My dear Miss Morgan;

I have just received the following telegram from you;

NEED CEILING FOR GOTHIC TOOM TWENTYSEVEN BY

OLD EXTERIOR ROOF TILE ANSWER JULMORGAN

The first portion concerning the ceiling is all very clear and I immediately sent out inquiries. I know of several ceilings that would serve the purpose beautifully but I am not certain that they are for sale; as soon as I have word I shall wire.

The second half of the cable is not so clear. Do you mean 120 square feet of old roof tile? As this would only mean an area of 10 x 20 feet it would seem too small to constitute an order; unless of course you were looking for a sample. Don't think I am not interested because it seems small; but knowing the way you and Mr. Hearst do things I have a feeling that there is some error in the transmission. All this was too complicated to inquire by cable so I await your instructions in answer to this letter.

We are making splendid progress on the Monastery. Fortunately the winter has been open permitting more out door work than we calculated. I have just returned from the seat of operations and am more than satisfied with things. Owing to the fact that we are ahead of our schedule I wrote Mr. Hearst a few days that an installment of ten thousand dollars would be necessary in Madrid by March first. I had previously said that March 15th would be time enough. I hope the money will arrive on time as I run on a close margin and I should dislike to tie up the work at this particular minute.

Have you and Mr. Hearst reached any decision about the various palaces sent you?

ALL MESSAGES TAKEN BY THIS COMPANY ARE SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING TERMS:

To guard against mistakes or delays the sender of a cable message should order it repeated, that is, telegraphed back to the originating office for comparison. 1. The Company shall not be liable for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any message received for transmission at the unrepeat-message rate beyond the sum of five hundred dollars; nor for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any message received for transmission at the repeat-message rate beyond the sum of five thousand dollars, *unless specially valued*; nor in any case for delays arising from unavoidable interruption in the working of its lines; nor for errors in cipher or obscure messages.

2. In any event the Company shall not be liable for damages for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for the non-delivery, of any message, whether caused by the negligence of its servants or otherwise, beyond the sum of five thousand dollars, at which amount each message is deemed to be valued, unless a greater value is stated in writing by the sender thereof at the time the message is tendered for transmission, and unless the repeat-message rate is paid or agreed to be paid, and an additional charge equal to one-tenth of one per cent of the amount by which such valuation shall exceed five thousand dollars.

3. The Company is hereby made the agent of the sender, without liability, to forward this message over the lines of any other company when necessary to reach its destination.

4. No responsibility attaches to this Company concerning messages until the same are accepted at one of its transmitting offices; and if a message is sent to such office by one of the Company's messengers, he acts for that purpose as the agent of the sender.

5. The Company will not be liable for damages or statutory penalties in any case where the claim is not presented in writing within sixty days after the message is filed with the Company for transmission.

6. It is agreed that in any action by the Company to recover the tolls for any message or messages the prompt and correct transmission and delivery thereof shall be presumed, subject to rebuttal by competent evidence.

7. Special terms governing the transmission of messages under the classes of messages enumerated below shall apply to messages in each of such respective classes in addition to all the foregoing terms.

FULL RATE

An expedited service throughout. Code language permitted.

DEFERRED HALF RATE

Half rate messages are subject to being deferred in favor of full rate messages for not exceeding 24 hours. Must be in language of country of origin or of destination, or in French. This class of service is in effect with most European countries and with various other countries throughout the world. Full particulars supplied on application at any Western Union Office.

CABLE LETTERS

For plain-language communications. The language of the country of destination may be employed, if the cable letter

service is in operation to that country. Subject to delivery at the convenience of the Company within 24 hours if telegraphic delivery is selected. Delivery by mail beyond London will be made if a full mailing address is given and the words "Post London" are written after the destination. Rate is approximately one-third of the full rate; minimum 20 words.

WEEK-END LETTERS

Similar to Cable Letters except that they are accepted up to midnight Saturday for delivery Monday morning, if telegraphic delivery is selected. Rate is approximately one-quarter of the full rate; minimum 20 words.
