HONORABLE JOHN F. KENNEDY

United States Senator From Massachusetts

The honorable John F. Kennedy of Massachusetts married Jacqueline Lee Bouvier in 1953 — their daughter Caroline was born November 27, 1957. Sen. Kennedy was educated in Massachusetts' schools graduating with honors from Harvard in 1940. Special education and graduate work at London School of Economics and at Stanford University. He has been awarded Doctor of Law degrees by 18 colleges. Five elections — five victories. Elected U.S. Senator by defeating Republican encumbent in 1952. Re-election by 870,000 votes in 1958, the largest majority ever received by any candidate in the history of Massachusetts.
