

Asian American Pacific Heritage Week

In 1978, President Carter proclaimed the week of May 14-19 as Asian American Pacific Heritage Week to honor and recognize the achievements of Asian/Pacific Americans which includes people of Chinese, Japanese, Philipino, Southeast Asian and Pacific Island backgrounds.

During the week of April 27-30, 1981, the members of the Asian Student Union will present speakers and events which will share some of the history and culture of Asian Americans. We hope to provide participants with an increased awareness and deeper understanding of the heritage and culture which has played an integral part in shaping our lives.

The Asian Student Union of Hayward (ASUH)

The A.S.U.H. strives to raise the level of cultural consciousness of the Asian American Student and community as well as to advance our ethnic awareness and pride. Most of all, the union tries to motivate the students in search of a meaningful understanding of Asian culture.

In the past, our activities have included Cherry Blossom and Chinese New Year celebrations which allowed us to share our cultural traditions with the campus community. In addition, we have participated in school sponsored activities such as the Science Expo and the Quarterly Social. The purpose of our activities are twofold: 1) to broaden the students and campus community awareness of the Asian American people and concerns and; 2) to gather the Asian students (members and nonmembers) together in social activities.
