



Mr. Humberto Garcia, Colaborators, Sponsors, Ladies and Gentlemen:

My personal thanks to Mr. Humberto Garcia and Mr. Dave Sierra for their understanding performance in being able to slap my articles so as to be legible.

My policy is that of sincerity and honesty and as a writer it is only expected that I expose my feelings, and after several months of thinking I came to the final decision of presenting my resignation in EL EXCENTRICO MAGAZINE for an indefinite period.

My reasons are as follows: I will continue to represent Mas Grafica and Correo Spanish Weekly Newspaper as the S. J. Human Relations representative and will also aid EL EXCENTRICO if time arises. I will try to devote more time with the GI Forum members and its activities. I will also try to support the CSO and do my share of participation as a regular member. As for MAPA, I will continue to give my fullest support and even beyond my capabilities. I hope to also become familiar with the Junior Chamber of Commerce and its policies.

I shall return to SJCC this coming semester and change my major from Law Enforcement to Political Science. I will also continue to full time employment for GM and somehow try to find time to crawl under the blankets.

My successor, Miss Reyes, is from Mexico so you can see I' ve already pleased some people. She's a writer and she is not a Pocha. I am hopeful that she will continue to awaken both the Mexican American and the Anglo to the reality of our situation.

The Kidnapping of the Sabines

(A Synopsis)

Romulus (WOLF RUBINSKIS) and Remus (VICTOR RUIZ) receive as a reward for restoring to the throne their grandfather King Numitor - the land near the Tiber River, where as children they were abandoned as a sacrifice to the gods...and according to legend they were nursed by a "she-wolf" and later rescued by a shepherd named Faustulus.

Inasmuch as Romulus and Remus are twins there is some confusion as to which of the two will be King. Both hold that they have received signs from the gods that he Romulus and also Remus will be the King.

Romulus and his men arrive at the designated spot first and Remus has no other recourse than to give in and he fakes submission. However, at every chance he tries to undermine Romulus edicts and makes fun of every effort to build the wall which will serve as a place where the persecuted can seek asylum. While making fun, he makes the remark that the wall is so low that anybody can jump over it and immediately sets out to do just that. Romulus, not knowing that it is his brother, catches him as he jumps, with his sword and cries out "any other who leaps over my walls shall have the same!"

The city progresses rapidly, however, there is one matter that worries Romulus. The city of Rome has no women and so Romulus sends Hostes out to neighboring towns with an edict to solicit alliances with the privilege of inter-marriage for his new subjects. Hostes is not even considered seriously and when he returns to Rome and advises Romulus that nobody will consider an alliance with Rome for the purpose of intermarriage, Romulus considers this an insult and soon a plan is formulated whereby they will kidnap all the Sabine women, who are considered to be the most virtuous, hardest working, loyal and proud women anywhere.

Plans are made for a celebration and the Sabine population is invited to attend.

However, it has been decided that at the right moment the Sabine women will be



captured and kept in Rome in order to insure progeny at home. At the appointed time a preconcerted tumult arose and young Romans darted this way and that to carry the girls off.

The performance broke off in a panic and the parents of the girls fled in grief, charging that the laws of hospitality had been trampled upon.

However, Romulus went about explaining that the fault was their father's pride in refusing marriage rights to neighbours and that they would be joined in wedlock.

Romulus chose Hersilia (LORENA VELASQUEZ the Sabine king's daughter and Hostes chose Rhea (TERESA VELAZQUEZ) another daughter of the Sabine King. All the women were angered and could not become reconciled to the fact that they had been kidnapped.

Titus, King of the Sabines, after two years of preparation, finally decides to avenge his honor, and goes forward to battle Rome.

At this crisis the Sabine women, whose wrong had given rise to the war, with hair dishevelled and dresses torn, female shyness crushed by disaster, boldly threw themselves amidst the flying missiles. Charging in, they parted the hostile lines, parted their fury, implored their fathers on this side and their husbands on that: father-in-law and sons-in-law should not stain themselves with impious bloodshed nor brand their children, their fathers' grandsons, their husbands' sons with the infamy of parricide.

If you disdain the kinship of marriage, it is upon us you must direct your fury; we are the cause of wounds and this slaughter of husbands and parents. Better we perish than lose either of you and be widowed or orphaned.

Men and officers alike were touched, silence fell - there was a sudden hush. The leaders step forward to make terms.

Dwight L. Mathiesen, County Assessor, today announced that the final filing date for veterans exemption claims is near.

1965 affidavits have been mailed to all veterans who qualified last year and these must be returned to the Assessor's Office by 5 P.M., May 3, 1965.

Veterans filing for the first time or filing on new property must appear in the Assessor's Office before May 3 with their deed and service record. Property on which the exemption is claimed must be recorded in the name of the veteran and/or his wife as of the first Monday in March or they must have a contract of sale as of the first Monday in March.

If a veteran did not enter the service as a resident of California, he must also present evidence of being a legal resident of California as of November 3; 1964.

Under certain conditions widows of veterans may also claim an exemption if their assets do not exceed \$10,000.







AN OPEN LETTER TO

GRINGOS DIG THE BRACERO!

I see by the local rag that the Governor has asked for return of the braceros to "save" our crops.

Naturally the growers are all for it. Where else can you get slave labor for 80¢ per hour. Where else can you get workers who can't bargain for their wages? Where else can you get people to work sunup to sundown, Saturdays, Sundays, & holidays without complaining? Where else people who will not complain if they live in a barracks without windows, showers, toilet facilities and heating?

The American grower is taking advantage of a nationality of people who live in hunger and poverty. And the officials in the Mexican government who negotiate the contracts are letting them get away with it.

Picture this situation: A Mexican official says: "Fine, Amigos Americanos, you can have 50,000 Mexican citizens to help in the harvest of your crops. But we just found out that American workers want \$2.00 per hour to do the work our men have been doing for 85¢ per hour. Our men will go -- at \$2 per hour."

I will guarantee you, my Mexican American friends, that it wouldn't take too damned long for our grower friends to discover that American citizens can pick ANY crop just as well as any other nationality -- if the price is right!
