All are encouraged to come see and appreciate the talent in Leisure Vil-

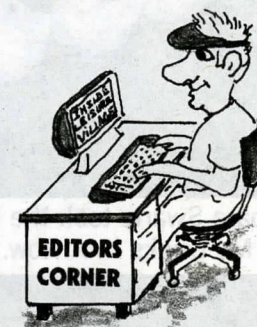
lage.

The Third Annual Pumpkin Festival filled the AR with three hours of fun and excitement for another full house of Village residents and visitors on Monday.

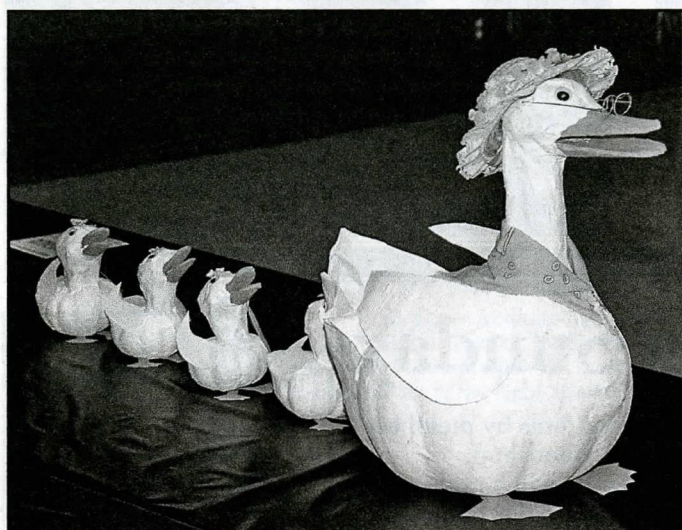
There was something for everyone as 27 very different decorated and carved pumpkins amazed and amused the Village residents. The number of pumpkin dishes and chili was overwhelming.

Village resident's ancestors were on Mayflower

On the fourth Thursday in November, we celebrate Thanksgiving in the United States. No one is more pleased to celebrate this wonderful day than Burt Everett Jacobs here in Village 34.

Jacobs' family history, based on extensive and thoroughly researched records, shows that he is a direct descendent of John Alden and Myles Standish, who came to America from England on the sailing ship Mayflower, and dates back to the year 1620 when the Pilgrims landed in Plymouth, Mass.

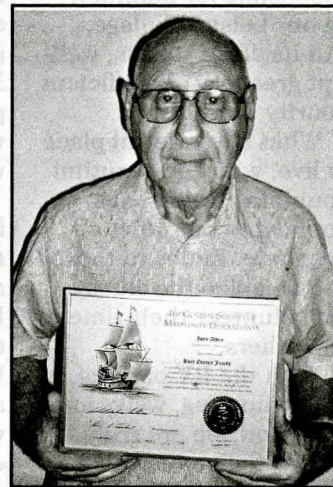
Burt is a member of the Mayflower Society, the General Society of Mayflower Descendants founded at Plymouth, Mass., in 1897. Only 29 of the 102 passengers on the Mayflower are currently

known to have descendants.

Burt's lineage traces back from his mother, grandmother and great-grandfather to John Alden, and a grandfather descended from Myles Standish. Burt has pages and pages of documents attesting these family ties. He has, in his own meticulous way, kept the paperwork in a manner to accurately lead you from generation to generation.

He is amazing! His interest in these family records are his to enjoy forever and to pass to the next generation. He proudly shares this information.

Burt and his wife, Nancy, have been married 54 years and have done their part to add to this fabulous lineage. They have four children, two

boys and two girls, and six grandchildren who live in

Tarzana, Simi Valley and Pine Mountain. The Jacobses have lived in Leisure Village for 10 years.

Burt was born in St. Paul, Minn., where he spent his youth. He moved to California in 1943. He has spent most of his life in Southern California. He met his wife in Paramount at the Paramount Ice Rink, and the romance took off from there.

He has, here in Leisure Village, enjoyed the RV Club and Showtyme, and he has been the deputy coordinator for the ESO, Echo Station.


He was in the U.S. Army Specialized Training Program that included a year in college. He had one year of basic engineering, then went on to active duty in 1945. He was in the Army 11/2 years.

Burt worked at Kaiser Steel in Fontana for approximately 20 years. He worked at Kaiser Hospital in Fontana and retired in 1992.

Although he enjoys reading, music and occasionally baking chocolate chip cookies, his main interest is his family, family history and genealogy. He wants to visit Plymouth, Mass., to update himself on history. He feels that Leisure Village is the best place to live and is happy here.

Burt's immediate goal is to stay with the study of his family's history, which he estimates will take another year of research.

Burt is a friendly person, and it is a plus to have this documented descendent of the Pilgrims living in Leisure Village.

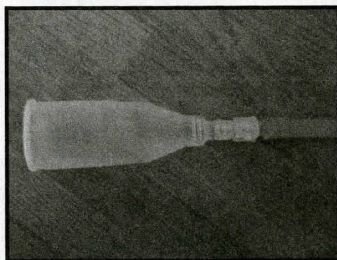
So, once again I remind you to remember better breathing techniques that will help you get things done a little easier.

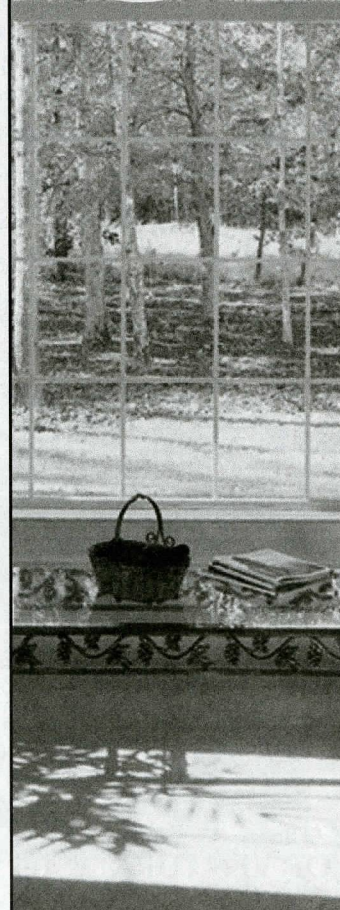

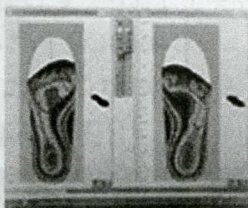

Condos vs. PUDs

Planned Urban Development. Below is a brief description of a condominium and PUD development.

The two most common interest developments in California are condominiums and Planned Developments, often referred to as PUDs. The basic characteristics shared by these two forms of ownership are:

1. Common ownership of private residential property;
2. Mandatory membership of all owners in an association which controls use of the common property;
3. Governing documents which establish the procedures for governing the association, the rules which the owners must follow in the use of their individual lots or units as well as the common properties;
4. A means by which owners are assessed to

finance the operation of the association and maintenance of the common properties.

Before continuing further, it may be helpful to clarify a common misconception about condominiums and PUDs. The terms condominium and PUD refer to types of interests in land, not to physical styles of dwellings. The terms condominium or PUD will say a great deal about the ownership rights the buyer will receive in the unit and the interest they will acquire in the common properties or common areas of the development.

Common interest developments offer many advantages to homebuyers — low maintenance and access to attractive amenities — however, there are restrictions and duties which come with the ownership of a condominium or PUD.

The owner of a unit

within a typical condominium project owns 100 percent of the unit. In addition, they will own a fractional or percentage interest in all common areas of the condominium project.

The owner of a lot within a PUD owns the lot, which has been conveyed to them — as shown in the recorded Tract Map or Parcel Map — and the structure and improvements thereon. In addition, they receive rights and easements to use in common areas owned by another — frequently a homeowner's association — of which the individual lot owners are members.

The above are basic descriptions and should not be considered legal definitions.

With approval and support of our Board of Directors and Village management, ground breaking will begin in the near future on the Walk of Celebration.

This new walkway will begin at the east entrance to the pool area and end across the greenbelt at the opposing sidewalk. It will be constructed of standard bricks, which will be ultimately replaced with the exquisite granite blocks being purchased from the Planned Giving Committee to support our covered bus stop project.

As the blocks are purchased and personally engraved with witty sayings, words of encouragement and remembrances, they will replace the existing bricks to make a stone "patchwork quilt" of

bricks and granite.

Six trees have also been personally donated through Planned Giving to make this wonderful area a new highlight in our Village.

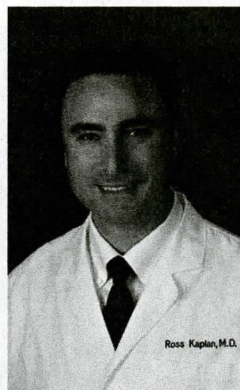

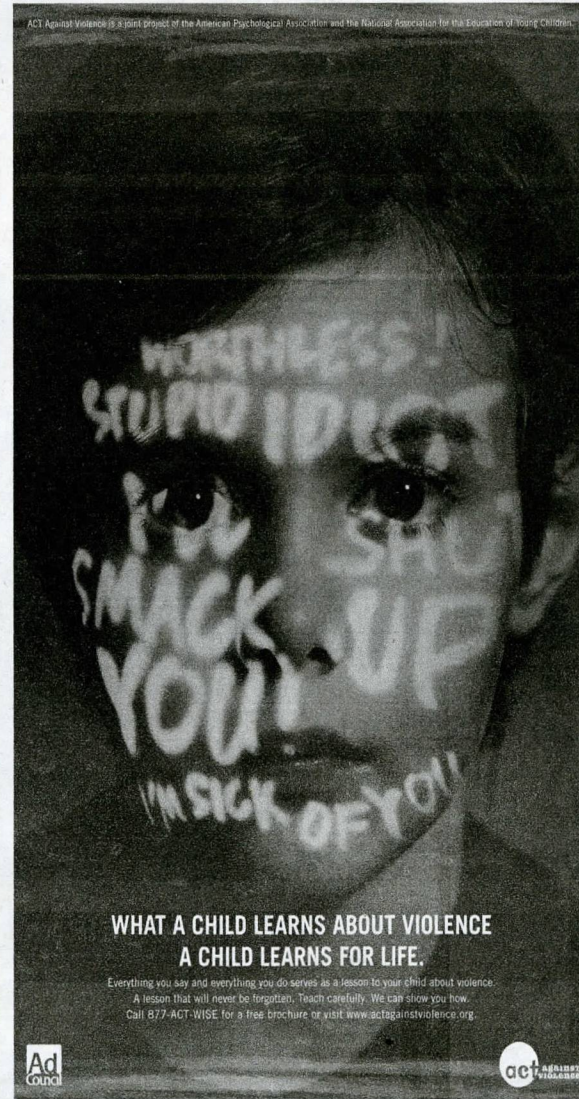
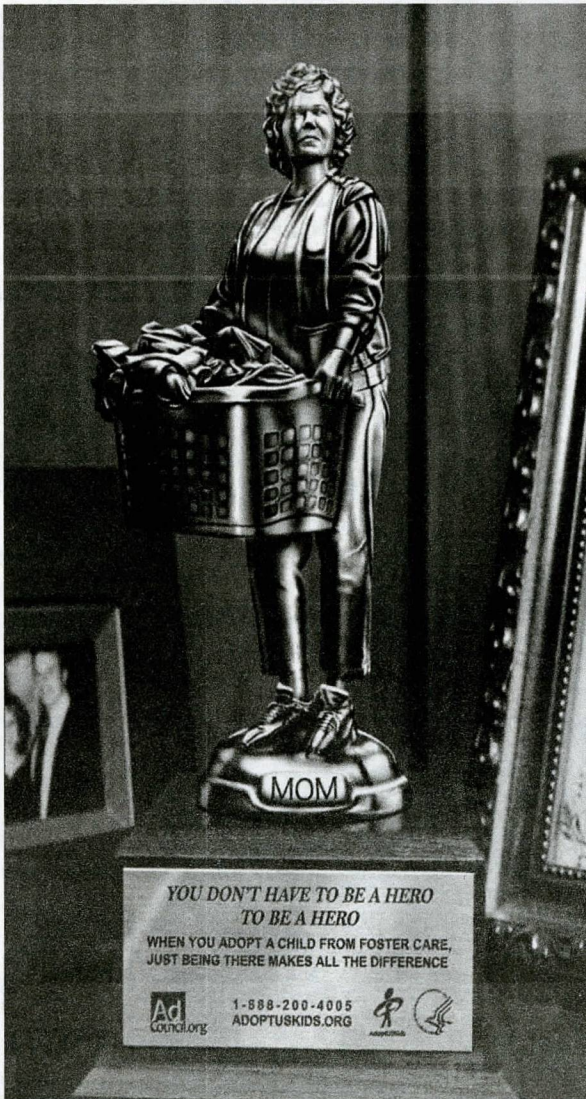
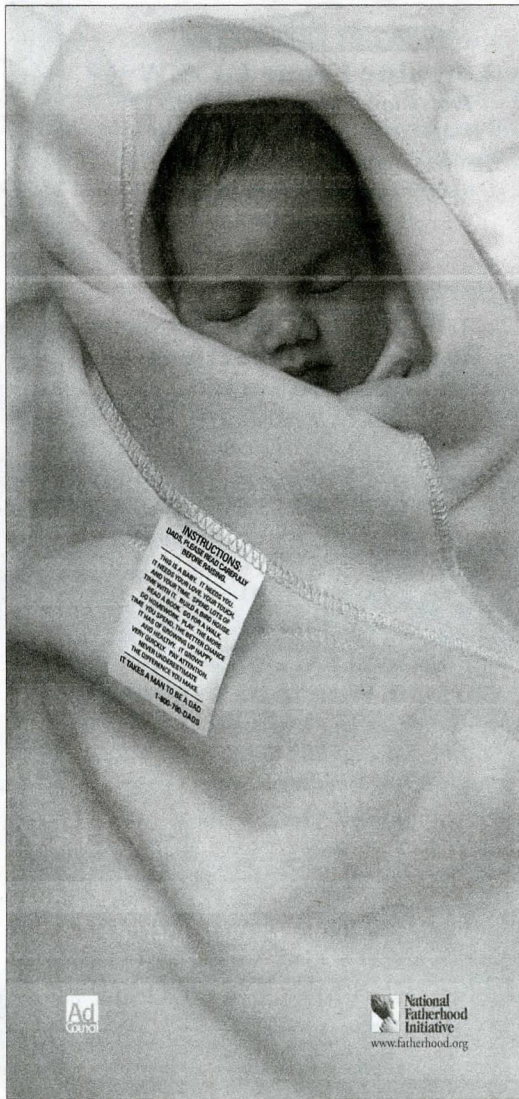
The first Wednesday of each month, the Ceramic Mold Decorators Club has its official club meeting at noon. We have a few empty chairs we would
