

ADMISSION OF UNDERGRADUATE TRANSFER STUDENTS

Applicants for admission to the California State University and Colleges as undergraduate transfers will be considered for admission under one of the following provisions.

Applicants who have successfully completed 60 or more transferable semester units or the equivalent are eligible for admission if they have achieved a grade-point average of 2.0 (C) and were in good standing at the last college attended. Nonresident applicants must have earned a grade-point average of at least 2.4 (C plus). Submission of SAT or ACT scores is encouraged, but not required.

Applicants who have successfully completed fewer than 60 transferable semester units or the equivalent are eligible for admission if they meet the above requirements *and* the current first-time freshman requirements. Applicants for admission as transfer students who have been continuously enrolled at a college since graduation from high school are eligible if they meet the first-time freshman requirements in effect at the time of their high school graduation. Either SAT or ACT test results are required of transfer applicants with fewer than 60 transferable semester units.

An applicant with a particular major who does not meet either of the above provisions may be admitted to the college for the purpose of pursuing a major for which appropriate course work is not offered at the college from which he seeks to transfer when he meets all of the following:

1. He has completed all appropriate course work offered.
2. He has attained a grade-point average of 2.0 (C) in all college work attempted.
3. He was in good standing at the last college attended.
4. He can, in the judgment of Fresno State, succeed in that degree objective.

ADMISSION AS AN INTERNATIONAL (FOREIGN) STUDENT

At Fresno State individual admission decisions are made on the basis of complete academic records from all secondary and college level schools, demonstrated English proficiency by performance on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), and certified financial support.

OTHER APPLICANTS

Applicants not admissible under one of the above provisions should enroll in a junior college or other appropriate institution. Only under the most unusual circumstances will such applicants be permitted to enroll in the college. Permission is granted only by special action.

FRESNO STATE APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications are accepted under provisions of the California State University and Colleges common admissions program. Applications for a fall semester should be filed during the preceding November. Applications for a spring semester should be filed during the preceding August. Applications will be accepted after the one-month open filing period if space is available. *Prompt submission of applications is important. See Application Procedure for 1973-1974.*

For undergraduate admission to Fresno State a student must:

1. Submit a current application with the nonrefundable \$20.00 application fee to the Admissions Office.
2. Upon receipt of a space reservation, request institutions formerly attended to forward directly to the Admissions Office transcripts of credits from high school and colleges. College transcripts are required in duplicate. Failure to include all colleges attended may result in cancellation of the student's registration. All transcripts submitted by matriculated students are retained by Fresno State.
3. Take the SAT or ACT and request official scores be sent to Fresno State, if lower division.
4. Take any additional entrance examinations required.

A veteran should, in addition, file a photostatic copy of his *Notice of Separation* (DD 214)
