

Cal State Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing. Classes were offered for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement, for five students, took place in 1960.

Cal State Fullerton Campus

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

Classes were offered for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement (for five students) was in 1960.

The University's 24,500 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Many students commute each day to and from classes; some come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 775-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 85 degree programs -41 of them at the graduate level plus several credential programs and five certificate programs.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally-known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups. Another is Continuing Learning Experience, which has spearheaded the fund-raising campaign to build a gerontology center on campus.

Further examples of community outreach are joint ventures with the City of Fullerton. One resulted in the Fullerton Arboretum, which opened on campus in 1979. Another produced lighting for the baseball field and adjoining soccer fields, while a third yielded lighted softball fields.

The long awaited reality of an on campus football/soccer complex andbaseball stadium in conjunction with an on-campus Marriott Hotel recently was approved with a fall, 1989 completion date targeted for the athletic facilities.

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great university.



SEASON PREVIEW

Titans Build On Hustle And Determination With Returnees

The Titans will look to build on this years' women's team on the same foundation laid for many years: strong offense, a powerful pitching staff, hustle and fair play. Fans will see many new faces, but the same old Fullerton softball tradition under the direction of tenth year Head Coach Judi Garman and assistants Marty Rubinoff and Linda Shafor.

The Titans were 52-20 a year ago and finished third in Big West conference play behind Fresno State and Cal Poly Pomona. It marked only the second time in the program's history that the Titans did not participate in the College World Series. But Fullerton has its eyes on the new Sunnyvale, California, site and will be shooting for a triumphjant return.

The 1989 team must overcome several key losses such as Valerie Van Kirk and Charis Monroe. Also gone from the starting lineup is senior infielder Valerie Douglas. The Titan women do have power in many top newcomers. Juniors Malia Ouzts, Debbie Hartwig, Deanna Sanchez and freshman Ann Van Dortrecht are among the bright prospects that will add strength to this season's squad.

The Titans also expect help from their ace pitcher, sophomore **Anjie Bryant**. She led the Titan pitching staff with a 0.97 ERA last season. Returning to outfield positions are juniors **Tiny Glomboske** and **Carey Hess**. Junior **Missy Combes** returns this year to play at first base. Each player is a strong performer and the program looks to these returnees for leadership and strength.

Other returnees include: junior **Mich Debree**, sophomore **Jill Matyuch** and junior **Yvette Hernandez**. Their contribution to this years' team is crucial. These women have experience that will make an impact on what will be an outstanding season for the Titan women.



Judi Garman Head Coach, 10th year

Beginning her tenth season at Cal State Fullerton, Judi Garman has led the Titans to no less than a ninth place national finish, an NCAA National Championship (1986) and 468 victories in her nine-year tenure. Garman is the only coach in the program's history and is three shy of 700 career victories.

Garman established the program in 1980 and finished third in the conference, second in the region and ninth place nationally. Since then, Garman's teams have won eight conference titles, and six out of nine regional championships while finishing second in the College World Series in 1981, 1983 and 1985 and third in 1982 and 1987 and winning the 1986 NCAA Championship.

Garman's tremendous success at Fullerton is only the latest in a remarkable string of accomplishments which stretch across the continent from Canada to Santa Barbara to Golden West College in Huntington Beach to Cal State Fullerton.

Garman earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Saskatchewan in 1966 and immediately moved to California where she began working on her master's degree at UCSB. While at Santa Barbara, she started club softball and soon had a varsity team. Upon completion of her studies, she took the women's athletic director position at Westmont College in Santa Barbara and coached the volleyball, basketball and tennis programs in addition to softball.

Garman then moved to Golden West College where, along with softball, she coached basketball (1973-76) and cross-country (1977-79). Garman coached the Rustlers softball team to an unprecedented four consecutive national championships (1972-75) while compiling a record of 211 - 40. Twenty-one of her softball players received scholarships to four-year institutions.

Very involved professionally, Garman was recently elected president of the National Softball Coaches Association for a two-year term. Each year, she hosts clinics which bring over 200 coaches and 1,500 players to the campus. Additionally, she has produced highly successful pitching video tapes with acclaimed pitching coach Don Sarno.

A popular speaker at clinics around the country, Garman recently made three trips abroad to Holland, Italy and Czechoslovakia. Many Titans have had the opportunity to play overseas because of these contacts.

Fishing and snow skiing occupy Garman's time away from the softball field. She also has numerous business interests and is actually involved in running a family business in Canada that manufactures moccasins.







Assistant Coach Marty Rubinoff

Second-year Assistant Coach Marty Rubinoff continues to bring experience and knowledge to the softball program at Cal State Fullerton. Formerly the coach of the six-time senior national champion California Raiders of the ASA, Rubinoff is a very positive addition to the Titan program.

Rubinoff grew up with a baseball/ softball background. He started playing fastpitch softball as a child in Toronto, Ontario until he moved to southern California when he was 13, playing in men's fastpitch leagues until he was 18. He signed a professional contract with the San Francisco Giants, playing for their Class A Decatur affiliate for three seasons (1972-74). In 1974, he left baseball and picked softball back up as a player in the Western Softball Congress (ISC) men's open division and played for 10 years while participating in five national championships and winning two ISC World Titles. In 1985, he captained the USA National team at the Maccabiah Games in Israel and was named MVP of the fastpitch competition.

While coaching the Raiders, Rubinoff was involved in the development of Titan outfielder Tiny Glomboske and a number of present collegiate stars. He has also been involved in hitting clinics throughout the United States and New Zealand.



Assistant Coach Linda Shafor

An integral part of the Titan coaching staff, Linda Shafor returns to the Titans for her fifth season as a part-time assistant coach with a direct responsibility in overseeing Fullerton's outfield. Shafor had worked with Garman in the latter's rookie season and returned to the program in 1986 in time to help the Titans win the NCAA Championship.

Coach Shafor possesses a wide and varied softball background from her playing days with the Sun City Saints (1966-67) to serving as the player-coach for the Huntington Park Blues in 1970. Shafor was head coach at LA Harbor College from 1971 until 1979. She was an assistant coach at the University of Arizona for one season prior to joining the Titans in 1980.

She returned to Harbor College and is currently a physical education and math professor.

Shafor is a 1966 graduate of the Ohio State University with a degree in physical education. She received her master's degree in PE at California State University, Long Beach.



Head Women's Trainer
Julie Max

Now entering her tenth year with her alma mater, women's trainer Julie Max plays a major role in the Fullerton women's softball program as well as all eight of the university's women's sports programs.

"Maintaining our team's health and making sure that they receive the finest preventative medicine available is our utmost concern," notes Max. "I am very proud to say that our training facilities are at a level at which our athletes' needs can be met."

Max has been recognized on the local and national level for her outstanding abilities including serving as the administrative coordinator for volleyball and fencing at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles.

She earned her Bachelors of Science degree from Cal State Fullerton in 1978 and received a Masters of Education with an emphasis in PE at Azusa Pacific University. Max became a Certified Athletic Trainer following graduation in 1979 and is also a Certified Emergency Medical Technician.

ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT

The rapid climb of Ed Carroll through the ranks of the Cal State Fullerton athletic department culminated in his appointment as Director of Athletics on July 1, 1985.

University President Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb made the announcement on May 28, 1985, after a nationwide

search and Carroll, now 38, immediately ushered in an era of "positive thinking" for Titan athletics.

"One of my priorities is to enhance the image of our athletic program by stressing positives," says Carroll. "We must use the power of positive thinking to overcome our limitations and build our program to greater heights."

In his first year as athletic director, Carroll immediately upgraded the football schedule. LSU, Florida, West Vir-

ginia and Tulsa have signed on to host the Titans over the next few years with several other major universities currently in negotiations to play Fullerton.

Carroll began his Fullerton athletic career as a wrestler. In 1972 he served as team captain and was selected the "Most Outstanding Wrestler" in the California Collegiate Athletic Association championship meet. He later served as an assistant to former head coach Don Matson.

Carroll earned bachelor's degrees in history and physical education from Fullerton as well as a secondary teaching credential. He taught physical education classes at Fullerton and earned a master's degree in recreation administration from CSU Long Beach.

After serving in various capacities in the Fullerton recreation department, Carroll left briefly in mid-1980 to serve as a recreational sports programmer and doctoral intern at Indiana University.

He returned to Fullerton in November, 1980 as an assistant athletic director. From October, 1981 to April, 1982 he was acting athletic director and also acting director of the Titan Athletic Foundation.

He then served under athletic director Lynn Eilefson, who left in January, 1985 for a similar post at San Jose State.

1989 Rules of Interest

- 1. Conference Softball Rules The NCAA Championship and ASA Softball Rules, with the exception of the 10-inning tiebreaker rule, shall govern play in all games in the Big West Conference.
- 2. Conference Championship Schedule The Conference Championship schedule shall include at least four games with each conference member institution, with a double-header played at each home institution's site; except for the series involving the University of Hawaii. The University of Hawaii shall play each institution either four times (two double-headers) at home or on the road, alternating each year. In each series involving the University of Hawaii, the first double-header shall be declared a home series for the host institution, while the second double-header shall be declared a home series for the visiting institution.
- 3. Conference Championship The Conference Championship shall be determined by the win-loss percentage of conference games played. In the event of a tie, co-champions shall be declared.
- 4. Conference NCAA Automatic Qualifier The Conference Champion in softball shall be the conference representative to the NCAA regional tournament. In the event of a tie, a 10-step tiebreaker system has been established to determine the conference representative.
- 5. NCAA Tournament Includes 20 Teams The 1989 NCAA Tournament will consist of 20 teams, four more than the first previous six postseason tournaments. The top four nationally ranked teams will play in two-team regionals with the remaining 12 teams playing four three-team regionals in a double elimination format.

Quick Facts About The Cal State Fullerton Titans

NAME:

Officially, it's California State University, Fullerton.

To make things easy, stick with Cal State Fullerton for softball.

NICKNAME:

"Titans" was adopted with the mythical greek origins in mind but a nationally and even internationally famous elephant race on the campus in the early 1960's linked the school with elephants forever and since they are big or titanic animals, the name has stuck.

COLORS:

Officially, they are blue and white. But when the school originally opened it was known as Orange County State College and later Orange State College so it was natural that some orange found its way into the playing uniforms. Besides, Titan "orange" is about the only link to the citrus past of urbanized Orange County.

SOFTBALL - The story is inside. Now in her tenth year at Fullerton, Garman has missed the World Series only twice, in 1984 when they lost in the regionals to eventual NCAA finalist Texas A & M and in 1988 when they fell to eventual NCAA Champion UCLA in the West Regionals.
