

Fully remodeled for the 2001 campaign, the Titan Softball Complex on the campus of Cal State Fullerton serves as the home to one of the nation's top Division I softball programs and stands as one of the finest softball venues in the country.

Construction on the complex began in the early 1980's and it became the permanent home of the Titans in 1985 after Fullerton spent the first five years playing at Lions Field located at Brea Blvd. and Lemon Street in Fullerton.

The complex consists of two lighted and fenced softball fields that are used at their capacity during Cal State Fullerton's two premier spring softball tournaments – the Worth Invitational and the prestigious 16-team Kia Klassic.

The primary diamond features elevated theaterstyle seating for up to 1,000 fans with permanent box seats located behind home plate and chairback bleachers along the first and third base lines. Located behind home plate, the expanded press box features two tiers of seating for media while the outfield features a state-of-the-art scoreboard and message board in left field.

The grounds are beautifully landscaped with a grassy knoll running from foul line to foul line and palm trees surrounding the entire field, adding atmosphere that only southern California could provide.

On the field, players are treated to sunken dugouts and separate bullpens which are suitable for two pitchers to warm up simultaneously.

The softball complex and baseball's Goodwin Field are joined by a structure housing offices for coaches and lockerrooms for both the baseball and softball teams. The building also houses the Doubek-Wilson VIP room used for special events.

f building a championship softball team were like baking a chocolate cake, Cal State Fullerton's sweet tooth would be big enough to make a dentist cringe.

As the Titans enter the 2002 season, there is no need to hit the grocery store at the last minute. All the ingredients are waiting in the pantry to take them back to the Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City, Okla., for the first time since 1995.

The recipe looks something like this:

Start with an experienced coaching staff led by third-year skipper Michelle Gromacki, who brings in a 93-29 career record, back-to-back Big West Conference titles, two season-ending top 25 rankings and two trips to the NCAA

Mix well with a roster that features 13 returning letterwinners, nine starters and three starting pitchers.

Blend in three newcomers to the program and let cool in one of the nation's finest softball facilities - the Titan Softball Complex which featured the eighth-best attendance total in the nation last season.

Hope you're hungry.

The 2001 season was filled with many successes for the Titans, but the cookie crumbled way too soon.

Cal State Fullerton finished with a 48-14 overall record and a 19-2 mark in Big West Conference play en route to the Titans' second consecutive league crown.

Fullerton advanced to the postseason for the 20th time in 22 years of softball on campus, but fell short of the Women's College World Series after losing heartbreakers to eventual National Champion Arizona and Southwest Texas State.

Individually, the Titans had a banner year, placing nine players on All-Big West teams, earning 11 player/pitcher of the week awards, placing four on the All-West Region team, one Big West triple crown winner and earning one nod for first-team All-American.

In the offensive explosion that was 2001, the history books also saw change as one career batting record and five single-season batting records fell at the hands of Titan play-

As a team, Cal State Fullerton set new single-season school marks in RBI (279), walks (196), hit by pitches (39) and on-base percentage (.387). The Titans also set the team mark for best conference winning percentage (.905) and most runs per game (5.03).

stable pitching staff in the nation as all three hurlers return in 2002.

The staff is led by four-year senior Christy Robitaille, who can start games and race in from the bullpen in relief situations for the

Held out for the beginning of last year due to injury, Robitaille was nothing short of dominating in 2001 once she got going, posting a 10-1 overall record and a 1.07 ERA in just over 91 innings of work. She tossed six shutouts and nine complete games last season in 14 starts and made nine appearances in relief for the Titans.

A pair of multi-tasking juniors will also take to the circle once again this season as Jodie Cox (who also plays in the outfield) and Gina **Oaks** (who also plays the infield) take to the field to complete this formidable pitching trio.

Cox finished the year with a 19-6 overall record and a 1.70 ERA while tossing a teambest 11 shutouts, 19 complete games and a perfect game against Minnesota at the Worth Invitational.

She held the opposition to a team-low .181 batting average and surrendered only 39 earned runs in 160.1 innings.

Oaks was equally outstanding, posting a 19-7 overall mark with a 1.71 ERA in 31 appearances. She threw 16 complete games and six shutouts while holdling opponents to a .208 batting average and 38 earned runs in 156.0 innings.

Softball...

Behind home plate, the Titan pitching staff will be guided by

an experienced corps of receivers paced by one of the finest players in the nation.

Junior Jenny Topping enters her second season in a Titan uniform after earning firstteam All-American honors as a sophomore last season.

Topping, who became only the second player in the history of the Big West Conference to win the triple crown, hit .423 with 14 home runs and 59 RBI.

The 2001 Big West Player of the Year led the team in 11 different offensive categories and set single-season marks for average, runs scored (55), RBI and walks (56).

Junior Amy LaRocque also saw time behind home plate last season, and was valued more for her ability at guiding the pitching staff than her offense. She appeared in 54 games last season, hitting .180 with 20 runs

Sophomore Jennifer Holt appeared in just 19 games as a rookie last season, but was sidelined due to injury for most of the year. While she was healthy, however, Holt showed some pop, batting .417 with five runs scored and five RBI.

Newcomer **Caylin Hornish** is one of two high school letter of intent signees from last fall out of Santa Monica HS. She was a three-time all-league selection, a league MVP as a sophomore and an All-CIF selection as a junior. Hornish played her first two varsity seasons at Crossroads HS.

The Titans return three starters from last year's infield

which helped set a new school record for least amount of errors in a single season with 58.

Senior first baseman **Monica Lucatero** anchors the right side of the infield, committing only three errors in 396 chances. She was an All-West Region selection after hitting .331 on the season with six home runs, 15 doubles, 41 RBI and 23 runs scored. She was also one of the Titans' best bunters last season, laying down 12 sacrifice bunts and tallying 13 sacrifices overall.

Next to her is senior **Shawna Robinson**, who returns for her second season in a Titan jersey after transferring from Missouri.

Robinson was the Titans' sure-handed sec-

ond baseman for almost all of last season and committed only four errors in 159 chances (.975 fielding percentage). She hit .214 in 28 at-bats with 13 runs scored.

On the left side, junior strong-armed shortstop **Amanda Hockett** returns after posting the best offensive season of her career last season. Hockett started every game but one and hit .280 on the year to go with 10 doubles, six home runs, 31 RBI and 27 runs scored.

Freshman **Heather Saltarelli** was a threeyear varsity letterwinner at Marina HS in Huntington Beach and earned all-league honors during her stay.

The Cal State Fullerton outfield this season is a great mixture of power and speed, but is not very deep when it comes down to experience.

2001 All-West Region selection **Yasmin Mossadeghi** is the pure definition of "power," setting the Big West and school records for career home runs last season as only a junior.

Mossadeghi hit .353 on the season to go along with 14 home runs and 45 RBI. Her .630 slugging percentage was second only to Topping's record-setting numbers while also walking 19 times.

Junior **Kristy Halagarda** was an All-Big West second-team selection in 2001 after hitting .323 with 18 runs scored and a perfect 8-for-8 record in stolen bases.

Sophomore **Julie Watson** made an immediate impact for the Titans as a rookie in the lead-off spot, hitting .285 for the season (including hitting .282 as the lead-off hitter) to go with 35 runs scored and 10 RBI. Watson was also 6-for-10 in stolen bases and walked 20 times in the top spot last season.

Finally, sophomore all-conference jack-of-all-trades **Brittany Ziegler** returns for her second season after spending most of last year as a pinch hitter or playing at one of three different positions.

Ziegler hit .273 on the year in 55 at bats, with 13 runs scored and three RBI. She was also 5-for-6 in stolen bases – good for fourth on the team.

Junior transfer **Krista O'Hanian** is a walkon who played one season of softball at Illinois State before taking a medical hardship redshirt year. She was named the team's Rookie of the Year in 1999 and finished second in the Missouri Valley Conference voting for that award.

Coincidentally, O'Hanian hit her first career home run at Cal State Fullerton's Easton Classic (now Worth Invitational) in 1999.

Freshman **Jocelyn Evans** also joins the lineup after redshirting all of last season.


#### the schedule...

The Titans will once again host the Worth Invitational and the Kia Klassic at the Titan Softball Complex, as some of the nation's top softball talent takes the field in southern California (Ed. Note: See pages 29-30 for more information).

Cal State Fullerton will also hit the road for three tournaments: the Fiesta Bowl Classic hosted by Arizona State (2/8-10), the Campbell/Cartier Classic hosted by San Diego State (2/14-17) and the NFCA Leadoff Classic in Columbus, Ga. (2/22-24) featuring many of the nation's top 25 teams.

Aside from that, the schedule lists games against NCAA runner-up UCLA at Easton Stadium, a home doubleheader against Southeastern Conference power Florida and a Big West Conference schedule featuring NCAA participants Pacific and Cal State Northridge.

Head Coach (3rd Season) Cal State Fullerton '87 Career Record: 93–29 School Record: 93–29

Turns out you can go home again.

Now entering her third season at the helm of the Cal State Fullerton softball team, head coach Michelle Gromacki has not only come back to the school which she helped lead on the field to a NCAA National Championship in 1986, but she now has the Titans once again on the verge of breaking through into the Women's College World Series as the Titans' head coach.

Hired as an assistant coach to the legendary Judi Garman back in 1995, Gromacki assumed the reins of the program in the 2000 season after Garman retired.

And, with the job Gromacki has done, Garman would be proud. In her two seasons as head coach, Gromacki has led the Titans to back-to-back Big West Conference titles (their first outright crowns since that fabled 1986 season) and two trips to the NCAA Regionals.

In her head coaching debut in 2000, Gromacki led a young Titan squad to a 45-15 overall mark including a 19-5 slate in the Big West Conference. Last year the Titans had more experience and more victories to show for it, finishing 48-14 overall and a remarkable 19-2 in the competitive Big West -- the school's best record in conference play in the history of the program.

However, Gromacki and the Titans are still looking for that first WCWS berth after they were eliminated from the Fresno regional in 2000 by the host Bulldogs and placed third in

2000 by the riose buildings and placed time is 2001 at the regional of the eventual national champion Arizona Wildcats.

In addition, Gromacki and former assistants (Kelly Ford and Justin Kloczo) were named the top coaching staff in the west region for the 2000 season. Last summer, Gromacki was included in a group of only six coaches to attend the Team USA summer program from which future international coaching staffs will be assembled.

As an assistant coach, Gromacki helped lead the Titans to a 184-129 (.588) overall record and a 79-69 (.534) Big West mark in five seasons. Fullerton posted a 20-8 league record in her first season as an assistant in 1995 (46-17 overall) and finished second in the conference before advancing to the College World Series where they finished fifth.

PLAYING EXPERIENCE: Regarded as one of the best catchers in the nation, Gromacki helped lead the Titans to a combined 170-19-1 overall record and a 65-10-1 mark in conference play while also helping to lead the Titans to the 1986 National Championship.

In 1995, Gromacki was invited to participate in the firstever Olympic try-out camp and helped lead the Redding





# Gromacki Helps Pilot USA National Team vs. the World

After spending most of her playing career as one of the top catchers in the nation, Head Coach Michelle Gromacki got to experience the other side of the ball as one of three coaches selected to help lead USA Blue in three international tournaments this past summer.

Along with current Titan catcher Jenny Topping, Gromacki and USA Blue posted a 20-7 overall record, including a perfect 9-0 mark at the Pan-Am Games Tournament qualifier in Venezuela at the end of July.

Gromacki is currently in a pool of 12 coaches from which the coaching staff for the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens, Greece, will be chosen.

Rebels to three of four ASA Women's Major Fastpitch National Championships while being named an ASA All-American, an honor she has earned eight times throughout her career. She was also selected as a member of the USA National Team who participated in the tournament to open the Olympic Complex in Columbus, GA, for the 1996 Summer Games in Atlanta.

In 1994, Gromacki was a member of several USA National Teams which claimed gold medals at the South Pacific Classic Tournament, the World Championships in Canada, and the Pan Am Qualifier in Guatemala. She was a participant in the Olympic Sports Festival in St. Louis, acting as both a player and an assistant coach to Ralph Weekly.

From 1985-92, Gromacki participated in three Olympic Sports Festivals and was a member of two USA National Teams that took gold medals in international competition in China (1987) and Japan (1985). She also spent eight months playing on a traveling team in New Zealand from 1988-89.

Aside from playing, Gromacki has also been involved in numerous other activities to promote the sport of softball. She was responsible for Junior Olympic try outs and Pan Am Team practices held at Cal State Fullerton, has conducted numerous clinics and speaking engagements around the world, and conducted a clinic in Italy, spending three days working with the Italian Junior Olympic National Team.

Gromacki is also a contributor to numerous athletic publications, including authoring a monthly column for Southern California Softball Magazine and writing articles for the National Fastpitch Coaches Association newsletter.

Terry Schweikert, who has spent the last five years at a pair of Big 12 universities, was hired as an assistant coach on Michelle Gromacki's staff in July, 2001.

"I'm excited as I could be," said Schweikert. "Fullerton is a wonderful place for student-athletes to excel on and off the field and I'm joining a staff with great credentials, experience and heart."

Schweikert comes to Fullerton after a three-year stint at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln as an assistant coach under Rhonda Revelle. She helped the Cornhuskers to regional final appearances in 1999 and 2000 and played a hand in Nebraska's back-to-back 2000 and 2001 Big 12 championships.

Schweikert, who assisted Revelle in recruiting, worked primarily with the middle infielders and coached two-time All-American Jennifer Lizama. In addition, Schweikert coordinated and directed camps, clinics and community outreach programs for Nebraska.

Schweikert played softball for Missouri from 1982 to 1985, earning Missouri's Rookie-of-the-Year honors as a freshman and Player-of-the-Year honors as a junior. She helped the Tigers to their only Big Eight Tournament title and first College World Series appearance in 1984. During her junior and senior years, Schweikert captained the Tigers and was named all-region both seasons.



Assistant Coach Susie Parra returns to the Titan coaching staff for her sixth season working primarily with the Cal State Fullerton pitching staff.

A three-time All-American (1992-94) and national champion (1991, 93, 94) from Arizona, Parra was an assistant coach with the Titans for three seasons prior to starting her own pitching school.

In 1994, Parra became Arizona's first-ever National Player of the Year awardwinner and helped lead the Wildcats to the national championship. That season she earned Pacific-10 Conference Player of the Year honors and was named to the All-College World Series Team after her one-hit, 13-strikeout performance against Cal State Northridge.

During the 1994 College World Series, Parra posted a perfect 3-0 record, pitching 21 innings and allowing just two runs (neither of those earned), walking seven, and striking out 18 batters while hitting .300 in four games at the plate.

In her four years, Parra posted a 9-1 record in College World Series play with eight shutouts and a 0.00 ERA.

Parra also ranks among the Arizona greats in the record books: No. 4 on the single-season home runs list (14 in 1994), No. 3 in career home runs (20), No. 4 in career RBIs (108), No. 8 in walks while batting (25 in 1994), No. 7 in career walks (57), No. 10 in career at-bats (541), No. 8 career games played (213).

While with the Wildcats, she also set numerous records (some which were later eclipsed), including: single-season pitching wins (33 in 1994), career pitching wins (101), earned run average (0.30 in 1992), single-season strikeout totals (256), career strikeouts (874), career innings pitched (780.0), and career no-hitters (8).

A leader in the field of sports psychology, Dr. Ken Ravizza began working with former Head Coach Judi Garman when she began the softball program at Cal State Fullerton in 1979 and he has been involved ever since.

Ravizza has worked with elite-level athletes at both the Olympic and professional level, serving as sport psychology consultant to the Anaheim Angels since 1985 and has also worked with the New York Jets and numerous Olympic teams, including the 1996 US Baseball and Water Polo teams. For the past three years, he has served as a consultant for the US Women's Softball team. He has also functioned as a consultant to numerous college programs including Harvard, USC, UCLA, Yale, Nebraska, Washington, and Arizona State.

He has authored the book, "Heads-Up Baseball," which focuses on mental training for baseball players. He also conducts performance enhancement workshops throughout the United States. Ravizza has given presentations on sports psychology at both national and international conferences.







# 2001 season in review...

The 2001 Cal State Fullerton softball team finished the season with a 48-14 overall record and a 19-2 mark in the Big West Conference for the Titans' second-straight league crown.

Cal State Fullerton advanced to the postseason for the 20th time in the 22-year history of the program, but fell short of the College World Series with losses to eventual National Champion Arizona and Southwest Texas State.

TITANS REACH MILENNIUM MARK WITH 1,000TH WIN—The 2001 Cal State Fullerton softball team added another milestone to the star-studded history of the program by claiming the school's 1,000th victory in the sport on Apr. 28 in the second game of a doubleheader against Cal State Northridge.

Fullerton has amassed an all-time record of 1,006-405-4 in the 22-year history of the program for a .711 winning percentage. The Titans have never had a losing season and have had nine seasons of 50 or more wins.

THAT'S "QUEEN TOPPING" TO YOU – Cal State Fullerton catcher Jenny Topping became only the second player in the Big West Conference to capture the league's Triple Crown in 2001, leading the conference in batting (.423), home runs (14) and runs batted in (59).

UNLV's Kim Rodina became the first player in Big West Conference history to accomplish the feat, hitting .436 with 15 home runs and 58 RBI during the 1995 season.

Topping is also just the fourth player (and the fifth time overall) to ever lead the team in all three triple crown categories, joining All-Americans Stephenie Little (1999), Senetha Thomas (1996), and Sue Lewis (1982 & 1984).

THESE CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL -- Cal State Fullerton sluggers blasted a grand total of 47 home runs in 2001, falling just four short of tying the school record of 51 home runs set back during the 1999 season, led by All-American Stephenie Little's 23 round-trippers.

However, it's the number of people who have been on base when those home runs have been hit that is more impressive. Of the 47 home runs hit by the Titans, only 12 of those were solo shots.

Cal State Fullerton hit 19 home runs with one runner on base and 10 home runs with two runners on and six grand slams.

**SPEAKING OF HOME RUNS...** – Cal State Fullerton outfielder Yasmin Mossadeghi doesn't just hit home runs, she has made her career out of crushing them.

Mossadeghi took her place among Big West Conference and Cal State Fullerton greats early in the 2001 season, smacking five home runs in her first seven games of the year and setting a new school record with her 26th career round-tripper against Centenary on Feb. 15. She took it one step further, setting a new Big West Conference career record with her 28th home run against Hawai'i on Feb. 18.

One of her highlight home runs came against Cal Poly on March 31, slamming a home run over the scoreboard and bike path in left field – a shot which measured roughly 300 feet.

She has 34 career home runs entering her senior season and ranks among the top 10 in four other career batting categories (batting average, hits, runs and RBI).

SAME STAT, DIFFERENT RECORD BOOK – With her assault on the Big West Conference and school record books running at an all-time high, Jenny Topping is now moving up the NCAA record books. Topping, who walked a team-high 56 times, finished the year in 11th place on the NCAA

fifth on that very same chart twice after walking 56 times during her redshirt freshman year at Washington in 2000.

Topping is currently 17th on the NCAA career list and needs two more walks to move into 15th place. The career record is held by Oregon State's Tarrah Beyster (1997-00), who walked 211 times.

Against UCSB, Topping surplanted Fresno State's Gina LoPiccolo atop the Big West single-season list with two walks in game one of the double-header. LoPiccolo walked 43 times during the 1991 season to set the record.

Topping broke into the school's career walks list with six free passes against Cal State Northridge, and

stands in sole possession of 10th place, just one walk short of tying Julie Williams and Jan Pierini for eighth place, and four short of passing Mich DeBree and Tobi Perkins for sixth place. The career record is held by Sue Lewis, who walked 89 times from 1981-84.

Topping needs just nine more walks to tie Cal State Fullerton's Julie Williams for No. 10 on the Big West career charts. The conference's career record is 106 held by Utah State's Jennifer Power (1991-94) and FSU's LoPiccolo (1988-91).

TITANS IN THE NCAA RANKINGS – Cal State Fullerton's Jenny Topping and Yasmin Mossadeghi ranked among some of the nation's best players at season's end, finishing in the top 25 in the final 2001 NCAA statistical rankings.

Topping ranked 13th in average (.423), 26th in home runs per game (0.23), tied for 13th in RBI per game (0.95), tied for 16th in doubles per game (0.31), sixth in walks per game (0.90) and sixth in slugging percentage (.821).

Mossadeghi was also ranked along with some of the nation's most prolific home run hitters, smacking an average of 0.24 home runs per game which ranked tied for 19th in the nation.

As a team, Cal State Fullerton was one of the most productive offenses in the country, ranking ninth in the nation in batting average (.298), 15th in runs per game (5.03), 10th in home runs per game (0.76) and eighth in slugging percentage (.448). The Titans also ranked 31st in the nation in fielding percentage (.968) and 13th in winning percentage (.774).

SCORE FIRST, ASK QUESTIONS LATER -- Softball is a funny game.


Often, just one run on the board will win you a ball game

and with just seven innings to play, the amount of time you have to mount a comeback is limited.

The 2001 Titans showed how important getting on the board quickly can be. When Cal State Fullerton was first on the scoreboard in 2001, the Titans were an amazing 42-1 overall.

The one blemish came against Arizona State in the second game of the Kia

Klassic on March 15. In that game, the Titans put up runs in the first two innings, but saw the lead disappear as the Sun Devils put up three runs in the third and held off the Titans late to win, 6-3.





### titan all-americans...

The National Softball Coaches Association annually honors the top collegiate softball players with the selection of the NSCA All-America teams. Head coaches choose three teams with 13 athletes on the first and second teams and 15 athletes on the third team. The teams are annually annually series in May.

Cal State Fullerton's All-America history is deep. In all, 23 different Titan players have been selected to a total of 29 All-America berths. First baseman Sue Lewis is the only three-time winner among the Titans. Tiffany Boyd, Denise DeWalt, Susan LeFebvre and Chenita Rogers are two-time winners. Currently, the Titans have two All-Americans on their roster, infielder Monica Lucatero earned third-team honors as a sophomore in 2000 while catcher Jenny Topping was a first-team selection in 2001.



### pam edde (1980-82)

A 1981 All-American for the Titans, Edde was masterful from the circle with a 25-8 record and a 0.61 ERA. Edde also hit .284 with 34 runs scored, six doubles, 15 RBI and 32 walks on the year.



### sue lewis (1981-84)

The only three-time All-American in Titan history, Lewis hit .354 with 25 home runs and 138 RBI for her career. Selected as an All-American in 1981, 82 and 84, Lewis holds six career records, stands second in career home runs and holds three single-season marks.



### janet lloyd (1980-82)

Another "Titan"-ic slugger in softball history, Lloyd was a 1981 All-American after hitting .381 with 15 home runs and 41 RBI. She also scored 26 times that season to go with seven doubles and three triples. Her 15 home runs stand second on Titan single-season charts.



### kathy van wyk (1982)

In her lone season with the Titans after transferring from Texas Women's University, Van Wyk posted a 35-1 record with a 0.18 ERA and 270 strikeouts. She also became the Titans' first-ever Honda Broderick Award winner that year.



### elise king (1983-84)

A 1983 All-American infielder, King hit .293 with 35 runs scored and 16 RBI while stealing 12 bases for the Titans. For her career, she hit .297 with 64 runs scored, 26 RBI and 18 stolen bases to go along with 34 career sacrifices.



### susan lefebyre (1983-86)

A two-time All-American in 1983 and 1986, LeFebvre finished her career with a 100-21 record and a 0.29 ERA to go along with 740 strikeouts. In 1986, she was honored as the nation's top player with the Honda Broderick Award after helping the Titans to the National title.



### debbie mygind (1984-85)

A 1985 All-American for the Titans in the circle, Mygind posted a 28-4 overall record to go with a 0.27 ERA and 183 strikeouts. She is second in career ERA (0.33) behind Kathy Van Wyk (0.18) and is third in career winning percentage (.831).



### ioann ferrieri (1983-86)

Ferrieri earned her 1985 All-America honor at the plate while also throwing one game in the circle. She hit .328 to go with nine doubles, 27 runs scored, and 23 RBI. Ferrieri led the team in hitting that season and finished her career with 70 RBI -- just out of the top 10.



### terri oberg (1985-86)

Oberg was the third Titan All-American in 1985, hitting .298 on the year to go with seven home runs and 35 RBl -- both team high's. Her eight triples that season set a school record and her 16 career triples are second all-time.



### chenita rogers (1986-87)

Another two-time All-American for the Titans, Rogers hit .365 for her career and led the team in hitting in both of her All-American seasons. In 1986, Rogers hit .330 with 14 stolen bases and 29 runs scored to help the Titans to the National Championship.



### connie clark (1986-87)

Connie Clark had a stellar 1987 season en route to her All-America honor, going 33-5 overall with a 0.47 ERA and 261 strikeouts in 283 innings. She was named Big West Player of the Year and was honored as the nation's top player with the Honda Broderick Award.



### valerie doualas (1987-88)

The lone 1988 All-American for the Titans, Douglas hit a team-best .351 on the season with 19 runs scored and a team-second best 28 RBI. Her 72 hits that season rank her in a tie for ninth place on the Titan single-season charts.



### missy coombes (1987-90)

A 1989 All-American for the Titans, Coombes hit .359 on the season with 14 doubles and a team-high 29 RBI. She scored 22 runs and was second on the team with nine steals. Coombes was also a three-time All-Big West and a two-time West region selection.



### carev hess (1987-90)

Hess joined her teammate Missy Coombes on the 1989 All-American team after hitting .409 with 52 runs scored, 10 doubles, and 14 RBI. Her 52 runs were a school record until last year and she ranks second all-time in career runs scored (134) and hits (255).



### joy tiner (1990-91)

A 1990 All-American, Tiner hit .311 on the year with 30 runs, 10 doubles, and 17 RBI. Tiner was twice named to All-Big West teams and was also named to the All-West Region First-Team that same season.



### ann van dortrecht (1989-93)

Van Dortrecht was a 1990 All-American after compiling a 29-12 record and a 0.43 ERA. She also had 217 strikeouts in a school-record 310.2 innings. A two-time All-Big West selection, she was named Pitcher of the Year in 1990 and is third all-time in innings and shutouts.



### tiffany boyd (1991-93)

Boyd is another two-time All-American, earning the honor in 1991 and 92. She was a combined 63-15 in those years with 543 strikeouts in 580 innings. A two-time Big West Pitcher of the Year, Boyd is second in career complete games (77) and third in shutouts (38).



### "mich" debree (1988-91)

Paula "Mich" DeBree earned All-America honors in 1991 after hitting .313 with nine doubles, 33 runs scored and 19 RBI. A two-time All-Big West honoree, DeBree is sixth all-time in hits (198) and seventh in career walks (55) on the Titan charts.



### denise dewalt (1992-93)

A two-time All-American in her two years as a Titan, DeWalt hit .396 as a Titan with 70 runs, 27 doubles and 49 RBI. She is the Titans' career batting leader and ranks 10th in career doubles. Her .418 average in 1993 stood as the school record until just last season.



### chris zboril (1995-96)

A 1995 All-American, Zboril led the team with a .373 average with 12 doubles, eight home runs, 25 RBI and 35 runs scored. She is fourth in career average (.338), sixth in runs (83) and third in single season runs (48 in 1996).



### stephenie little (1998-99)

A 1999 All-American, Little led the team with a .372 average to go with 23 home runs and 57 RBI while scoring 39 runs. She is the single-season home run king at Fullerton and held the single-season record for RBI until last season.





### The Titan Tradition...

From modest beginnings and never with abundant resources, the Cal State Fullerton Titans have achieved successes that are the envy of many older and larger institutions across the country.

"Titan Pride" has been the rallying cry for 11 national team championships in seven different sports, hundreds of individual All-Americans, dozens of eventual professional athletes, numerous national coach of the year award winners, Olympic basketball players, a Miss America candidate and the subject matter of a Walt Disney film.

The tenor was set by the first intercollegiate team - men's basketball. In only his second season, Coach Alex Omalev advanced the Titans five rounds into the NAIA playoffs in 1961-62. Sixteen seasons later, the nation watched another "Cinderella" Titan Five advance to within one victory of the "Final Four" as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association postseason tournament and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the NCAA Western Regional.

The basketball tradition began even stronger on the women's side. Recent Naismith and Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Billie Moore coached the Titans to the national championship in 1970 and star forward Nancy Dunkle was one of her players on the women's 1976 silver-medal winning Olympic team. The most recent Titan All-American was center Genia Miller in 1991.

The Titans earned gold in 1984 when point guard Leon Wood directed the men's Olympic team to victory in Los Angeles. The first-round draft pick of the Philadelphia 76ers went on to a 6-year National Basketball Association career and he currently is in his third season as a referee, only the second former NBA player to make that career switch.

Future NBA performers Richard Morton, Henry Turner, Cedric Ceballos and Bruce Bowen were some of the stars of the 1980s and 1990s, when the Titans made NIT appearances on both the men's and women's sides. Ceballos gained notoriety for winning the NBA Slam-Dunk contest one year while the women can point with pride to Autumn Hollyfield, the nation's top 3-point field goal shooter in 1993-94, and Koko Lahanas, the nation's scoring leader in 1994-95. Miller still holds NCAA records and came back from a career in Japan to earn a spot with the Los Angeles Sparks of the WNBA as Eugenia Rycraw.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton considerable fame. Former men's Coach Dick Wolfe won three college division NCAA titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and had subsequent teams in the Top Ten at the Division I level while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. His 1987 squad was ranked No. 1 in the nation. Coach Lynn Rogers began the women's program in 1976 and the Titans have finished sixth or better in the nation 12 times and won the national title in 1979. One-armed Carol Johnston was an All-American and star of the Disney film, "Lefty," while Tami Elliott (1984-86) won 10 All-American awards


before becoming Miss Virginia and competing in the Miss America pageant.

Baseball exploded onto the national scene behind former Coach Augie Garrido by breaking the USC monopoly in the NCAA western regionals in 1975. The Titans won the national title in 1979 behind Tim Wallach, who would play 17 major league seasons. They won the College World Series again in 1984 and John Fishel was the MVP of the CWS. They were national runners-up in 1992 with another MVP in third baseman Phil Nevin, who also was the first pick in the amateur draft by the Houston Astros.

The Titans placed third in the CWS in 1994 and came back with their best season ever in 1995, going 57-9 en route to their third national championship. Leading the way was Player of the Year Mark Kotsay, now with the San Diego Padres, and one of 35 former Titans to have played in the majors. Fullerton has made a pair of trips to Omaha under Coach George Horton, finishing as high as third in the nation in 2001.

Five players have become Olympians with Kotsay and Brian Loyd helping the U.S. win a bronze medal in 1996 in Atlanta. Nevin, Jason Moler and Bob Caffrey are the other Fullerton baseball Olympians.

Women also have sparkled on Fullerton diamonds. Hall of Fame Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and won more games (913) than any previous Division I coach. The Titans have made eight trips to the College World Series and 20 regional appearances. They brought



home an NCAA Championship in 1986 and boast three national players of the year in pitchers Kathy Van Wyk, Susan LeFebvre and Connie Clark.

The now-defunct football program made great strides in Division I-A after its humble Div. II beginnings in 1970. Coach Gene Murphy guided the Titans to two conference championships and four runner-up finishes between 1983 and 1989. Titan products included Super Bowl rookies Bobby Kemp (Cincinnati in 1982) and Mark Collins (New York Giants in 1987). Titans have starred in the Canadian Football League led by receiver Allen Pitts of Calgary, 1995 MVP Mike Pringle of Baltimore and perennial quarterback star Damon Allen.

With the loss of football, Head Coach Al Mistri's soccer program filled the void in Titan Stadium. A women's squad was launched in 1993 and it coincided with a memorable men's season that saw the Titans climb as high as No. 3 in the national rankings. They were led by All-American forward (and current Titan assistant) Eddie Soto and competed at the NCAA Final Four, placing third. There have been four subsequent trips to the playoffs and a No. 2 national ranking in 1996. Four former Titans were on 2001 MLS rosters and on the international level, former Titan Brian Dunseth captained the U.S. Olympic team in the 2000 Sydney games.

There have been national titles in men's cross country (1971) and women's fencing (1974) and individual standouts such as golfer Martha Wilkerson, runner Mark Covert and wrestler Laszlo Molnar, who finished second in the nation in 1994 at 167

pounds. Heather Killeen became the Titans' first Div. I cross country All-American in 1994, won three events at the 1995 Big West Conference track championships and was one of 10 finalists for 1995 NCAA Woman of the Year Award. The Titans have a rising star in junior Brandon Campbell. He became the first Titan to compete in the Pan-Am Junior Games and won a silver medal in 1999 in the high jump. He holds six school records, was the 2001 Big West Conference male track Athlete of the Year and also plays on the basketball team.

### Why the nickname?

"It was the students' decision in a vote," explained Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname "Titans." "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down to a few for the purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels."

It was a unique student body, all upper division students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College.

"Even when it was decided that 'Titans' would be the nickname, there was confusion as to what it represented," said Becker. "I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormitories were named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done but then along came the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History."

What began as a practical joke attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as the hastily graded field became known that spring afternoon in 1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions of the caricature have been made to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek. The costume that brings the mascot to life also has changed. Tuffy even attracted a female Tiffy in 1992.

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was appropriate on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was formally acknowledged by the Athletics Council in 1987. A change to a navy blue was initiated in 1992 with a deemphasis of the orange.



Headed by Christine McCarthy, the Athletic Academic Services department, tabbed as Titan Scholars, provides effective support services to help student-athletes reach their academic goals. The academic services staff takes a proactive role by coordinating study plans, study skills workshops, tutoring sessions, study halls, faculty and peer mentoring and campus services referrals. Staff members also monitor progress toward graduation, assist studentathletes in selecting and registering for classes and teach a Life Skills 100 class.

Coaches rely on Athletic Academic Services to track student-athletes' progress in classes and to alert them and the students to any potential problems. The department has an "early warning" system in place, which utilizes periodic grade checks and clear communication with faculty members when student-athletes may require additional academic sup-

The department's services are available to all past and current student-athletes. "Not all student-athletes are able to graduate in four years, because of professional opportunities or personal commitments," says McCarthy. "We developed a re-entry program for former student-athletes who wish to complete their studies."

### **NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills**

Cal State Fullerton is a participating institution in the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program, which is aimed at enhancing the quality of the student-athlete experience within the university setting. Throughout their career, Cal State Fullerton studentathletes are provided with resources that will assist their development in five primary areas: academics, athletics, personal development, career development and community service.

The athletic training program at Cal State Fullerton plays a major role in maintaining the health of Titan student-athletes. A team doctor, three full-time certified athletic trainers, two certified graduate assistants and more than 20 student assistants comprise a program that is generally regarded as one of the very best in the country.

Titan athletic training personnel specialize in preventive medicine, recognition of injuries and rehabilitation. Student athletic trainers who are admitted into the highly selective ATEP (Athletic Training Educational Program), which is administered through the Department of Kinesiology and Health Promotion, must meet demanding requirements. In addition to taking 100 units of kinesiology and athletic training courses, they must serve five semesters and 1,500 clinical supervised hours. Before becoming certified, candidates must pass the National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of Certification examination. Since 1997. nearly 80 percent of Cal State Fullerton graduates have passed on their first attempt, compared to the national rate of about 30 percent. Since the inception of the program, dozens of alumni have moved into coveted positions across the country.

### **Head Athletic Trainer Julie Max**

Julie Max. Cal State Fullerton's Head Athletic Trainer, has been the driving force behind the development of an athletic training program that has received national acclaim. Max is in her 23rd vear at her alma mater since replacing her mentor, the late Jerry Lloyd. Max is in her second year of a two-vear term as president of the 25,000-member National Association of Athletic Trainers (NATA). The first female president in the organization's history, Max served a six-year stint on the organization's board of directors and a one-year term as its vice president prior to her election to the top post. In 1997, Max was honored with the NATA Service Award, which recognizes out-standing service to the athletic training profession at the state and district level.

### Titan Gymnasium

Titan Gymnasium undoubtedly has a place in Cal State Fullerton lore, having served as the backdrop for such memorable triumphs as the men's basketball team's 1983 upset of No. 1 UNLV. Titan Gym also has an impressive international history — it served as the venue for 1984 Olympic team handball — and political history — former President Ronald Reagan made his last Orange County appearance at Titan Gym while campaigning for his successor, George Bush. The facility also features practice and match rooms for the wrestling, gymnastics and fencing programs. Titan Gym is scheduled to undergo an expansion in the near future, which will add significant office space and a practice facility.

### **Goodwin Field**

Goodwin Field was the host site for Cal State Fullerton's first NCAA Baseball Regional in the spring of 2000 and also played host to a Regional and Super Regional in 2001. A \$3 million expansion project, spearheaded by a \$1 million gift from Jerry and Merilyn Goodwin, has transformed the field into one of the premier collegiate facilities on the West Coast. The field now features the Wilson Clubhouse – which includes lockerrooms, a reception area and offices for the coaches – and the Doubek VIP Room.

### **Titan Stadium**

Titan Stadium is considered among the finest soccer facilities in the nation and regularly hosts professional and international soccer matches in addition to the Titan men's and women's programs. The facility, completed in 1992, was home to the Titan football program for one year before the sport was dropped after the 1992 season. The stadium is also a hot-spot for the entertainment industry and is regularly featured in television commercials and programs.

### **Titan Softball Complex**

Having received a complete makeover since the 2000 season, the Titan Softball Complex boasts one of the top facilities in the nation. Utilizing the adjacent Wilson Clubhouse and Doubek VIP Room, the two-diamond complex can now adequately serve as a host site for postseason competition in addition to the annual Kia Klassic, the top tournament in the nation.

### ATHLETIC FACILITIES



Cal State Fullerton student-athletes have yearround access to the services offered by the Strength and Conditioning Program, under the direction of Mike Nagler. Aimed at developing speed, power, strength and endurance in Cal State Fullerton's student-athletes, the program plays a key role in the success of Titan teams.

Individual workouts are designed, implemented and regularly adjusted by Nagler to help each student-athlete develop the stamina needed to maintain the rigorous year-round workouts associated with Division I sports.

Now located inside Titan Stadium is a 6,000 squarefoot weight room facility featuring eight platforms, eight squat racks, plyometric devices and nearly 8,000 pounds in free weights. The facility will service more than 300 student-athletes over the course of the year.

Mike Nagler was named Cal State Fullerton's first full-time strength and conditioning coach on Jan. 4, 2000. Nagler had spent the previous 17 months as assistant strength coach at the University of Iowa. At Iowa, Nagler was in charge of developing and implementing weight lifting programs for women's basketball, volleyball, women's soccer, men's and women's track, gymnastics, softball and men's and women's golf. He also assisted with the men's basketball program.

He also previously worked as an assistant at Baylor University, the University of Washington, UNLV and Washington State and served as an intern with the NFL's Seattle Seahawks.

Nagler, 30, earned his bachelor's degree in exercise science from Washington State in 1993 and picked up a master's degree in kinesiology from UNLV in 1996.




Fullerton, a city of more than 123,000 inhabitants, is located in North Orange County, about 30 miles southeast of central Los Angeles. It is part of the Southern California population center and within easy freeway access of all the diverse natural and cultural attractions of this region.

Orange County, with an area of 782 square miles, is the 48th in size of California's 58 counties, but it is the third largest county in population (2.7 million). Orange County has experienced during the last four decades almost unprecedented growth as communities continue to occupy the diminishing expanses of open land.

Today, there co-exists an interesting mixture of the old and new economic and life styles in Orange County. Underneath the soil, archeologists and bulldozers uncover traces of the hunting and gathering Indian bands who flourished at least as early as 4,000 years ago in what was a benign and bountiful region.

More visible traces remain of the Spanish and Mexican periods and cultures: Mission San Juan Capistrano, which began the agricultural tradition in Orange County, and subsequent adobes from the great land grants and ranches that followed. Additionally, both customs and many names persist from this period, and so does some ranching. The architectural and other evidences of the subsequent pioneer period are still quite visible: farmsteads, old buildings from the new towns that were established in the late 1800s, mining operations, and traces of early resort and other types of promotional activities. For about 100 years, farming was the main economic activity with products such as grapes, walnuts, vegetables and oranges replacing the older wheat and cattle ranches. Today, agriculture still is very important. Orange County ranks high among California's counties in mineral production with its oil, natural gas, sand and gravel, and clay mining and processing activities.

The extensive development of the 42 miles of beaches in Orange County and the development of such attractions as Disneyland, Knott's Berry Farm, the Laguna Festival of Arts and Pageant of the Masters, the Arrowhead Pond of Anaheim, Edison International Field and Convention Center and the Orange County Performing Arts Center continue to make tourism an increasingly important activity. So does the Mediterranean-type climate, with rainfall averaging 14 inches per year, and generally mild days (either freezing or 100-degree temperatures uncommon) with frequent morning fog during the summer. Both downtown Los Angeles and the Pacific Ocean can be reached by car in half an hour, and mountain and desert recreation areas are as close as an hour's drive from the campus.
