

WHO KILLED MAPA?

The Mexican American Political Association (MAPA) who has had its share of problems in the past has finally lost its way. The coup de grace was rendered with the help of Anglos, Birchers, conservatives and do-gooders under the false impression that MAPA was being taken over by the ultra liberal left wing turned out to support Friday Aguilera who was supposed to face impeachment as President of MAPA at the meeting of March 18th. What these people didn't know was that the move of the Executive Board of MAPA to impeach Friday had fizzled out. Many of Friday's opponents did not show at the meeting and some who were there were so put out with the conduct of the meeting and lack of parliamentary procedure that they either didn't vote or walked out.

Many MAPA members felt that the censuring of Friday Aguilera for his turnaround in the Potts issue was enough. MAPA will elect new officers in a couple of months.

The overwhelming vote of 54 to 11 to drop impeachment charges against Friday Aguilera and to give him a vote of confidence speaks for itself.

As the only statewide Mexican American political organization MAPA has excellent aims and purposes for furthering the political condition of the Spanish-speaking.

However, good aims and purposes don't make good organizations. Many organizations have crumbled in spite of good aims and purposes.

It is people who make good organizations and the aims and purposes and their implementation are expressed by the quality of leadership and membership in the organization. Now MAPA finds itself in a ridiculous situation. With a significant non Mexican American membership how is MAPA going to carry out its aims and purposes? Aguilera and his supporters won, no one can doubt that. The question is...they won what?

There was great fear that MAPA would be taken over by left ultra liberal left wingers. This was a myth.

Infiltration can only be effective when it is subdued. The MAPA infiltrators including the ultra conservative right wingers found themselves too much in the limelight for comfort in the MAPA debacle. Some did not understand what the issue was.

There is no question that MAPA needs help from the total community. But the sincerity of some of the infiltrators is open to question.

Several concerned people in MAPA are now seriously pondering how to put MAPA together again into an effective Mexican American political organization. To simply say, "throw the gringos out!" is not the answer. We live in an American community and we should not adopt strict nationalistic attitudes although certainly some restriction in membership will have to be in order.

The wound is deep and the MAPAtient is in critical condition. It is going to take a good brain surgeon.

Who killed MAPA? We can come to immediate conclusions that don't tell the story. Aguilera played his part, the Executive Board played its part in their haste to rid Aguilera. The Birchers, the right and left wingers all played a part. Perhaps the real blame falls on the Mexican American himself for his lack of interest in the politics of our community. A strong membership in MAPA could have given the organization much needed stability. We cannot excuse the attitude of some MAPA leaders in the past who seemed to think that there was no room for any other political organization.

However a new unity was emerging in MAPA. New leaders were joining. It all came too late.

The explosion within MAPA offers an opportunity for reflection. More Mexican Americans must emerge in the political scene. A few people cannot cope with the job to be done. Help is needed.

Who won in the MAPA affair? Nobody really won for in the end result MAPA may be lost. The quickest way to cut off our own necks is to fight among ourselves. We got some help here.

Maybe we don't learn fast....but every indication says that we sure learn good.

THE POLITICAL S C E N E

PHILOSOPHICALLY SPEAKING:

The man who walks alone oftentimes walks the difficult path of principle. This is truly the leader for it is upon principle that constructive advancement is made.

There are no shackles and the ties of allegiance are only to his conscience.

The emergence of group strength and the leadership responsible to the group must be a cohesive movement founded on principle and impervious to deterant emotional or materialistic forces. Initially the need is recognized and the motivation conceived. Intrinsic strength is evaluated with relation to transitional challenges and the objective is established. To this, dedication and discourse serve, but realization demands beyond these essential but superficial contributions.

It is strength of purpose and strength of character that can transform the idea to reality. Strength of battle comes easily in the heat of challenge, but it is the weak who forfeit their goals to the appeals of self interest in the calm of victory. The weak can follow this change of direction, but the man who walks alone, onward, toward fulfillment is the leader. The man whose strength refuses to allow him to relinquish victory for the false securities of public acclaim and the support of those whose weakness subjugate purpose is no sheep.

MAPA

The March 18th meeting (allegedly a recall meeting) could well be described as a lesson in the science of politics. It cast an aura of amateurism interspersed with the polish of seasoned pros.

The impeachment forces with the confidence of their polish and precalculated timing arrived late, due to an understanding that their interest in the evening would follow adjournment of the regular meeting. Although still in session the floor recognized the subject of intended recall. The battle raged and the dissident forces found call to leave their seats during the vote. This voluntary boycott of their own proposal offers two perplexing thoughts. Were they in doubt of the legitimacy of their charges or would the loss of closed session secrecy reveal embarrassing support. The count 54 (eleven anglos) in a vote of confidence for their president against 11 (six anglos) opposing votes.

JUDGESHIP RACE:

I wish to personally extend an apology to Mr. Hector Moreno for the disgraceful behavior of a newcomer Anglo during the endorsement of candidates at the MAPA meeting. His unjust and ill-conceived attack against Mr. Moreno could only represent his own irrational and impulsive nature. Those of us anglos who have been in attendance at Mexican American functions somewhat regularly resent his rude attitude.

It is my personal desire to see a Judge of the Municipal Court whose insight of the Mexican American will allow for a greater understanding of the non-judicial forces of human behavior to be extended in the administration of justice. Hector Moreno's involvement with his fellow man (Mexican American and Anglo) has given him a firm foundation as an attorney to be fair and impartial, and as a judiciary to execute the laws with a respect for human strengths and weaknesses.

His election will contribute a long overdue addition to our representative form of government.

Works of Man

The experts say the poor are apathetic, inarticulate, incapable of formulating demands, designing programs, assisting and diagnosing their own needs.

"They are wrong," says Fred Allbritten. "The poor are only waiting for the opportunity to be heard on a subject only they fully understand."

With this thought in mind the Community Improvement Center was started by two honest and sincere men, Fred Albritten and John Hernandez. The first meetings were held in a garage, then in a living room, and now the center is located at 230 Lynette, San Jose, California.

One Eastside "instant Blight" area is not sitting back waiting for funds to pour in. The Community Improvement Association has been trying for the past two years to help themselves and improve the Mayfair district neighborhood bounded by Bayshore, McKee, Story, and Jackson.

The main demonstration project is the Pre-School Program. It has continued to succeed for about 1-1/2 years also without the aid of funds. All of the help is volunteered. Children from the ages of 2-1/2 to 6 years attend the pre-school classes. Not only are the children taught knowledgeable information but they are also taught important things such as respect, courtesy, hygiene and other subjects.

Classes are held three days a week for a two hour period. "Along with knowledge, we also need to learn respect," says Fred Allbritten.

His greatest aims, through the Center, are to make the Community independent rather than dependent, to create jobs on the community level, and to help people who need it and want to help themselves.

On behalf of the community, I would like to thank these two generous men for giving everyone their generous support. We need more people like Fred Albritten and John Hernandez among us.
