SNDP no waltz for two busy organizers

Why did two people get together and improve an already good thing?

An evolution was started in Leisure Village on May 17, 2004, the beginning of the Saturday Night Dance Party (SNDP), when Bill Byrnes, originally from Lansdale, Pa., and Barbara Ohmstedt, originally from Jersey City, N.J., got their heads together and said: "We can make life even more enjoyable for Leisure Villagers by selecting music for their listening and dancing pleasure, especially in a party atmosphere, and Saturday is the perfect night for this event!"

And they got it! It would take lots of development time, meetings, phone calls, etc. This "do

good" project and the time to perfect it met with the approval of their respective spouses, Liz and Ernie.

When Bill and Barbara first took over the responsibility and direction of the SNDP, they were playing cassettes and developing CDs and doing the music/ song list for the evening. Gone are those days, and live groups or live bands are now the order of the evening. It was a huge job, and Barbara did all the recording work. What a difference live group or band music has on your evening's enjoyment!

The SNDP is a conglomeration of lots of thought, research, gathering musical informational data and, at the same time, trying to please many personal tastes, which, as you know, is usually not totally possible.

Perseverance did it! Saturday night after Saturday night and many days in between, records were kept to determine what was necessary to satisfy divergent tastes - types of music, types of dances, dress code, costs, table arrangement and settings, music groups, food, drink, decorations, lighting — to name some of the considerations.

It all took a lot of time. but today we see the successful results of their efforts.

The SNDP is a production of a type. Bill likes to be called the chief executive officer, and he likes to call Barbara his chief operating officer. Their parts in this production are always in cooperation with each other. and they work well together.

Bill's contributions are scheduling, hiring and negotiating costs for the various music groups, including how many musicians are needed for the particular evening they are playing. He rates the music groups and runs surveys and analysis. He runs opinion polls, and he solves many problems that

come up when you have a lot of guests at a Saturday night party.

Barbara does advertising posters - she designs, prints and posts them. She shows up an hour and a half before any dance begins to see that it is set up properly for the evening and, if it is a "theme evening," such as Mardi Gras or Hawaiian Night, that the respective decor is proper and in place. She keeps a written history of what they do. She does the banking, keeps all paperwork in order and schedules the annual audit, which has always seamlessly passed the auditor's examination. And more, and more and more!

Bill and Barbara share data, new ideas, band selection and other items. They have instigated the many celebrations: birthdays. wedding anniversaries, other types of anniversaries, welcoming family evenings at the party and even singing for the celebrants.

This is a Leisure Village evening that is run successfully by two people who make it that way. They run it with friendly discipline. The evening, as required, is non-profit. The \$5 fee, per person, at the door covers most of the evening's expenses, which goes mostly to the evening's band. They have a committee of 18 wonderful people working in six categories: Management, Executive Committee, Tickets and Greeters, Refreshments, Lighting and Set Decorating, and Publicity.

They have a winning agenda! They always try to provide enjoyment, entertainment and fun for those who attend. They work hard and give their time providing remarkable and wonderful Saturday evenings.

Thanks, Bill Byrnes and Barbara Ohmstedt, for your hard work and dedication to helping all Leisure Villagers to have their moment "Dancing with the Stars."

'The Wrong Box' is British classic

The 1960s were a very fruitful period in British film history. Many of their finest films were produced all over the world during this period: "Bridge Over the River Kwai," "Lawrence of Arabia," "2001: A Space Odyssey," to name just three of the films produced in whole or part in the British Isles.

This month, we show a relatively little-known comedy, "The Wrong Box." It's a shame, too, because it is hysterically funny in spots and merely uproarious in others.

Encarta describes tontine as a noun, "a group investment scheme: an investment or insurance plan in which contributors pay equal amounts into a common fund and receive equal dividends and benefits from it, with the final surviving contributor receiving

everything."

Now that we all know what a tontine is, this movie is all about one. It has nearly every fine British comedian in it, and some good dramatic actors not necessarily known for comedy, including Sir Ralph Richardson, Sir John Mills (father of Hayley), Sir Michael Caine, Peter Cook, Dudley Moore and the magnificent Peter Sellers in a cameo role.

Director Bryan Forbes was well-known as an actor in British films for years before directing. He had appeared in such classic films as "The Guns of Navarone" and "The League of Gentlemen." He also directed many more classic films, such as "The Stepford Wives" and "King Rat." He wisely cast his wife, the impossibly beautiful Nanette Newman, as the female lead in "Wrong Box."

This romp follows the adventures of a group of folks who are all part of the tontine and the efforts of each to make himself the survivor and heir to the fortune. As with "Kind Hearts and Coronets," it is wise to follow the dialogue closely because the British wit is at its best here.

In June we will not be showing any films because Sarah and I will be in Europe. Once again, the Danube University of Krems, Austria, has hired yours truly to lecture on film production, so we have to make the schlep across the pond and help the poor dears. It's a nasty business but, as they say, someone has to do it.

As always, there will be free popcorn, coffee and punch. The event is at 7 p.m. in the AR on Sunday, May 13. See you at the mov-



Bill would give senior homeowners a tax break

A proposed law would lower seniors' property taxes. The bill, AB351, Property Tax Exemption Bill, would change the county property tax exemption from \$7,000 to \$27,000 for seniors 62 and older who own their own homes. This means a savings of about \$356 per year for seniors.

Senior-friendly law

Often we hear that your friends and family members may want to join you in living in our wonderful community but are hesitant to move to the Village because they don't want to start paying today's rates on their property taxes. Do they currently live in California? If so, you need to make sure they are aware of Propositions 60/90. They may qualify.

This is a great law for seniors. A simple explanation of the proposition is: If you are over 55, you can have a one-time exemption where you sell your personal residence in a participating county and purchase a replacement residence (in Leisure Village) at least one dollar cheaper and therefore are able to bring over your Proposition 13 tax base from the original home to the new one.

For the official qualifications, you can look at Ventura County's form for this exemption on our Web site. Here is the link .:

This proposition does not just help individuals moving into the Village, but it helps increase the value of your Village property by allowing more people a tax-friendly way to purchase your home. Make sure local politicians know we like this seniorfriendly proposition.

Too personal

Realtors typically urge clients to make their homes as neutral as possible, which means removing personalized collections of political, cultural and religious artifacts, among other items.

Though such confrontations are difficult, agents say it is essential that they inform their clients of the impact of having their personal belongings on display. Be prepared to look quickly and carefully at that ice-skating scene. There! Just as Cary Grant ties Loretta Young's skates, to the lower left of the frame, in the foreground, the little guy on the edge of the bench is the now 68-year-old resident of Village 24, where he resides with Sarah, his wife of 18 years. They share a love story that goes back to when they were childhood sweethearts at the Ojai Valley School in 1953.

Ah, but that's for a movie or another article.

Bob has had a long and fascinating career, one that went from ditch-digger to more than 100 production credits in films and television shows of all kinds and in all locations. He has even had a few acting jobs beyond that early celluloid silhouette as a child extra. In 1961, he graduated from the UCLA Theatre Arts with a major in cinema produc-

Those are the highlights of his past history.

But history is something always on the mind of Bob Koster these days. It is intensely personal and deeply entwined with motion pictures.

He is well along in his research and writing of what promises to be a unique and definitive work covering a chapter in motion picture history. The subject in which he is steeped is that of his father, one of the most successful Hollywood film directors of his generation. Koster plans a multimedia presentation which, at its core, will be a

book, but which will include historic clips from personal family film photo archives, additional Hollywood and European feature film clips, and other audio and video materials that will trace the Koster line through at least four generations.

Koster's father fled from the Nazis in Berlin and his emerging filmmaking career in 1934 after an altercation with a Party underling. He managed to stay just ahead of the Nazi tide, making films in Hungary and The Netherlands before finally coming to freedom in the United States. Once here, he teamed up with his legendary European partners, Joe Pasternak and Felix Jackson (Jackson also lived in Leisure Village in retirement). At Universal, they created films to introduce a young sensation to film, Deanna Durbin. Of her 16 career films, Henry Koster directed the first six.

Beyond regular teaching assignments in various as-

pects of motion picture history and production for the nationwide Osher Project a college/university-based philanthropic venture in lifelong-learning for adults Koster is an instructor for the UCLA Extension Division and lectures on behalf of the "Budget Book for Film & Television," which he authored. Over the years, he has lectured and taught in Austria, Germany and The Netherlands.

Bob proudly serves in the Camarillo Police Department's Citizen Patrol, which involves him in all aspects of police support, from traffic control to photographer. Despite the many calls on his time and energy, Bob keeps enough in reserve for many friends inside and outside the Village, as well as the large family that he shares with Sarah. There are her two sons and daughter and grandchildren, as well as his two sons from an earlier marriage.

Fittingly, his sons


