











## A new bridge opening at Canton

The structure spans the Pearl River, 650 ft., connecting Canton and Honan.



A study in photography ~



25<sup>th</sup> of a second in time

Opening at 11.  
Distance 10 feet  
focus on placards

(Note distant  
objects  
blurred)



Time 1/25 opening 11 Distance 15 feet

The post that was blurred in the first picture comes into focus, but not sharply.



Smoke from firecrackers.

If opening was set at 22

and distance at infinity

the picture would have been further improved



Time 1/25 opening 11 Distance 15 ft.

Stopping down to smallest opening, 22,

brings distant objects into focus.

Setting distance at infinity ∞ and opening at 11  
would have given same results.



Time 1/25 opening 11 Distance 25 ft.  
The post is in focus and sharp. The post is 25 ft. away. - Distant objects blurred
