

## Mujeres Latinas en Accion Gala

A sparkling fundraiser was hosted by Mujeres Latinas en Accion on Feb. 29th at The Palmer House downtown. The theme "Cambios: Women in a Changing World," was a celebration of the agency's 23 years of service to the Latino community.

The evening began with a sumptuous dinner and included many moving speeches from members of

Mujeres and those who are involved in the organization.

"I am proud to be a part of Mujeres. This is a most needed agency which has served the Latina community for years. Without Mujeres, many women would have nowhere to turn," said Luisa Echevarria, Community Relations Director of WGBO Channel 66, Corporate Dinner Chair.

The keynote speaker Nancy De Los Santos, associate producer of the movie Mi Familia, gave an inspiring address. A Chicago native, she discussed her participation in the Mujeres youth program as a teenager and how her life changed as a result. Mujeres sponsored her participation in the first United Nations Conference on Women held in Mexico City, which greatly expanded her outlook and dreams. Her speech also included an emotional part of her life when Mujeres helped her leave an abusive relationship.

De Los Santos is co-producer of The Bronze Screen: The History of Latinos in Hollywood as is part of the production team developing the story of slain Tejano singer, Selena Quintanilla. De Los Santos is one of the few visible Latinas in Hollywood who actively works on projects regarding the Latino community in this country.

Mujeres Latinas is a bilingual, bicultural social service and advocacy agency that serves over 4,500 Latina women and families each year. It was founded 23 years ago by volunteers and now has an operating budget of \$1 million. They offer comprehensive programs and advocacy in domestic violence prevention and intervention; case management for women at risk of homelessness; support groups for parents; youth crises intervention and support; after school programs; Latina Leadership

courses; counseling for victims of sexual assault and information and referral for a wide range of services.

"(Mujeres) is there to lift spirits, help heal, step in in an emergency situation and provide support," stated Virginia Martinez, Executive Director of the organization.

The monies raised from the \$150 tickets will be used towards building Mujeres a new home, as well as general operating costs.

"The proceeds generated by our annual dinner are critical in helping us maintain the high quality of services so valued by this community. Not only are we striving for a much needed new home, we strive to serve the growing needs of the Latina community," stated Board member Marta Cerdá.

citizenship ceremonies held by UNO.

Following his swearing in, Solis took his seat with the council, making it the first time in almost two months that the 25th ward has had a representative in the City Council.

On January 12, Ambrosio Medrano, who was the previous 25th Ward alderman, resigned after pleading guilty to accepting bribes from F.B.I. mole John Christopher. Medrano

was the first politician to be indicted in Operation Silver Shovel, an F.B.I. investigation involving illegal construction dumps that Christopher ran in minority neighborhoods.

Although other Chicago alderman have been mentioned in connection with Silver Shovel, the F.B.I. has yet to formally charge any of them.

Solis being named as alderman brought an end to political squabbling that included protests in City Hall and the stepping forward of many potential candidates.

His first act as new alderman to support a resolution by Ald. Jesse Granto (1st) that praised the contributions that Mexican Americans have made to the United States.

The resolution was drafted in response to a recent column by the Chicago Tribune's Mike Royko, depicting Mexico in a mocking way. Though defended by the Tribune as satire, some Mexicans were offended and protested on Michigan Avenue in front of the Tribune Tower.

"I think that he has relish with the way he uses satire," said Solis. "I have been reading him since the 1960's, and I think that he has gone too far."

Granto says that he drafted the resolution because "I want to bring out the positives of the

Mexican people. It has nothing to do with any one writer."

Other Latino alderman also had opinions about the Royko incident. "I want to thank Mike Royko for bringing together the Mexican people," said Ald. Rafael "Ray" Frias, on the council floor, in response to Granto's resolution.

Ald. Ricardo Munoz(22nd) said "The Latino community has worked together on a variety of issues. Mike Royko is just a big nightmare. The Latino community was united before this."

Said Ald. Billy Ocasio(26th) "This comes at a time where the United States is going into a whole different direction with an anti-immigrant sentiment."

Other issues that came up at that day's council meeting were ordinances to cut down on outdoor cafe litter, reduce charter and sightseeing bus license fees and to expand the parking administrative adjudication program to include City sticker and vehicle compliance violations.

There was discussions of community projects that would come about as a result of the empowerment zone. The empowerment zone includes the Pilsen/Little Village area.



## Paralegals are in growing demand

How can law firms improve service to clients while at the same time lower costs? By using more paralegals, according to a recent survey of attorneys. Ninety-six percent of attorneys whose firms have increased the use of paralegals over the past five years said that client service has improved as a result. They cited lowered costs as the number one reason for the improvement.

The survey was developed by The Affiliates, a staffing service specializing in the temporary and permanent placement of legal support personnel. It was conducted by an independent research firm, which polled 100 attorneys

from the nation's 1,200 top law firms.

Attorneys were first asked whether they had increased the use of paralegals at their firms during the past five years. Fifty-six percent of attorneys said yes. Of this number, 96 percent said the use of paralegals had improved their service to clients and cited the following reasons for the improvement:

Lowered costs	61%
Provided faster response time	31%
Improved depth of research	4%
Don't know	4%
	100%

"Paralegals have never been more critical to law firms," said Florence Kanofsky, founder of The Affiliates.

"They are assuming more diverse functions, from organizing and coding documents to supervising litigation support teams."

Finalmente lea la tabla de costos en la que se describe los costos de administrador y lo que usted tiene que pagar.

\* Pese la "carga". Algunos fondos mutuos tienen una "carga frontal" -- cuota que usted paga al comprar las acciones. Otros fondos cobran la carga cuando se venden. Algunos fondos no tienen carga ninguna (pero tal vez no tengan la investigación

y servicios que tienen los fondos con carga).

\* Cuestione lo que se alega en la propaganda. NASD revisa la propaganda de fondos mutuos para mantenerla honesta e informativa. Un consejo: Si ve algo que parece demasiado bueno para ser verdad, probablemente lo sea.

A diferencia de los depósitos bancarios, los fondos mutuos no están asegurados. Por lo tanto haga preguntas y conozca sus opciones. Despues de todo, es su dinero. Para más consejos, llame a NASD al (301)590-6500 y pida un folleto gratuito titulado "Invest Wisely".

- \* Read the prospectus. It tells you about the fund's objectives and risks. The prospectus may read like a car rental agreement, but Beauchamp says to check for a few key items.

Find the minimum dollar

amount required to open an account. If it's more than you're willing to invest, stop reading. Check the performance section to see how well the fund has done over time. Finally, read the fee table, describing the management costs and fees you have to pay.

- \* Weigh the "load." Some mutual funds have a "front-end load" - fees you pay up front when buying the shares. Other funds charge the load when you sell your shares. Some funds have no load at all (but they may not have the research and

services that load funds do).

- \* Question the claims in advertisements. The NASD reviews mutual fund advertising to keep it honest and informative. A rule of thumb: If you see something that looks too good to be true, it probably is.

Unlike bank deposits, mutual funds aren't insured. So ask lots of questions and know your options. After all, it's your money. For more tips, call the NASD at (301) 590-6500 and ask for a free brochure titled "Invest Wisely."

## How to deduct employee business expenses

Earning money inevitably costs you money. Professional journals, union dues, business meals and continuing education are expenses typically incurred in the line of duty. However, you may be able to offset your out-of-pocket costs by deducting a portion of those expenses on your federal income tax return, points out the Illinois CPA Society.

### FOLLOWING THE ROAD TO AN AUTOMOBILE DEDUCTION

If you use your own car for business and aren't reimbursed by your employer, there are two ways to claim a deduction. You may deduct your actual costs for gas, oil, insurance, repairs and maintenance, in addition to depreciation, or you can use the standard IRS mileage rate, which is 30 cents per mile for 1995. In both instances, you also can deduct the cost of unreimbursed, business-related parking fees and tolls. Most people come out ahead by keeping track of their expenses, but this method requires a little more detailed recordkeeping.

### GET SMART AND DEDUCT EDUCATIONAL EXPENSES

As an employee, you may be entitled to a deduction for unreimbursed monies spent on job-related education. Among the expenses you can write off are the cost of tuition, books, supplies, lab fees, certain costs for travel to and from your studies, and even the wages of a tutor or typist you used in connection with your educational pursuits.

However, your curriculum must meet one of two Internal Revenue Service (IRS) imposed requirements: (1) your education must be required by your employer or by law to keep your current

### TRAVEL NEAR AND FAR FOR A WRITE-OFF

When you travel strictly for business, you may deduct your unreimbursed travel expenses. Deductible expenses include the costs of transportation and lodging, 50 percent of meals, and incidental expenses, such as the cost of dry cleaning and laundry, that you incur while away from home.

### SEARCH FOR A JOB AND FIND A DEDUCTION

If you looked for work during 1995, you may be able to claim deductions for related expenses, as long as you were seeking a position in your current line of work. Deductible expenses include costs for resume preparation printing and mailing, career consultations, travel to interviews, telephone calls and publications

## Como deducir los gastos de negocio del empleado

## Week in Review

### Prostitution sting results in 44 arrests

A prostitution sting on Chicago's West Side resulted in 44 arrests. The sting came as a result of complaints from women who said that they were mistaken for prostitutes. All but two of the men were released on bond, and are awaiting trial, according to Harrison District police Sgt. John Kenny. The men face misdemeanor charges that could result in up to 364 days in jail or a \$1,000 fine. Police women walked up and down the 4600 block of West Madison Street and West Roosevelt Street and acted as decoys in the sting.

### Minnie Pearl dies

Minnie Pearl, the first woman to perform at the Grand Old Opry has died at age 83. The comedian was known for her straw hat with a price tag that said \$1.98 dangling from it as well as her loud greeting of "How-dee!" Pearl, whose real name was Sarah Colley, died of complications from a stroke on March 4. She had originally wanted to be a serious actress, but created the Minnie Pearl character while she traveled rural areas with a theatrical group. In 1975, she was inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame.

### Michael Jordan ends charity

Michael Jordan has announced that he will end his charitable foundation.. He announced that its board of directors has voted to end it on March 31, at the end of its fiscal year. Rising administrative costs was given as the reason for ending the charity. Last year, a television station stated that the foundation spent more on its administration than it did on charitable acts. Though he will no longer have a charitable foundation, he says that he and his wife, Juanita, will still support charitable causes. His mother, Deloris, who was co-founder of the foundation, says that she will work closely with the James Jordan Boys and Girls Club on the West Side. Michael Jordan recently donated \$2 million to the club, which was named after his late father.

### Trade allies angry at U.S. trade sanctions against Cuba

companies that trade with the United States are angry about the "The Cuban Liberty Act," which was passed in December by both the U.S. House and the Senate. The act would allow Cuban Americans who had land confiscated by the Castro regime in Cuba to sue in the U.S. courts any foreign company who has benefit from the land. Among the companies who could be sued are sugar refining companies in Mexico and mining companies in Canada. Both countries have said that the act violated the North American Free Trade Agreement. As a result of the act, the European Union has warned that U.S. - European relations could be damaged. Cuba's does most of its trading with Canada, but it also trades with Mexico, Italy, France, England, Ireland and Spain. Cuba has announced that as a result of the latest U.S. sanctions, which came about because of the downing of two unarmed planes from Miami, that it may ban U.S. airlines from flying over Cuba. If this happens it will take longer and cost more to fly to Latin America and the Caribbean.

### Chicagoan convicted of killing boyfriend turns self in

A woman who fled Chicago to avoid being charged with her boyfriend's murder, has turned herself in to police in Honolulu. Catherine Suh, 26, fled during her trial. She had been charged with asking her brother, Andrew, to kill her boyfriend, Robert O'Dubaine. Andrew had already been convicted of murder, and sentenced to 100 years in prison. Her trial went on with out her, and she was convicted and sentenced to life in prison. While in Chicago, Suh lived in Lake Point Tower, and drank champaign. After fleeing, she changed her name to Tiffini Escada, and moved to Honolulu, where she convinced a new boyfriend to buy a condominium in a pricy high-rise building. She went back into hiding after the television show America's Most Wanted broadcast her picture. On March 8, Suh called an old boyfriend in Chicago, and after speaking to him for two hours, she turned herself in to police. She will be sent back to Illinois to serve her prison sentence. Both Catherine and Andrew Suh are suspected in the murder of their mother. Elizabeth Suh was found stabbed 38 times in her Evanston business in 1987. The siblings shared a \$800,000 life insurance policy after their mother's death.

Aunque ya no tendrá una fundación de caridad, dice que él y su esposa, Juanita, continuarán apoyando las causas de caridad. Su madre, Deloris, co-fundadora de la fundación, dice que trabajará muy de cerca con el Club Boys and Girls James Jordan en el Lado Oeste. Michael Jordan donó recientemente \$2 millones al club que lleva el nombre de su difunto padre.


### Comerciantes extranjeros enojados por las sanciones comerciales de E.U. contra Cuba

Mientras estuvo en Chicago, Suh vivió en Lake Point Tower y bebió champagne. Después de huir, se cambió el nombre por el de Tiffini Escada y se fue a vivir a Honolulu, donde convenció a un nuevo novio a que comprara un condominio en un costoso edificio. Volvió a esconderse cuando el show de televisión "America's Most Wanted" (La más buscada en América) transmitió su fotografía. El 8 de marzo, Suh llamó a un viejo amigo de Chicago y después de hablar con él por dos horas, se entregó a la policía. Será enviada de regreso a Chicago para cumplir su sentencia en la cárcel. Tanto Catherine como Andrew Suh son sospechosos del asesinato de su madre. Elizabeth Suh fue encontrada muerta con 38 puñaladas en su comercio de Evanston en 1987. Los hermanos compartieron un seguro de vida de \$800,000 después de la muerte de su madre.



## La Junta de Comisionados de Elecciones necesita jueces

La Junta de Comisionados de Elecciones de Chicago todavía tiene una escasez substancial de jueces de elección para la Elección Primaria de Marzo 19 de 1996.

A los jueces de elección se les paga \$75 por el día de elección, más \$25 por asistir a la escuela de instrucción de la Junta, para un total de \$100. Para información votantes pueden llamar a la Junta al 269-7900.

## Judges needed for election

The Chicago Board of Election Commissioners still has a substantial shortage of judges of election for the March 19, 1996 Primary Election.

Chicago Election Commissioner Richard A. Cowen said there are a total of 2,737 vacancies to staff the city's 2,545 polling places. With more than 13,000 judges of election utilized on election day, the vacancy factor is in excess of 20

percent, Commissioner Cowen noted.

"Although we have had a tremendous response to our public appeal for judges of election during the past week, it is imperative that we fill the remaining vacancies as quickly as possible so that the judges can be assigned to one of our school of instruction classes," Commissioner Cowen said. "Our need for persons to serve as

Republican judges of election is especially acute."

Judges of election are paid \$75 for election day, plus \$25 for attending the Board's school of instruction, for a total of \$100. To serve as a judge of election, a person need only be a registered voter in Cook County. For information, voters can call the Chicago Election Board at 269-7900.

## Parents seeking school funding to march on Springfield

Three parents fed up with public school cutbacks and high local property tax burdens have spurred a statewide mobilization for school funding reform, and they're asking as many parents as possible to join them.

The parents, along with the Illinois PTA, Illinois AARP, Illinois Education Association, Chicago Urban League and several other community groups, are organizing thousands of parents for a march on Springfield on March 27th.

The march will take place at 11 a.m. on Wednesday, March 27th

at the state capitol, while the State Senate and House are in session.

"We're marching to let legislators know that we care about the future of our children," said Glenwood resident Mardelle Giantlike, one of the three parents who initiated the march.

March organizers are demanding adequate and equitable funding for schools and reduced reliance on local property taxes. "We're urging parents, grandparents, uncles and aunts all across the state to urge the General Assembly to make kids a priority," said Sharon Voliva, legislative chair of the Illinois PTA.



# Estrogen may help prevent heart disease

Researchers at Loyola University Medical Center, Maywood, are seeking volunteers for a study to determine whether hormone replacement therapy, specifically the use of estrogen, can protect older women from heart disease.

'For women, the rate of heart disease increases after menopause, suggesting that decreasing estrogen levels may significantly affect cardiac risk,' said Sue Penckofer, Ph.D., R.N., associate professor at Loyola and principal investigator for the study. The two-year project is being supported in part by a grant from the American Heart Association of Metropolitan Chicago.

Volunteers for the

study must be at least 50 years of age, no longer experience monthly ovarian cycles and neither stroke nor suffer from any known heart disease, high cholesterol, high blood pressure, diabetes, cancer or liver disease. Participants will include women who are already receiving estrogen therapy, as well as those who are not Penckofer said.

Earlier research indicates that estrogen may act as an antioxidant. Antioxidants, such as vitamin E and beta carotene, fight 'free radicals,' unstable molecules in the body that attack and destroy cells and may lead to disease, including heart disease.

Synthetic estrogen often

is prescribed as a replacement for the natural female sex hormones at menopause. The hormone is used to prevent bone loss in women at risk for osteoporosis.

Estrogen also may be used to control abnormal body temperature fluctuations, commonly called "hot flashes;" mood swings; vaginal dryness; depression; and other symptoms that occur when menstruation stops. Its protective effects on the heart are still being explored.

'As women age and go through menopause, they may be more susceptible to disease,' she added. 'However, there are risks associated with estrogen replacement therapy, such as uterine and breast cancers. We need to weigh the benefits against those risks to determine whether or not the therapy should be given to females at risk of heart disease.'

An initial time commitment of one hour will be required of those women accepted into the study. Individuals will

# Giving vaccines away doesn't guarantee inoculation

Nearly 40 percent of U.S. children under 2 are vulnerable to a host of diseases that only a few decades ago claimed scores of children.

Even though the government recommended routine infant vaccination in 1991, only about 62 percent of American 2-year-olds are vaccinated against diseases like diphtheria, measles and polio, said Larry DeBrock and Richard Arnould, economics professors who specialize in health-care issues. That percentage pales in comparison to Europe's 90 percent vaccination rate among the same age group.

While the U.S. vaccination rate jumps to a nearly perfect 98 percent among school-age children, DeBrock and Arnould pointed out that there are strong

complete questionnaires and undergo free diagnostic testing, including blood pressure and heart rate measurements, at

medical grounds for vaccinating infants by 22 months of age, when their immune systems are weak and they need added protection.

Although President Clinton made raising vaccination rates to 90 percent a national goal at the onset of his term, current U.S. vaccination rates still lag well behind those of many nations, the economists said.

One major stumbling block could be an underlying assumption by many government officials that giving away vaccines guarantees vaccination. That assumption was the guiding philosophy for several state give-away programs, they noted, as well as an early Clinton administration proposal suggesting that the government could become the sole buyer of vaccines, providing them



to the public at no charge.

'Essentially, the Clinton argument was that by giving them away, you'll get to 90 percent. But what the data have shown was that even if you give them away, it's not easy to get to 90 percent,' DeBrock said.

'When states have concerted public awareness programs to give away free vaccines, you see higher rates of inoculation,' Arnould said. 'But if you look at those states that only offer free vaccines, you get an incredibly wide variation [in rates].'



## Las quemaduras pueden evitarse

Un pequeño corre por la cocina en busca de su juguete favorito. En la estufa, arriba, la sopa hiere en una olla. El niño tropieza con un cable de extensión...

Sucede con demasiada frecuencia. Los niños menores de 10 años suman la mitad de los casos de quemaduras que requieren hospitalización y tanto como el 75 por ciento de quemadas por escaldadura. Tales heridas pueden poner en peligro la vida, muchas veces son debilitantes y casi siempre causan cicatrices de por vida.

Sin embargo, la mayoría de quemaduras, especialmente las que atañen a los niños pequeños, pueden evitarse.

Los niños pequeños enfrentan mayores riesgos que los adultos y los niños mayores, por varias razones. Se pueden mover con más rapidez de lo que los adultos creen. Realmente se queman más rápidamente que los adultos cuando quedan expuestos a una fuente de calor. Los niños pequeños pueden además desconocer los riesgos de una quemadura y no quitarse rápidamente del peligro.

Siga estos consejos para la prevención de quemaduras:

\* Los niños deben de ser siempre supervisados de cerca. No importa cuán a "prueba de niños" sea la casa, nada substituye la supervisión de un adulto.

\* Nunca use cables de extensión en electrodomésticos pequeños. Trate de evitar cables que cuelguen de los electrodomésticos de cualquier clase.

## Regalar las vacunas no garantiza que se apliquen

Casi el 40 por ciento de los niños de E.U. menores de 2 años son vulnerables a una variedad de enfermedades que solo hace unas décadas reclamaban la vida de veintenas de niños.

## Tips to deal with dental fear

A trip to the dentist can be a terrifying experience for some people, but visits can be made easier when patients follow some simple guidelines.

"Start by sharing your feelings with your dentist and dental hygienist," says David Miller, DDS, a general dentist who practices on Chicago's South Side.

These tips are offered by the Chicago Dental Society.

\* Try to identify your specific fears and concerns. Some people feel anxiety because they had or heard about a negative dental experience during childhood. Others fear the sound of the drill, the possibility of pain, or the lack of control during a dental procedure. Pinpointing the cause of anxiety will help patients understand and control it better.

\* Ask the dentist or hygienist to explain each step of the dental exam or procedure. The more you

know about the reasons for a certain procedure and what will be done, the more relaxed you will be.

\* Set your appointment at a time when you are not rushed. Ask for the first appointment in the morning so you won't have to worry about it all day, or go on a Saturday.

\* Get a good night's sleep the night before the appointment and eat a light breakfast. To allow easier body movement, wear loose, comfortable clothes.

\* Schedule short appointments by having different procedures performed on different days. Also, arrange a break from lengthy procedures now and then. Signal the dentist to stop by using a pre-arranged signal.

\* Go to the appointment with someone you trust; a friend, relative or spouse who will reassure you. If you and a friend have the same dentist, consider joint appointments.

\* Take a Walkman or

Discman with tapes or CDs with you so you can listen to music or news to distract you from treatment.

Some offices provide these items, as well as goggles that show cartoons or movies. Find out what your dentist offers.

\* Remember to breathe. Put your hands on your stomach and concentrate on making them go up and down. Another relaxation technique is to tighten, then relax the major muscle groups in legs, hands, arms, shoulders and neck.

Distraction techniques include focusing on an image within view to take the mind off of treatment.

"Whatever you do," says Dr. Miller, "do not avoid dental care until you have a problem that causes pain." "Infections, impacted wisdom teeth and other procedures are more likely to be painful, creating the exact scenario that patients want to avoid."

## Burns Can Be Prevented

A toddler runs across a kitchen, in search of her favorite toy. On a counter high above, soup boils in a hot pot. The child trips over the extension cord ...

It happens far too frequently. Children under 10 account for half of all burns that require hospitalization and as many as 75 percent of all scald burns. Such injuries can be life-threatening and often debilitating and almost always cause life-long scars.

Yet most burns, especially those involving young children, can be prevented.

Young children face greater risks than adults and older children for several reasons. They can move around more quickly than adults

sometimes realize. They actually get burned more quickly than adults when exposed to a heat source. Also, young children may not be aware of the risks of burns and may not be able to remove themselves easily from the burn source.

Follow these tips for burn prevention:

\* Children should always be closely supervised. No matter how "child proof" the home, there is no substitute for adult supervision.

\* Never use extension cords with small appliances. Try to avoid dangling appliance wires of any kind.

\* Do not allow young children to enter the kitchen while food is being cooked - especially in a walker, which can easily snag cords and

bump furniture. Keep children out of the kitchen or confined to a high chair during meal preparation.

\* Do not allow children to cook or heat foods until they are old enough to observe the proper safety precautions.

\* When your children are in other people's homes, be especially careful. Many people who don't have young children are not aware of the risks in their homes.

According to Daniel E. Cohen, and the CEO of CNS, Inc., "While wearing a strip at night, the nasal passageway is more likely to stay open, making breathing easier."

The strips also provide a non-prescription solution for people concerned with taking medications, sleep quality, pregnancy and issues related to drug interactions.

Clinical studies have shown that nasal strip can reduce nasal airflow resistance by an average of 31 percent, making it easier to breathe through the nose.

In November 1995, Breathe Right nasal strips made headlines when the FDA cleared the way for the strips to be sold as a way to reduce or eliminate snoring by improving nasal breathing. Originally developed for people with nighttime nasal problems, they are the same strips that have become regulars on the nose of three-time Super Bowl champion Jerry Rice, and numerous other football players, bikers, runners, hockey players and even car racers.

and health experts and the multitude of medicines available on the shelves at local drugstores, it's difficult to find easy answers. Following are some straight facts to help clear up your confusion and congestion:

"The best thing to do in either case, is to stay home, rest and drink liquids, such as tea or juice," advises Registered Dominic's Pharmacist Luis Mauras.

However, he warned, if you are plagued with sustained sneezing and watery eyes and nose, then you are probably experiencing an allergy rather than a cold. To relieve allergy symptoms, generally antihistamines are used, which do cause drowsiness. But these may not necessarily clear up allergy-related congestion, in which case you may also need a decongestant.

Mauras explained that decongestants are taken by both cold and allergy sufferers. They clear up sinus and nasal passages and most are designed not to cause drowsiness. He suggests reading the package carefully to be sure about sleepy side effects.

"Over-the counter medicines can help you tolerate cold symptoms, but prevention is the real key to staying healthy this winter," Mauras advised.

Both colds and flu are transmitted from person to person, especially in crowded areas, such as trains or buses, and hand contact is the most common culprit of virus transmission.




## Women's health fair held at Harrison Park

## Hynes mails tax relief forms to senior citizens

Cook county Assessor Thomas C. Hynes announced the mailing of renewal forms for an exemption that offers as much as \$250 in property tax relief for senior homeowners.

Nearly 260,000 seniors will be receiving the Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption form, Hynes said. Seniors must sign and return the form each year to qualify for the exemption for the previous year.

"With increased government spending, the

property tax has become a heavier weight on all property owners and a particularly burdensome one for senior citizens on a fixed income," said Hynes, who introduced this exemption and has fought for its continued increase. "It is important that this form be signed and quickly returned to our office."

Homeowners receiving the Senior Citizen Exemption automatically qualify for the general Homeowners Exemption and will not have to apply





**What is Asylum?**

Asylum is a form of protection that the U.S. provides to persons fleeing persecution in their home countries. The right to seek protection from persecution is an internationally recognized human right which became law in the U.S. in the Refugee Act of 1980. To be eligible for asylum, a person must show that he or she has been persecuted in the past or has a "well-founded fear of persecution" if group, political opinion, or national origin. A person can apply for asylum in the U.S. or when seeking admission to the U.S. at a port of entry. For more information about the U.S. asylum system, refer to FaxBrief X11 (June 22, 1995).

The INS enacted new asylum regulations in January 1995 in response to concerns over the apparent abuse of the asylum system. Streamlined procedures are now in place

**Asylum application filing deadlines**

to quickly adjudicate claims and to help asylum officers keep current with incoming applications. Since the new regulations took effect, the asylum offices have kept current with new asylum applications and have completed 76,000 backlogged cases. The number of newly-filed asylum applications has decreased 57% and the number of applications is expected to decrease even more in 1996.

**What does current immigration legislation say about asylum?**

The Immigration Reform Act of 1995 (S. 269/1394) in the Senate and the Immigration in the National Interest Act (H.R. 2202) in the House of Representatives are very comprehensive immigration reform bills which include restrictive asylum provisions. Con-

gress has included these restrictive provisions. Congress has included these restrictive provisions based on a perception that increasing numbers of undocumented immigrants file frivolous asylum applications in the U.S. However, Congress clearly has not taken into account the sharp decline of asylum applications following the promulgation of the 1995 asylum regulations.

One of the ways these immigration reform bills would affect asylum is by imposing a 30-day time limit, or filing deadline, on applications. The legislation would require every asylum applicant to file an application within 30 days of entering the U.S. Those who failed to meet this requirement would lose any opportunity to apply for protection from persecution and would be forcibly returned to the country

from which they fled.

**How would a time limit affect persons seeking asylum?**

By definition, refugees who deserve asylum are persons who have fled situations of extreme danger and trauma. Many refugees and their families have been the victims of rape, torture, or other physical abuse.

Refugees—who usually arrive in the U.S. with little more than the clothes on their backs—naturally have first priority in obtaining food, shelter and clothing. Only after securing these basic necessities do refugees have time to begin finding their way through the U.S. asylum system. Even then, many legitimate applicants who fear persecution by repressive governments are reluctant to present claims until they gain confidence

that their claims will be treated fairly and confidentially and not result in retaliation against them or their loved ones back home. Moreover, the application process itself is complex and time-consuming. First, many refugees arrive without knowing anything about the asylum process and need to schedule an appointment for assistance with a human-rights organization or pro-bono lawyer. The application must be filled out in English. To have a reasonable chance of success, an applicant needs to obtain supporting documentation, often for overseas. Simply collecting the necessary documents often takes a few months.

It is impossible for asylum applicants to recover from their trauma, to familiarize themselves with the legal process and to properly complete the application within 30 days of en-

try into the U.S.

**What are people saying?**

We strongly oppose this provision. It will require the INS to divert resources from adjudication of the merits of asylum applications to adjudication of the timeliness of filing.



## The Abraham Lincoln Brigade

### Part I

In 1936, an exiled Spanish general named Francisco Franco launched a military revolt from his place of exile in the Canary Islands to take over Spain. At the time Spain was a republic. It had discarded the monarchy in 1931, and the people of Spain had elected a republic. However, the Spanish army in alliance with the rich ruling class and the Roman Catholic Church were completely against the republic, and so when Franco along with the Spanish army revolted these conservative forces joined in the revolt. Thus began the Spanish Civil War.

The republican government was defended by the ordinary citizens in the cities, and by the police. The republican government had a couple of disadvantages. They were fighting the Spanish army, a well disciplined and ruthless force. The republican forces did not have the weapons nor officers in the beginning. And to make things worse for the republicans, the forces of Franco, also called the El Falange or Nationalists, were receiving massive aid from Nazi Germany in the form of airplanes, weapons and advisors, and soldiers, weapons and aircraft from Fascist Italy. The only countries which gave any substantial aid to the republican government were the

Republic. It should be emphasized that the volunteer brigades were indeed voluntary, and no one was forced to go to help the Spanish Republic. Indeed, many were also turned away. These brigades of volunteers went to Spain clandestinely mostly through France through the southern border with Spain. These brigades of volunteers were composed mostly of young men and some women who wanted to fight "the good fight" against fascism. They were an unusual group of people. They came from all walks of life, they were men and women serving as soldiers, nurses and doctors. They were black, white and one Asian (a Japanese), and they came from all political persuasions from militantly communist to non-communist to anti-communist. But they all had one goal in mind—to protect the fledgling Spanish Republic, its democracy and fight fascism. These brigades became one of the most unique armies in not only American but in world history. This army of volunteers were not mercenaries as mercenaries fight for pay and profit, and they were not an army which served a government. This was an international army driven by an ideal, a goal of helping to preserve a government elected by its people. This army was set up in brigades with different names. One such brigade was called the Abraham Lincoln Brigade. The ideals of Abraham Lincoln fit in with the ideals of the American brigades' philosophy of "government of the people, by the people, for the people shall not perish from the earth." This sort of idealism became the driving force for why the brigades fought in Spain. But eventually the name of "Abraham Lincoln Brigade" was soon applied to all of the American volunteers serving in Spain, and the name stuck.

The army only had a few volunteers who were veterans of World War I, and they helped to train some of the volunteers, but otherwise they were raw recruits. They were not a disciplined army, but they were an enthusiastic one. When it came to the defense of Madrid, they fought hard to defend it. They also helped to defend other areas under the control of the Spanish Republic. At first many of the American volunteers got mauled by the firepower and numbers of the Nationalist forces. Many were killed in offensive action taken by the Republican forces trying to cut off the Nationalists and split the enemy forces in two. It failed miserably, and during almost the entire war the Republican forces remained on the defensive.

During this time the American volunteers gained not only experience in battle but also realized their mistakes in trying to go against overwhelming numbers. The Abraham Lincoln Brigade began to not only fight better but also how to inflict the most casualties against the Nationalists. Francisco Franco, who detested the volunteers who fought on the side of the Spanish Republic, issued orders that they be shot if captured. This for the most part was complied with by all Nationalist forces. And the fact that the Abraham Lincoln Brigade fought so hard and so tenaciously that the Nationalists completely despised them. Some of the battles which the Abraham Lincoln Brigade fought in made them legendary among the Spanish people. Slowly but surely, the Nationalists gained the upper hand. They had the upper hand all along. They had superior numbers, more weaponry, massive aid from both Italy and Germany, and the unity. The Republican forces were plagued by disunity, a continuing shortage

of arms due to an embargo to the Spanish Republic by the western democracies (tried as hard as they did, the Soviet Union, France and Mexico could not always get around Franco's blockade of the coasts) and not enough numbers. In the end the Republican forces were defeated. The war in Spain ended with the surrender of Madrid in 1939. Most of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade which survived had escaped. Some of them were captured at the end of the war and shot, while others would languish for years in Franco's prisons. As many as 3,000 Americans had volunteered to fight in the Spanish Civil War, and out of that number one-third were killed. The estimated number of Spaniards killed on both sides numbered over one million. Ironically, just as the Spanish Civil War ended, the Second World War began. The western democracies would fight against the very enemies the Abraham Lincoln Brigade fought against. Sadly, many of the American volunteers in Spain were kept out of the war by the U.S. government against the Germans and the Italians even though they knew better than anyone else the enemy that the Allied forces and the United States would be pitted against. Interestingly enough, some of those American volunteers were used as agents and informants for the American OSS (Office of Strategic Services, the forerunner of the CIA). It was also ironic that those who had a better reason to fight for their country than almost anyone else were kept out of the fighting because of their "tainted" background (after all, the idea of the united front and the American volunteers fighting in Spain in the first place came from the Communist Party U.S.A.). It would also be true that there remained until about 20 or so years ago a link between the Communist Party U.S.A. and the Abraham Lincoln Brigade.

However, the Abraham Lincoln Brigade became more than that. It had become a force of its own, and recognized on its own merit. They had become heroes to many Americans at the time, and their bravery against an overwhelming enemy made them almost legendary. But in their brief moment of glory, a new dark phase in American history was about to attack them.







# Comentario

## La Brigada de Abraham Lincoln

### Parte I

En 1936, un general español exiliado llamado Francisco Franco, inició una revuelta militar desde su lugar de exilio en las Islas Canarias para apoderarse de España. En aquella época España era una república. Había descartado la monarquía en 1931 y el pueblo de España había elegido la república. Sin embargo, el ejército español en alianza con la clase adinerada gobernante y la Iglesia Católica Romana, estaban completamente contra la república y cuando Franco, junto con el ejército español, inició la revuelta, esta fuerza conservadora se unió a ella. Así comenzó la guerra civil española.

El gobierno de la república fue defendido por ciudadanos comunes de las ciudades y por la policía. El gobierno republicano tenía algunas desventajas. Combatían contra el ejército español, una fuerza cruel y bien disciplinada. Para empezar, las fuerzas republicanas no tenían, ni armas, ni oficiales. Y para empeorar las cosas para los republicanos, las fuerzas de Franco, llamadas también de la Falange o los Nacionalistas, recibieron ayuda masiva de la Alemania Nazi en forma de aereoplanos, armas y asesoría y soldados, armas y aviones de la Italia Fascista. Los únicos países que prestaron alguna ayuda considerable al gobierno republicano fueron la Unión Soviética, Francia y México. Gran Bretaña, Canadá y Estados Unidos no hicieron absolutamente nada para detener el avance de las fuerzas fascistas en España. Por el contrario, declararon su neutralidad y prohibieron que nadie ayudara a la república española.

Pero hubo mucha gente en todo el mundo que consideró esto un acto de agresión para que el fascismo controlara el mundo poco a poco. La Unión Soviética creó así una directiva a la que llamó un "frente unido" de todas las fuerzas contra el fascismo. También decidió que esa gente debería tratar de dar toda la ayuda posible a la república española. Esto incluía a voluntarios que iban y ayudaban a la república española a luchar contra las fuerzas nacionalistas.

En Estados Unidos, el Partido Comunista de E.U.A., empezó a organizar brigadas de voluntarios para luchar por la república española. De hecho, muchos fueron rechazados. Estas brigadas de voluntarios fueron a España clandestinamente, la mayoría a través de Francia por la frontera sur con España. Estas brigadas de voluntarios estaban compuestas en su mayoría por hombres jóvenes y algunas mujeres que quería pelear en "la buena lucha" contra el fascismo. Era un grupo de gente fuera de lo común. Venían de toda esfera social. Eran hombres y mujeres que trabajaban como soldados, enfermeras y doctores. Eran negros, blancos y asiáticos (un japonés) y venían de todas las tendencias políticas, desde comunistas militantes a no comunistas y anti-

comunistas. Pero todos tenían una meta, proteger a la novata república española, su democracia y combatir el fascismo. Estas brigadas se convirtieron en uno de los ejércitos más singulares, no solo en la historia de América sino en la historia mundial. Este ejército de voluntarios no eran mercenarios como las luchas mercenarias que se libran por la paga y la ganancia y no era un ejército que sirviera al gobierno. Era un ejército internacional movido por un ideal, con la meta de ayudar a preservar un gobierno elegido por el pueblo.

Este ejército fue organizado en brigadas con diferentes nombres. Una de esas brigadas se llamó la Brigada de Abraham Lincoln. Los ideales de Abraham Lincoln se ajustaban a los ideales de la filosofía de las brigadas estadounidenses de que "un gobierno del pueblo, por el pueblo y para el pueblo no debe perecer en la tierra". Esta especie de idealismo se convirtió en la fuerza motivante por la que las brigadas combatieron en España. Pero eventualmente, el nombre de "La Brigada de Abraham Lincoln" fue aplicado a todos los voluntarios estadounidenses sirviendo en España y el nombre prevaleció.


El ejército solo tenía unos cuantos voluntarios veteranos de la primera guerra mundial y estos ayudaron a entrenar a algunos de los voluntarios que de otra forma eran reclutas sin preparación. No formaban un ejército disciplinado pero eran un ejército lleno de entusiasmo. Cuando se trató de defender Madrid, les costó trabajo hacerlo. También ayudaron a defender otras áreas bajo el control de la república española. Al principio muchos de los estadounidenses voluntarios fueron derrotados por las armas y el número de las fuerzas nacionalistas. Muchos resultaron muertos en ofensivas de las fuerzas republicanas que trataban de reducir a los nacionalistas y dividir las fuerzas enemigas en dos. Fallaron miserablemente y durante casi toda la guerra las fuerzas republicanas permanecieron a la defensiva. Durante este tiempo, los estadounidenses voluntarios ganaron no solo experiencia en el combate sino que se dieron cuenta de su error al tratar de enfrentarse a un número abrumadoramente superior de combatientes. La brigada de Abraham Lincoln comenzó no solo a combatir mejor, sino a lograr más bajas contra los nacionalistas. Francisco Franco, quien detestaba a los voluntarios que combatían al lado de la república española, dio la orden de disparar sobre ellos si eran capturados. Esto en su mayoría fue cumplido con todas las fuerzas nacionalistas y el hecho de que la Brigada de Abraham Lincoln combatiera en forma tan tenaz hizo que los nacionalistas los odiaran. Algunas de las batallas libradas por la Brigada de Abraham Lincoln los hicieron legendarios entre los españoles. En forma lenta pero segura, los nacionalistas ganaron la mano superior. Tuvieron la mano superior siempre. Eran







Aunque otros concejales de Chicago han sido mencionados en conexión con Silver Shovel, el F.B.I. tiene que acusar formalmente a todos ellos.

El nombramiento de Solis como concejal pone fin a querellas políticas que incluyen protestas en la alcaldía y otras manifestaciones.

Su primer acto como nuevo alcalde es apoyar una resolución del concejal Jesse Granto (1) que elogió las contribuciones que los mexicanoamericanos han hecho a Estados Unidos.



superiores en número, superiores en armas, tenían ayuda masiva de Italia y Alemania y la unidad. Las fuerzas republicanas estaban plagadas por desuniones, una continua escasez de armas debido al embargo a la república española impuesta por las democracias de occidente (por más que trataran, la Unión Soviética, Francia y México no siempre podían atravesar el bloqueo de las costas) y insuficiente número de combatientes. Al final, las fuerzas republicanas fueron derrotadas. La guerra en España terminó con la rendición de Madrid en 1939. La mayor parte de los sobrevivientes de la Brigada de Abraham Lincoln había escapado. Algunos de ellos fueron capturados al final de la guerra y fusilados, mientras otros languidecían por años en las prisiones de Franco. Tantos como 3,000 estadounidenses se ofrecieron como voluntarios para luchar en la Guerra Civil Española y de ese número, una tercera parte resultó muerta. El número de españoles muertos en ambos bandos sumó más de un millón.

Irónicamente, justo al terminar la guerra civil española daba comienzo la segunda guerra mundial. Las democracias occidentales luchaban contra los mismos enemigos que combatió la Brigada de Abraham Lincoln. Tristemente, muchos de los voluntarios estadounidenses en España fueron mantenidos al margen de la guerra por el gobierno de E.U. contra los alemanes y los italianos, aún cuando conocían mejor que nadie el enemigo contra el que serían lanzadas las fuerzas aliadas y de Estados Unidos.

Lo que es interesante es que algunos de esos voluntarios estadounidenses fueron utilizados como agentes e informantes de American OSS (Oficina de Servicios Estratégicos, antecesor de la CIA). También parece irónico que aquellos que tenían más razón que nadie para luchar por su país, fueran mantenidos al margen de la lucha por sus antecedentes "corruptos" (en primer lugar y después de todo, la idea de un frente unido y la de enviar voluntarios estadounidenses a pelear a España, vino del Partido Comunista de E.U.A.). También sería cierto que fueron, hasta hace aproximadamente 20 años, un vínculo entre el Partido Comunista de E.U.A. y la Brigada de Abraham Lincoln.

Sin embargo, la Brigada de Abraham Lincoln fue más que eso. Se convirtió en una fuerza propia, reconocida por sus propios méritos. Sus componentes se convirtieron en héroes para muchos estadounidenses de la época y su valor contra un enemigo abrumador los hicieron casi héroes legendarios. Pero en su breve momento de gloria una nueva fase oscura de la historia estadounidense estaba a punto de cernirse sobre ellos.

On March 8, Pilsen Neighbors escorted Board of Education members through the Pilsen community, giving them a tour of possible sights to build several middle schools.

The junior high schools, designed to relieve overcrowding at the high school level, would accept 7th, 8th, and 9th graders. Benito Juarez currently serves five grammar schools.

The Board of Education seems open to hearing option to solve the problems, and has committed to putting a plan together to lay out possible solutions.

Pilsen Neighbors plans to hold a public press conference when a decision has been reached regarding locations for the schools.

### Cristo Rey Scoop

Sources tell me that the budding Cristo Rey High School have chosen a location for their grand opening for the 1996-1997 school year. The school's new home is at the corner of 22nd and Wolcott. They are currently collaborating with architectural firms to renovate and spruce up the building.

The response to the new school concept has been "going very well," according to Father John Foley. "There has been a lot of enthusiasm and inquiries."

They have received over 50 applications for teacher positions, and expect to employ between 8-10 for the first year.

They are still accepting student applications. Father Foley expects the applications to pour in starting in May, once school is out. Students must be entering their sophomore or junior year and must attach transcripts with their application.

The unique concept of their work-study program to assist in paying the tuition has been overwhelmingly accepted in the community. They have found enough jobs for each student to have a position for the first year. The jobs are entry level jobs in the community, and each job will be assigned five students. Each student works one day a week.

# Mexico's reports revised January trade surplus

MEXICO CITY (Reuter) - Mexico's Finance Ministry said Saturday the country's revised trade surplus for January totaled \$704 million, down from the \$779 million originally reported. Exports for the month totaled \$7.405

billion against imports of \$6.701 billion, the ministry said. Exports were up 24.8 percent and imports increased 7.4 percent compared to January 1995. The January surplus compares to the January 1995 deficit of more than \$250 million

and a deficit of almost \$1.5 billion in January 1994. Petroleum product exports for the month were \$805 million, up 27.4 percent over the same month a year earlier. Crude made up \$752 million of the total, the ministry said.

## New Mexican bank rules seen boosting past-due loans

MEXICO CITY, March 11 (Reuter) - As Mexican banks battle their worst crisis in years, the government is drawing up changes to accounting rules that will at the stroke of a pen almost double the amount of loans considered past-due.

Officials of the National Banking and Securities Commission say the rules are aimed at taking Mexican accounting principles closer to U.S. standards. They are tight-lipped about the impact the new measures will have on banks. But analysts say they are bound to force them to raise loan-loss reserves at a particularly tough time. "We know that this is going to have some kind of impact on past-due loans," Guillermo Zamarripa, director general of development and economic studies at the National Banking and Securities Commission (CNBV), told Reuters in an interview. "We're talking of (an increase of) about 70-80 percent."

Zamarripa, who is heading the project, said the CNBV estimated last September that under existing accounting rules 12 privatised banks not taken over by the government would have had past-due loans of

about 75 billion pesos (\$9.9 billion). Those same banks, audited under the tougher U.S. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), would have had bad loans of about 120 billion to 130 billion pesos (\$15.8 billion to \$17.1 billion), he said. He acknowledged that the changes would be tough. Under U.S. GAAP principles, banks have to consider all outstanding payments on a loan past-due when they are not met over a certain period. Currently in Mexico, only those instalments of a loan so far unpaid are considered past-due. "They're not mild changes, nor are they subtleties. They're profound changes in the accounting structure that imply a lot of hard work.

That's why a long period of transition is reasonable," Zamarripa said. The transition period started in January, and the CNBV is currently waiting for banks to respond to the proposals. But the government intends to stick to its plan of having Mexican banks using the new rules by January 1, 1997.

Zamarripa declined to comment on the fallout the new accounting principles would have on bank loan-loss provisions, but analysts say they would

# Mexican president asserts power as governor fired

## MEXICO CITY

(Reuter) - Mexican President Ernesto Zedillo has hit back at critics who accused him of lacking authority by forcing out of office a key state governor over allegations the governor ordered a peasant massacre. Ruben Figueroa, the hardline governor of Guerrero state, stepped down Tuesday in a surprise decision only days after he vowed never to leave and organized public rallies by party activists in his support. His exit was the result of strong political pressure from figures inside the Zedillo government, particularly Interior Minister Emilio Chuayffet, who negotiated with Figueroa for several hours Monday. Zedillo's hand in the affair was not publicly visible but government sources said the president wanted to send a signal to the country that ruling party politicians "must act within the law in all cases."

"The signal (Figueroa) got was the firm conviction of the president to act if necessary to show his determination to apply the law," one source told Reuters. The decision came at an opportune time for Zedillo's government because human rights groups and opposition figures had seen Figueroa's fate as a test case. They allege that he ordered police to gun down 17 left-wing peasant activists in Aguas Blancas, Guerrero, last June because he feared they might turn into a guerrilla army.

They also charge that Figueroa obstructed an investigation into the affair by tampering with evidence. Zedillo has repeatedly proclaimed his determination to submit



Mexico's often unruly politicians to the rule of law but his image has suffered over the past year as old-guard party figures such as Figueroa defied his authority. A string of recent cases, including opposition allegations of electoral fraud in Puebla and Quintana Roo states and of excessive campaign spending by the governor of Tabasco state, led some critics to question Zedillo's promise.

"The President On The Defensive — Problems Are Swamping Him", headlined opposition weekly Proceso in its latest issue. Government critics had assured their readers in recent articles that Figueroa would never step down, noting his personal friendship with Zedillo and the fact that he was godfather to one of the president's children. But the government source said on Wednesday, "the message is that we are convinced the law must be applied."

If that pledge is to be honored, the Zedillo government still has plenty of work to do to shake off Mexico's authoritarian political traditions and modernize its institutions, stiff from

67 years of one-party rule. Newspapers Wednesday said Figueroa had vetoed four possible successors as governor in his negotiations with Chuayffet and insisted on a hand-picked choice from among his closest political allies. The left-wing Democratic Revolution Party (PRD) welcomed the governor's resignation but said it should not excuse him from facing justice in the courts over the massacre. Zedillo must still face the electoral problems in Puebla and Quintana Roo, where old-guard governors insist they will not alter electoral victories the opposition claims were secured through fraud.

The conservative National Action Party (PAN) has vowed not to return to national talks on major political reform — a key plank of the Zedillo government — until the electoral problems in Puebla and Quintana Roo are resolved. Analysts say this will force the president in coming weeks to choose between picking another fight with hardliners in his own party or risking a loss of credibility by agreeing to political reform without the participation of the opposition.

Tired of the same old tuna salad at lunch and the usual chicken breast for dinner? If you crave


something with more pizzazz once in a while, don't just head for the nearest high-fat takeout food. Instead, let some fat-free herbs, seasonings, and condiments come to the rescue.

There's a wide range of deliciously different tastes that can make simple, healthy foods into satisfying everyday meals that have variety. They can make eating nutritious vegetables, grains, and fruits a satisfying experience, so that it's easy to eat a healthy diet that lowers your cancer risk, as recommended by the American Institute for Cancer Research.

Mustard often gets used only for hotdogs, but a turkey breast flavored with a few dabs of spicy brown mustard is sensational. Mustard comes in many varieties, and is delicious mixed with non-fat yogurt, vinegar or lemon juice, minced garlic, a bit of

1. Prepare Yogurt Cheese: If you do not have a yogurt strainer, line a colander or sieve with muslin or a coffee filter. Place the colander in a large bowl or place the sieve over a bowl. Spoon the yogurt into the colander or sieve to drain. Cover and refrigerate 12 hours to make yogurt cheese.

2. Prepare Crust: Preheat oven to 325°F. Spray a 10-inch spring

form pan with non-stick cooking spray. In a bowl, combine cracker crumbs, margarine or butter and syrup. Press crumb mixture onto bottom of prepared pan. Bake 10 minutes; cool on wire rack.

3. Prepare Cheese-cake: In a large bowl, with mixer at medium speed, beat cream cheese until smooth. Slowly beat in sugar. Add yogurt cheese, nonfat yogurt, cornstarch and salt. Beat 1 minute or until smooth. Add egg substitute or eggs, egg whites, lemon juice, lemon zest and vanilla. Beat 1 minute or until smooth and well combined.

4. Pour cream cheese mixture into pan. Bake 1 hour. Turn oven off, let cheesecake remain in oven for 1 hour. Remove and cool cheesecake in pan or wire rack or place in refrigerator until well chilled.

5. Prepare Cherry Fluff Topping: Drain cherries reserving 3/4 cup cherry syrup. Set cherries aside. Place the cherry syrup in a small saucepan. Bring to a boil over high heat. Add cherry gelatin and stir until gelatin completely dissolves. Place mixture in large bowl. Add cherry pie filling and almond extract. Stir to combine. Fold in whipped topping.

6. Arrange cherries around top edge of cheese-cake. With metal spatula evenly spread cherry fluff topping on top of cheese-cake. Cover and refrigerate several hours or overnight or until cherry fluff topping is firm.

7. To serve, gently run a thin knife around the edge of the cheesecake. Remove the side of the pan. Garnish with whipped topping, cherries, mint sprigs and lemon zest, if you like. Makes 18 servings.

honey and herbs for a salad dressing or dipping sauce for vegetables. It can flavor fish, skinless chicken or lean meat.

Vinegars come in all flavors these days, including tarragon, raspberry, mango and garlic. Mix them with some tomato or orange juice for a fat-free salad dressing. A teaspoon of cider vinegar gives a pot of chili just the right flair or nicely sharpens the taste of beef stew. Robust balsamic vinegar gives a tangy taste to salad greens, and an elegant contrast to sweet fresh fruit.


Other fat-free flavorings to keep on hand are salsa, picante sauce, soy sauce, teriyaki sauce, Worcestershire sauce, chili sauce, pepper sauces, cooking sherry, pickle relish, chutney, low-fat broth, bouillon cubes, and stewed tomatoes. If you're in the mood to explore, Latin and Asian food markets often have wonderful spices and condiments that are reasonably priced.

Back to that languishing chicken breast: turn it into Chicken Yucatan for a low-fat mouthwatering entrée.

Chop the vegetables and coat a large skillet with the vegetable oil. Heat on medium-high for 30 seconds, and add the chicken with marinade liquid, stir-frying 3-4 minutes. Add the onions and peppers and stir-fry another 2 minutes, or until the chicken is completely opaque. Add the tomato and ground pepper- cover, lower heat and cook until heated through. Serve over brown rice or rolled up in warmed flour tortillas with salsa and additional hot pepper sauce. Each of the 4 servings contains 238 calories and 7 grams of fat. # Oatmeal is excellent source of both soluble and insoluble fiber

Mom always said that oatmeal was good for you. Thirty years of science has shown there were many grains of truth to her advice. Why? One big reason is that oatmeal is one food that's an excellent source of fiber.

## Packing twice the punch

We've heard a lot about fiber but, did you know, there are actually two kinds of fiber—soluble and insoluble. And they have different health benefits. While other grains such as wheat, corn and rice contain mostly insoluble fiber, only oats has a significant amount of soluble fiber as well. Three decades of research have found that, if your cholesterol is high or borderline high, oatmeal can help. These studies have shown a link between diets that contain the soluble fiber in oatmeal and a reduction in both total cholesterol and low-density lipids (LDL or "bad" cholesterol).

After reviewing the 30 years of science on oatmeal's ability to lower cholesterol, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) recently proposed to allow, for the first time, a health claim for a specific food. It would read: *Eating oat bran or oatmeal daily*

*as part of a low saturated fat and low cholesterol diet may reduce heart disease risk. "Heart disease is the #1 cause of death in the U.S.," said Jeanne Goldberg, Ph.D., R.D. of the School of Nutrition Science and Policy at Tufts University. "That a part of the solution might be as enjoyable and close to home as a bowl of oatmeal is good news."*

The Quaker Oatmeal Health Institute, a panel of distinguished nutrition experts from around the country, was established to focus on further research on the heart benefits of oats and oatmeal. "There are strong indications that oats may assist in blood pressure maintenance, help with weight maintenance and control blood sugar levels for persons with diabetes," said Constance J. Geiger, Ph.D., R.D., C.D. of the University of Utah. "The Institute will focus future research efforts into these areas."


According to health experts, Americans should eat 20-30 grams of fiber each day. Most of us eat on average less than half the fiber we need. To boost your fiber intake, gradually add foods that are good sources of both soluble and insoluble fiber so that your body has time to adjust to the change in diet. Begin with breakfast

# Your Card... Is it valid?

## IS YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY CARD AUTHENTIC? IS YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY RECORD OF EARNINGS CORRECT?

It is important that you use only a correct Social Security number, the number that was assigned to you. During your working years, your wages are reported by the employer to your Social Security "earnings record" and you gain "credits" based on those earnings. Later, the credits and wages are counted to determine your eligibility for retirement, disability and survivor benefits.

### YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY CARD MAY NOT BE AUTHENTIC OR CORRECT IF:

- \*someone charged you a fee to get your Social Security card
- \*you obtained your card by presenting false identification
- \*someone loaned you a card or you did not get it through a government agency.

### YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY EARNINGS RECORD MAY NOT BE COMPLETE OR CORRECT IF:

- \*you worked at one time or another with an incorrect number
- \*you used different names on the job
- \*your employer paid you cash wages (did not report the taxes)
- \*you continue using an incorrect Social Security card even though you have been assigned another valid number.

### WHAT SHOULD YOU DO IF YOU THINK THAT YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY CARD OR YOUR EARNING RECORD IS INCORRECT?

- \*apply for a replacement card at any Social Security office
- \*ask for a "Personal Earnings and Benefit Estimate Statement"

The Social Security office personnel can help you to resolve these problems if you are now a U.S. citizen, you are legally admitted for permanent residence, or

you have been given permission by the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) to work.

# The Tokto Islands Incident

Seoul, South Korea: "What do you think of the Tokto Islands dispute?" one student asked me while I was observing a class. I ducked the question by saying I knew little about the subject. It was a wise choice on my part because I knew the subject is very sensitive here.

Actually, it is only one part of the larger conflict between Korea and Japan. The Tokto (pronounced "Tukdo" in Korean) Islands dispute concerns a group of uninhabited islands between South Korea and Japan. (The Japanese call them the Takesima Islands.) The issue was largely academic until recently, when the Japanese again laid claim to them. This stirred up the hornet's nest of Korean nationalism, as many Koreans demonstrated in the streets and burned the Japanese flag. The South Korean government then promptly laid claim to the islands, and relations between the two countries have gone to an all time low. The Japanese government, unwilling to back down for fear of losing face but wanting to find a resolution to the dispute appealed to the United Nations to mediate the dispute.

However, this has not corked the open bottle of Korean nationalism and anti-Japanese feeling here. Some of my fellow teachers have discovered how even the most quiet and passive Korean students they teach become enraged over the Tokto Islands dispute with Japan. "I had one woman in my class who was so quiet and shy that she barely talked," a friend told me. "She was such a sweet student. But when this thing about Tokto Islands came up, she stood up and screamed and railed against the Japanese. I couldn't believe the extreme reaction."

Indeed, the whole issue of the Tokto Islands dispute featured prominently in the Korean holiday on March 1, which is called Independence Day Movement. This holiday is in commemoration of the Mansai Uprising in 1919 against Japanese colonial rule. (The Japanese ruled Korea from 1910 to 1945.)

I personally attended some of the celebrations. One of the cultural events, held in and near Pagoda Park in Seoul, featured a woman in traditional Korean dress singing patriotic songs against the Japanese, a children's play which told about the struggle against the Japanese. Then the crowds threw bean bags shaped like rocks at styrofoam caricatures of Japanese militarists while shouting "mansai" (hurrah). Little children came up to me, waving Korean flags and saying in English, "Tokto belong Korea." To me, the events

of March 1 was a huge demonstration of Japanese Bashing. I have never seen such anti-Japanese bashing as intense as this, not even among Americans who fought the Japanese en World War II!

To put it mildly, the Korean hatred of Japan runs very deep. One day I went to the Kyongbokkung Palace, a complex of buildings initiated by the first king of the Yi dynasty in 1392. This complex of buildings has many of the most beautiful handcrafted wooden I have ever seen. Much of the complex is a reconstruction created by Korea's last ruling monarch, King Kojong (1864-1907). The original palace, like almost everything else, was burnt to the ground by the Japanese invasion of 1592-1598. But the worst did not end there. When Japan conquered and ruled Korea, they demolished 490 of the 500 buildings of the newly reconstructed palace complex. The Japanese added greater insult when they cut off the path from the main northern gate directly to the main palace building by constructing a huge neoclassical modern building right in the middle. This building became the Japanese governor general's headquarters for Japanese rule in Korea. The ery building itself is constructed in the shape of the Japanese character for "Japan.". The building, which now houses the National Museum, is considered an insult to Korean national honor. Korea has resolved to tear it down soon. For anyone who knows about the historical animosity between Korea and Japan, this building was built as a symbol by Japan as an indication that it had forever conquered Korea. It was the first step toward obliterating Korea's culture and its sense of identity. By razing the building, the Koreans are symbolizing their determination to remain free of domination and preserve their culture, traditions, and identity. And this is where the Tokto Islands dispute comes in. It is too symbolic of the long historic animosity between the two nations. Some even speculate a possible war between South Korea and Japan, but this is unlikely because of the threat from North Korea against South Korea. Still, the situation is highly unpredictable. Since there is no love lost between the Koreans and the Japanese, this is just one more bone of connection between. It is anyone's guess how far this animosity will carry them.

# Appeals Courts May Allow TV

WASHINGTON (AP) — In a reversal of a longstanding rule, a policy-making body decided Tuesday to let each federal court of appeals decide whether to allow television cameras. Permission was not extended to cover federal district courts, which are at the trial level. Appeals courts hear only arguments from lawyers in favor or against lower court decisions. The Judicial Conference of the United States also endorsed transmission of the Oklahoma City bombing trial by closed-circuit television. The trial has been moved to Denver, and the telecast would allow families of the victims to watch from back home. Chief Judge Gilbert S. Merritt of the U.S. Court of Appeals in Nashville said such closed-circuit TV is appropriate in the Oklahoma City case and would not set a precedent. Closed-circuit TV has been used to allow unruly defendants expelled from courtrooms to watch proceedings from holding rooms. The conference made a notable exception to the TV option: the one appellate court not covered is the Supreme Court, whose chief justice, William H. Rehnquist, strongly opposes courtroom cameras or

broadcasting. Rehnquist presides over meetings of the judicial conference, but it has no jurisdiction over Supreme Court policy. In addition to the U.S. chief justice, the conference comprises the chief judge and a district judge from each of the 11 circuits, the District of Columbia circuit, the federal circuit and the Court of International Trade. Merritt said Tuesday's vote loosening restrictions on cameras was 14-12. Many state trial courts permit television and radio broadcasts and still photography. The judicial conference conducted a three-year pilot program beginning in 1991 in some circuit courts in New York and California and in six district courts. At its end, the conference decided that "the intimidating effect of cameras on some witnesses and jurors was cause for serious concern" and refused to expand the experiment. The pilot program ended on Dec. 31, 1994. The conference sets guidelines for federal courts but has no power to punish violators. It strongly urged circuit court councils to do away with any local rules of court that would conflict with the decision to retain the trial court ban. That stemmed from a decision March 1 by U.S. District Judge Robert Ward in Manhattan that permitted Court TV to televise a hearing in a class-action suit challenging New York City's child welfare system. Ward relied on a local court rule permitting judges to authorize cameras, which he decided took precedence over the

judicial conference's 1994 decision. Court TV broadcast the hearing.

## Jane Seymour Has Twins At 45

NEW YORK (AP) — Jane Seymour says she "had to follow my heart" on having children at age 45, despite her doctors' warnings. "They told me I could have died," said the star of "Dr. Quinn, Medicine Woman," adding that doctors were concerned about her age and her history of two miscarriages. "But I knew it would turn out all right. I had to follow my heart on this," Seymour said in an interview in the April issue of McCall's magazine. Seymour recently gave birth to twin boys, John and Kristopher. She now has four children of her own and two stepchildren.

# French TV boss found guilty of racism

PARIS (Reuter) - The chairman of France's private TF1 television station and a star impersonator were convicted of incitement to racial hatred Tuesday over a satirical sketch broadcast last September. A Paris court ruled that TF1 chairman Patrick Lelay and entertainer Patrick Sébastien were guilty of "an explicit appeal to hatred" of non-whites in a sketch in which Sébastien impersonated right-wing National Front leader Jean-Marie Le Pen singing a song entitled "Beating up Blacks." They were fined \$6,000 each and ordered to pay a symbolic 20 cents in damages to two pressure groups which initiated the rare prosecution — the Movement against Racism and for Friendship among Peoples (MRAP) and the League against Racism and Anti-Semitism (LICRA). The court rejected the defense argument that the sketch had been clearly a satire poking fun at racism. "The caricature was not sufficient, the border-line between the literal and the satirical was not clearly drawn and the mixed audience at that viewing hour, including many youngsters, did not understand it was being asked to laugh at racists and reject that kind of behavior," the court said in its ruling. Le Pen, whose main issue is halting immigration and repatriating millions of immigrants to their home countries, was shown on the program laughing along with the song. Sébastien abandoned his prime-time Saturday night show "Osos" (Let's Dare) after three programs.

## Willis Eyed For 'Combat' Role



\$250,000 — with the company paying the rest. The 1993 deal was made even after Roseanne grabbed her crotch and spit after singing a raucous rendition of the national anthem at a San Diego Padres game in 1990. Even so, CelebSales countersued for more than \$24 million, claiming the two reneged on an agreement to market the clothing on cable television and generated publicity so vile nobody wanted to buy the product. Warner testified that retailers wouldn't buy the line after media reports that included her supposed three-way marriage to Arnold and former assistant Kim Silva. On Thursday, Hupp threw out fraud claims for both sides, including allegations that the clothing line was substandard and CelebSales' claim about the bad publicity. CelebSales attorney Jed Schlacter said Friday that the ruling all but lost his case and "forced the jury to do something they didn't want to do." The jury deliberated only hours. Foreman Vincent Schmidt said the celebrity of the plaintiffs had nothing to do with the verdict. "But it made it (the case) a little more interesting," he said. Roseanne was not in court and in a statement made no specific comment on the verdict — instead including a plug for her hit sitcom "Roseanne." Roseanne's attorney said the comedienne has not given up on having her own fashion line. "I'm sure that it's something she's still interested in doing," said Theresa Kristovich.





## GM Strike Idles 4 More Plants

DAYTON, Ohio (AP) — The week-old strike at two General Motors Corp. brake plants forced the automaker to close four more of its plants Monday, for a total of 15 idled by a shortage of parts. No new negotiations were scheduled. Monday's closings mean the walkout at two Dayton plants has idled more than 49,000 GM workers at 13 of the automaker's 29 North American assembly plants and two other parts plants, the company said. "The longer this strike continues ... the more plants that could be closed," GM spokesman Tom Klipstine said Sunday. "We're going to be watching day-by-day and even hour-by-hour in some cases." Workers at one of the idle assembly plants threatened their own, separate walkout once the brake plant strike is settled. About 3,000 United Auto Workers at two Delphi Chassis Systems brake plants in Dayton struck the nation's largest automaker March 5 over safety and job security issues. The plants supply brake systems and parts to nearly all of GM's assembly plants. No talks were scheduled Monday. Informal talks were held over the weekend, but no progress was reported.

UAW Local 696 officials said they were ready to return to formal talks. Shut down Monday were the Saturn plant in Spring Hill, Tenn.; truck plants at Pontiac, Mich., and Fort Wayne, Ind.; and a car plant at Ste. Therese, Quebec. The strike had earlier shut down GM assembly plants at Moraine; Lordstown; Shreveport, La.; Detroit; Lansing and Orion Township, Mich.; Oshawa, Ontario; Wentzville, Mo.; and Wilmington, Del. Also idled by the Dayton strike was an engine plant in Lansing and a seat plant in Auburn Hills, Mich. After the Dayton walkout is settled, workers at the Lordstown assembly plant are prepared to stage their own strike, also over safety and job security, Al Alli, shop chairman of UAW Local 1112.

Like other automakers, GM minimizes inventories to cut costs, a practice that makes it vulnerable to disruptions in supplies.

## GM Co. Must Repay \$4.3 Million

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — General Motors Corp.'s finance arm charged 116,000 California car buyers too much for insurance and must repay them a total of more than \$4.3 million, a judge said. Sacramento County Superior Court Judge James L. Long found General Motors Acceptance Co. violated fair-business laws in the way it bought car insurance for customers



Continued from page 47 whose own policies had lapsed. In a 59-page opinion released Monday, Long said GMAC unfairly bought coverage for longer than most customers needed, then refunded less than it had promised when they obtained new insurance.

"The practice of purchasing a multi-year insurance policy and adding the entire insurance premium amount to the outstanding automobile loan is harmful and is substantially injurious to consumers because of the unnecessary increase in finance charges," Long said. He ordered GMAC to correct its records and credit its customer accounts for the overcharges. GMAC attorneys said they will

ask the judge to reconsider his ruling before it becomes final March 17. Failing that, they plan to appeal. "One of the disappointing parts of this decision is it's going to take a good deal of time and money ... to correct customer accounts for people who have not repaid GMAC for months of insurance and aren't going to repay in the future," said John B. Sullivan, a San Francisco attorney representing GMAC. Sullivan said the people represented by the class-action lawsuit account for less than 5 percent of GMAC contracts in California, yet owe the company more than \$100 million. San Francisco attorneys Ronald Lovitt and J. Thomas Hannan filed the suit on behalf of 116,000 customers whose cars loans were financed by

GMAC from February 1989 through August 1994. When the car buyers failed to maintain insurance as required by their sales contract, GMAC bought "collateral protection insurance" from its wholly owned subsidiary, Motors Insurance Corp. The premiums were added to the customers' car loans.

Lovitt said premiums added up to \$6,000 to their bills. When car buyers replaced the coverage with their own policies, their refunds were calculated by a formula that gave them less money than the pro rata basis GMAC had promised, Lovitt said. He and his partner had originally sought \$45 million. A jury last July awarded \$1.8 million in damages. Long's decision increased that award, and added \$419,000 in interest.
