Special Major: A student may be permitted to propose his own program of correlated studies in the completion of a special major. This proposed program must include courses selected from two or more fields and must be presented to and approved by a faculty committee composed of the student's faculty adviser, the Associate Dean of Students (Admissions), and the Dean of the College. This major must include a minimum of 24 units of which 12 are upper division, the same as any other major.
