# 1979 FOOTBALL PROSPECTUS

If, like General Electric, progress is Cal State Fullerton's most important product, then last season the word significant can also be used to describe Jim Colletto's fourth season as the Titans' head football coach.

Last season, a 5-7 year for the Titans, was significant in

several respects:

· The five wins was the highest total since 1974, when Cal

State Fullerton was still a Division II team;

 Two of the wins came against Pacific Coast Athletic Assn. teams, neither of which was a squeaker - a 34-9 pasting of Long Beach State, and a 37-8 blitz of Fresno State; • CSF finished 2-3 in the PCAA, placing fourth in the

conference. Both the number of wins and the finish are

Titan highs;
Individually, CSF fullback Obie Graves rushed for 1,789
Individually, CSF fullback total in NCAA history; and,

yards, the fourth highest total in NCAA history; and,

Graves was the first CSF player honored on a Division I All-America team, being named to AP's third team. He also played in the Shrine East-West game, another first for a CSF player. All of which added up to a partially, if not totally, successful

season in 1978.

Colletto expects the Titans to continue their upward trend

"Possibly the single most significant thing to come out of last season is the feeling the returnees have that they can win at this level," says Colletto, who is entering his fifth season at CSF. The Titans return 36 lettermen for the '79 season, but

offensively the losses would seem tough to replace — Graves, tailback Mike Martin who gained 948 yards rushing, and quarterback Dale Bunn who passed for 1,112 yards and rushed

for another 522.

"We did lose two exceptional running backs and a great Veer quarterback," Colletto says. "We obviously will feel those losses most. However, despite the fact that the group of backs we recruited have no game experience, they are the fastest group we've ever had, and after becoming accustom to the Veer and gaining the necessary game experience, we should field an excellent backfield."

Tailback John Rayford (5-10, 180) gained 1,189 yards last season at Fresno City College, and will be joined by two other junior college transfers; Mike Griffin (5-10, 170) a JC All-American at Taft, and Ken Jackson (5-11, 205) a teammate of Griffin's at Taft. All three have been clocked at 4.6 or better

in the 40-yard dash.

Colletto's quarterback will be young. The heir apparent to Bunn is sophomore letterman Eric Bullock (5-11, 180). Bullock passed for 189 yards and rushed for 108 last season as a freshman, but when the Titans' defensive backfield was whittled down by injury he became the starting free safety. The other candidate is freshman redshirt Kim Green (6-0, 185), thought to be the better passer of the two.

"Both Eric and Kim have the skills to run the Veer," Colletto says. "They're greatly skilled athletes who've not played very much. Here again, after they gain some experience, I don't expect any drop-off at the quarterback position. They're both

exciting players.'

Besides his football skills, Bullock is a former draft choice of

the LA Dodgers.

The offensive line returns three starters; weak tackle Jim Smith (6-3, 245, senior), All-PCAA weak guard Mike McClinton (6-1, 255, senior) and center Harris Burnett (6-3, 240, sophomore). Senior letterman Greg Bell (6-3, 240) has the

inside track on the strong guard spot, and redshirt Pete Spiers (6–3, 220, senior) seems to have the tightened post locked up. Only the strong tackle position in Colletto's unbalanced line is wide open, but three players were recruited to try and fill the void — junior college transfer Jim Pappa (6–5l, 260, West Valley College), and freshmen Richard Robinson (6–2, 245) and Allan Kruegar (6–4, 245).

"McClinton and Smith are two of the best linemen on the coast," Colletto states. "And Harris Burnett is as fine a center as there is in the PCAA. I feel we'll be as good, or better on the offensive line as last year." Titan running backs gained a PCAA

record 3,632 yards behind the '78 offensive line.

Colletto sees the wide receiver posts as "a wide open situation, with no experience. We do have some speed there, but we'll just have to wait and see who emerges." The two receivers recruited by CSF are junior college transfers Rick Escalera (5–11, 185, Santa Barbara City College) and Jamie Dickson (5–11, 180, Golden West College).

While the Titans were able to eat up chunks of real estate offensively last season (5,053 yards), the defense was prone to giving up even larger chunks of ground (5,266 yards), hence the

5-7 record.

Thus Colletto's recruiting was geared mainly to the defensive team. Fifteen of the 27 recruits are slated for action on defense.

"Potentially, our defensive line could control an offensive line, our linebackers are excellent, and the defensive backfield

will have great speed and size," Colletto says.

Eight candidates will vie for the three down line positions. Lettermen Stanley Randle (6-4, 260, junior), Ray Carlos (6-6, 250, sophomore who runs a 4.9 40) and Carl Davis (6-2, 240, senior) have game experience, but not as starters. Recruits include junior college transfers Richard Aguilar (5-11, 220, Hancock College), Mike Rivera (6-1, 230, Hancock College), both middle guard candidates, and tackle Joe Cameron (6-5, 235, Golden West College). The freshmen recruits are Mike Kennedy (6-4, 225) and Mike Walsh (6-4, 220).

At linebacker, Colletto feels he has "the best quality and depth ever. Our linebackers might be the strongest position on the team in terms of quality. The top six are all good, sound football players. And, John Bungartz is one of the best in the

PCAA.

Bungartz (6-3, 210, senior) was an All-PCAA selection last year. Lettermen Ricardo Gallegos (6-2, 220, junior) and Clarence Irving (6-1, 230, senior) both started at one time or another last fall. Kimo Igarta (6-1, 220, junior) redshirted last year, but Colletto feels may push for a starting berth. And, for depth's sake, two junior college linebackers were recruited — Brian Bilotti (6-0, 220, Chabot College) and Mark Bowser (6-2, 220, Hancock College).

The defensive end position in Colletto's 50 defense is "wide open." Colletto indicates he may have to move a linebacker over to an end spot. Roger Moore (6–0, 220, senior) did start several games, as did Marvin Smith (6–2, 200, senior) and Greg Galli (6–1, 210, senior). Three recruits will also get a look — Junior college transfers Steve Bird (6–2, 210, Solano College) and Ray Jackson (6–0, 205, Riverside City College),

and freshman Frank Jones (6-3, 215).

Last season the Titans' defensive backfield gave up 2,255 yards passing, thus five DBs were recruited out of the junior college ranks. Holdover cornerbacks Lucious Smith (5–10, 180, senior) was an All-PCAA pick last fall, and Emzie Massey (5–11, 190, junior) is a two-year starter, and gives Coletto "two of the better cornerbacks in the PCAA."

The Titans' top JC recruit was defensive back Mike Harris (6-3, 205), a junior college All-America last fall at Porterville

College. He is expected to take over the strong safety position. Other recruits include Bobby Kemp (6–1, 175, Taft College), Ken Campbell (6–1, 190, San Mateo College), Marcus Boykin (6–0, 190, Hartnell College) and Doug Boswell (6–1, 190, Orange Coast College).

"We have more depth and skill in the defensive backfield than we've had in four years," Colletto says. "I think the secondary

will be one of our strong points."

Placekicker Mark Pollard (5–11, 180, senior) connected on 10 of 14 field goal attempts, and 28 of 30 PAT. Vince Abbott (5–10, 180, sophomore), a '78 redshirt from Washington, will provide depth. Punting chores will go to Richard Aguilar, who averaged 40.5 yards per kick (on 61 punts) last season at Hancock College. Says Colletto, "I have to feel our kicking game will be excellent."

Colletto sees his team's strengths as "good overall team speed and size," and weaknesses as "lack of game experience." "How quickly the junior college players come into their own will be crucial to our season," Colletto summarizes.

Individually, Obie Graves, a 5-9 fullback from Monrovia left a record at CSF that will be hard to duplicate. Graves rushed for 1,789 yards, the fourth highest total in NCAA history, was selected to the Associated Press All-America team and selected to play in the Shrine East-West All-Star game in San Francisco, both firsts for a CSF player. Additionally, his jersey number, 25, was retired, another first for a Titan football player.

The yardage total, of course, is the single most significant of Groves' achievements, and thus, his game-by-game

performances are listed below.

# JIM COLLETTO

#### **Titan Head Football Coach**

When Jim Colletto accepted the head coaching job at Cal State Fullerton on Jan. 22, 1975, he became the voungest major college head coach in the country. However, the Monterey, Calif. native already had 10 years of coaching experience under his belt. James Michael Colletto, now entering his fifth season at CSF, came to the Titans following a three-year stint as offensive line coach at University of the Pacific,



and previous assignments at UCLA, Brown and Xavier. He is the third head coach in the Titans' eight-year history of intercollegiate football. His predecessors were Dick Coury (1970–

71) and Pete Yoder (1972-74).

Colletto was born Oct. 2, 1944 in San Francisco, and following an all-sports prep career at Monterey High School attended UCLA where he played three years of varsity football as a defensive end, and four seasons of varsity baseball for the Bruins. He won All-Coast and All-AAWU (Athletic Association of Western Universities) honors in 1965, and was co-captain of the UCLA squad that defeated Michigan State, 14–12, in the '66 Rose Bown to finish the season with an 8–2–1 record. Colletto was an All-Conference baseball selection in 1964 and '65. He earned his Bachelors' and Masters' degrees from UCLA.

His coaching career began in 1966 as a graduate assistant at UCLA under head coach Tommy Protho. In 1967 he was elevated to freshman football coach, and in 1968 he became

one of Prothro's varsity assistants.

offensive line coach.

Colletto moved on to Brown University (Providence, R.I.) in 1969 as offensive line coach. In 1970 he became offensive coordinator at Xavier University (Cincinnati, Ohio), a position he held for two seasons. He accepted the offensive line post at Pacific in 1972. During the three years he coached the Tigers, UOP recorded a 21–10–1 mark against teams from the Pac-8, Big-8, Southeast and Western Athletic conferences, as well as the Pacific Coast Athletic Assn.

Ten of his offensive linemen at Pacific were named to the All-PCAA team, and one, guard Willie Viney, was honored as an All-America in 1972 and '73. Colletto was credited as the man most responsible for the vast improvement in UOP's offensive line, and therefore the team's overall offensive performance. Pacific was ranked in the top 15 nationally in rushing offensive in 1972, '73 and '74: Colletto's three seasons as

The Cal State Fullerton Assignment is Colletto's first as a

head coach. His four previous Titan squads compiled records of 2-9 (1975), 3-7-1 (1976), 4-7 (1977), and 5-7 (1978). Colletto married the former Suzanne Renee Gratiot, Aug. 20, 1966. They have two children, Dawn 9, and Dan 7. They reside in Diamond Bar.

Included in the running back group of returning people for UNLV are senior fullback Leon Walker and sophomore running back Michael Morton. The Rebels also got a lot of quarterback prospects, but last year's starter, Doug Robertson does return. He threw for 1,104 yards and seven tds last year and ran for four more. In the offensive line, the Rebels also return starters Dennis Opsal (6-2, 216, SR), Jack Concannon (6-2, 226, SR) and Tim Hart (6-2, 228, SR).

On defense, the returning starters are tackle Craig Silverman (6-3, 244, SR), end Ron Crews (6-3, 232, SR), linebacker George Sherwood (6-0, 214, JR) and free safety Pat Cason (5-11#, 174, SR). Senior kicker Jim Gaetano has

scored 116 points in two years.

#### **BRONCO OUTLOOK**

#### **TIGER OUTLOOK**

First-year University of the Pacific head football coach Robert Toledo has many questions about his team, and

now it's answer time.

One of the new items Toledo wants to teach is a Multiple Pro-Set offense that features a controlled passing attack. The Tigers ran out of the I-formation the last two seasons, but second-year assistant Art Asselta (the only holdover from Chester Caddas' staff), installed a myriad of formations and motions last season that helped generate one of the more potent passing games in UOP history.

A strong offensive line, plus a stable of top-notch receivers should help continue Pacific's passing prowess and could give it one of the more feared offenses in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association if a replacement can be found for record-setting quarterback Bruce Parker, who

graduates this spring.

The defense, which for the second straight season yielded the least points in PCAA competition, will have about the same look — but a different name (Multiple 5–2 as compared to the 5–2 the Tigers have used). There are big gaps to be filled in the defensive line and secondary, but the linebacking corps is one of the strongest positions on the team.

As any coach will say, defense wins games, but it is here that Toledo hopes to come up with some answers in the spring.

#### INDIAN OUTLOOK

Northeast Louisiana University made one of college football's largest turnarounds in 1978 and, with 16 starters returning the Indians should keep winning in 1979

returning, the Indians should keep winning in 1979.

Coach John David Crow's Tribe went from 2–9 to 6–4–1 last fall, the fifth best improvement among Division 1-A teams, earning Crow Louisiana "Coach of the Year" honors, breaking all attendance records and generating the most enthusiasm among the Indian faithful in history.

If Crow and his aides can adequately replace star quarterback Kirby Arceneaux, all-time receiving leader John Floyd and all-South Independent defensive back Roy Binion, along with three other starters, Northeast should match or better last year's record.

The chief candidate to replace Arceneaux is senior Bud Cespiva, who completed 25 of 44 throws for 372 yards and

two touchdowns last year.

Whoever the quarterback is, one of his most pleasant tasks will be to hand the ball to Nathan Johnson, a junior jet who had 731 yards rushing and averaged 54 yards per scoring play.

Wide receivers Tony Morrison (14 catches), Larry Hamilton (12 catches) and Jimmy Russer (10 catches) and tight end Charles Kingrey (13 catches) are the top pass catchers returning and the offensive line returns intact.

The defensive unit recorded a school record four shutouts, ranked No. 15 nationally in scoring defense and stopped opponents inside the five-yard line nine times.

#### MATADOR OUTLOOK

When Tom Keele served as offensive coordinator at Cal State Long Beach in 1977 and 1978, he was known as an "offensive genius." The 45-year-old Keele replaces Jack Elway, who became the new head football coach at San Jose State in December. Elway recorded the best three-year mark in CSUN grid history, winning 20 games, losing only 11, and tying one.

The last two Long Beach football teams have had tremendous offsenses, and Keele is faced with the task of rebuilding CSUN's offense, along with solidifying the

defense.

The person Keele hopes will be the catalyst for that offense is quarterback Rick Minyard, a 6-1, 195-pound transfer from Los Angeles Pierce Junior College.

Returning guard Buck Martin (6-1, 245) and center Kelvin Yamada (6-0, 238) are leading candidates to fill out the offensive line, expected to be a Matador strength.

With no running backs returning, Keele sought immediate help via the junior colleges, bringing in 5 JC recruits.

#### AGGIE OUTLOOK

As last year's undefeated early season (5-0) and eventual PCAA co-championship would suggest, Utah State football is back.

Fourth year Head Coach Bruce Snyder made it that way, with his club's 7-4 record a year ago and 4-1 record in the

PCAA to tie San Jose State.

"Utah State football for 1979 is in good shape," said the PCAA's Coach of the Year. #### **BULLDOG OUTLOOK**

As he enters his second season as head football coach at Fresno State University, Bob Padilla looks to incorporate changes that agree more with his coaching philosophy after having spent his initial season at FSU acquainting himself with a new coaching staff, a new program and different ideas.

Not only will there be changes on the field, there also will be changes that affect the entire structure of the football program at Fresno State. As an example, "We will move more towards a blend of freshman and JC recruiting," said Padilla.

There also will be changes on the field. "Offensively, we are changing from the veer to a pro set," said Padilla. "We are going to run the football by handing it to the running backs rather than forcing the quarterback to make the decision of whether to keep the ball or pitch it as the play develops. The pro set also will allow us to become more effective throwing the football because it will give the quarterback more time to read the defense.

Defensively, the changes will not be as drastic, but there will be some. "There will be three down linemen instead of four, with four linebackers and four backs instead of three." "It is not an attacking type of defense that swarms," said Padilla. "Rather, it is an absorbing defense that does not give up too many long plays."

#### **49ERS OUTLOOK**

For the first time in Dave Currey's three years as the Head Coach at California State University, Long Beach, he will have a clear cut starting quarterback to engineer his

sophisticated pro-style offense in 1979.

Senior Paul McGaffigan, who was an Honorable Mention All-American selection by the Associated Press in 1978, will be back to guide a 49er passing attack that was ninth nationally a year ago. McGaffigan is the number six returning signal caller and total offense leader in the major college ranks. McGaffigan (6-2, 185) went into the '77 and '78 seasons in a battle for the starting job, but after an outstanding campaign last year, is clearly the leader this time around.

"Having a clear-cut starting quarterback going into the spring is certainly a bright spot for us," says Currey, who is

beginning his third season at CSULB.

"Paul is a coach's quarterback, probably the most coachable I've ever been around, and he has charisma and the ability to move the team. He reminds me a lot of Roger Staubach in his ability to win for you any way he can." Currey, while an assistant at Stanford for seven seasons, has worked with quarterbacks like Jim Plunkett, Guy Benjamin and Mike Boryla.

McGaffigan completed 169 of 300 attempts last year for 2,163 yards and nine scores, ninth best nationally, and completed over 56% of his attempts for an average of 196 yards per game. If that isn't enough, he set three school records and should own almost all of the passing marks

before leaving Long Beach.

## THE PCAA-MOVING AHEAD

It's amazing how time

The Pacific Coast Athletic Association, about to celebrate its tenth birthday, has grown up. What was once a fledgling alliance of schools looking to upgrade their athletic programs is now one of the nation's most progressive conferences.

The PCAA's decication to the future was emphasized eight months ago when Lew Cryer was



hired to succeed the retiring Jess Hill as Commissioner. In six plus years, Hill brought stability and national recognition to the conference. Cryer, in his brief tenure, has already started to build on that

foundation. Innovation has almost become synonymous with the PCAA, which was the first conference in the west to adopt the tournament concept to determine the league's representative to the NCAA basketball championships. The introduction of associate memberships which offer conference affiliation to non-members was also a PCAA innovation. Involving sports other than football and basketball, associate memberships can be beneficial to all involved. Not only do they provide more competition for scheduling and championship purposes, they give other schools the opportunity to upgrade certain sports while not requiring the financial commitment of upgrading an entire program.

In this day of ever rising costs, schools must be especially careful of how they spend their athletic budgets—trying, as we all do, to get the most for their money. It was for this reason that the PCAA and the West Coast Athletic Conference (WCAC) joined forces to form the Northern and Southern California Baseball Associations. With competition scheduled on a regional basis rather than a statewide

one, travel costs have been reduced drastically.

The PCAA originally consisted of seven members—Cal State Los Angeles, Cal State Long Beach, Fresno State, San Diego State, San Jose State, UC Santa Barbara and University of the Pacific. Feeling limited by their memberships in the California Collegiate Athletic Association (Los Angeles, Long Beach, Fresno and San Diego) and the WCAC (San Jose, Santa Barbara and Pacific), the PCAA charter members decided to band together for the step up to university level competition.

Representatives from the schools assembled as a body in May of 1969 to finalize the founding of the conference. July

first of the same year, the PCAA was official.

As do most newly founded associations, the PCAA had its growing pains. Back in 1974, Cal State LA and UC Santa Barbara left the conference because they were unable to field Division I football teams (Santa Barbara dropped the sport while Cal State LA de-emphasized it). To replace the departed members, Cal State Fullerton was admitted that summer.

The conference has since moved away from the absolute requirement of football to encouraging it, but putting more emphasis on well-rounded athletic programs. Santa Barbara has been readmitted and UC Irvine was subsequently granted membership—and neither school has a football team.

## THE UNIVERSITY

# A REMARKABLE **GROWTH RATE**

California State University, Fullerton is a young institution having opened only 19 years ago. However, it already has grown to 22,500 students and achieved national distinction in many fields.

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes; many come to classes only

in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 800-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its over-all program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, journalism, music, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 77 degree programs—36 of them at the graduate level. Reinforcing classroom instruction is one of the largest internship

and cooperative education programs on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the continuing education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Continuing education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Yet another strong poing is the university's cultural events program, including a series which brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public

performances.

A new development is formation of a professional caliber chamber orchestra to provide the university community and area

residents with high-quality music.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the 5,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

A further example of community outreach is the university-operated Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary in the Santa Ana Mountains.

Meanwhile, construction is under way on campus on a 25-acre arboretum. This preserve represents a joint venture of the City of

Fullerton and the university.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community service, President L. Donald Shields has recently embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Partners in Excellence." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to achieve the president's chief goal for the university. That goal is to make Cal State Fullerton the foremost bachelor's/master's degree granting institution in the nation within five years.

# DR. L. DONALD SHIELDS

## **PRESIDENT**

Dr. L. Donald Shields became president of California State University, Fullerton in 1971. At the time he was 34, making him the youngest chief executive of a major state university in the nation.

Since 1974, Dr. Shields has served as a member of the National Science Board, having been appointed by President Ford and confirmed by the U.S. Senate. He also is the only person from the western United States currently serving on



the National Commission for Cooperative Education.

Dr. Shields received his undergraduate education at University of California, Riverside, then went on to earn his Ph.D. in chemistry

from UCLA

Dr. Shields joined the Cal State Fullerton faculty in 1963 as an assistant professor of chemistry. He became an associate professor in 1966 and a full professor in 1967. He was elected chair of the Faculty Council in 1967 and later that year became the campus' first vice president for administration. From October 1970 to May 1971, he was acting president of the University.

Dr. Shields has authored three books and numerous articles in professional journals. He had addressed or participated in professional meetings throughout the United States, and in 1976 represented the National Science Board in Vienna, Austria, at the first biennial international symposium at the International Institute

for Applied Systems Analysis.

Among Dr. Shields' community activities are having chaired the Disneyland Community Service Awards Committee, being a trustee of the World Affairs Council of Orange County, and being a director of Orange County Sports Celebrities

At present, Dr. Shields' foremost goal is to make Cal State
Fullerton the most outstanding bachelor's/master's degree granting

institution in the nation within the next five years.

# TITAN ATHLETIC FOUNDATION

The Titan Athletic Foundation is a non-profit organization with the express purpose of aiding the athletic program at Cal State Fullerton. It is a group of individuals, not necessarily alumni, who have a genuine interest in athletics and the University.

It is community involvement for some, business involvement for others, or simply an interest in a fine sports program that has attained national recognition and respect the past few years.

The Foundation supports the athletic program by providing funds for scholarships and grants in aid which insure an effective

recruiting program that attracts the best student-athletes available. The Titan Athletic Foundation was founded in January 1973, and is the University's official athletic booster organization. In the TAF's first year approximately \$30,000 was raised and 150 members enlisted. Just six years later the TAF raised almost a quarter-of-amillion dollars and has a membership of about a thousand.

Fullerton businessman Pierre Nicolas was the TAF's first president, and was succeeded by Don Karcher, executive vice-president of Karcher Enterprises. Buck Johns, general manager of Trane Home Comfort Center, became the TAF's third president in the summer of 1978. Ralph Barkey, former head basketball coach at UC Santa Barbara, is the Foundation's executive director.

# **NEALE R. STONER** DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Neale Stoner, a former athlete (basketball and tennis) at Cal State Fuller-ton in 1961 and '62, returned to his alma mater in August 1972 to take over the reins as director of athletics.

In those seven years he has seen four of his teams win national championshipsbaseball, men's gymnastics (twice) and women's gymnastics-and the general resergence of the Titan athletic program overall.



Stoner, 43, served as head basketball coach and assistant athletic director for three years (1969-72) at Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo, and previously held the same positions at the University of California-San Diego (1966-69).

At Cal Poly Stoner's teams compiled an overall record of 48-32 and did not suffer a losing season in his three years as head coach. The Mustangs reached the NCAA Western Regionals following the 1970–71 season. The following year the basketball team attracted an average of over 2,000 fams a game as the Mustangs tied for the CCAA basketball championship with UC Riverside and Northridge State.

As Cal Poly's assistant athletic director Stoner was responsible for the on-campus scholarship program, scheduling, budget preparation, the athletic job program and fund raising through the

Mustang Booster Club.

Stoner was named UC San Diego's first basketball coach in 1966, and in three seasons compiled an overall record of 40-32 and

led the Tritons to the NAIA District III playoffs each year. He also coached UCSD's tennis squad in 1966, '67 and '68.

Since coming to CSF in 1972 Stoner has attracted some of the outstanding coachine talent in the country, including three coaches who've made their sports national powers — Augie Garrido (six straight conference baseball championships and an NCAA championship), Lynn Rogers (three straight conference titles and an AIAW national gymnastics championship) and Bob Dye (who turned a perennial patsy into a respected West Coast power, and the owner of six consecutive winning seasons). Stoner earned his bachelor's degree for Cal State Fullerton in

1962 (in communication), following an athletic career that included two years of varsity basketball and tennis for the Titans. The '62 basketball squad reached the NAIA national quarterfinals. Prior to attending CSF, he attended Fullerton Junior College and Montebello High School.

Following graduation for CSF, Stoner became the school's business services officer, a position he held for four years. He also coached the Titan freshman basketball team.


He earned his master's degree in physical education and school supervision in 1972, and is currently working on his doctorate at


Brigham Young University.
