transit Authorities; representation elections in labor-management relations; arbitration of labor-management disputes; labor management problems.

Division of Apprenticeship Standards

Develops, approves, and monitors **APPRENTICESHIP STANDARDS** in industry including **EQUAL OPPORTUNITY PLANS**; files **APPRENTICE AGREEMENTS** for individual apprentices; provides consultative services to management and labor organizations, governmental and community agencies. Approves apprenticeship and other training on the job programs under the **VIETNAM G. I. BILL**.

The **APPRENTICESHIP COUNCIL** establishes apprentice labor standards; issues rules and regulations; fosters, promotes, and develops the welfare of apprentices, and advances their opportunities for profitable employment. The Council also promotes on-the-job training programs other than apprenticeship.

Division of Fair Employment Practices

Administers, enforces and generally promotes the purposes of the **FAIR EMPLOYMENT PRACTICE ACT** relating to the prevention and elimination of practices of **DISCRIMINATION** in **EMPLOYMENT** against persons because of **RACE, RELIGIOUS CREED, SEX, COLOR, NATIONAL ORIGIN OR ANCESTRY**.

The **FAIR HOUSING ACT** of 1963 assigned additional responsibilities of promoting **EQUALITY OF OPPORTUNITY** in **HOUSING ACCOMMODATIONS**.

Division of Industrial Safety

Administers and enforces all laws and lawful orders relating to safety in employments and places of employment; establishes **SAFETY ORDERS** such as **GENERAL INDUSTRY, CONSTRUCTION, ELEVATOR, PRESSURE VESSEL, MINING AND PETROLEUM**; examines and certifies qualified **BOILER, PRESSURE VESSEL, and ELEVATOR INSPECTORS**; and publishes **CALIFORNIA SAFETY NEWS** and other educational safety materials.

Division of Industrial Welfare

Enforces standards for minimum wages, hours of employment and working conditions for women and minors in all industries and occupations except government and domestic household employment. Also enforces specific statutory requirements in **LABOR CODE**, including the **Equal Pay Law** and the **Home Work Act** which cover men and women.

Division of Labor Law Enforcement

Enforces general labor laws, including laws relating to **PAYMENT OF WAGES; COLLECTION OF UNPAID WAGES; EMPLOYMENT OF MINORS; HOURS AND WORKING CONDITIONS IN SPECIFIED INDUSTRIES**; issues permits for minors to work in **THEATRICAL and ENTERTAINMENT INDUSTRIES**; enforces laws relating to **EMPLOYERS' CONTRIBUTIONS TO HEALTH and WELFARE PENSION** and similar funds and **WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION INSURANCE**; administers laws relating to **EMPLOYMENT ON PUBLIC WORKS; FARM LABOR CONTRACTORS; DAY OF REST LAW**; laws regarding **SAFETY and WORKING CONDITIONS** in industry generally.

Division of Labor Statistics and Research

Collects, compiles, and presents facts and statistics relating to **WORK INJURIES, WORK FATALITIES**; and **HOURS and COLLECTIVE BARGAINING, WAGE RATES, WAGE SETTLEMENTS, WORK STOPPAGES (STRIKES, INDUSTRIAL DISPUTES), UNION CONTRACT PROVISIONS, UNION MEMBERSHIP; COST OF LIVING BUDGET**.

Division of Industrial Accidents

Workmen's Compensation Appeals Board

Is a court of special jurisdiction with authority to hear and determine controversies under the **WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION LAWS** of California.

MUNICIPAL COURTS are located in judicial districts with population of more than 40,000 and have jurisdiction over civil cases involving \$5,000 or less and misdemeanors, except juveniles.

JUSTICE COURTS are located in judicial districts with a population of 40,000 or less and have jurisdiction over civil cases involving \$1,000 or less and minor criminal offenses.

Judicial Council

Function is to improve the administration of justice by surveying judicial business, making recommendations to the Governor, Legislature and courts, and adopting rules of court administration, practice and procedure. Chief Justice, as chairman of the council, seeks to expedite judicial business and to equalize the work of judges and may assign judge to another court. **COURT RULES, PROCEDURES; COURT STATISTICS.**

Staff agency to assist Judicial Council in carrying out Council policy and recommendations. Collects, compiles and analyzes judicial statistics, prepares legal research and aids in judicial administrative matters.

The **ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH AND CONSUMER PROTECTION PROGRAM** conducts licensing, inspection, enforcement, and educational programs to protect the public from: contaminated, adulterated, mislabeled, or falsely advertised foods, drugs, medical devices, and cosmetics; hazardous household products; health frauds; radiation hazards from radioactive materials, machine sources of radiation, and unqualified operators of x-ray machines; and unwholesome domestic water supplies and disease-causing sewage disposal systems. Causes of nonmechanical occupational injuries and diseases and environmental hazards are investigated, and consultation on prevention and treatment is provided. Surveillance conducted and consultation is provided to local communities for protection from animal and insect borne diseases, and unsafe and unsanitary conditions in the preparation, selling, or service of foods, in the harvesting of food crops, and in residential or institutional housing.

The **PREVENTIVE MEDICAL SERVICES PROGRAM** develops and implements programs and provides consultation for: the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of infectious and chronic diseases; treatment and control of venereal diseases; and improvement of dental health. Programs are administered and consultation is provided for: the health care and rehabilitation of physically handicapped children, the mentally retarded, disabled, and person suffering from chronic kidney failure; reducing the risks of childbirth and infant deaths; protecting the health of mothers, infants and children; providing family planning services; and health care services for disadvantaged groups.

The **LABORATORY SERVICES PROGRAM** provides specialized laboratory services and consultation to the Department, local health departments, and others to meet public health needs throughout the state.
