On August 18, 1991, I lost a brother. But his memory lives on with me. In the words of his favorite song "It's so hard to say goodbye to yesterday."

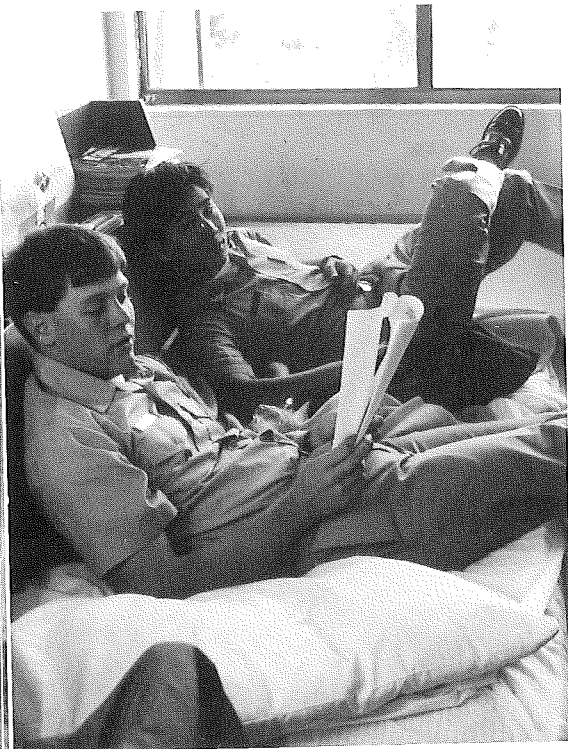
