Margaret tried calling 911 on her cell phone but kept getting cut off due to poor reception in the canyon. Bill tried to call on his cell phone and also was cut off.

After many attempts, apparently the call center understood enough to send a fire truck from Engine Co. 34. The cell phone has a longitude and a latitude, which also



Long-postponed maintenance of Village roads under way

In response to a comment recently overheard that the current roadwork in our community is a huge waste of money because the "roads look fine," it is important to note that regularly scheduled facility maintenance represents an ongoing and critical part of the Association's responsibility to protect community values.

A review of the records further documents that failure to maintain our infrastructure often ends up costing homeowners more in the long term than might be expected — pennywise and pound foolish.

For example, some years back, several previous boards initially received accolades for keeping the Association fees low by deferring maintenance on roads and other permanent infrastructure facilities. When the roads began to crumble and potholes outnumbered smooth

surface areas, and over \$1 million in additional dollars were needed to simply rebuild the base that resulted from the deterioration, an outcry associated with the increased dues was heard far and wide.

Largely because of the referenced events, two things happened to insure that the Village remained on solid financial ground:

- A 20-year street plan was adopted to insure that an adequate repair and maintenance program was in place.
- Streets were incorporated into the reserve account, simply meaning that sufficient funds are collected and banked in a reasonable manner up front in an effort to offset the potential for large increases in assessment fees in the future.

The work being completed under contract this year, then — and in



Woodshop elves carve their place into Village's heart

According to an authorized review report recently completed by Merle Ruiz of the Finance Committee. Leisure Village is home to some 59 individual clubs and groups that sponsor activities ranging in scope from A to Z.

Although most of these groups are designed to encourage education, provide entertainment, promote good health and fulfill other individual needs, a few of these clubs also provide direct benefit to the community as a whole, one of which is the woodshop.

According to current records, the club has 80-plus keyholding members (including two women), has official status as a subcommittee of the Ed and Rec Standing Committee, and is generally recognized in the annual budget process with an appropriation for miscellaneous expenses — a meager sum of \$1,516 last year.

Historical records compiled by Marilyn Holthouse, the Village historian, further show that a woodworking club had its beginning in 1974 — one year after the first residents moved into the community. Instructions associated with the hobby were provided by resident Walter Lucas.

Although known by different names throughout the past 37 years, at one time the group was referred to as the Sawdusters and boasted a membership of over 300 residents.

When Sid Alweiss (affectionately known as the Admiral) moved to the Village in 1997, he implemented two important programs that remain in place today:

• A focus on workplace safety, including the requirement for new members to be "checkedout" before using the potentially dangerous machinery.

· A program designed to provide free assistance (fix-it service) to residents. Over the course of the past 14 or so years, the woodshop elves have repaired an undetermined number of chairs, tables and other similar products. This service is currently provided on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings from 10 a.m. until noon at




the Recreation Center.
