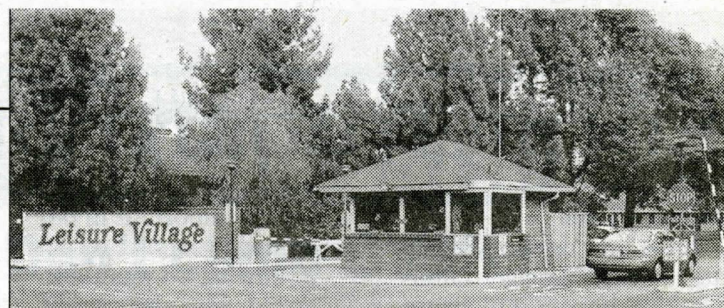

Mayor Mike Morgan, a council member since 1980, is in his fourth term as mayor. He is a founding member of the Camarillo Youth Advisory Council.

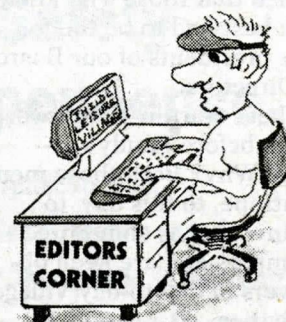
Council member Charlotte Craven has been a Council member for 20

An era came to a close prior to the September Open Board Meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 5, as many, many Villagers came to shake hands with and say goodbye and good luck to General Manager Randy Watkins who, after eight great years, leaves for a key assignment with Pulte Homes, the parent company of Del Webb Co., reported to be the largest homebuilder in the United States.

Here for this special yet informal get-together were dignitaries representing both Ventura County and the City of Camarillo.

Mayor Mike Morgan told of the many projects his city and Randy

Former board presidents praise Watkins

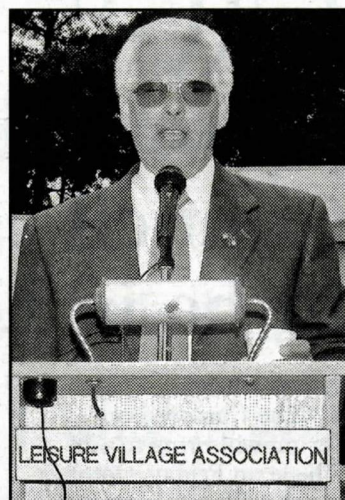
Just how does one evaluate General Manager Randy Watkins' impact on Leisure Village over the past eight years? Your reporter determined that those who knew him best had to be the former presidents of our Board of Directors.

Let's start in 1996, two years before Randy's arrival. Why? Both those men continue, to this day, to be involved as committee members and are keen observers of day-to-day Village activities.

Ed Hawthorne, then president, says: "Randy Watkins was the best manager of the five I've known since coming to LV. He is very knowledgeable, he is an excellent organizer and leader and has been sympathetic and always available to homeowners — which

is so very important in our retirement years."

Following Ed was Dick Griswold, who also carries today the title as Senior Senator in the California Senior Legislature for Ventura County. Dick, in his own words: "I have served on the Leisure Village Association Board of Directors for eight years, four months, and worked with General Managers Bob Collatti, Gene Verbeck, Jim Gembala and Randy Watkins. Randy requested and got Board approval to obtain four CAI Management credentials, thus educating himself to a superior degree in the management and administration of our Planned Unit Development Homeowners Association type of business. His dedication to self-improvement qualifies him as our most outstanding

General Manager, and I am proud to designate him with this honor."

Bo Humphrey was President when Randy arrived, and he says: "In 1998 I was President of the LV Board of Directors, and Randy had been on the job as Senior Accountant for just a few months. Our GM passed away, and we asked Randy to take charge temporarily. After checking for potential General Managers and observing Randy in day-to-day operations, we offered the job to him, and he

accepted. In my opinion, he has been an outstanding General Manager, and I wish Randy and his family all the best in his new endeavor in Nevada."

Max Heller followed, and in his own words, "In 1998, during my first year on the Board, our then General Manager, Jim Gembala, suddenly died. Randy was then the newly appointed Head Accountant for the Village. He had come to us with an impressive executive background. As Treasurer, I had worked with Randy for several months, and I had no difficulty in agreeing that Randy was well-suited to step into the position of General Manager. His subsequent accomplishments over the years have proved that his appointment was one of the best decisions we ever made."

Caroline Pratt served two and one half years as President, and she states: "I believe that the condition and attractiveness of our 33-year-old Village is the greatest accolade I can pay our Randy Watkins. I wish him and Sandy God-speed and many joys in their new life."

Carol Sweeney Zimmet followed, but she will appear again later.

In 2003, Jack Prosen was elected President, and in his own words: "During my tenure as Board President, Randy was my right arm. There was nothing

that I could ask him that he either immediately knew the answer or said he would get back to me, which was done promptly. Many times I would ask certain things that I thought would necessitate the use of a lawyer, but in most cases Randy would have the answer right at his fingertips, saving the Village possible legal expenses. He was such a pleasure to work with, and I personally know the Village is losing a very capable General Manager. I wish him every kind of success in his new position."

Then came Bob Ellis, who said: "It was my pleasure and good fortune to have worked with such a fine General Manager as Randy Watkins. Randy handled every situation placed before him with the poise and expertise of a Fortune 500 Executive. While making decisions, both long and short range, Randy always kept the welfare of the Village, its residents and his employees at the forefront. He will be dearly missed."

Today's President, one who has served us often and well, Carol Sweeney Zimmet, says: "Randy Watkins has been a tremendous asset to the Leisure Village Association and Homeowners. Further, he has been an invaluable help to me and to the Board Members because he readily shared his expertise. Randy will be missed."

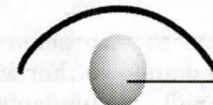

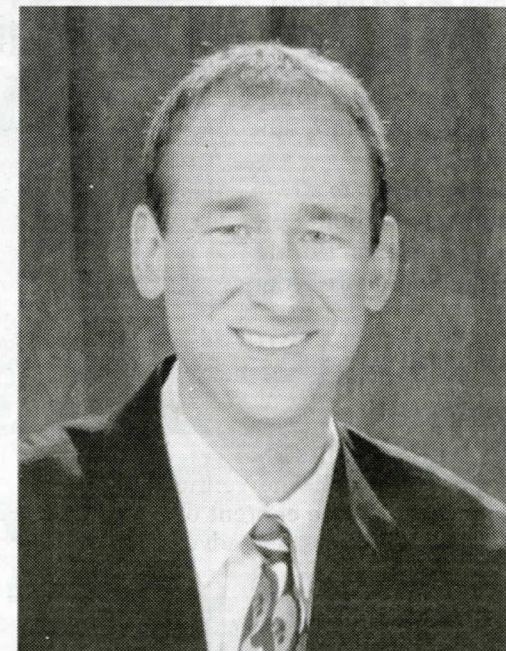

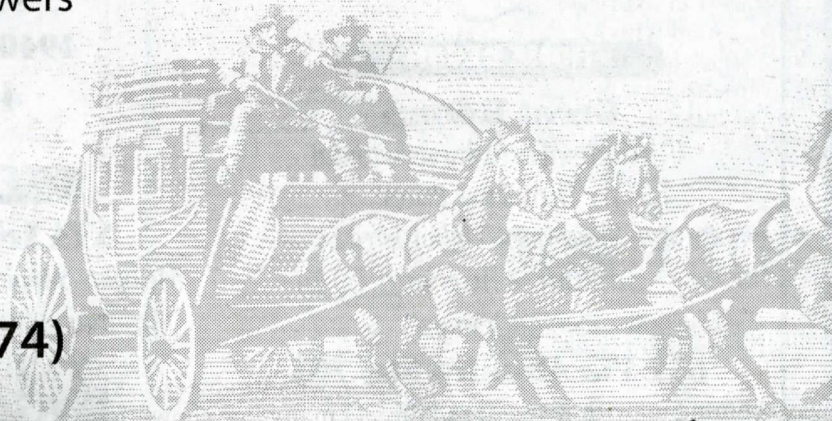

Every Village needs a Burt Swallow

When a man reaches the nonagenarian age of 90, he can expect to hear mostly praise from here on out, if only to honor a life well-lived and an excellent taste in genes.

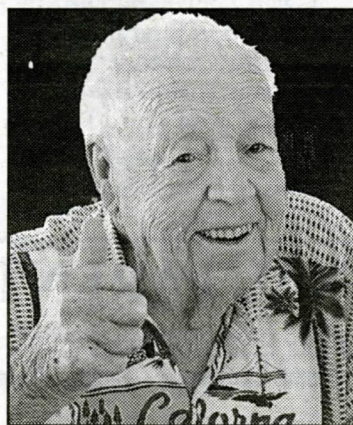
On September 23, some 200 family and friends gathered on the outdoor patio at the Leisure Village Recreation Center to do just that — celebrating the 90th birthday of Burt Swallow. The party was two days ahead of the actual milestone, which he planned to observe one of his favorite ways, fishing.

Despite Burt's dislike of extreme displays, Dorothy, his wife of 68 years, along with some 16 members of the four generations of their immediate family, made sure this party was as exceptional as its honoree. Missing only his grandson who is in the Air Force, the event brought together the whole Swallow clan: two sons and daughter, five grandchildren, seven great-grandchildren and one great-great-granddaughter.

And what a party, fully catered, from nearly a dozen appetizers to two fabulous food lines — one themed Mexican and the other Italian, all the food and drink anybody would want — to the music of a wonderful jazz combo. None of that overshadowed the praise and admiration expressed for Burt, a man who has become legendary in the Village for his tireless, selfless sharing of himself and his talents in the seven years he has lived here.

Ernie Ohmstedt, chair of the Village's Education & Recreation Committee, said of Burt, "He keeps Leisure Village a fantastic place to live. He and Dorothy are very active, never negative, always coming up with ideas and contributions to make it better."

In addition to service, the couple also are admired for their willingness to do

all they can despite increasing physical limitations. Both rely on motorized wheelchairs for mobility, a fact which did nothing to keep Burt and Dorothy from flitting among the birthday crowd.

Two older Village nonagenarians, Art Kauffman, who is 94, and 93-year-old Milt Mankoff, praised Burt's constancy and for always helping to make things better.

Kauffman said Burt's expertise in woodworking and electrical skills, "proved invaluable in modernizing and maintaining the television studio and the lighting booth in the Rec Center."

"For a young kid," Kauffman said, "Burt's really OK."

Mankoff, who produces and directs many live shows from the Rec Center, called Swallow "talented and brave, an all-round man."

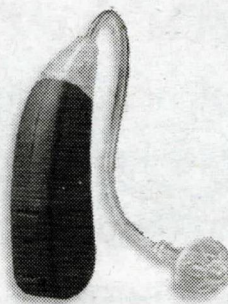

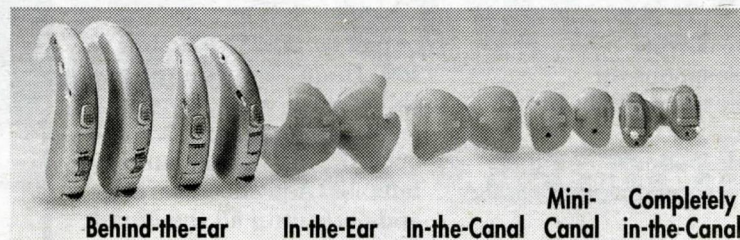

And, in typically droll, Mankoff fashion, he advised those who would live a long life, "Don't stop breathing."

Recalling once when a resident was preparing to throw out some old kitchen cabinets, Recreation Director Susan Rockwell recalled, "Burt said no. He got some help, took the old cupboards, retrofitted them, and today they are used in our Multi-Purpose Room. He is always helpful, always volunteering."

Burt Swallow has had his share of "inconveniences," as he calls them. Two years ago he lost his left leg to diabetes and undergoes dialysis three times a week. But, warns Sid Alweiss, his friend and fellow woodworker, "Don't ever call Burt handicapped. When he wants to do something, he does it and does it well."

Of all that Burt has done in Leisure Village, his impact has been greatest in the Woodshop Club and the Architecture Committee. Ted Lansing, who succeeded Burt as Chair of the Committee, praised him as, "an amazing man, clear, concise, and to the point, warm and affable, a pleasure to be with."

1857 California quake a challenge for newspapers

Southern California's most recent great earthquake occurred on January 9, 1857.

The sparsely-settled area at that time was populated by approximately 35,000 people. A small contingent of soldiers occupied the Fort Tejon military facility, which was located near the quake's epicenter. One soldier was killed and another dozen suffered minor injuries.

Years later, geologists would prove that the nearby San Andreas fault had delivered its eighth great quake over a 1,200-year period.

Today, more than 25 million people live in the area that will be seriously assaulted by the next great earthquake in Southern California. The epicenter of the Fort Tejon Earthquake is about 50 miles northeast of Camarillo.

The lack of wholesale carnage made it difficult for newspaper reporters of that area. Nearly all the documented information is filled with humor, descriptions of weird happenings, and religious references.

The accounts that follow were published by two Los Angeles area newspapers.

From the Los Angeles Star, January 17, 1857: "In an instant, the fearful cry of 'earthquake' issued from every mouth — then a rush, shouting and screaming, which may well be conceived, but cannot be described. At the hotels, the breakfast tables were instantly deserted, people wildly rushed to the streets, tripping and tumbling over each other in their hurry and dismay — in some cases blocking the door, so as to prevent egress for the moment. Many people, used to indulge in a comfortable snooze on a morning, were unceremoniously turned out of the comfortable quarters, in anticipation of having the roof about their ears before they could make their exit. They took no thought of their toilet — but gallantly gave their linen to the

breeze in hopes of bringing up safe quarters.

"One gentleman, who in his hurry mistook a window for a door, was soon running along the roof of an adobe building, thinking should it fall, it was better to be on top of it rather than it on top of him. Another, enjoying the luxury of a bath, stood the rocking for some time, but at last was compelled to evacuate the premises, and rush to the yard, where, to his

horror a number of ladies had also sought refuge and were seeking consolation in prayer. Whether from the shock to his feelings, or the shock from the earthquake, he was immediately brought prone to the earth, where he managed to creep under cover, unobserved ..."

From the Los Angeles El Clamor Publico, January 12, 1857:

"The first shock started at 8 in the morning and lasted between 80 and 90

seconds. It began very gently, became strong, and was a little less strong when it ended. The ground immediately around us seemed to shake violently, like a cradle rocking. Only rarely do earthquakes last so long and have such strong motions. The water standing in pools was thrown about and splashed over the edges. The water in the ditches around the village was also thrown about and over the banks, and from being

crystal clear became thick with mud. Dogs howled and the beasts stood like statues while flocks of startled birds flew shrieking from south to north as if moved by an invisible force. The people fled into the streets; many could not stand and in terror fell to their knees and cried out, 'Lord have mercy!' The houses cracked, and if they did not have light roofs of asphalt would have fallen in.

Many people were nauseated.

"Along the banks of the creek near here the earthquake has produced long open cracks of varying widths. A few minutes past eight, there was another earthquake which lasted for a short time. At 11 at night there was a third shock which lasted 4 seconds. During the night three more were felt, making a total of six that were noticed by most people. There is also another phenomenon. From the first shock until 5 p.m., the earth has been moving constantly, though it has required close attention to it. There have certainly been more than a few periods, up to 20 minutes long of almost imperceptible earthquakes. It seems as though the Earth, tired of suffering our sins, was shaking herself free of us as birds shake off what disturbs their feathers."

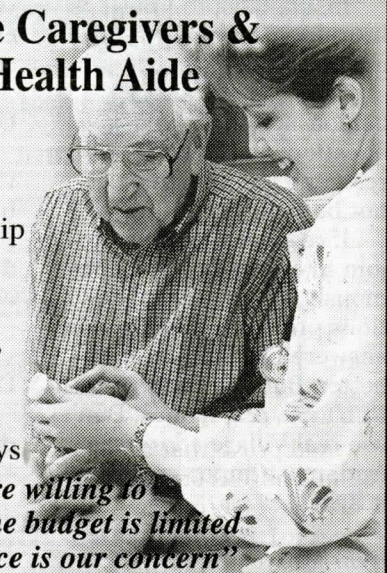

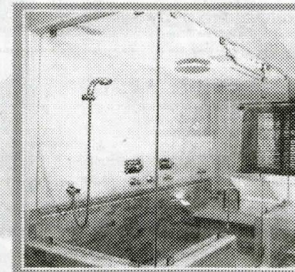
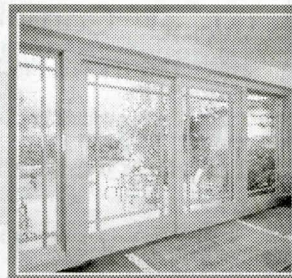

La Brea Tar Pits, L.A. River helped shape region

Here we go again!

Today we will stroll around the La Brea Tar Pits, and I will attempt a brief history of Los Angeles and Los Angeles County.

Originally the tar pits were located about seven miles west of Los Angeles. They are still in the same place, but urban sprawl has put them in the middle of downtown Los Angeles. The tar pits were originally described as "The Salt Creek Oilfields." They contain one of the richest, best preserved, most studied assemblages of Pleistocene vertebrates. They include at least 59 species of mammals and over 135 species of birds. Aside from vertebrates, they also include plants, mollusks and insects — more than 660 species of organisms in all.

Tar pits form when crude oil seeps to the surface through fissures in the earth's crust. The oil evaporates, leaving heavy tar or asphalt in sticky pools. Tar from the pits was used by early native Americans as a glue and waterproof caulking for baskets and canoes. Later the tar was mined by Westerners and used for roofing.

Scientists have been extremely successful in their excavation of the pits. Today the George C. Page Museum of La Brea is right next door, where a huge number of fossils are displayed. The Page Museum is part of the National History Museum of Los Angeles County. It's well worth visiting.

The history of Los Angeles began some 10,000 to 20,000 years before the first Europeans arrived. Hunters and gatherers of many Aztec and Indian tribes populated the area. Around 1769, the first Mexican and Spanish settlers began to settle. Among the most

notable were Gaspar de Portola and Junipero Serra. Commanding the soldiers was the Mexican Rivera y Moncada. In addition, there were 80 indigenous people from Baja, California, 25 Catalan soldiers, a group of Franciscan missionaries and

a dozen artisans.

A permanent colonial settlement was established on September 4, 1781, as El Pueblo de Nuestra Senora de los angeles di Porciuncula. It was named in honor of the shrine to the Virgin Mary, Santa Maria de Angeli, Our

Lady of the Angels in Assisi, Italy. The construction of a presidio and town was the project of Governor Felipe de Neve, mandated by King Charles III of Spain.

The city was built on the Rio Porciuncula, the broad river running through

the valley, now known as the Los Angeles River. The Spanish saw a full-flowing wide river, overflowing at times into vast marshlands that were home to a myriad of waterfowl and small ani-

mals. Though it flowed plentifully near downtown all year long, by the turn of the century it had become a dry wash for most of the year, and the ample stream had become a local joke that has never gotten any funnier. By the time the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers had lined its banks with cement, they were literally "closing the coffin" on a river that was already dead. What a shame, and all in the name of "progress." Trees had been felled, the wetlands dried and the river diverted into a series of irrigation ditches, often spilling over with "garbage and foul matter."

The Spanish period was dominated by vast Ranchos, the result of land grants. Rancho San Pedro, soon known as the Dominguez Ranch, began as a gift of 75,000 acres in 1784. The historic Gilmore Adobe was built in 1852. The original building had two rooms with a dirt packed floor and a brea roof from the tar pits. Today, it is the location of the Farmer's Market.

California was ruled by Spain until 1822 when Mexico assumed jurisdiction. After a two-year period of hostilities with Mexico beginning in 1846, the area came under U.S. control. In 1848 The Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo made California a U.S. territory.

The County of Los Angeles was established on February 18, 1850, as one of the 27 original counties, several months before California was admitted to the Union. It derived its name from the area known as Los Angeles, already a large community, and it was designated the "seat" of county government.

On April 1, 1850, the people of Los Angeles County asserted their newly won right of self-government and elected a three-man

Court of Sessions as their first governing body. In 1852 the Legislature dissolved the Court of Sessions and created a five-member Board of Supervisors. In 1913 the citizens of Los Angeles approved a charter recommended by a board of freeholders which gave the County greater freedom to govern itself within the framework of the state law.
