Actors from the London Stage on Campus!

CSUCI to host International Theater Troupe

Camarillo, Calif, October 22, 2003 — The Actors From The London Stage theatre troupe will be in residence at California State University Channel Islands from Monday, November 3, through Saturday, November 8. The troupe of five Shakespearean artists - who hail from professional theatre companies such as the Royal Shakespeare Company, the Royal National Theatre of Great Britain, and Shakespeare's Globe Theatre - are part of an educational program based in London, England and the University of Notre Dame. While on campus, they will conduct workshops in a number of classes, meet with students and faculty, and perform a full-length Shakespeare play.

Actors From The London Stage is part of an educational program developed by Homer Swander at the University of California, Santa Barbara. Each fall and spring semester, for almost thirty years, a different small group of acclaimed artists has brought Shakespeare to life in classrooms across the nation. Their one-week residencies typically entail classroom visits, "one-hander" performances by a single actor, and the staging of a full-length play.

During their visit to Cal State Channel Islands, the actors will visit twenty undergraduate classes, applying elements of Shakespeare's work and theories of acting not only to English literature courses, but to classes in art, communications, education, business, and Spanish as well. In between classroom visits, two of the actors will perform "one-hander" solo performances entitled "Lady Macbeth

Speaks" and "Charles Dickens In America," and the troupe will hold workshops for high school students and community theatre groups.

The theatre troupe will also stage three performances of Shakespeare's "Measure for Measure." All roles in the full-length play will be performed by the five actors who use subtle gestures, body movements, and voice modulations, rather than elaborate costumes or sets, to convey the action and shifts of character. All three performances are open to the public, on the following days and times: Wednesday, November 5, 5:00 p.m., at California State University Channel Islands, Conference Hall 3 (One University Drive, Camarillo); Friday, November 7, 7:00 p.m., at San Buenaventura Mission Theatre (211 E. Main Street, Ventura); and Saturday, November 8, 7:00 p.m., at Pacifica High School Theatre (600 E. Gonzales Road, Oxnard).

"We are extremely fortunate to attract this type of international talent to our campus," comments Jacquelyn Kilpatrick, Professor of English. "Members of our campus community, and the local community, will not only see some world-class entertainment, but also get to discuss acting and the theatre with seasoned professionals."

The Outreach Program introduces elementary and middle school students to the many opportunities available at a college or university campus, as well as allowing them to become familiar with the requirements for admission to a University.

Student preparation programs such as University Outreach Program provide the information necessary for students to learn about higher educational opportunities and assist them in qualifying for and gaining access to the program that meets their educational, vocational, and social goals.

Outreach programs are designed collaboratively to include school visits by CSU Channel Islands Staff, as well as visits by elementary and middle school students to the Channel Islands campus.

CA Mini-Corps

I am actively recruiting CSUCI/CSUN undergraduates who are planning to become classroom teachers to participate in the CA Mini-Corps program. CA Mini-Corps is a program designed to assist future educators by providing them with paid field experience as teacher assistants and professional development prior to them entering the credential program. Mini-Corps serves the migrant student population in local public schools, and therefore needs teacher assistants who have experiential knowledge of the migrant lifestyle and who are bilingual.

CA Mini-Corps has been federally funded and state operated since 1967. It is founded on the same ideas as the Peace Corps program, but focuses on the migrant population at the local and state level. The goals of the Mini-Corps program are to provide direct services to migrant children, to impact the number of teachers who are culturally sensitive to the language needs of children, and to increase the number of bilingual professionals who are sensitive to the needs of migrant children. Mini-Corps participants are advocates for migrant children.

How Can Writing Center Consultants Help *Me* With My Papers?

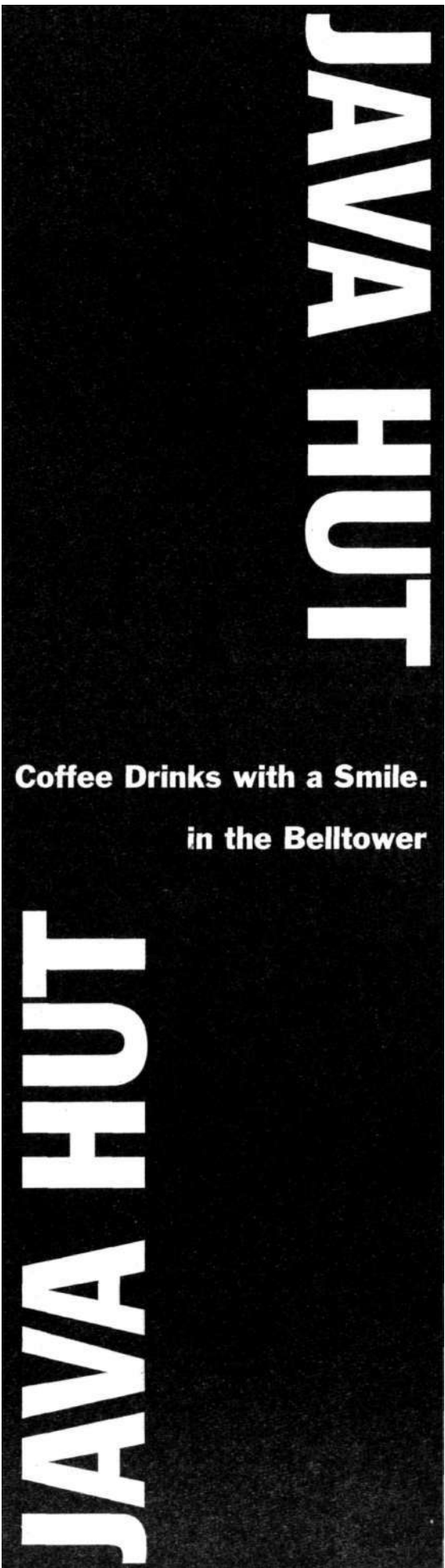
Writing Consultants Can:

- Help you organize your ideas into clear paragraphs
- Help you with the flow of your paper
- Help you develop your thesis and critical thinking skills
- Point out strengths in a draft
- Point out weaknesses—spots that are unclear, repetitive, or irrelevant
- Help you to clarify your audience, argument, and purpose
- Comment on the effectiveness of a paper's structure
- Help you to develop a clear, academic style in *your* individual voice
- Identify patterns of error in sentence structure or grammar
- Make you more aware of what professors look for in student papers
- Advise on research methods and library resources
- Refer you to sources for improving your writing

Writing Consultants Cannot:

- Do your thinking for you
- Rewrite the draft or tell you what to write
- Guarantee an A
- Address every strength and weakness in the draft
- Point out every error in sentence structure, grammar or mechanics
