

ADD RECORDS UPDATE

We have several new releases out on the label. "Ritalin Riot 2" CD is not just another craptacular sequel. It contains 30 songs in total with eight unreleased, eight brand new, one rare, and several instant classics. Some of the bands include: At the Drive in, Hot Water Music, Leatherface, Less Than Jake, The Movie Life, Autopilot Off (formerly Cooter), Cadillac Blindside, The Impossibles, The Thumbs, and several more. We clogged the disk with Simpsons samples and other annoying sound bytes to amuse people with short attention spans. "Please Send Help" is a split CD with Doc Hopper and El Secondhand that's nine tracks total, with new songs by each, and covers by The Replacements, Slayer, Elvis Costello, Buddy Holly, and Black Flag. The Superchinchillarescuemission are a new band from D.C. with Gainesville/Tampa area transplant and ex Pantho UK bass player Jimmy United. The debut four song CD EP titled "is out of the crate and I promise no chinchillas were killed in the production of this CD. "Get This Shit Under Way" is the full length CD by Chattanooga, Tennessee's Jack Palance Band. There are seventeen blistering punk gems that flat out fucking rock like a hurricane beating up the Florida Coast. A comparison cannot justify the song writing ability of this band. They'll be on the road this summer with The Thumbs, touring the country.

The Tim Version "Creating Forces That Don't Exist" CD is still doing well and they are currently on the road this summer for a month long tour playing shows with Tiltwheel, The Superchinchillarescuemission, and Jack Palance Band. The last trip they had in April is the now classic SPRING BREAK tour and they're looking forward to fucking it up with some destructive bands this time around. The Superchinchillarescuemission will also be out on tour this summer, supporting their new ADD release with Tiltwheel and The Urchin from Japan. Look for a split CD with them and The Tim Version sometime this fall, and a new full length by Tim Version at the turn of the new year. Until then, be on the lookout for these ADD bands and if any of them come to your area please check out the show and help support underground music. Here's a tip when encountering an ADD band. Offer them a beer. They like beer. They also would love to sleep on your mildew stained couches and alcohol soaked carpets. Offer up these things and when they come back to your town they'll more than likely mooch off you again if you're around. Wait... That can't be good.





I have this friend with a really hot girlfriend and she keeps on hitting on me. I told my friend and he doesn't seem to care at all. What should I do?



Anyway, this cat starts to pass us by when I hear him mutter out something in Spanish. I took two years of it in school and can't speak a word. My partner looks somewhat befuddled too, so the man turns to us and says, "He's just trying to sell you weed." It turns out there's like one of these guys on just about every corner in this district. We aren't in need so we just ignore everybody that asks, but it starts to get real old fast.

A block later we walk by this monument that's full of squatter punks just sitting around smoking cigarettes and spare changing. I find them amusing although I can tell they don't find anything too amusing about our kind. On the next block we find about a mile long soup line for homeless people, which is on the same block as city hall, where out in front there is some kind of protest going on against government assistance. None of these events are an every day occurrence where I live so naturally I ask if we can chill out for awhile and take in some of this entertainment. The man says there's no time because we have to catch a bus. So we trudge on through the chaos. We get to the bus stop a couple of blocks later. My partner takes a seat on the bus next to some old black guy, but before he can totally put his ass down in the seat this guy begins waging war on him. "What the fuck you doin' white boy? What are you some kind of faggot? I'll mother fucking kill your ass!" We're here on a higher purpose and this situation could blow our cover, so needless to say, he switches seats and ignores the man's ignorant comments.

We get off on Haight Street by this huge graffiti mural. The street is just packed with people. I remember seeing pictures of this place in the 60's and for some reason it doesn't seem like half of these people have left that era. We can't get one block without some burnout trying to sell us grass or doses of acid. But if it's not that, it's somebody spare changing our asses, or even worse some asshole trying to sell us something they just stole. Some Grizzly Adams looking mother fucker actually tries to sell us a stolen wheelchair and then calls me a redneck when I tell him to go fuck himself. What an asshole. Of course then there's this airl who tries to sell us stolen Keebler Soft Batch cookies wrapped up in plastic. She actually says the money is going to charity. I quickly realize these people are the scum of the earth and we must be cautious of every twist and turn this psychedelic freak show throws our way.

At the end of Haight is Golden Gate Park which is our meeting ground. It's time to sit and wait for the messenger. We sit and relax in the grass while we take in the sights. My feet are sore and my nerves are a bit shot from having to deal with all the derelicts. A few hours go by and no sign of the messenger. Me and my partner start to get hungry and the man just tells us to cool off and wait patiently. It's been an hour or so and my stomach is starting to unravel. Finally this guy on a bicycle rides up and gives the man some directions. The guy is all business because after a brief conversation between the two the biker rides off and the man turns to us and says are you hungry?

We go to this pizzeria on Haight and I'm so hungry right about now that I could eat the pizza box if there was some Parmesan cheese on it. We discuss the next plan of action over

lunch. It turns out we're supposed to meet someone in the park around four PM so we still have some time to kill. I suggest we lose this scene and find a nice Irish Pub to drink away the time, but my partner is a little fancy boy who likes to shop for every baseball cap and pair of dope sneakers that came out on the market in the last twenty years, so we end up on the Haight for entirely too long.

The chances of getting fingered on the Haight are pretty high because there are undercovers everywhere. They know it's the mecca and they're not going to overlook all the trafficking that goes on down here. We walk from Golden Gate Park all the way to the other end of Haight and I see pigs on horses, pigs on foot, pigs in squad cars, pigs in unmarked vans, and undercovers dressed like hippie burnouts. I'm not fooled. I just keep my profile low and try to avoid looking into all the hidden cameras placed along the street. I'm more than happy when we reach the bus stop.

We head back toward downtown and the plan is to go back to the man's and relax for a little bit before our rendezvous in the park. Walking over junkies while I make my way up the stairs almost seems routine. Even pork chops greeting us at the door to the dingy room is a welcome site. We settle into the room, the man puts some tunes on the radio, and then pulls his giant purple hookah out of the closet. It's covered in a towel but we can see the hoses of the mighty smoke serpent protruding out from under. He pulls off the towel and we are in awe. Too bad he doesn't have any weed.

The man offers to go to the park and hook up with some tweeds. He tells us it's quite an experience because there are guys on bicycles who hide their weed under rocks and shit. It's too much excitement for my partner to pass up so he invites himself along. I pass on the offer and decide to watch some Jefferson's reruns on the shitty little black and white television with pork chops. Those guys go off and do their thing and I try to sneak in some sleep while pork chops tries to make time with some little runaway who just got off the bus from Mississippi. It's a spectacle to say the least. The guys don't score any weed and it's pretty humorous because this morning everybody and their grandma wanted to help us score. We grab another bus and head our way to a park that's closer to downtown. The park turns out to be way cooler than any of the others we've been to so far during our journey. This park is on top of a hill and you can see a great view of the

city from up here. It's funny how beautiful this city is on the outside, yet evil to the core. The sun is setting and the wind is whipping through the trees. We're enjoying ourselves when we notice a pack of bald headed guys in flight jackets heading our way. We're thinking, "Here? Now? Why?" We have had our problems with these kinds back home too and I start to think about how shit just finds you sometimes. They head directly our way and we prepare for a harsh confrontation. There are five of them and three of us and I like those odds because I've tangled with three locals at home on my own and managed to come out on top so I figured what's the difference. Then I realize we're here for a higher purpose and I'm holding our entire future in my backpack. This situation could quickly diffuse any plans of hooking up. I'm thinking over just about every possible scenario that could transpire when they approach. I look up at them with my game face and they just walk by without even a stare. This is bizarre to us because back home we would have had a confrontation, but these guys don't give us a second thought. I'm relieved and confused at the same

The skins hang out on the other side of the park while we wait for our possible connection. The time passes by slowly. Those guys come and go and so do others as we wait a couple hours after dark for the courier. We realize it's way too late and it seems evident that he isn't going to show. We ask the man what the plan is now? He tells us it's time to go back to the hotel and start all over again in the morning. Me and my partner are starting to feel really unsure about what once seemed like a great plan. Well, day one of our fly by the seat of our pants venture is over and so far it's looking bleak for us and our big score. So we head back to the man's with our heads hanging and our future dangling in the balance.

Next issue... Day two, the struggle continues.



The plastic covered barbell flies toward the window. Everyone crowded around the window gasps as it breaks the surface of the glass. Looking at each other we figure out we now have access to the structure. I smile and he smiles back. This moment was a week in planning and a lifetime away or so it seemed. But all in all the time for action had come and someone answered. Me. We didn't have time to argue over

who was going to throw the object through the window, so I took it upon myself. I guess being the mastermind behind some bullshit theft makes you think that you are better then everyone else or above the law. Could be true, but all the facts aren't in yet. The only fact I know is that the alarm is going off and we are just standing around like a bunch of idiots. I look at my watch and hit the timer. "Okay we have 60 seconds and no one, I mean no one, goes into the store. Everything we need is right here." That said. I start to break out the rest of the glass so we don't cut ourselves upon entry. The timer has been started. The glass has been cleared. Now it's a race to see who can carry the most products at once. Jumping over the wall and onto the broken glass I run to the objective, video games on the wall at the front of the establishment. They have the game systems sitting right next to the games which makes grabbing stuff easy. They were also nice enough to put a bunch of games in baskets that are attached to the wall. So in my next run I grab two baskets full of games and throw them into the trunk of the car. When I make my way back into the store one of the two individuals accompanying me is wandering further into the store. I start to grab some more stuff and turn around to yell at him when the timer goes off on my watch. "Our 60 seconds are up. Grab what you can and lets get the fuck out of here." I toss what I have into the trunk which is now full and then run back for one more load since they are taking their sweet time getting out of the place. I throw my junk into the back seat and go back to grab the barbell that was used to gain access to the store and put it in the back seat with me. From there I yell at the two gentlemen, "The cops are more than likely getting a call about a break in right now, so let's get the fuck out of here." They jump in the car and start the engine. This interview was done with a guy name Deejay about his DSS hacking web site. This site has been around since the beginning of DSS hacking. Some of you may be asking yourselves, "What the hell is DSS hacking?" That's a good question. Well when you go to your local Wal-Mart or Megalowmart and pick up your DSS (Digital Satellite Service) receiver they come pre packaged with an access card. When DSS TV first started the brainiacs didn't even think too hard about their access cards in the receiver. They thought that now one could crack their great encryption. They were wrong. For years now people have been buying hardware to write to these cards and to develop programs to write to them. The first set of cards that came out were called H cards. These cards, after being cracked and set up to receive free TV were going for hundreds of dollars. Then when everyone found out about the H card the actual card by itself, not even set up for free TV, was going for hundreds of dollars. Supply and demand. But Dave (Direct TV that is) was and is still not happy about people getting free TV since they are a huge corporation and all. So Dave like a God in heaven started sending down software updates from the satellite. These updates would render whatever software was on the card to get free TV useless. So there you were getting TV for free and now all you have is, "Please insert valid access card" on the screen, and all you want to do is throw something at the TV. So after a round of this you go smoke some weed to calm down and sit yourself in front of the computer for a long long time.

Until someone figures out what will work next. Currently they are developing software that will crack the cards that are coming with DSS receivers right now. So this means that if you have the knowledge and the equipment you can go buy a receiver now and take the card out, run some software on it via special hardware, put it back in the receiver and, bam, you're watching free TV. So that's the gist of it. I'm sure I raised more questions then I help at answering any that you have had in the first place. Just read the interview, and remember, pretty soon everything will be free. Maybe even us.

1:> First off, tell us what the hobby of DSS hacking is and how it came about?

The hobby is basically all about digital encryption and smart card technology. It just so happens that the satellite equipment and cards are idea to work on in this area.

The dssug came about in 1995 when I noticed there was NO site out there that had free information on the technology at that time. I started the site so that people such as myself could get together to discuss this stuff and create a open "channel" where we could all gather our ideas and solutions. Before this, everyone was scattered and no one knew anything about it, except the dealers who got info directly from the hackers at that time. A very basic way to put it is, that we filled a need on the web for info that wasn't available....

2:> Why did you start the web site?


See above... There was no where to look for this info at the time. I decided to make a site then so everyone could talk about it. I mostly started it though because I was sick of relying on a dealer for fixes when I thought there must be a better way to do this all myself... Helping others came with the territory!:)

3:> How long has it been going on?

The dss hacking has been going on since LATE 1994 and early 1995... I made the web site around early 1995.:)

4:> Have you ever had any problems with cops or the Feds?

We get letters from various legal firms claiming to represent DTV.... I think we got one from some layers rep'ing a Canadian service too, even though we have no CDN info. We have gotten probably about four letters asking our ISP to shut us down. We have not got a single letter directly from them to our site though. They are trying to be sneaky and get us taken down from other means... Like the isp. The isp has told them that they have to deal with US... The dssug... It seems they don't want to, or haven't tried yet. My site is a haven for free speech.... I do not censor anything in my site at all, and I also now do not coach anyone on how to do anything. I simply run the machines. Therefore, it would be against the rights and freedoms of myself, the site, and the users if anyone tried to shut me down. I will fight any kind of attack my anyone. We have the phone



number to Canada's top DSS and satellite TV lawyer and I will use it if I have to. So far though, there isn't really anything anyone can do to shut us down. We are not doing anything illegal here in Canada. I have not heard from anyone in the FBI or anywhere else at all actually. Only lawyers with empty threats of laws that don't apply to my site. Mostly Bullshit.

5:> What is a day in your life like? What do you do for fun'and other things?

Fun? Hmmm... Well, I do like 4x4-ing... I also run www.bogginfreaks.com Most times though it seems I spend most of my day on the computer trying to keep everything running smooth. Running the DSSUG and the other web sites I host is pretty much a FT job. Things crash when you least expect them to! (I also run www.intertechment.com too)

6:> What is your philosophy on the future?

I always think about this. The truth is though, that it's VERY unpredictable... You never know if things are going to be around the next day. This goes for all the fixes and hacks on dss, as well as pretty much the whole thing! I do all I can to be sure that I will be around forever, and am also building new sites in hopes they grow and become popular too. There is a lot more to my and my internet biz than just the DSSUG. I want to grow past that. I want to still have the DSSUG forever, but I must also grow past that and have other popular sites to stay here online in the fu-

ture as well! Small minds never get far... Growth is key. :)

7:> How many people do you think are getting free TV? You can take a guess.

Oh man... Well, I can tell you the numbers have DEFINITELY SHRANK since Black Sunday (a term I made up by the way, just off the top of my head, and now everyone and their dog is using it to name the ecm day that killed almost everyone off free tv!). I would hate to guess at the number... I can say there was probably 100's of thousands that where getting free tv across North America BEFORE black Sunday, but now afterwards, I would say it's been cut at least in half... Maybe more... They where VERY effective in stopping the normal everyday people in testing... It's the hardcore people out there that know a lot about computers and love to play with this stuff that are still going, or have the best chances of going again. The fixes to the problem now are quite complex, and not really something a normal person can handle. With the exception of paying a dealer to program one of the new HU football cards for you. Anyone can get that done, but the BS ecm killed a TON of people that where watching for free. Fact.

9:> What are your thoughts on Dave employees sitting around on IRC giving out false information?

I think it's funny. I have been on IRC for a long time. Before I even got

into this stuff. You never really know who you are talking to on there. That's the most important thing to know there. I don't really listen to anyone there cause I know this. So many people out there are new and have no clue. The IRC and any other kind of chat is should be used more for entertainment anyway... Hangin out and making friends. People should never take the chat or IRC too seriously. Most of it is Bullshit ... :) But, I also think that this scenario is not very common. I do not think that DTV employees are logging into the chats very much, if at all. If they do, I think they sit there and watch more than anything. I may be wrong, but out of all the time I have been there, I have NEVER ONCE seen anything that would lead me to believe that anyone from DTV was ever there. Again, it's possible, but I haven't seen anything to make me think they were.

10:> Do you think if people are smart enough to get stuff for free without really hurting anyone they should be able to do so freely?

That is a very good question. I honestly believe that if you are able to legally get something, then you should pay for it. Seems the right thing to do. Just because I run this site doesn't mean I want everyone out there to break the law, or to look for some way to rip off someone else. I think a lot of people think we are in this to screw Dave... Not so... We are hosting up here Canada. DTV is not allowed to sell here. I think this sucks! There is a huge understory here about the Canadian CRTC and the bullshit Canadian Content laws

that prevent QUALITY programming from being shown here by such great companies such as DTV. I often tell people I would legally pay and subscribe to DTV if we where actually ALLOWED to here. The downside is if it was legal here to pay for DTV then my site would therefore be illegal, and then I would need to find another way to make a living. (grin) But I still think the whole picture needs to be seen. Bullshit Canadian laws prevent everyone here in Canada from watching what they want to on their own tvs! It's like we live in the old day Russia. We are in effect being censored in what we watch here. It's amazing in this day and age that the population sits there and simply takes this! I think it's mostly a matter of them being sheep, and not even knowing this is going on! Canadians need to WAKE UP and realize their government is restricting them in this matter! It makes me mad thinking about it! Anyway, to make a long story shorter, I think if people can legally get the programming, they should pay. People will be people though. I am sure that as long as there is a way to crack something, there will be people out there doing it. It's human nature to find ways to beat or outsmart the system.

11:> Do you feel the punishment for hacking is iust?

It is an actual fact that those in the US that are doing this are breaking the law. Plain and simple. DTV pays millions for it's equipment, and broadcast rights. If no one paid, they would not be able to provide the service. I feel that the laws in the US to try to stop people from doing this are just. DTV is just trying to protect themselves from signal pirates. They are totally within their rights to do so in the US... And the US only. As long as they DON'T have the right to broadcast or sell the signal here in Canada, then they should lay off Canada and the Canadians out there. If they ever where to get rights here, even I would pay for the service I am getting. In actual fact I used to pay through a grey market provider for a long time too! So even though I wasn't allowed to pay, I did anyway.

12:> Is DSSunderground the only site you run?

Nope, as I said, I just opened the www.intertechment.com ... A site for Internet, technology, and ENTERTAINMENT. Fun stuff! As well as www.bogginfreaks.com where 4x4 mudders go to shoot the shit. Lots of big horse-power fun there! I have a couple other sites too, that I am kind of shutting down... I don't seem to have the time for them... www.intertechment.com, bogginfreaks.com, and the dssunderground.com are the sites I am focusing on mainly now:)

13:> How does it feel to be giving important information to people who need it?

Well, again, I don't really give out any information at all! I basically simply run the machines now! With the forums and the live chat, the uses have found that they can all help themselves. This also helps me in that I do not actually give out any info to directly help them hack. Keeping me (sort of) out of the hacking loop. I want to be sure the site is around a long time, and when the users provide the info, it makes is so THEY are

responsible for the info there... not me!:) I am glad though that so many people have chosen to make the DSSUG their home for this info. I am extremely grateful to everyone who comes here, and who has helped me make the site what it is today. I just cant say thank you enough to all of them. I am VERY glad for it.:)

14:> Do you have a lot of weirdos harassing you (besides me)? Give us a little story.

You wouldn't believe some of the email I get. Well, maybe you would. I don't mean to slag anyone. but the AOL'ers are the worst. A couple years ago, I actually banned ALL AOL'ers from being able to read the site, because none of them seemed to be able to read... I still to this day have WAY MORE problems with AOL'ers than any other group of users. They all are very new to the new, and are all running the crappy AOL software and browsers that do not work right. I think AOL should be shut down. My personal opinion. Let the users use a REAL isp to get on the net. Most of the mail I get now is actually all already answered in the forums or on my site though, so I have auto reply setup on my email to filter out 99% of the BS mails that come. Since I have done this, my life has become 100x better... Email used to be a real drag, but now it's happy again. Anytime you run a site this big, you will always get the hot heads out there that will slag you before you even get a chance to help them. Plain ignorant, and I simply tell them to not return. I respect my users, as much as they respect me. If someone doesn't treat me as a human being. then I return the favor. Only fair. :) I am always here though, to help anyone with problems in using the site, as long as they are nice about it:)

15:> What type of malted beverages, if any, do you drink?

I used to like beer when I was younger. You know I never really liked it though, hahahaha Back then I drank to get pissed. (grin) Seems I have switched a lot in the area of booze. Beer, to Whisky, to rum, to vodka, back to whisky, back to Vodka.... I'm in the vodka mode again now. I don't drink beer at all anymore. Just don't really like it. I think there are lots like me out there though too. Beer is OK for lots of people, but I prefer the hard stuff a little more:)

16:> What do you think the ultimate hack is??

Well, if we are talking no limits to the imagination.... The ultimate hack would be some kind of unit that would be smuggled out of DTV's labs. A programmer that can program and fix any card out there. If we are talking something that's out there now, that exists and the hackers are using... I think the BEST one out now, is the Emulators... As long as the H stream still flows, these units should stay up till the very last day. Not the ultimate, but the best by far.

17:> Do you think that a government task force is going to be able to stop people from hacking?

No... NEVER... No one can stop hacking... I am not talking about simply dss here though either. As long as there is computers, there will be hackers. It's human nature to want to get into things.

Exploring... It all comes to that. Most of the hackers are puzzle freaks. Most of all hacking is like a puzzle. They get great feelings of accomplishment and fulfillment from cracking and hacking. The guys that do the main hacking and cracking are VERY VERY smart people. Any computer company would be extremely well off to have these guys on their side... Anything the government tried to do to stop hacking will just make it worse. It would be a waste of money at the very least.

18:> Does running the web site get you a lot of chicks???

HELL NO.... hahahha I wish...:) I have a good woman now though. I wouldn't mind all the women sending me in scanned pics though if they want!

19:> What kind of music do you listen to?

Funny you should ask that. My nickname is Deejay, because I was one. I used to DJ at a popular nightclub here in Calgary... Was there about three years. At that time I spun a lot of house music, and underground type stuff. Of course, being in a nightclub here in this city at that time, a lot of Commercial garbage music was played too. I got so freakin' sick of some of that shit. It annoved me to no end that the hordes of people where so shallow to want to hear Mr. Vain twice in one night... Remember that shitty song? Man, I hated it. It was crap. I prefer new cutting edge music.... Back then I loved the House/ techno/ progressive scene. I di'd the odd rave here and there too. 20:> Any last words for the kids??




ful pills falling from the ether in perfect unison to wipe out the nasty viruses below me.

The Fairlanes



Welcome To Nowhere

The Fairlanes are a hard working band with a really good story. They started their band while attending school at the University of Colorado at Boulder. Throughout their stretch during school, they never sold a million records or won any grammys. However, they had a lot of fun playing shows, releasing records, and touring in between semesters. They all graduated and all found really great jobs, the kind of jobs that made their parents very proud. At this point, the band existed as a part-time entity but continued none the less despite singer, Jason Zumbrunnen, moving to Houston and then to Long Beach. They continued recording and even put together a two week summer tour with the Gamits, and again they had lots of fun. They went back to work and started putting together what would become an admirable career. Something was missing though. On March 2nd, 2001, the Fairlanes quit their jobs and decided to be a full time band. They recently recorded their best album to date, "Welcome to Nowhere", which is quite a departure from their earlier releases musically and lyrically. We had the opportunity to sit down with the Fairlanes on Wednesday, March 14th right before they embarked for their two month tour.

Interview by Scott Kaplan and Virgil Dickerson.

What are your names and what instruments do you play?

S: I'm Scott, I play the bass and sing a little vocals

J: Jason...sing, and play a little bit of guitar.

A: I'm Andy lead and rhythm drums.

R: I'm Robbie. I play guitar and sing a little bit.

Scott, why don't you tell me what has been going on since the release of "Bite Your Tongue" (their last release) and what is going on today?

S: Bite Your Tongue was recorded during a time that we had all graduated and had career jobs or whatever. Since then we've all quit our jobs to go full time touring. Our old bass player Jeff quit, I moved over to bass, and we got Andy Baldwin to be the new drummer. We recorded Welcome to Nowhere and now we are going to be touring full time in support of it.

The older records were easier to peg, basically the whole Blink 182 meets the Queers, and this one is more of a departure. What changes were made in the song writing between those earlier releases and this latest recording?

S: One thing, and this really relates to both... The way I look at songs is, there's the music and then there's the lyrics. In the past we did not spend nearly as much time on the lyrics. I mean, you can kind of tell on our older releases which songs we spent more time with. OBYT, Wide Awake, the lyrics are a lot better than the other songs. More time was spent on it. And music-wise, the same thing, we kind of were not consciously doing this but getting songs done to get them done. A lot of the time we were in the studio like, "Yo, what are we going to do here?" Not that everything was just thrown together because that's not the case. But some things certainly were. Whereas, on this one we basically took one song at a time and tried all these different ways of doing it, different ways of singing it, different lyrics here and there, and tried to as much as we could do. We could have still not recorded and still be doing this shit. You have to draw the line somewhere, but we really tried to make it as much as a complete song as we could.

J: Simply, we spent a lot more time on the music and on lyrics separately, and we have become better song writers and musicians. You know, we want to expand on what we are doing and I think that is very evident on the CD.

If you were to cover a song that you don't already cover, what would that song be?

S: "Little Fighter" by White Lion.

All: (Laughs)

S: I'm serious. You guys are all laughing.

J: I would like to do "I Love Rock n' Roll" by Joan Jett. She is the best female rock n' roll singer out there.

A: I'd have to, uh, ask Robbie what he would like to do.

R: I would like something from the Cars or Steve Miller Band.

R: I think a Police cover or a Cars cover would be cool, something like that. The Talking heads...bands that I listened to when I was in high school.

J: Rob would choose the Spin Doctors.



All: (Laughs)

What's the hardest thing the band has had to endure? What do you fight about most?

R: The toughest thing for these guys would have to be dealing with me.

S: One of the biggest things was when Jeff left because we were a really tight unit. The chemistry between each of us and the way we deal with each other, we know how to push each other's buttons and how not to. We knew that since Jeff, Rob, and Jason have been in the band together for nearly 6 years and I was for about 4 years, filling that void when he left just simply based on personality, and someone that was easy to deal with was a big thing.

J: I think also making the decision go full time, to quit our jobs.

Who was the first person to say, hey, we should do this full time?

J: Jeff, and then he quit.

All: (Laughs)

S: It was initially him.

R: We were all kind of thinking about something like that. We all got out of school. After a little bit of time, the job thing had kind of lost its luster. And I think we all realized that was not what we wanted to be doing with the rest of our lives. The thought was going through all of our

minds. I heard it from Scott or Jason and I thought they were kidding around, but I also thought it would be so cool. We found out we were all thinking the same thing.

S: Jeff did get the ball rolling as far as being a little more serious about it.

R: When we all found out we were thinking the same thing, we were like, hey, this is something we should think about doing.

Jeff Merkel was an original member of the band. Why is it that he left?

S: He has his own company, Mach 8, and he really wanted to concentrate on that and did not feel that touring for x months a year would allow him to put 100 % of his time and energy into it. He made a decision on two things he loved and cared about and chose that.

J: I think he is already doing a little bit of what he wanted to do. Although it may have been easier for him to go on tour at that point, it was a harder decision cause he already had a job he loved to do.

You guys are about to embark on an almost 2 month long tour. What will happen if this tour is a horrible experience and the shows are not as good as you thought? S: First of all, we have been out of the touring game for a while. The way I'm looking at all of this is. I'm not too concerned. Of course I want the band to become more popular, but that



is not my main focus. Even if did this for a few years, 10 years, 1 year, I don't want to look back and see I have taken it for granted and that I was always whining. I think too many bands go out on the road and just fucking bitch about touring Japan and not finding a soda. It's like, shut the fuck up, you know what I mean? I just don't want to take anything for granted.

J: I think if this U.S. tour doesn't go well, we'll go to Europe right after that. Maybe we will just stay over in Europe just get huge in Luxembourg.

R: At this point we have been planning to get out on the road for so long and do this that it is going to take a pretty awful tour to get me down at all. I think we are just excited to be doing it. And like Scott said, we have not been touring for a while so this will present a good opportunity to get out there and start getting back into the swing of things.

J: We have a R.V. now. It can't be that bad. That's to take care of us. Even if the tour is tough it will be a lot easier than the old '77 van we used to tour in, sleeping in the gutter where the door opens falling out if someone stops for gas and opens the side door.

In line with the whole length of tour, it is a lot of time to be together with one another.

And you guys (Scott and Rob) live together so when you get back you don't get a
break at all. Do you think that is going to have any effect on the band or your friendship at all?

S: I don't think so. It's different living with someone in a band, but I'm not concerned. Actually, when we get back from tour we have 3 weeks before we leave for Europe, come back, and then I move out like 2 weeks later and his brother will actually be moving in. I will be moving in with my girlfriend.

R: The time off that we are back we are going to be doing different stuff. I know I want to go out and climb and hike and stuff like that. It's not like we're in each other's hair all the time. A: I'm sure the extra space in the R.V. will help a lot. Because of that back room we will be able to get some breathing room.

I know that you named your last van. Do you have a name for the R.V.?

J: Did you see our license plate?

S: 8-3-3-D-R-E

R: the name of the vehicle is "The Motherfuckin D-R-E"

3 of you guys have serious girlfriends and I know It's going to be really difficult. Are there any steps or considerations being made to make things as smooth as possible?

S: One of the things that I want, and the same thing with looking back, the girls are coming out to Europe and we are going to do a little bit of a vacation after we tour. I want everyone to look back at this time of their lives and I would hate for my girlfriend to say "that fucking sucks" when I'm like "that fucking rules." We have taken those things into consideration.

J: We have had almost a year to get ready for this so that helps a lot.

S: I don't like them watching VH1's "Behind the Music" because everyone cheats on their girlfriends and starts drug addictions.

J: It's a bad show for girlfriends to watch.

What makes for a good show?

J: People

All: (Laughs)


J: Actually that doesn't even matter. A couple of kids help. I just like a lot of energy from the crowd, even if it's small. When they're into the music it makes your show ten times better. Even if it's 10 kids there, if they're loving it, that's great.

S: That's what it's all about. A good show for me is when people are into it and I'm into it as much as they are. Giving them their money's worth. If 10 people paid to come see you, give your all to them. It doesn't matter if 100, 500, or 6 people came.

R: I would rather play for 5 kids that are into it and having fun. So that's what matters to us

What is the craziest/welrdest tour story that you have?

R: One of my favorites has to be, and I really hope something like this happens again, the last time we went on tour with the Gamits. We were in Sheridan, Wyoming. After the show these kids took us to this giant rock pile. And that is, by the way, when we had our drinking contest with the Gamits and we totally kicked their ass. They haven't admitted it yet but we



posted some photos on the web to prove our victory.

While we were at this giant rock pile quarry, we were jumping off these huge piles of rocks and falling twenty feet and just going crazy and drinking and shooting fireworks off. These kids started this giant bonfire and we found this really, really giant piece of equipment with over 6 foot tires on it. One was a front end loader and I thought it would be the funniest thing if I could get it going and pick the fire up in the front end loader. I thought everyone would probably go crazy and I would be the coolest guy there. I'd had some experience with hot wiring things before.

J: Remember Rob is really drunk at this point.

R: I'd had some experience hot wiring things before so I was confident we could do it. Forest, the drummer from the Gamits, and I broke into the thing and we got it running. It started up and I thought that was really funny but then I couldn't turn it off. I was looking at the controls before I started driving it, but the light in the driver's cockpit would go on and it wouldn't turn off. Meanwhile, there were like 15 kids just hanging out, sitting on the front end loader with their hands between the loader and the body of the thing and all these kids started coming into the cockpit and moving it around. We started moving, going forward and backward, and the thing started taking off. We couldn't stop it and it started going right for the Gamits van, and this thing wass like the biggest piece of equipment in the world. Finally, we were yelling at everybody to get off before they got run over. The Gamits thought their van was about to blow up and we finally couldn't control it anymore. It was just going out of control and there were all these giant piles of rocks. I thought we could totally come over on the side and it could fall over and fall on the door and trap me in and I would be sitting in there until the next morning or killing somebody or something. Forest and I abandoned ship while it was still going and I thought it was going to fall off of a cliff. Luckly the front end loader part went down and it kind of stalled out. I never got to pick up the fire which was a big bummer.

Outside of music what influences your band:?

S: I like writers, different stuff. Music is a giant one for me but I read a whole lot

R: "The Rise and Fall of Death Row Records"

S: I read that, yeah. I don't know how much that influenced me, but it was interesting none the less. I read a good Hunter S. Thompson book called "The Rum Diary". I read this Rudolpho Anaya, I have a collection of a bunch of his shit that I have been reading and I am always reading like three or four books. I was taking Flamenco lessons before we were leaving for tour, which was really fucking cool for me to learn a completely different type of music and with so much history. Punk rock even if you go back to the Stooges and all that, what is that 30 years of history? It is so interesting to have this music that has so much to it and has evolved so much.

J: I guess reading quite bit. I just read Nick Homsby's "High Fidelity" which was made into a movie.

R: I'm reading "Into Thin Air" again by John Cockhower.

A: I go to lots of shows no matter what kind of music it is and that really influences me. I love spending time with my friends.

Based on the genre that you guys are playing in, everything gets lumped together really quick especially with pop-punk. It's ridiculous. They say it's pop punk, but that could mean a million things. How would you say that you guys set yourselves apart? R: With the new album we have parts where we have breakdowns. We do little

acoustic things. We have a song that is more of a rock song than anything we have ever done. The tempos on some of the tunes are different, and to me that makes me feel that we have a lot more versatility in the band now. That's the kind of thing that makes the band not so easy to categorize. I don't even know the difference between power pop and power punk. Everyone throws those words around and has their own definitions of them. With the new record we are a little less of that standard, whatever that standard is. I think we could play with lots of different bands. I know on this tour we are going to play with some rock bands which is cool, some emo bands, and everything in between.

A: I think when you get to the point to describe a certain bands sounds and everyone tries to throw in these catchy words like, "We are not an emo band. We are a driving rock band." It's like, you can mix around whatever you want, and I think all in all, when it comes down to it, the music has to speak for itself. It's hard when every record reviewer wants to categorize 50 different bands into 3 different categories. I guess the best way to say it is to say we like to play music.

There are millions of bands releasing records, why should someone purchase your album?

J: Within the genre, this album in particular has a lot more diversity of rock and roll to the faster stuff, and a lot of unique parts, some acoustics, and quite a bit of different guitar tones. With that, it is definitely melodic and enjoyable to listen to, and very powerful. If you like the driving rock and roll and lots of different parts, it will be a great album.

You have always said, "We are not punk rock when it comes to the hipster crowd. We won't be buying records at double e."

S: I don't have a problem buying the records, but I won't be sitting cross legged watching the acoustic show

With you guys it has always been a little bit of a bigger thing. It hasn't been about stuff like anarchy, but more to do with friendship. My question is, you go to the shows and all of these kids are the doing whatever they define punk rock to be. How do you see yourselves fitting in with that now or do you feel that you don't fit in?

J: I think, like you said, for us the music is most important, as well as our friendships, not the politics with punk rock. At the same time it is there obviously, Like you said, we are supplying music and enjoyment, but also in our lyrics I think we are talking about some issues even if they are personal or social issues that people can relate to. We will let other people deal with the politics of punk rock. We just want to play the music.

S: To give you an example, I love shows that are extremely diverse bands, whether they be punk or not. If anyone comes to see us play I could care less if they are a punk rocker or a corporate accountant. If they enjoy it, that is fucking awesome.



What is the best album of last year, punk or not?

J: Get Up Kids' "Something to Write Home About" and Promise Ring's "Very Emergency". R: The albums I listened to the most this last year were the Koufax album that came out last year, I listen to that a ton, and that last Lagwagon. That Get Up Kids record was awesome. S: "Hang on Ted" by Armchair Martian, great fucking record. The Buena Vista Social Club is an excellent release.

A: The first Jets to Brazil album, "Orange Rhyming Dictionary" was one of the albums that I listened to the most, one of my favorites.

S: "Brave New World" by Iron Maiden

R: Another album that I listened to, especially at the beginning of the year, and it never left my stereo, was the Gamits album, "Endorsed By You". Things that are against you because those are things that are on your side and that is what you have to take to your advantage.

In closing, is there anything you would like to add?

R: If someone finished this interview, thanks for making it all the way through, and thanks to our record label and our friends and the people that come to our shows and support us. That is what allows us to keep doing this.

Jord: Well, they're starting to grow hemp fucking legally now.

oped a more through process in terms of song writing. It took a lot more time going over things and we really wanted to incorporate the CD-ROM part of the album into it as well, which took a little bit of extra time and energy. Chris actually took some time to learn about the software to get it going, and then Derrick, one of the guys that we work on G7 Welcoming Committee with, actually did the authoring and a lot of the production of the CD-ROM. So it's kinda cool because it was a lot of people that we know working on the project together out of Winnipeg. And then we just had a lot of fucking weird shit that kept postponing it by 3 month increments. I broke my leg playing hockey, Chris and Todd's vocal cords both got blown out when we were doing the vocal tracks. That pushed it back for a while. There were weird guitar problems for a while. We thought, "Holy Fuck maybe there is a GOD and he's pissed off at us. Or the CIA is pissed off." Ultimately it came out and we're happy with it. I think that we think it's the most ideal project that we have worked on thus far.

ADD: What's your favorite multinational corporation and why?

Jord: (Cough-cough) Let's see. I don't know if I really have a favorite since we live underneath a corporate paradigm that pretty much dominates economy and culture at this time. I'd say, take for instance a company like Padagonia who makes organic clothing out of organic cotton. I'm not too sure what their labor standards are. I don't know. I know of some indie labels who are organized as corporations simply for tax purposes.

ADD: The answer that I was looking for is a company that you don't like and why.

Jord: Oh okay, that's a lot easier. How about Dupont? (Cough-cough) I don't know. The whole corporate thing is just... Well, to be honest about it, I think is to replace the whole idea of a nation state being the pinnacle of the hierarchies, which kind of replaced the whole idea of kings and queens and the serfland owner kind of relationship. Now what we have is essentially a handful of corporations ruling the world Individuals making more than hundreds of millions of people make at one time. It's a frightening prospect this concentration of power and the gap between the wealthy and the poor being I think the widest it has ever been in the history of human kind. And all that goes along with that The ownership of the media, the military industrial media corporate kind of complex. I think we're truly heading toward a global totalitarian system, which is the preferred trend of the elite.

ADD: What about the merger between AOL and Time Warner?

Jord: It just seems like a trend of power and money, a concentration of power; and those are the people ultimately influencing who gets into government and what kind of policies the government use. Whether it's fucking bombing countries like Serbia because they have a more socialist kind of way, or dismantling the universal health care system in Canada, it's all part of the same fucking trend. Privatize everything in site because public ownership is inherently evil according to people who want to privatize everything and capitalize off of it. It's all fucked.

ADD: Do you think the government keeps a file on you guys?

Jord: I don't know actually. None of us have ever gone through the process of the freedom of information act to try to gain access to that kind of stuff. It's hard to say.

ADD: Do you think they would?

Jord: Possibly, like in times like the McCarthy era when they were trying to slag everybody as being a quote/unquote "communist". people were losing their jobs over it. Ultimately, that kind of strategy, being employed to weaken the left or the radical left, or anything that is antiestablishment, then sure that's going to hit all kinds of things.

ADD: You don't think you guys are involved with anything like that?

Jord: Yeah, by association we are totally involved. We are supportive of critical, radical, political honest media.

ADD: So you don't think that they're keeping a file on you because you are doing this?

Jord: I can't say.

which is basically the exact opposite of what is happening in my opinion, I think that people would really be outraged. I think that nobody wants to contribute to hundreds of thousands of Iraqi kids dying every year just so that some business man in the oil game can make a million. It's just totally fucking insane. But that's a pretty large undertaking given the current education system and what everybody is blasted with through the media every day. I think one way to get across that is if there can be a total leveling of the faith in corporate media and just the general cynicism of what message people are getting from corporate rich white man's news. Then I think there's hope. I think it all starts in the brain with ideas.

ADD: What's your favorite main stream band and why?

Jord: I don't really pay attention to too much to new music. But I did see Ted Nugent in Winnipeg. If I can use that for my Nugent rant I will. For one guy to show up in Winnipeg at a KISS concert, and do his encore with a fucking confederate flag shirt and an Indian headdress, telling people in Canada if they don't speak English get the fuck out of Canada, it was the harshest most political act I have ever seen. There's the irony for you there. He was probably the most political performer I have ever seen in my life. He was actually having conferences the day before to get people to show up and talk about hunting rights and stuff like that. And having the sign up for the latest far right political party in Canada, who had a booth at the conference and they were signing up people. He was telling people that they should be ashamed if they go out and spend 10 bucks on a pack smokes instead of giving that money to the alliance party. He was doing the same thing about beer. It was bizarre. The guy is a total fucking freak. So, fuck Nugent.

ADD: What's the song Natural Disaster about?

Jord: Natural Disaster is sort of based on an occurrence Todd had when he was a younger lad. I think he and a buddy were going through his parents' fucking drawers to see what lied within. In Todd's brain, which very well might be true, they found a dildo, and on the other side was Jesus Christ. Which is pretty fucking funny. So it's just basically about the conformity that a lot of Christians kind of express in the religion as being: live your life according to this fucked up set of rules (which was nicely edited by the powers that be at the time of Christ), and they took four gospels out of twelve and basically wrote the bible, and the history of the Catholic church was just insane, total Fascism. Just like, you know, you tell people to do this then what are you hiding in your closet? There's no reason to buy into a religion of the white man variety as I see it.

ADD: Noticeable Habitual Tendencies?

Jord: Wake up, take three shits, then I'm cleaned up for the day, which has not been

ADD: What's your philosophy on the future?

Jord: That kind of goes back and forth between a negative realization and a hope for the positive. I think that if things don't radically change very soon, we are headed towards a doom-like catastrophe, mainly because of the state of the environment and us in North America being the major consumers of all natural resources, and just going so crazy destroying the ozone layer. Then a guy like Bush getting into power. Just this week he said fuck it and just left it up to the corporations to do their own policing. And thinking that science has adequately proved it enough, if there is a strong enough correlation between the two. It is just a continuation of the whole ownership of the government by the rich. That's the idea. It's fucked up and if things don't change it's just going to get worse. It's definitely going downhill, but on the hopeful side, seeing things like Seattle and Washington protests, like that in Prague and in Sweden, and all throughout the third worlds, it gives me a little bit of hope that people are catching on and taking this shit a little more seriously.

ADD: Do you think that anyone is actually listening?

Jord: Judging from some of the correspondence we get, which is obviously a very small fragment that say would come out to these shows, I would say that about 95% is really positive in terms of the substantial issues that we are more or less trying to get across. Which is encouraging to us that is kind of one of the things that keep us going. And just even the amount of literature that the book table is selling on this tour is a good thing and quite surprising. Yeah, I think we're getting across in kind of a proportional sense. To the majority of people it's just like...enjoying good tunes. Like, fuck...we were all like that when we were all young kids. When we started getting into political bands like Dead Kennedys, Subhumans, DOA and stuff like that, we were more or less into the tunes and it took a few years for the ideas to sink in. So I'm always hopeful for that to occur.

ADD: What do you think will need to happen for change?

Jord: A public shift in the general ideology of everybody. I think that if people catch on to the scam that represents the government and democracy and all these other things,

happening on this tour. I don't know. I guess if I am working on G7, head down there at about 9 o'clock, stay there till about 5. For the past couple moths we would practice after work. Then get something to eat, chill out for a while, have a beer and a hoot, and then go to bed.

ADD: Last words for the kids?

Jord: Yeah, if anybody wants to check out our record label: http://www.g7welcomingcommittee.com/. Another awesome web site is www.zmag.org. It is a site that we recommend to someone who is trying to get involved with whatever type of cause. I got the guys to sign my CD, hooked Weasel up with some tweed, he handed me my camera, I turned it on, we passed some joints around, and Chip pulled out his questions... Enjoy. -Eric

Some Chick: When's the interview starting?

Jason: No, it's starting now.

Chip: It's already started. We got the dope deal but that's about all we've video taped so far.

Jason: No, it's starting right now. This is all going to





Jordan: You know, people ask us that all the time but I don't think we can honestly say when another release is gonna come out.


Chip: It just says "upcoming releases" so, I mean, are you working on stuff or what?

Joi: Great. I don't feel like ..


WEASEL: Like ass?

That kid is going to get beat up every day in school with a name like that. We played a show like two months ago, and it's pretty much the same shit. Dave was up here all last year. We played and had the most active year. We probably played like six times a year for two years before and now Dave's got a kid and he lives in Atlanta. We'll probably play once this year and in the fall. Then in the fall of 2001 we'll play our tenth anniversary show.

Chip: So are you thinking of getting back together and recording again?

Bill: We're not getting back together because we really never got away from each other. We always not a priority with No Idea, but they're the only label that will put out a record that is only go-

ing to sell about two thousand copies. We're not going on tour but we're stoked about those two thousand though.

Chip: Tell me about Sheryl Cro-Mags. Were you looking for a side project?

Bill: I'm not looking for a side project because I am currently in six bands.

Chip: Jesus Fucking Christ!!

Bill: Tonight I didn't think I was playing. I thought we were practicing. In the next four days I'm playing with four different bands. Two are performances that are completely unrehearsed. Tomorrow is practice with The Joey Smith Project. I do a lot of shit and have no time to do it. I get really drunk and start bands. Or my friends like to play with me and like to start bands with me. I can't say no half the time.

Chip: How do you feel when you see some of the press nowadays that names Radon as the beginning to the emo-hardcore movement in Gainesville? Bill: We came out in '92 and Chris told me seeing us and Spoke was the reason everyone decided to move here and start bands.

Innocent Bystander: Hey, are ya'll drinking in here? Chip: It depends, are you handing out beers? I have a hand extended. HAND EXTENDED!!!

Bill: The answer to you're question is, I concur. There was the '85 Gainesville punk scene, consisting of Roach Motel; and in '84 Husker Du passed through here on their way to Miami. The Replacements and people like Hide and Seek are the real reason, but Radon came along and the ball was already started. When I got here in '91 Spoke already had their 7 inch out and you'd go to a party and they would be playing. They didn't have a cover for it but they had their record and they were playing shows. I got the record and then we did the same thing. We recorded, started playing shows, and that's about it.

Chip: That's all the serious questions I have for you on the spur of the moment. How about favorite tooth-

Bill: Aquafresh, no wait, Arm and Hammer Whiten-

Chip: As far as porn goes which do you prefer, magazines or videos?

Bill: Videos, because...

Chip: Any particular company?

Bill: In magazines?

Chip: No, you picked videos. You have to pick your company.

Bill: Did I? No, magazines.

Chip: What's your favorite? Is it Club International? Hustler?

Bill: Drunk Chicks. (Laughter all around) Mike (Althea): How about favorite whiskey? Bill: I'm going to have to go with Jim Beam.

Chip: Charcoal filtered whiskey, that makes for great

rednecks

Bill: (Laughter)

Chip: Any influences when you were growing up? Bill: The Outfield, I have that tape in the player in my car right now. The Outfield has one of the best rock drummers ever. And then of course Neil Pert, Rush, and Zeppelin were pretty much the reason I wanted to play drums.

Chip: What do you think the biggest influence for Radon was?

Bill: Husker Du, but the biggest influence for Radon is probably heartbreak. (Laughter)

Chip: Did you follow up with Sugar?

Bill: Love Sugar, I paid two bucks just to see the Sugar video on Video Jukebox. Other than that we all liked something different. Dave liked Bob Mould. Brett liked the new stuff like Alice in Chains and Soundgarden. I liked the punk rock. I came from punk and hardcore and metal. James liked new wave a

Mike: What plans do Sheryl Cro-Mags have? Bill: We have a 7 inch today on Chris' new label. He's got about a month before the Warped tour to get the shit done. Maybe some touring. Chris is a good guy to work with cause he's like a fucking ma-

ADD: I saw this movie called "Another State of Mind" that you did with Minor Threat and Social Distortion After you filmed it, how long did it take

before it actually came out?

Shawn: The movie was filmed in '82. They did a premier in '83, so it took them about a year to edit it and put it together. Maybe not, maybe 8 to 10 months. ADD: How many tours have you done? I know you've been around along time. I saw you once before. A few years back you played at my friend Brian's skate park. it's called the "Skate Park Of Tampa" at least 6 years ago.

Shawn: Yeah, I remember that, '94 I think it was ADD. You played here with the Voodoo Glow Skulls? Shawn: Yeah, we played here in '96 with the Voodoo Glow Skulls at the Rubb.

ADD: I didn't see that one

Shawn. That was a weird show but we've done, god, 8 or 9 tours of the states, 6 or 7 in Europe, twice in Japan, and many times up and down the west coast ADD. I wish I had a list of questions. I didn't think I'd meet you guys. Who are some of your favorite bands to play with? Do you still go out to shows or just practice and hang out with your friends?

Adam: We go to shows.

So Bouncing Souls were going out and said, "Hey, Why don't you come out with us." So we came to do 12 dates with them. We were just in Hawaii for 2 weeks. We had a show for one night then we figured we might as well hang out since we were already there. We went surfing. We went to Maui for a week then surfed the Northshore which is pretty unbelievable.

ADD: Awesome

Shawn: So we're all about going to places where we can surf.

ADD: Any real jobs left?

Shawn: He has a real job.

ADD: I'm drawing a blank here. Anything you guys want to say?


Shawn: Don't say no. Do what do you want to say? Adam: Question everybody.

LANCE: YEAH, FIRST TIME IN TAMPA BUT I'VE BEEN TO FLORIDA BEFORE. WE'VE PLAYED GAINESVILLE AND WEST PALM BEACH.

SHAWN: DO YOU LIKE TOURING IN THE SOUTHEAST A

LANCE: WELL, THIS IS OUR FIRST TOUR IN AWHILE BUT WHEN WE DO TOUR WE LIKE COMING DOWN HERE. ALL OF OUR FLORIDA SHOWS ARE FUN. GEORGIA AS WELL, SO I LIKE THE AREA.

SHAWN: WHERE ARE YOU PLAYING AT IN FLORIDA?

LANCE: WEST PALM BEACH TOMORROW NIGHT.

SHAWN: CLUB WISE?

LANCE: I DON'T KNOW, IT'S ALL PROPAGANDHI. STILL IT'S PROBABLY SOME HUGE PLACE WE'VE NEVER PLAYED BEFORE.

SHAWN: HOW DID YOU GUYS GET HOOKED UP WITH ALL THIS?

ERIC: I HANDED YOU PICTURES I TOOK FROM A SHOW IN ATLANTA. DO YOU GO THERE A LOT? WHEN I LIVED THERE BANDS WOULD PLAY THERE THAT NEVER CAME TO FLORIDA.

LANCE: USED TO... THERE WAS A TIME WHEN WE DID THAT BUT WE GOT SO MUCH CRAP FOR IT, JUST PLAYING ATLANTA... LANCE: YEAH WE HAVEN'T PLAYED THERE IN LIKE 7 YEARS.

SHAWN: HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN AROUND AS J CHURCH?


LANCE: THE BAND STARTED IN 91', 91'-92'... SO LIKE JUST AROUND 10 YEARS.

LANCE: JUST ME.

SHAWN: HOW DID THAT WORK? YOU DO IT ALL YOURSELVES OR WHAT?

LANCE: FRIENDS... BY THAT POINT I'D MADE FRIENDS FROM RECORD LABELS. SO ASKING AROUND, SEEING WHO WOULD BE INTERESTED IN LICENCING OUR RECORDS. AT THIS POINT WE'VE LICENSED RECORDS TO JAPAN, SPAIN, EUROPE, ENGLAND, ALL OVER, SO IT LOOKS LIKE WE HAVE ALL THESE RECORDS BUT WE ONLY HAVE 5 ALBUMS.

SHAWN: I KNOW YOU DID A LOT OF 7 INCHES.

LANCE: THOSE ALSO ARE LICENSED. WE HAD A LOT COME OUT IN ENGLAND, SPAIN, THE STATES, THERE IS A LOT OF OVERLAP. BASI-CALLY WE HAVE 100 SONGS. THE WHOLE IDEA IS WE PREFER TO BE CHEAP FOR EVERYONE, IF YOU JUST WANT THE BASICS, IF YOU'RE NOT A COLLECTOR NERD, IN ANY COUNTRY FOR DOMESTIC PRICE. AND THAT'S THE IDEA BEHIND LICENSING.

SHAWN: HOW DID YOU DO THAT? I ALWAYS PICTURED YOU AS A 4-TRACK BAND IN THE GARAGE WITH A RECORDING STUDIO.

LANCE: WE DID FOR STUFF LIKE B SIDES AND SINGLES, WE HAVE A

ERS AND STUFF LIKE THAT, BUT A LOT OF TIMES WHEN WE GO IN THE STUDIO WE RECORD LOTS OF STUFF. WHENEVER WE RECORD AN ALBUM, WE RECORD LOTS OF EXTRA STUFF MOSTLI BECAUSE WE LIKE TO HAVE A LOT OF STUFF TO CHOOSE FROM. SO WE HAVE A DOZEN OF WHAT WE THINK ARE THE BEST SONGS


FOR THE LP AND WHATEVER IS LEFT, AS LONG AS WE LIKE IT WE'LL GIVE THEM TO COMPILATIONS OR SINGLES OR B SIDES.

SHAWN: HOW DID YOU MEET PROPAGANDHI?

LANCE: WELL I USED TO BE IN MONSULA ON LOOKOUT IN 92'. I KNOW PROPAGANDHI FROM PLAYING WITH THEM BEFORE. THEN WHEN I WENT ON TOUR WITH MONSULA, AND MET THEM THROUGH THAT THEN J CHURCH STARTED TOURING WITH THEM. YOU KNOW WE HAVE A LOT OF SIMILAR IDEAS BUT DIFFEREN APPROACHES. THEY ARE ONE OF THE FEW BANDS THAT ARE RE ALLY SAYING SOMETHING THAT WE ARE PRETTY MUCH IN AGREE MENT WITH 98% OF THE TIME. WHEN WE RECORDED OUR LAST RECORD, THEY WERE IN TOWN SO THEY CAME IN AND SANG ON A COUPLE SONGS. WE'VE BEEN FRIENDS WITH THEM EVER SING THEN, IT'S LIKE ANY OTHER BAND THING, WE LIKE EACH OTHER'S MUSIC, WE LIKE EACH OTHER'S IDEAS, BUT BASICALLY WE LIKE HANGING OUT, WE LIKE GETTING DRUNK, HAVING DINNER TO GETHER. THERE ARE SOME BANDS YOU MEET AND YOU JUST KNOW YOU'RE GOING TO BE PALS.

ERIC: WHERE DID THE NAME J CHURCH COME FROM?

LANCE: IN SAN FRANCISCO THERE IS A STREET CALLED CHURCH STREET AND ALL THE BUSES ARE LETTERED FOR THE SUBWAY SYS TEM AND THE J GOES DOWN CHURCH STREET, I USED TO LIVE OF THE J CHURCH, WORK OFF THE J CHURCH. THE FIRST 50 SONGS



WHERE WRITTEN ON THE J CHURCH.

SHAWN: THAT'S FUNNY, I'D HEARD RUMORS THAT THERE WAS A JEFF CHURCH IN THE BAND.

LANCE: THE BOUNCER ON THE FAR SIDE OF THE STAGE, HIS NAME IS JOHN CHURCH AND HE WAS LIKE THAT'S MY NAME. THE FIRST TIME WE WENT TO SPAIN PEOPLE THOUGHT IT WAS A JOKE ON JULIO IGLESIAS.

SHAWN: THAT'S COOL. SO DO YOU TOUR OUT OF THE COUNTRY ALOT?

LANCE: OH YEAH, BEEN TO EUROPE 10 TIMES, JAPAN.

SHAWN: SHOWS THAT COMPARE WITH THE STATES?

LANCE: DEPENDS ON WHERE YOU ARE. ILIKE ENGLAND A LOT, ILIKE BRITAIN. I LIKE SCOTLAND AS WELL. I THINK THE SHOWS ARE REALLY GREAT THERE. THERE ARE SIMILARITIES BUT OVERALL OUR NORTH AMERICAN SHOWS ARE PROBABLY OUR BEST SHOWS BECAUSE NOT ONLY ARE THE CROWDS GREAT BUT YOU FEEL LIKE YOU CAN RELATE BECAUSE MOST OF THE TIME WE ARE SPEAKING ABOUT SOMETHING SPECIFIC.

SHAWN: YEAH, I CAN TELL YOUR LYRICS ARE VERY PERSONAL EXPERIENCES FOR YOU.

LANCE: THERE ARE TIMES WHEN WE ARE LIKE IN GERMANY AND THE SHOW MAY BE REALLY GREAT BUT SOMETIMES YOU FEEL LIKE THEY JUST DON'T GET IT. NOTHING AGAINST THEM... IT'S DEFINITELY A CULTURAL BARRIER, BUT A SHOW IN CANADA IS JUST AS GREAT AS THE STATES, TOKYO AS WELL, IT'S HARD TO EXPLAIN BECAUSE THERE ARE SO MANY CULTURAL DIFFERENCES.

ERIC: WHAT INFLUENCED YOU TO PLAY MUSIC?

LANCE: I WAS BROUGHT UP IN MUSIC. I GREW UP IN HAWAII.

SHAWN: HOW OLD ARE YOU?

LANCE: 34. THERE IS A LOT OF MUSIC, IT'S ENCOURAGED. I STARTED PLAYING GUITAR IN 7TH GRADE. I KNOW IT SOUNDS LAME BUT MY PARENTS WERE HIPPIE TYPES, INTO HENDRIX, CREAM. WHEN I GOT OLD ENOUGH TO BUY RECORDS I LOVED QUEEN AND WANTED TO PLAY LIKE BRIAN MAY SO BADLY.

ERIC: "NEWS OF THE WORLD" WAS MY 1ST RECORD. I HAD TO CHOOSE BETWEEN THAT AND AC/DC "BACK IN BLACK", QUEEN WON.

LANCE: THEN I GOT INTO CLASH AND PUNK ROCK, AFTER I'D BEEN INTO PUNK FOR YEARS A LOT INFLUENCED ME. OBVIOUSLY YOU CAN HEAR THE STIFF LITTLE FINGERS OR DC TYPE STUFF, HUSKER DU.

SHAWN: WHAT ACTUALLY MADE YOU TURN TO THE PUNK ROCK STUFF?

LANCE: I HAD AN UNCLE WHO WAS LIKE THE COOL UNCLE. EVERYONE'S GOT ONE.

SHAWN: THE ONE THAT SMOKES POT.

LANCE: YEAH, OR WHATEVER. HE'D BUY ME CHEAPTRICK OR ROLLING STONES. WHEN "LONDON CALLING" CAME OUT HE GOT IT FOR ME FOR X-MAS. AFTER THAT I GOT INTO THE RAMONES, STIFF LITTLE FINGERS, ALL THE OLD STUFF, AND I STARTED READING MAGAZINES BECAUSE I'M A NERD AND I SAW AN AD FOR "GROUP SEX" BY THE CIRCLE JERKS. I CAN REMEMBER WHEN "DAMAGED" BY BLACK FLAG CAME OUT. THEN I SAW "THE DECLINE FOR WESTERN CIVILIZATION". I WAS REALLY INTO LA HARDCORE LIKE BLACK FLAG, MINUTEMEN.

SHAWN: WHERE WERE YOU LIVING AT THIS TIME?

LANCE: HAWAII.

SHAWN: SO HOW DID YOU FIND OUT ABOUT THIS STUFF?

ANCE: HAWAII IS PRETTY BIG. HONOLULU IS ONE OF THE BIG-GEST CITIES IN THE COUNTRY.

SHAWN: DID YOU GET A LOT OF PUNK PUBLICATIONS LIKE MRR?

LANCE: YEAH, I REMEMBER BUYING THE 2ND ISSUE OFF MRR WHEN IT CAME OUT, YOU CAN GET THEM ALL, LIKE FLIPSIDE, A LOT OF POLITICAL BOOKSTORES CARRIED THAT STUFF SO THAT'S HOW I GOT ALL THE CRASS SINGLES. EVERYBODY I KNOW IS IN A BAND THAT COVERED MINOR THREAT OR GOVERNMENT ISSUE

SHAWN: WHAT KIND OF SCENE IS IN HAWAII?

LANCE: WELL, YOU HAVE A LOT OF NOFX TYPE BANDS OR SCREECH-ING WEASEL, BUT THEY ALSO HAVE STRAIGHTEDGE BANDS. IT'S LIKE EVERYWHERE ELSE. A LITTLE BIT OF EVERYTHING.

ERIC: EVER HAD A MULLET?

LANCE: NO, I WAS ALWAYS UPSET THAT I COULD NEVER HAVE THE HAIRCUT I WANTED. I WENT TO A PRIVATE SCHOOL. WE HAD A DRESS CODE. FOR 2 YEARS I HAD TO DO ROTC SO'I WAS PREVENTED FROM HAVING LONG HAIR OR A MOHAWK.

SHAWN: WHEN DID YOU MOVE MAIN LAND?

LANCE: 85', CRINGER HAD ALREADY STARTED. WE MOVED TO LA THEN ONTO SAN FRANCISCO.

SHAWN: WHEN DID CRINGER START? HOW LONG DID IT LAST?

ANCE: WHEN I WAS IN HIGH SCHOOL. WE WANTED TO LEAVE HA-WAIL IT WASN'T JUST CRINGER, WE BROUGHT LIKE 15 FRIENDS AND STARTED PLAYING IN LA.

SHAWN: SO YOU MOVED TO LA. YOU HAD QUITE A FEW 7" RELEASES DIDN'T YOU?

LANCE: WHEN WE MOVED OUT TO LA WE HOOKED UP WITH VINYL COMMUNICATIONS, MET BOB, AND STARTED PUTTING OUT RECORDS IN 86' OR 87

ERIC: CAN YOU SURF?

LANCE: NO, WHICH IS PRETTY SILLY GROWING UP IN HAWAII. I SKATED A LONG TIME TILL I BROKE MY ARM REALLY BADLY. THEN I STARTED PLAYING GUITAR MORE SERIOUSLY. I NEVER WENT BACK TO IT. I'M AFRAID I'LL BREAK MY ARM AND SCREW UP A TOUR. IT'S HAPPENED TO US. I WAS NEVER REALLY GOOD AND I'M REALLY CLUMSY 50 ...

SHAWN: WHERE DID J CHURCH FORM? WHERE DID YOU MEET ALL THE GUYS?

LANCE: WELL, THIS IS OUR 5TH LINEUP. WE'VE BEEN AROUND SO LONG, PEOPLE COME AND GO. ADAM WAS IN JAWBREAKER. WE USED TO PLAY WITH JAWBREAKER ALL THE TIME. WE LIVED WITH THEM.


SHAWN: YOU'VE BEEN ON A LOT OF LABELS, HOW DID THAT WORK OUT?

I did this interview with guitarist/vocalist Mike from the band via email shortly before the band left for tour with Leatherface. I took some pictures of the band at the St. Pete show but they weren't that great. I spent most of the time before they came on drinking beer with My friend Davey Tiltwheel in the Leatherface tour van. He was on the road doing sound for the band so we got loaded and talked a lot of shit. Anyway, I stole these photos in the layout from the No Idea Records site. It's www.noidearecords.com if you want to check it out. Dave D.

.1 Where are you from geographically? Do you like it there? Who are some of your favorite bands from the area?

Born and raised in Michigan baby! We all grew up in a little town called Marshall, population 9000. I actually really like Michigan for a lot of reasons. I like having four seasons. It keeps things refreshing, even if it gets ridiculously cold. Some of my personal favorites from Michigan currently are Trocar, End It, Biddy Biddy, Remainder, Inside Five Minutes, and Lovesick. They are all super talented and fun to hang out with.

- .2 The story or reason behind the name Small Brown Bike for the band? Back in middle school we used to hang out, play video games, and work on bikes in the summer. One bike we built was called 'Poop'. It was a little pink Barbie bike that we painted brown and added some modifications. So that's where it came from. Instead of Poop, we went with Small Brown Bike.
- .3 Did you seek out No Idea records or did Var approach you guys? What's it been like working with him?

I really really like being involved with No Idea. It was never a weird record label/band relationship, no contracts or anything. We have become really good friends with Var and Jennifer and everyone who works there. It is really inspiring and comforting to know that you have their support and friendship. We sent our first 7" to them to see if they would distro it. There is some crazy story about Var going through stacks of 7"s that they received for distro and ours ended up in the "nice cover, I will check this out" pile. Total luck. We got a postcard from him a couple of months later offering to help us out with Florida shows if we needed it and he asked if he could put one of our songs on a sampler. And then at the bottom, it said, "Maybe we could do a record someday?" We were all so damn excited about it.

.4 I heard the new album, it's incredible. How have the new songs worked out on the road so far?

Thanks! Yeah, we have had a great time playing the new ones. We generally try to play three or four every night. But now that it is out, we are going to bump that up. At a couple shows in Michigan people have been singing along, so that is pretty rewarding.

.5 Where do you draw your energy from when you write music? What were



some things that influenced you during the production of "Dead Reckoning"? I personally get inspired to write when I see my friend's bands play. There is something really cool about personally knowing someone who is writing music that you really enjoy. It just makes it that much more personal and genuine, and it just gets me pumped up to work on stuff. I've been trying to make up chords to write songs with. That is what really excites me. Especially with two guitars. If you can both hit that crazy sounding chord at the right time... aaah shit! As far as lyrics go, I usually start with notes or my journal and draw from that. Then it becomes a task of getting the ideas to come out right, and not sounding like a complete jackass, but staying honest too. In the production on "Dead Reckoning" my thoughts were to try to make things more separated; so you could pick out a certain instrument and really listen to it, but then have them all work together as a big wall too. I'm really excited on how it turned out. Ed was the man and we had a great time.

.6 I see you're about to go on tour with Leatherface and Hot Water Music. What do you think about that?

Fucking insanity. I'm so excited to hang out with those guys for a month. I'm so grateful that they offered it to us. Plus we get to play in places where we have never been. It's going to be a crazy trip. There are a couple of shows with Propagandhi, Avail, and J Church and I'm just going to feel like an annoying little brother on that one.

.7 What are some of your favorite things to do on the road when you're not rocking out?

It's so hard to do anything except drive and play, but I really enjoy staying with the people who we have become friends with. Hanging out, having beers,



making dinner, etc... We are really lucky to have that opportunity to travel and make a bunch of new friends. It's always nice to have that day off to go swimming or go to some amusement type place.

.8 Has anything horrible ever gone wrong while on tour, or maybe something strange and humorous?

One of the funniest/strangest shows that we ever played was on tour with The Casket Lottery in May, 2000. We were added to a show in Tulsa, OK because one had fallen through. We got the directions to the show and were on our way. The next thing we knew, we were pulling into the Tulsa Zoo! The directions were right and we were all a little like, "What the hell?" It ended up that the show was at the picnic area in the zoo. We played outside under a shelter in front of about 30 people. It ended up being a really great time. Definitely unforgettable.



.9 Do you have any enemies or rivalries amongst your peers? Maybe a particular band that gets under your skin?

Yeah, those fuckers in Cursive should stay in Omaha. Ha.

.10 Do any of you work or go to school? Is it hard to juggle you schedules?

Yeah, we all have lives outside of the band. I work at a web design company and at a warehouse. It makes it kind of tough, but they are usually cool. Dan just went full time doing web design at Michigan State University. So that makes it hard for him to tour a lot. We have a friend, Jeff, who is going to be playing drums for us on some tours. He is an awesome guy and an amazing drummer. He plays with a band called Biddy Biddy Biddy. He learned a bunch of our songs in a couple of weeks. And Dan is cool with it too. he is the one who actually suggested it!

.11 Do any of you drink? What's your worst alcohol experience?

Probably the worst experience that I have had with alcohol involved beer, Jager... and uh... that's about all I remember.

.12 This is Weasel's pet question... Has anyone ever had sex with someone's mom?

Nope.

.13 What's your favorite Simpsons episode? Favorite characters? I'm not really the guy who knows every single episode by heart. I suck at the "...the one when..." Simpsons conversations. But I do know that the comic book guy makes me crack up every time he's on.

.14 There are some labels, who shall go nameless, who have warned bands about doing interviews with us. Now tell me, is it hard to be light hearted in the topsy tervy world of rock and roll when hard hitting guerilla media tactical lines of questioning like, "How much beer can you drink?" and "Who's the smelliest?" bombard you without warning?

I try to stay out of the bullshit... message boards and the biz. It's interesting, but annoying too. Most of it isn't worth my time.

.15 Where's the preferred eating stop on tour? A lot of people like Waffle House.

The preferred eating stop is anywhere that isn't fast food. It's always nice to check out a cool restaurant somewhere. It just wouldn't be right to say, "Hey, you gotta check out this Mcdonald's in Boston! It's insane! Try the Filet-O-Fish!"

This interview was done outside the Orpheum on April 19, 2001; and in case you can't tell from Zack's comments, the band was kind enough to do this before eating dinner. -Simi B.

Please Introduce yourselves.

Zack: I play guitar and sing. James: Guitar and sing. Trent: Bass guitar.

Rebecca: Drums.

Give me a little history about the band.

James: It's been a few years and we've had a of couple drummers.

Zack: Me and James met through mutual friends, Trent and James went to high school together, and then Becky moved here from San Francisco.

How long have you guys been together?

Becky: I've been with the band for about a year. They were all together a couple of years before that.

Trent: Myself, for college. I was going to school and I just wanted to take a break from it after three years.

Zack: Rochester is just an hour and a half away from Minneapolis. It's not easy to deal with music in a small town like that.

How's the tour been going so far?

Becky: Good!

Zack: Ups and downs, ups and downs... We had a couple shows that sucked and then we played like MacRock and that was really cool. We had a good streak where we played with Hot Rod Circuit and got to know them well and had a lot of fun.

Zack: The shows have been fun, but some just...

James: ...some have been bad.

Bad in what way?

Becky: We go to the show and there are just people, but not the crowd that wants to see us.

Zack: Yeah, there was one show where nobody showed up. There had been a lot of shows that week in town and everyone was like showed out. So no one showed up.

Becky: Yeah, but we just try to make the best of situations. We still have

Got any good tour stories so far? (This question was followed by guilty laughter from the entire band.)

Zack: I could tell the "fire in the hole" story... We were on tour in January and February. We were on the road and we bought a whole bunch of fire-crackers, like Black Cats and stuff. We'd light 'em, throw them out the window, and just watch them explode. One day I was lighting them and throw-

ing them out onto the road. I was sitting shotgun and Becky was driving. What happened was she got cold and put the window up without telling me. So I lit some firecrackers and went to throw them out the window, and they fell into my lap. I jumped military style into the back seat and they started going off. Becky was in the driver's seat leaning into the door like, "Aah we're gonna die!" I was so scared!

Becky: Zack was so mad. He was like, "What the hell did you do that for!?"

James: We were cracking up. It was so funny.

Yeah, well you guys in the back seat were all safe with nothing to worry about. Of course it was funny.

James: It was definitely funny for us.

Tell me a little about the Minneapolis scene.

James: For a while it just seemed like many Minneapolis bands weren't touring much or anything. But now there are a lot putting out records and stuff. There are new labels now and we have bands like the Dillinger Four and Selby Tigers, so it's cool. Becky: There's a lot of history there too though.

Zack: The only thing that sucks right now is that there aren't any good all ages venues. There are a lot of good bands and the scene is getting really good but there's no place for them to play.

You guys have a new album coming out on May 22nd. Can you tell me a little bit about it?

James: Yeah, it's called The Allegory of Death and Fame. It's going to be out on Fueled By Ramen Records.

Becky: It's overall rock really.
Trent: It's poppy.

Becky: We went a little Pink Floyd-esque on it.

Zack: There are a lot of hippie jams on it.

Trent: A lot of hippie guitar solos.

Becky: No, no, we're just kidding. Overall it's more dark and more rock.

Do you guys have an overall theme with this record?

Becky: Teddy bears.

Zack: Not really, basically this is just a pretty bitter record.

That's a theme...

James: No, it's just a lot darker and that's about it.

What were you guys listening

to during the making of the record and did that influence the record at all?

Zack: That's a good question... I don't like that meal. What??

Zack: Oh, sorry, I'm just hungry. James just touched my belly. You can tell what's on my mind. I'm like Homer Simpson. I need a little monkey to run around and get me food.

You're need a helper monkey, like Mojo?

Zack: Yeah, that's what I need.

Becky: Anyway, we all listen to a lot of different things, so they may have influenced us, but not directly.

Zack: I think a lot of the darkness on the record came from us being in Minneapolis in the winter when everyone's just in a crabby mood.

Becky: Yeah, everyone gets pissed off and bitter. It had been my first winter back in really shitty weather and there was just a lot of stuff happening in all of our lives.

Zack: Foooood...

What was the hardest thing breaking out onto the scene for you guys, as a band?


James: It's hardest not knowing a lot of people. It sucks, but sometimes it really depends on who you know and where you can play







Eric: Wow, that's amazing. You guys kinda remind me of the Afghan Whigs with that R&B feel. Why did you decide to incorporate R&B into your music?


ND: That's one of our favorite types of music. We like all kinds of music but that's one of our top favorites.

This interview was conducted by Eric Grant.

NAME/INSTRUMENT YOU PLAY?

My name's Murray Fucking Acton but in the Dayglo's they call me The Cretin. I play guitar and sing. (If you can call it that.)

WHERE DID THE NAME COME FROM?

I had a punk band in 70's called the Sickfucks (we broke up cuz we sucked and also there was another Sickfucks from NY or something) and at our last show we got paid in spray paint instead of money. They told us it was free advertising. Anyway, it was Dayglo brand spray paint (Dayglo Orange) that they gave us which just ended up clogging up my room after the band broke up. I had a shit load of tunes ready to go so I hooked up with Bonehead, our drummer and we decided to start a new band. Me and him sat in his kitchen one day smoking fatties and we figured that we'd name the band the Dayglo...whatever, the most frequently used word on the front page of that day's paper was (except the obvious ones like if, and, the, but, you know what I mean). So we pick up the paper and right in the fucking headlines it's got "Dr. Fucking Henry Whatever His Name Was gets Fucking Busted for his Fucking Abortion Clinic". We go, "Whoa, dude, it's like a sign from God or something. We're the Dayglo Abortions."

I HAVE "FEED US A FETUS" ON VINYL, AND IT'S ON A LABEL CALLED TOXIC SHOCK, BUT NOW YOU ARE ON GOD RECORDS. HOW'D THAT COME ABOUT?

That was our first U.S. release and those guys did all right for us. After that we did 3 records for a company called Fringe Product that ripped us right fucking off so we started up God records ourselves so we could take back control of our tunes. Now we do it all. We make the records, book the tours, make our own shirts and shit, run the web sight...never a dull moment.

I'VE LOVED EVERYTHING I'VE EVER HEARD YOU SING. WHY DID YOU DISAPPEAR ON A COUPLE ALBUMS?

At that time I had been in the Dayglos for about 15 years. That's a lot of fucking beers. I had a couple of other killer bands going and I thought I'd give it a go with them. You can't do the same thing your whole life. That would be boring. I was away for about 4 years and I played some rockin' gigs. Then Bonehead talked me into coming back to do this show that closed down an old punk bar in Toronto called the Generator and it was pure fucking mayhem. I realized that I missed the

chaos and I'd be an idiot not to fuck shit up like that at every possible opportunity. So, that's it. I'm back.

WHO HAVE BEEN SOME OF YOUR INFLUENCES?

I don't know. It started of when I was a kid in the 70's with Black Sabbath, King Crimson, and the almighty Mahavishnu Orchestra. Then rock music went sour with Journey and Kansas and that shite. That was about the time I heard Iggy Pop, the Dead Boys, and the Pistols. I was kind of reborn. It was obvious that rock still had balls. Since then there's been so many good bands. Take your pick: Black Flag, DK's, Slayer...whatever.

HOW MANY RELEASES DO YOU HAVE? Out of the Womb, self released in 1981 Feed Us A Fetus, Toxic Shock/Fringe '83/'84? Here Today Guano Tomorrow, Fringe '87 Two Dogs Fucking, Fringe '91 Little Man in the Canoe, God '95 Corporate Whores, God '96 Death Race 2000, God '99

DO YOU PREFER TO PACK A BONG OR ROLL A JOINT?

When I'm at home (like right now...bubble bubble bubble) I smoke through only the most reeking of bamboo bongs. But that's a pain on the train, so when on the road we prefer the big fat choads.

WHAT DO YOU THINK WE CAN DO TO PREVENT VIOLENCE AND HATRED AT SHOWS? Well, up in Canada we might not be the most politically correct pack of hockey playing hoolies; but when an individual or individuals try to be hateful or violent without cause at a punk gig, they are publicly beaten. They are always outnumbered. They never stand a chance when the whole crowd turns on them. And most of all, they never come back. It's up to the band to observe these idiots in action and point them out to the audience. Just what every wanna be Hitler needs, a couple of hundred drunk punks on their ass.

DO YOU STILL HAVE A DAY JOB, AND IF SO, WHAT DO YOU DO?

Man, if I told you what I did for money I'd have George Jr. at my door in a fucking tank by breakfast. You know he wants to declare B.C. a drug exporting area and

dump some economic sanctions on us over the weed. The guy's a fuckwit. You guys pay us in American dollars. The less our dollar is compared to yours, the more our weed is worth to us.

WHAT IS CANADA LIKE? I HEAR STORIES ABOUT HOW PEOPLE USED TO RUN THERE TO AVOID THE DRAFT. I LOVE PROPAGANDHI AND THEY ARE ALSO PROUD TO BE CANADIAN. THEY JUST PLAYED HERE AND JORG WAS COMPLAINING THAT IT'S TOO HOT HERE, THAT HE NEEDED SNOW. DOES IT SNOW THERE A LOT?

Oh yeah, eh. It's fuckin' freezin'. We hafta wrap ourselves up in fur, eh. The other day I let one of my dogs out for a piss, and I had to go out and break him off a fuckin tree.

HOW OFTEN DO YOU TOUR THE STATES?

Since the war on (the citizens of the United States) drugs started it has been hard for us to get into the states. It's the hardest country on earth. We can go anywhere else, no worries. But just because of a few pot charges it's fucking near impossible to get into the good of U.S.A. We pull it off now and then though. We're going down to L.A. and back next week (if we can sneak across the border).

EVER HAD A MULLET? Fuckin eh! I grew up in the 70's.

HOW DO YOU FEEL ABOUT PEOPLE WHO TAKE THEMSELVES TOO SERIOUSLY?

 \boldsymbol{I} don't give a shit. People can be whatever they want as long as they let me be whatever \boldsymbol{I} want.

HOW DO YOU THINK THE SCENE HAS CHANGED SINCE YOU STARTED? It's become more unified. It used to be punks against skins against metal heads against jocks against each other. These days they all seem to go to the same shows and get along a fuck of a lot better than before. We get lots of rockers and skins (non-racist kind-Nazis can't go out in public in Canada) snowboarding jocks, and way, way more chicks at the gigs than in the old days.

WHAT IS YOUR MOST MEMORABLE SHOW?

There are tons. Playing for the Serbs and Kroats in Slovania. The Portland Punkfest in the early 90's. We just played some killer shows in Australia. They're all good.

WHAT IS THE MOST ANNOYING THING YOU DO?

Nothing really bothers me that much but it has been said (mostly by women) that I scratch by balls in public too much. I'll be leaning against a wall massaging my scrotum then pull my hands out my pants and shake hands with someone. It doesn't seem like much to me, I mean I'm clean and all, but it bugs the shit out of everyone else.

WHAT ARE YOUR ADDICTIONS?

The only thing I'm really addicted to is cigarettes. I'm in a continual state of quitting, which is better than smoking 3 packs a day. Everything else is OK. I keep the beer down to a 15 pack a day, keep away from most hard drugs most of the time, and only take hallucinogens once or twice a year. Face it, I'm a regular health nut.

WHAT ARE YOU LISTENING TO THESE DAYS?

We just got back from Australia where we played with 20 or 30 kick ass bands. I've been listening to their stuff lately. Vicious - killer punk band, Throw Down - blazing hardcore, some American bands like the Idiots, Portrait of Poverty, Oppressed Logic, Dr. Know...mostly bands we play with.

ANY CRAZY TOUR STORIES?

Every time we go out something crazy happens. The last tour was Australia. They're a serious pack of piss drinkin' lunatics down there. I guess the funniest thing we did on that trip had to do with a pig's head that I picked up from a public market in Melbourne. I saw this fucking gross looking thing hanging on the wall in a butcher stall and it only cost 4 bucks so I figured that's gotta be the most fun you could ever have with 4 bucks so I bought it. We carried the fucking thing around for a few days, sticking it in people's beds, leaving it in the fridge at a vegan backpackers hostel, stuff like that. After a while it started to rot and holy fucking Christ did it stink. We had to get rid of it. On our last night in Melbourne we had a radio interview to do with a mainstream FM station so we decided we would give it to them (so they could remember what cool guys we were). It was a late interview so there wasn't anybody working in the building. It was easy to find an out of the way place right next to the intake to their ventilation system to stash our smelly gift. By the time we finished the interview the whole building stank of rotten pig's head. It was really fucking bad. We split pretty quick because it was getting to the point where you couldn't breathe in there without puking. I still wonder how bad it smelled when everyone showed up for work the next day. I also wonder how long it took them to find it. It was pretty well hidden after all.

WHAT'S THE WORST THING ABOUT BEING IN A BAND?

I don't know. Starving kind of sucks. Spending 8 or 10 hours a day stuck in a van with a bunch of unclean fuckwits kinda sucks too. It's a lot of fucking work and musicians are generally a lazy bunch. If they weren't, they'd get real jobs. The worst for me is what the fuck to do with yourself when you get home (if you even have one).

HOW OLD ARE YOU?

I'm 40. I've been playing punk rock for 23 years. I can't remember anything else.

ARE YOU A FAMILY MAN, A LONER, OR JUST GAY?

I have a family. Three kids a wife and a dog. I'm pretty lucky. They nurse me back to health when I get home from the road and for the most part support me in what I do. It bums them out when I'm away but I bring them back cool shit from around the world, and every now and then get to take them somewhere really cool.

WHAT'S A NORMAL DAY LIKE FOR CRETIN?

I get up at 8 a.m. (have a bongtoke), get the girls ready for school (have a bongtoke), tell my son to stop stealing my weed and not to get brought home by the cops today (have a bongtoke), answer my e-mail (have a bongtoke), work on the web site (have a bongtoke), play guitar (have a bongtoke), take the wife out for a beer/lunch (smoke a fatty), visit bro's (drink some beers and smoke some fattys), get home at 3 for the kids and start on dinner (have a bongtoke). Once the kids are in bed, check the grow show (have a bongtoke), read a book (have a bongtoke), walk the dog (have a bongtoke), go to bed. Pretty normal by anyone's standards I think.

ANYTHING YOU WANT TO TELL THE KIDS OUT WHO READ OUR ZINE? Brush your teeth every day and never tie. People hate liars.





7 SECONDS-"Scream Real Loud...Live", CD (Side One Dummy)

Okay, being that I've long been a fan of this band, this is another one of those CDs I was excited to find in my stack to review. 'A New Wind" will probably always be my favorite record by Kevin and crew but as many times as they've played here I have vet to see them. Well, as far as live records go, this could use some work. But as far as Seconds goes, this rocks. Includes "99 Red Balloons", "Satyagraha", and "If the Kids are United". I kinda wish that they had done more off of "Soulforce Revolution" or my favorite song "We're Gonna Fight", but you can't win them all. -Ink Master

12 CENT- S/T, CD (Self Released)

Good sounding, sort of mid-late 80's style NYHC with a modern production. Lots of bands going back to this style, which is cool, but a lot of them sound the same and not as good as the old stuff. These guys hold their own though, and I like this CD I can't tell what the lyrics are all about, but some of the titles are amusing: "Jalapeno Peppa Nutz" and "I Have A Stunt Double". The lyrics don't seem to fit with them, though, so go figure... I won't give these guys any shit for sending a (very cheap) CD-R that wouldn't play in my CD player and that I had to put in the computer to import the tracks in order to hear them; but they should at least send a release copy to make up for it. AGENT ORANGE- "Greatest & Latest, This, That-N-The Other Thing", CD

I always thought Dave was a cool guy even before he started hooking me up and giving me free shit just to write a review. But when I find shit in my stack by my favorite bands (Agent Orange, Snuff, RFTC, Nanalm Death, Fear) it's like Christmas or my birthday because it's something I would buy brand new anyway. I bow at the alter of Dave Disorder for helping my poor ass so that I might buy more equipment and pot. You rule. As far as this release goes, well, it's a greatest hits package with 2 new songs. The coolest thing about this is that they went back into the studio and rerecorded all the old shit, so you have new versions of classics like "Bloodstains", "I Kill Spies", "El Dorado", and "Everything Turns Grey". Now they just need to go back into the studio and record volume 2 because they left out "Pipeline", "The Last Goodbye". With members of the Gamits and the Fairlanes you know this has melodic masterpiece written all over it.
