107. Geography of Natural Resources (3)

Prerequisite: Geog 3 or permission of instructor. Study of the spatial distributions and relationships of natural resources, including land, water, minerals, plants, and animals; form, inherent characteristics, and external relations with the regions in which they are found; use and misuse.

119T. Population and Settlement Geography (3; max total 9 if no topic repeated)

Summer Session 1974: **World Population Problems (3).** Characteristics, growth patterns, distributions, densities, relationships to resources, and migrations.

128T. Asian Regions (3; max total 9 if no area repeated)

Summer Session 1974: **Far East (3).** After a general overview of the landforms, climate, vegetation, and soils, the economic and cultural regions of China and Japan will be described and analyzed. Subsequently, population problems, agrarian reforms, industrial development, transportation, marketing, minorities, etc., will be examined systematically.

Summer Session 1974: **Southeast Asia (3).** Representative countries in Southeast Asia will be selected for intensive regional and systematic analyses. Topics such as agricultural patterns, population problems, natural resource potentials, political systems, colonial rule, ethnic minorities, etc., will be discussed.

July 8-26. Comprehensive analysis of the physical, economic, and cultural geographic foundations of the northern half of the North American continent.

141. Conterminous United States (3)

June 17-July 5. Systematic and regional survey of the United States; cultural and physical phenomena related to economy.
