Dear Don:

I noticed you in the Council meeting Wednesday night and thought you would be interested in a copy of the report prepared by Mrs. Odessa Dubinsky and HRD. As you are aware, the study shows that the airport would bring virtually no employment into the community. Rather, if OAFB were begun as a commercial airport operation, the effect would be to move the 159 persons in the County whose employment depends on the airport from Oxnard to Camarillo-- with no net employment gain. Also, Mrs. Dubinsky pointed out that it is more productive to train people to do useful work than to chase after another airport. This is consistent with the City/Pepperdine/Ventura County Community College District application for an educational/recreational use at OAFB. Please feel free to contact me if you would like any additional information or have any helpful comments.

VENTURA COUNTY AIRPORT PROJECT

This report was prepared by the Employment Data and Research Section of the Department of Human Resources Development with the assistance of the State Employment Services Office in Oxnard.

The central focus of this report concerns the proposed conversion of Oxnard Air Force Base into a commercial airport serving Ventura County. The report, which is in two parts, shows the employment which might be generated by the new airport and the characteristics of available unemployed workers in the county who may fill these positions.

The purpose of Part A of the report is to show the number and types of occupations that might be created by the proposed airport. This was based on a survey conducted on airports throughout California serving relatively the same population that would be served by the Ventura County Airport. The results of the survey are presented in a series of industrial-occupational matrices by airport.

Part B shows characteristics for approximately two-thirds of the unemployed workers in the county. It was obtained from applicant records in the local Employment Services Office in Oxnard. The purpose of this section is to show the kinds of workers available for employment at the airport.
