PRESS ROOM: Room 162 in the eastern wing of the gymnasium building serves as the press room for Titan basketball. Three telephones are available approximately 10 minutes after the final buzzer.

PRESS TABLES: Primary beat reporters and broadcasters will be located on the south side of the playing floor, around the scorer's tables. Auxiliary media seating and scout seating will be available at tables along the base lines.

GAME SUMMARIES: Will be collated and distributed in Room 162 of the gymnasium building. Halftime box scores, play-by-play accounts and final box scores will be provided. PRESS CREDENTIALS: Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. When time permits, credentials will be mailed. If not, Press Will Call is located at the western entrance to the gymnasium to the right or south of the doors. Credentials MUST BE WORN in plain sight to access the doors leading to the locker rooms and press rooms.

PARKING: Except on Monday through Thursday evenings, ample free parking is available in the lot immediately west of the gymnasium. On Monday through Thursday evenings, parking is available by: a) Using Lot A at State College and Yorba Linda Boulevards and paying \$1.50 upon entry for a daily permit, or: b) Obtaining a complimentary pass upon presentation of news credential to the visitors information booth located on the south side of campus, northwest of the intersection of Commonwealth and Nutwood Avenues.

FAX/TELECOPIER: One Xerox 7010 will be available on a page-by-page, first-come, first-served basis from the SID office, located on the exterior northeast corner of the gym. TELEPHONES: There is one telephone at the press table -- (714) 773-3970 -- which must be kept free for messages, out-of-town scores, etc. Additional telephones CANNOT be installed at the press table due to the physical limitations of the building.

LOCKER ROOMS: Located off the hallway on the north side of the playing floor. John Sneed will conduct post-game interviews in the equipment manager's office just outside the Fullerton players' locker room, which is closed to the media. Players will be brought to the office area upon request after a reasonable cooling-off period.

SCOUTS: Requests should be made at least one week in advance. Seating is very limited.

The University

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

Classes were offered for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement — for five students — took place in 1960.

The University's 24,500 students come primarily from southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes, although nearly 400 now live on campus in recently completed residence halls.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 775-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University is fully accredited and enjoys national recognition for both its array of traditional academic programs and a growing list of independently accredited professional programs, including art, athletics training, business, chemistry, communications, computer science, dance, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing and theater. All told, there are 85 degree programs —41 of them at the graduate level — plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups, including the Titan Athletic Foundation.

Further examples of community outreach are the new Ruby Gerontology Center, which serves as an educational and research facility for the study of aging and a meeting place for the Continuing Learning Experience support group.

Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing now with the October grand opening of the Marriott Hotel, the University and the City of Fullerton are working to complete an on-campus sports complex by mid-1992. Already in use are two lighted softball fields. When the main part of the sports complex is finished, it will include a stadium for football, soccer and other activities plus a pavilion for baseball.

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great university.



Administration



Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, President

Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb became the third president of Cal State Fullerton on Oct. 1, 1981. She has announced her retirement effective in July, 1990.

Dr. Cobb had served as dean of Douglass College at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, since 1976. There she also held the rank of professor of biological sciences. Prior to her Douglass appointment she was dean of Connecticut College and professor of zoology for seven years. Previously, she was professor of biology at Sarah Lawrence College in New York.

Known for her work in cell physiology, her promotion of the advancement of women in scientific fields and her activities on behalf of minorities, she is the first black woman to head a major public university on the West Coast.

Cobb earned her bachelor's degree from Talladega College in Alabama and her M.S. and Ph.D. in cell physiology from New York University. She also holds 17 honorary doctorates. She is the mother of a son, Jonathan, a graduate of the Cornell University Medical School now serving on a post-residency fellowship at the New York University Medical Center.

Athletics Department



Ed Carroll, Director of Athletics

The rapid climb of Ed Carroll through the ranks of the Cal State Fullerton athletics department culminated in his appointment as Director of Athletics on July 1, 1985.

University President Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb made the announcement on May 28, 1985, after a nationwide search and Carroll, now 39, immediately ushered in an era of "positive thinking" for Titan athletics.

"One of my priorities has been to enhance the image of our athletics program by stressing positives," says Carroll. "We

must use the power of positive thinking to overcome our limitations and build our program to greater heights."

One of Carroll's first moves was to upgrade the football schedule. The Titans have played LSU, Florida and West Virginia in recent seasons and have dates with Georgia and Auburn in the near future. With the new stadium complex now firmly on the horizon, Carroll has signed Mississippi State, Colorado State, UTEP and Army to a home-and-home series.

Carroll scored his first hiring coup when he was able to replace Augie Garrido with equally successful Larry Cochell as the baseball coach for 1988. Cochell took the Titans to the College World Series in his first season and was selected national Coach of the Year by "Collegiate Baseball Magazine."

Building plans are being finalized and construction has begun indirectly for an on-campus Sports Complex to provide a playing facility for football, soccer and baseball as well as an all-weather track. An on-campus Marriott Hotel opened in October and the revenue it generates will help finance the \$10.2 million athletics project, due for completion in 1992.

Fund-raising levels have reached record numbers during Carroll's tenure. The Titan Athletic Foundation's 1989 spring drive raised more than \$450,000.

Carroll began his Fullerton athletic career as a wrestler. In 1972, he served as team captain and was selected the "Most Outstanding Wrestler" in the California Collegiate Athletic Association championship meet. He later served as an assistant to former head coach Don Matson.

Carroll earned bachelor's degrees in history (1972) and physical education (1974) from Fullerton as well as a secondary teaching credential. He taught physical education classes at Fullerton and earned a master's degree in recreation administration from Long Beach State.

After serving in various capacities in the Fullerton recreation department, Carroll left briefly in mid-1980 to serve as a recreational sports programmer and doctoral intern at Indiana University. He returned to Fullerton in November, 1980, as an assistant athletics director and later served as acting director of the Titan Athletic Foundation. He then served under athletics director Lynn Eilefson, who left in January, 1985.

Ed and his wife Connie live in Fullerton with young children Brandon and Kimberly.

Head Coach John Sneed



Second Year Career & at CSUF: 16-13 Long Beach State '71

"I hope the job's a little easier to keep than it was to get."

That was one of John Sneed's simple comments to summarize a complex story that was capped March 11 when he was named head men's basketball coach at Cal State Fullerton and signed a 3-year contract. The appointment after a thorough nationwide search came the day after the conclusion of an "interim" 1988-89 season that saw him bring energy and excitement to Titan basketball.

After three years as an assistant at Arizona and San Diego State and eight years under George McQuarn at Fullerton, Sneed was thrust into a head coach-

ing role last Nov. 3 when McQuarn resigned. What Sneed lacked in time was compounded by other shortcomings — no returning starters, a roster of barely 10 healthy players and no chance to hire another assistant coach.

"I told the players that we could hopefully surprise one another and surprise others out there," Sneed recalls.

The Titans responded with a thrilling 16-13 season. Picked to finish ninth in the Big West Conference, they tied for fourth and gained the semi-finals of the post-season tournament. They went 8-2 in games decided by 3 points or less and were 5-1 in overtime games including their first win over UNLV in six years.

"A lot of people stood behind me last year in a difficult situation, and I am thankful to them," said Sneed, 41. "The faculty, administration and fans... everyone was very positive and gave me a lot of help. I was fortunate to get the opportunity. A lot of assistants never get that chance."

Sneed has paid his coaching dues. He began at Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles as an assistant to McQuarn. After two years he succeeded McQuarn and immediately won the 1974 CIF Championship and Coach of the Year honors when he guided the Eagles to a 30-2 record and the mythical national championship by National Sport News Service. He followed that up with two more Camino Real League titles with 28-1 and 23-5 seasons for a three-year prep record of 81-8 (.910).

He went to Arizona as an assistant to Fred Snowden for the 1976-77 season, which saw the 21-6 Wildcats in the NCAA Tournament. He was at San Diego State under Tim Vezie for two years. The 1977-78 Aztecs won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association title but were eliminated in the post-season tournament by Cal State Fullerton.

After 11 years as a college assistant, Sneed has special compassion for the assistant coach and his chances of becoming a head coach.

"The goal I had for a number of years was to be a Division I head coach," he explained. "Sometime you don't get that opportunity, because it's not like a player, who can walk on to show his ability. A coach never has that opportunity."

Under McQuarn, Sneed coordinated the scouting of opponents, recruiting and academics programs and tutorial services and also was the inspiration behind many promotional themes.

"One of my priorities will be to improve the academic situation at the university," said Sneed. "We have been working very hard at that, to bring about a change in attitude in our athletes and to raise our graduation rate. We're not going to complete that in a few months. That will be over a longer period of time."

Sneed and his wife, Rose, live in Anaheim with 2-year-old daughter Ashley.



Assistant Coaches



Dan Dion First year St. Mary's ('76)

Dan Dion brings a wealth of experience in collegiate basketball in the west to the Cal State Fullerton program, where he will work primarily with the Titans' backcourt. Off the floor, he will be involved with academics, scouting opponents and recruiting.

Dion, 35, was an assistant to Coach Neil McCarthy the past seven years—three at Weber State and the past four at New Mexico State. The Aggies posted a 70-54 record during his tenure and annually were in the top half of the Big West standings. Dion also played for McCarthy at St. Patrick's High School in Vallejo and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Weber State in 1976-77.

Dion was an All-Big Sky Conference selection as a sophomore at Weber State before transferring to St. Mary's, where he was team captain. He served as head coach for five years at St. Patrick's, where he had scored more than 2,000 points in an illustrious prep career.

"Dan is a quality addition to our staff," said head coach John Sneed of his April 19 appointment. "I've known Dan for several years and he is a hard worker with great knowledge on and off the floor. We are excited to have him join us."

Dan and his wife, Karen, have a 7-year-old daughter, Lindsay.



Keith Starr First year Pittsburgh ('76)

Keith Starr brings a winning tradition to the Titans' program, where he will work with the inside players in his first season in Fullerton. Off the floor, he will be involved in academics, scouting of opponents and, of course, recruiting.

Starr, 35, spent the last four seasons on the staff of Coach Jerry Tarkanian at UNLV. He worked extensively with the

Rebels' big men and ran UNLV's summer basketball camps. During his tenure in Las Vegas, the Rebels posted a 127-21 (.858) record and made four trips to the NCAA Tournament, reaching the Final Four in 1987.

"Keith has great knowledge of basketball talent in California and the Southwest and will be a great asset to our program," said Coach John Sneed of Starr's July 1 appointment. "He has been involved with winners at every level of basketball."

Starr was a premier player in the East at Pittsburgh and played briefly in the National Basketball Association. He was on the Panthers' 1973 NCAA Tournament team and graduated in 1976 with a degree in economics.

The Sewickley, Pennsylvania native lived in Las Vegas for 12 years after ending his playing career. Keith, a bachelor, enjoys reading and listening to jazz.



Brian Underwood First year Cal Lutheran ('86)

Brian Underwood joins John Sneed's coaching staff for the 1989-90 season as a part-time assistant. He will perform myriad duties including film exchange and recruiting mailings as well as assisting on the floor.

Underwood, 26, most recently served as an assistant coach at Cal Lutheran University in Thousand Oaks, his alma mater,

the past two seasons. He was recruiting coordinator, academic advisor, fund raiser and director of the Kingsmen Klassic summer camps. During the same time frame he originated and coached the Ventura-Santa Barbara Breakers club team.

A communication arts major at Cal Lutheran, Underwood graduated in 1986. He spent one season as a varsity assistant coach at Thousand Oaks High School and led the freshman team to a 16-5 record, its best mark in 10 seasons. He was head coach in the 1987 Ventura County All-Star Game, directing the South to a 122-103 victory over the North.

Underwood's playing career came at Corona del Mar High School in Newport Beach. He was a member of the Seakings' CIF playoff team in 1982.

Brian and his wife, Allyson, live in Placentia. His goal is to become a head coach of a competitive men's intercollegiate basketball program.

Alison Cone is in her seventh year at Cal State Fullerton as Academics Coordinator, assisting student-athletes in reaching their academic goals. She organizes the tutorial programs, sets up

study halls and conducts advisement sessions with each athlete.

Cone previously served as assistant athletics director and advising and eligibility coordinator at Cal State Dominguez Hills.

A native of Washington, Cone earned her bachelor's degree at Washington State and her teaching certificate at Central Washington. She coached tennis, basketball, track and soccer at Auburn High School and basketball and volleyball at Green River Community College in Washington.

Cone worked on her master's degree at Dominguez Hills, where she also lectured in physical education classes and served as women's tennis coach for the 1982-83 seasons. She is single and lives in Fullerton.

Season Preview

With four starters and seven of the top eight scorers back from a pressure-tested 16-13 team, the scenario for another exciting Cal State Fullerton basketball season in 1989-90 seems ready to be played out.

"Considering the difficulty of our non-conference schedule and the improvement of so many Big West teams, winning 16 games again this year will be a challenge," said Coach John Sneed, who proved the "experts" way off base just this past season. "I know what the expectations are, but I also knew what they were last year and look what happened."

With no starters back, player defections reducing the roster to 10 players and the head coach resigning on Nov. 3, the Titans' prospects for the 1988-89 season were gloomy at best. Instead, "interim" head coach Sneed orchestrated a memorable campaign that he parlayed into a 3-year contract as the head man.

Fullerton went 5-1 in overtime and overcame a mid-season 7-game losing streak by posting an 8-2 record in games decided by 3 points or less. The only regular from that team the Titans must replace is forward Derek Jones, who averaged 11.5 points and 6.9 rebounds in an inspiring comeback from serious gunshot wounds.

"Derek was the team leader and we will have to find someone to fill that role," said Sneed. "With the experience and the number of seniors we have, that should not be a problem."

Inside scoring is the Titans' main concern. Returning centers John Sykes (4.9) and David Moody (2.9) have not shown that quality so Sneed will be looking for it from the power forward spot. The immediate candidate is sophomore Agee Ward, a rugged 6-foot-5, 220-pounder from Washington High in Los Angeles, who was idled last year by Prop. 48. Another possibility, but not until he becomes eligible on Dec. 16, is University of Washington transfer Ron Caldwell. The former Crenshaw High School standout was a regular for the Huskies in 1986-87 but missed the next season due to a knee injury.

"Both of these players have the potential to be outstanding, but both are coming off a year of inactivity," said Sneed. "You never know what effect that will have."

The perimeter is the team's strength and it should be even better this year. All three starters are back and each will be trying to better post-season acclaim from a year ago.

Small forward Cedric Ceballos was first-team All-Big West and honorable mention All-American and again should challenge for Player of the Year honors. He led the conference in scoring (21.2 ppg) and was second in rebounding (8.8rpg). He was at his best against UNLV, AVERAGING 29.7 points and 12 rebounds in three contests.

Off guard Mark Hill was an honorable mention all-conference selection and probably deserved higher honors. He was the second best scorer in Big West play at 19.3 points per game and averaged 17.6 overall. He set school records in 3-point field goal proficiency and shot 42 per cent for the year.

Point guard Wayne Williams made the Big West all-freshman team and some thought he should have been Freshman of the Year. Starting all 29 games at the demanding position, he made the game-winning plays on at least five occasions, ranging from buzzer-beating 3-pointers to last-minute open-court steals. He averaged 8.3 points and 5.2 assists, fifth best in school history.

Back-ups or even challengers to this trio are plentiful.

Van Anderson returns for a full senior season. A mid-year addition to last year's team, the 6-foot-4 defensive specialist is a perfect complement to the offensive minded Ceballos.

Hill will be rested or tested by **Dareck Crane**, the co-MVP of the Orange Empire Conference from Orange Coast College. The 6-foot-2 junior scored 992 points last year, third-best in Pirate history.

Competing with Williams again will be senior Marlon Vaughn, a two-year letterman with plenty of experience in a relief role.

There also are two promising youngsters waiting in the wings in Bruce Bowen, a 6-foot-5 guard from Edison High of Fresno and Aaron Wilhite, a 6-foot-7 forward from Lincoln High in San Diego. The Titans also have two walk-on candidates in guards Jason Hart from St. Paul High School and 5-foot-6 Tom Parada from St. Francis High.

John Rebenstorf returns for his ninth consecutive season as the radio voice of Cal State Fullerton basketball in 1989-90 with all games to be carried LIVE on KMNY (1600 AM), with studios in Anaheim and transmitter in Pomona.

"We are pleased to continue our working relationship with KMNY," said Athletics Director Ed Carroll upon signing a five-year (1989-1994) contract that will cover all men's basketball games and selected other events such as baseball and women's basketball.

"Its strong signal gives Titan fans throughout southern California an opportunity to follow our teams."

This will be Fullerton's fifth season on KMNY (formerly KWOW), which features an all-business news format for its regular programming.

Rebenstorf began broadcasting Titan sports during the 1981-82 school year and has handled the play-by-play duties for eight seasons of football, eight years for basketball and four years for baseball. He has brought to Titan fans the excitement of the California Bowl, National Invitation Tournament men's basketball, NCAA Tournament women's basketball and the College Baseball World Series.

During the summers of 1986 and 1987, Rebenstorf was the voice of the Oklahoma City 89ers of the American Association. He previously did play-by-play for Cal Poly Pomona and UC Riverside as well as filling in for Long Beach State. His radio station work has included stops at KBON and KMEN in San Bernardino, KNTF in Ontario and KFI in Los Angeles.

Titan basketball will receive more television coverage this season than any other in school history. Two national games on ESPN, five regional games on Prime Ticket, three regional games on Sports Channel--Los Angeles and one exposure on KHJ-TV (Channel 9) in Los Angeles should whet the appetite for millions of present and future Fullerton basketball fans. All other home games on the schedule will be video-taped for delay broadcast on local cable outlets by Titan Sports Productions, produced by Professor Larry Ward. Ed Larkin and Greg Bunch are the cable commentators.

The ESPN broadcast from Titan Gym will be on Monday, Feb. 19 vs. Long Beach State. It will be the first nationally televised basketball game and the first of a Fullerton event since the early 1989 baseball game against Stanford. The Titans also will be seen on "Big Monday" at UC Santa Barbara on Jan. 29. The Prime Ticket games are Dec. 9 vs. Tulsa; Dec. 23 at UCLA (delayed); Jan. 13 vs. Pacific; Feb. 24 at UC Irvine and March 3 vs. UNLV. The SportsChannel games are Jan. 18 at Long Beach State, Jan. 25 vs. UC Irvine and Feb. 15 vs. UCSB. The KHJ game will be broadcast out of Las Vegas on Jan. 3.

The Big West Conference is conducting its second season of basketball competition since a name change from Pacific Coast Athletic Association. The switch, initiated on July 1, 1988, is seen as a simpler, more accurate description of the league's 12 member institutions -- Cal State Fullerton, Fresno State, Long Beach State, New Mexico State, San Diego State (women only), San Jose State, UC Irvine (no football), UC Santa Barbara (Div. III football), Hawaii (women only), UNLV, Pacific and Utah State.

When the league was formed in 1969, it consisted of seven charter members, all of which were located in the state of California. In its 20 years of existence, however, the conference has expanded to include universities from states which do not border the Pacific Ocean (Utah, Nevada and New Mexico).

Basketball success reached its apex in 1987 when the conference was the only one represented at the Final Four of both men's (UNLV) and women's (Long Beach State) competition. The Rebels have been permanent members of the Top 20 polls the past several years and have held down the No. 1 spot on several occasions, including many of this year's pre-season lists. Fullerton, UC Santa Barbara and New Mexico State have dented the Top 20 on occasion in recent years and Fresno State won the post-season National Invitation Tournament in 1983, beating DePaul in the title game at Madison Square Garden before a crowd that included nearly 2,000 Fresno residents.

A total of 29 starters return on the 10 conference rosters with at least two at every school. Defending champion UNLV has all five starters back while Fullerton and Pacific boast four each and UC Irvine and UC Santa Barbara each have three. Most of the individual statistical leaders return in top scorer Cedric Ceballos of Fullerton and rebound champion Eric McArthur of UCSB.

The San Jose State victory was hard to evaluate but there was no questioning the Titans' performance in beating a Utah State team that had been playing up to its preseason billing for the previous two weeks. All 10 Titans scored and they combined to hit 12 of 16 free throws in the final 3 minutes to hold off the Aggies, 96-87.

Reid Newey was most of the Utah State attack as he tallied 19 first-half points to keep the Aggies within 7 at intermission after Fullerton had led by as many as 12. The euphoria of the win over UNLV didn't prevent the Titans from capping a truly remarkable 3-game run with their first regular-season win over UC Irvine in three years and their first in the Bren Center. Wayne Williams captured Conference Player of the Week honors with a career-high 20 points highlighted by 4 of 4 3-point shooting and the successful conversion of a pair of critical 1-plus-1's in the final 27 seconds.

The victory was accomplished despite a cold (5 of 22) shooting night by Cedric Ceballos and torrid (.500) 3-point shooting by the Anteaters. However, Kevin Floyd's try for 3 went in and out at the buzzer as Fullerton held on to win before a vocal crowd of 4.718 that featured nearly 1,000 CSF fans.

For the fourth consecutive year, UNLV ended Fullerton's season with a victory in the post-season tournament. The Rebels got a great performance from Stacey Augmon to offset an equally brilliant effort by Cedric Ceballos and UNLV advanced to the championship game against New Mexico State.

In Fullerton's earlier win at home and close loss at UNLV, the Rebels' guards had poor shooting nights. Not this time, however, as Anderson Hunt hit 4 of 7 3-pointers to lead an 8-for-16 UNLV effort that opened up the inside for David Butler and Moses Scurry.

UNLV jumped out to a 13-4 lead and the Titans never could catch up. With Ceballos having a 19-point first half, Fullerton cut the gap to as little as two at 25-23 but it was 8 points at intermission at 46-38.

Fullerton made a run early in the second half as baskets by Wayne Williams, Ceballos and Mark Hill made it 49-45. But UNLV went on an 11-2 run and its defense began producing points and the rout was on.

Nickname and Mascot

"What exactly is a Titan?"

"Why do you have an elephant for your mascot?"

Those are two of the first questions that pop into the minds of media and fans when a Cal State Fullerton athletic team makes its inaugural visit. While the relatively young institution carved out of the Orange County citrus groves may be too new for many traditions, here are the recognized legends.

"It was the students' decision in a vote," explains Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname 'Titans.' "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down to a few for the

purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels."

It was a unique student body at the outset, all upper division students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College. They voted to organize as a student body and to assess themselves a fee of \$10 per semester.

"Even when it was decided that 'Titans' would be the nickname, there was confusion as to

what it represented," said Becker. "I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormitories were named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done about a mascot because no one knew quite what to do. Until, of course, the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History."

What began as a practical joke turned into probably the biggest "happening" on the campus to this day.

The "gag" attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as the hastily graded field became known that spring afternoon in 1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions in the caricature have been made in recent years to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek.

The mascot outlived the race. In 1963, one elephant charged the crowd causing minor injuries and an early sign of a now-common liability insurance crisis nipped a tradition in the bud

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and

white when they chose Titans, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was an appropriate color on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was formally acknowledged by the Athletics Council in 1987.

When Lynn Eilefson was appointed athletics director in 1982, he furthered the cause of orange because of its uniqueness and brightness compared to the wide variety of blues. Thus, the "Orange Crush" booster group was born and the color remains prominent in most team uniforms.

And, finally, there is the matter of the school's name. As mentioned earlier, the name originally was Orange County State College. It's also been Orange State College and later California State College at Fullerton or California State College, Fullerton. The change to university status necessitated a further change to California State University, Fullerton, but the school's address could not be changed from 800 N. State College Boulevard. And that's only the start of the confusion.

To out-of-staters, the picture clouds quickly because most don't realize there are two distinct systems of higher education in the state — the University of California and the State University system. So, the school has been called everything from Cal-Fullerton to UC Fullerton to California State Fullerton State to simply Fullerton State. The preferred moniker is Cal State Fullerton, with no hyphens, which is what most of the more than 80,000 graduates recognize. But since there are only two other major institutions known as Titans (University of Detroit and Oral Roberts University), just call Fullerton teams the "Titans!"

History of Titan Athletics

How many universities can claim national championships in seven different sports, a star major league third baseman, men and women basketball players in the Olympics, two rookies in the Super Bowl and the subject matter of a Walt Disney feature film?

The tenor was set by the first Titan intercollegiate team - men's basketball. In only their second season, the Titans of coach Alex Omalev advanced five rounds into the NAIA national playoffs in 1961-62.

Sixteen seasons later, the entire nation watched another "cinderella" Titan five advance to within one victory of the "Final Four" as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association post-season tournament and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the Western Regional.

The basketball tradition, which included a women's national title in 1970 and coach Billie Moore and star Nancy Dunkle on the women's 1976 Olympic team, was continued in 1984 as Leon Wood helped the men to a gold medal before he became a first-round NBA draft choice. Coach George McQuarn's teams were usually factors in the PCAA race and had national Top 20 rankings and a victory over the nation's No. 1-ranked and undefeated team to their credit. Fullerton also has competed twice in the post-season NIT Tournament while the women have recently been in both the WNIT and the NCAA fields.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton more fame. Coach Dick Wolfe won three college division titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and has had recent teams in the Top Ten at the Division Ilevel while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. His 1987 squad was ranked No. 1 in the nation led by former Chinese Olympian Li Xiao Ping. Lynn Rogers began the women's program in 1976 and the Titans have finished sixth or better in the nation every year but two and won the national title in 1979. One-armed Carol Johnston was an All-American and star of the



Disney film, "Lefty," while more recently Tami Elliott won 10 All-American awards before suffering a fractured vertebra in her senior season.

Baseball exploded on the national scene with the arrival of coach Augie Garrido. He broke the USC monopoly in the western regionals in 1975 and won the national title in 1979 behind the play of Tim Wallach, now of the Montreal Expos. He won the College World Series again in 1984 with players such as pitcher Greg Mathews of the St. Louis Cardinals. The Titans won their first six-team regional and finished third in the CWS in 1988 under the direction of new coach Larry Cochell.

Women have sparkled on the Fullerton diamonds, too. Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and the Titans have been a powerhouse, making seven trips to the College World Series in 10 years. The Titans brought home their first

NCAA Championship in 1986 and have been ranked No. 1 in the nation often during the past three seasons.

There have been national titles in men's cross country (1971) and women's fencing (1973) and individual standouts like golfer Martha Wilkerson and runner Mark Covert. Soccer finished second in the nation (1973) and coach Al Mistri has rejuvenated the program at the Division I level. His 1986 team shared the PCAA Championship and the Titans have flirted with national rankings the past few seasons as well while building a loyal fan following.

Football is the only sport that matches the popularity of men's basketball and the Titans have had their share of success on the gridiron as well.

Dick Coury was the inaugural coach in 1970 and he built an instant winner at the Division II level. The Titans were 27-16-1 over the first four years under Coury and successor Pete Yoder before the growing pains of moving up to Div. I were endured. But the program came of age under the guidance of Gene Murphy in the 1980s. The Titans won the PCAA title in 1983 and 1984 and played in the California Bowl in 1983. The team had finished first or second five of the previous six seasons going into the 1989 campaign.



Cal State Fullerton has been well represented at the professional level despite the relative youth of the intercollegiate basketball program.

Six Titans were drafted in the past six years and several more players have signed as free agents. The Titans hit it big in 1984 when two players made National Basketball Association rosters -- guard Leon Wood with Philadelphia and center Ozell Jones with San Antonio. Each was subsequently traded more than once. Wood played four seasons in the NBA and most recently was with the



Santa Barbara Islanders of the Continental Basketball Association. Jones has been in and out of the NBA, most recently on the summer roster of the Indiana Pacers.

Recent stars Henry Turner and Richard Morton also have flirted with the NBA. Morton started the 1988-89 season with the Pacers and spent this summer with the Golden State



Warriors. Turner, who was a teammate of Morton's last year in the CBA, was starting in October for the Sacramento Kings.

Another recent Titan to play in the NBA was guard Kevin Henderson, who played with Golden State and Cleveland. Other players drafted in the 1980s were Ricky Mixon (Lakers), Tony Neal (Lakers) and Kerry Boagni (Utah Jazz).

From the decade of the 1970s, the Titans saw forward Greg Bunch play for the New York Knicks and forward Mike Niles play with the Phoenix Suns. Foreign leagues have featured the likes of center Herman Webster, Boagni and sharpshooter Kevin Heenan to name a few.
