He's a Leisure Village "original." Chuck Donnel and his wife Marie moved here in 1977 when their house was still being built and the streets around it weren't paved. "We were driving past Camarillo on our way to lunch with friends when we saw a sign about this new community. We decided to take a quick look," recalls Chuck with a laugh. "We bought the house that day." Thirty-nine years later, he says he wouldn't change a thing – except he wishes they had a two-car garage.

At first, the Donnels used the Village house as a weekend get-away. They lived in Los Angeles. He was a cartographer, a mapmaker for the City for 23 years, then for his own firm. It was a stressful career, all about getting details exact, meet-



ing requirements, satisfying governments and clients. In 1986, the Village house became their full-time home when Chuck retired. It didn't take long for him to get busy in an entirely different way.

Let's Not Be Too Conservative

Last month, we reported Board President Lin Grant's calculation that, on average, if each of the estimated 300 volunteer residents gave eight hours a month, (skipping the math) it would save each household approximately \$330.60 a year. Mistakenly, I figured eight hours a week. Sharp-eyed volunteer Paul Coffman, Chair of the Long-Range Planning Committee, caught the error - it should have been eight hours a month. However, I know quite a few volunteers who give more than eight hours a week - some even give eight hours a day because they like

doing what they do. But, the idea here is to get the numbers straight. Using the extremely conservative eight hours a month, the rest of Grant's conclusions stand.

As an aside, back in August, 2008, day after day, for a few weeks, I watched as John Wirtz, Bill Foeller, Leonard Belcher & Jim Ronge) converted a small space outside the entrance to the Billiards Room to create a patio that the entire Village enjoys today. Aside from some very welcome expertise from Resident Services and Landscapers, the bulk of the bricks and mortar work, the fire pit, and a lot of sweat came from Village Volunteers, giving more than eight hours a week to all of us in the form of a year-round patio to enjoy.



More Than A Drop In The Bucket

After totally missing an ex- bone-dry reservoirs. pected soaking from the no-show "El Niño," now the National Weather Service says, "La Niña," the wet one's weak sister has arrived. And that, they say, means cool and dry weather for the winter season, just the opposite



of the wet wild weather "El Nino was supposed to deliver. There is a bright spot: unseasonal heavy rain for Northern California and the mountains, the major sources of water for the state's nearly

And there is another bright spot right here at home. Villagers are bucking the apparent trend of too many Southern Californians who are back to using too much water. Our consumption of potable (drinking) water was down

in September, a whopping 673,200 gallons, or an average of 11 gallons per household per day. It may not sound like much, but it cut our water bill \$2,610.

And it's not hard to make that kind of savings: turning off the water as you brush your teeth saves 2.5 gallons a minute; spend only five minutes in the shower and save eight gallons a minute; use a broom

instead of washing down the patio and save 50 gallons, and every household leak wastes 20 gallons a day.

So, you see, it's not difficult to stop wasting water!

people with jackpots of \$3.00," he says. "I was calling games at the Camarillo Senior Center as a volunteer when the Village asked me to call here." The rest is history. B.D. (before Donnel), Bingo brought in \$19,000 a year. Chuck reorganized the weekly event, bought a new Bingo Machine, and increased the prizes. In 2013, the game brought in nearly \$88,000, after paying the winners. The money goes to the Village (minus costs like paper and daubers). The fun goes to Chuck, he says.

But that's only one part of the Donnel busy-ness. "I just love to help people," he explains. So he's a member of the Buildings and Grounds Committee, keeping an eye on how residents keep their gardens and patios neat. "I usually talk to the homeowner before I write anything up. A lot of cooperation comes when you are polite," he says. As an Emergency Preparedness Coordinator, Chuck focuses on the safety of people in his Village in the

event of a disaster, "You'll see me in my hard hat and vest if there's a problem. I'm CERT trained and radio-ready." And he's been the Village's Chief Election Officer for 14 years, which means Chuck supervises ballot counting for all Village elections.

He and Marie still call Leisure Village "heaven" as they approach their 40th year here and agree they wouldn't change a thing - except that darn one-car garage.

A NEW LOOK FOR THE RECREATION OFFICE

A holiday present to Village residents and staff is the larger, reconfigured space that used to be the tiny area of the Recreation Center called the Rec Office. The new Office will provide badly needed room for the dozens of daily transactions between Villagers and the Recreation team headed by Shelley Runge and, for the first time, contain a break room for LVA employees.

The remodeling work is being done primarily by Village staff. Only the electrical work will be installed by an outside company. As a result, the price tag for this improvement project is estimated at \$9700 (or less, according to the General Manager Bob Scheaffer).

A long modern counter for

customer service will replace the current peek-a-boo window. The employees' lunch room will contain the needed appliances and the space so Village workers have an alternative to eating lunch in their cars or at a desk in the back of the office.

It's a welcome change for Shelley Runge. "The staff refrigerator and microwave have always been in my office, "she explains with a good-natured laugh, "which often meant we were stepping over each other." She estimates that between 50 to 60 residents come to the office daily to sign up for classes, get club information, buy tickets for events, pick up LVA forms, or just ask a question. Now the office can add comfortable customer service to that list.

COOKING WITH LARRY

My Kitchen is My Laboratory

When Joy Babcock said "My kitchen is my laboratory" during our conversation last week, I knew I had a great title for this article. Born in Dalian in Northeast China, Joy now lives with her American husband in Village 20 and they are very happy for many reasons. Joy is happy because she loves to cook, experimenting with healthy foods and Gary loves to

be her guinea pig. That's because her experiments always turn out great. Joy remembers being in the kitchen when she was around five years old. Both her parents worked, and she and her siblings would be given a list of things to do to prep for dinner.

Now, years later in Camarillo, she loves to experiment. I've been professionally involved with food for over 40 years and she has things in her kitchen I have never even seen before, much less cooked with, like roasted, blanched, halved apricot seeds. Even though she loves to experiment, Joy still loves basic simple dishes that taste great.

She loves to cook with Tofu and she says "I use different textures for different dishes. Soft tofu is good for soups but not for stir fry." Even though the word "tofu" is Japanese, most food historians accredit the invention of "bean curd," to the Chinese, and it is made by curdling soymilk. I don't have to tell you the benefits of tofu, but I will: it is a good source of protein and contains all eight essential amino acids. It is also an excellent source of iron, calcium, manganese, selenium and phosphorous and tofu is great at absorbing the flavors surrounding it. For those who don't eat grains or are on a gluten free diet, use tofu to stuff a Holiday Turkey. There are plenty of recipes online.

Basic Tofu Stir-fry: (Serves 2)

INGREDIENTS: 1/2 Package (70z) firm tofu cut into 3/4" squares 1/2 cup (shelled) cooked edamame

Two (2) medium carrots diced & blanched till barely soft 2 garlic cloves finely diced Two (2) 1/4 slices of red onion cut into 8 pie wedges Olive Oil Chicken Broth - preferably homemade or Better than Bullion (if you don't have time to make fresh broth) Low Sodium soy sauce (according to taste)

Directions: Sautee garlic on low heat till golden, do not allow to brown or burn. Add onion, edamame, carrots and tofu. Add a small additional amount of oil as required. Raise heat to medium; stir fry for approximately five to six minutes or until golden brown and the onion is translucent. Add a few drops of toasted Sesame oil if desired, 34 cup chicken broth and stir. Taste for seasonings. Add soy sauce if desired. Serve with vegetable, rice or noodles.

When the Lights go Out —Don't Blow a Fuse

By Cliff Kearsley

I've hesitated a bit longer than necessary in writing about this next topic - ELECTRICAL. I've put it in caps, because there should be more than a little caution when approaching this topic. There is some risk in an inexperienced attempt to deal with electrical problems, so we won't get happened? You've just overloaded a

too technical or suggest that you try to deal with anything that might be risky.

Let's say that you plug in an appliance - perhaps a vacuum that hasn't been plugged into that specific outlet before. You switch it on and it immediately quits and some lights go out entirely. What circuit and tripped a breaker - we used to say that you "blew a fuse." Before going further, unplug the offending appliance and switch off some, but not all, of the lights that went out. Not to panic! And not yet time to call a handy man or electrician. Some investigation

is called for first. On an outside wall of your house - the one furthest from your "roofmate" - there is a breaker panel. Open the door - no risk here. As you look at all of the breakers, one should stand out. The toggle switches for all but one of your breakers are pointing in the same direction. The switch on one of them is pointing directly at you. That's the one that you have tripped. You need to switch it from

Close the breaker panel cover and go inside to check the lights that you didn't switch off earlier. They should be on. If so, pat yourself on the back for having solved an electrical problem. If not, now's the time to call a handy-man. Most can handle simple electrical problems. If they can't, they'll tell you and then you can call


