The PSA is part of a series in a "Campaign Against Elder Abuse" that addresses the different kinds of abuse that nearly 2 million senior citizens are experiencing every year.

Ernie, who is not a profespublic service announcement. sional actor, deftly portrays a

vulnerable victim of abusive neglect by his caregiver. The PSA, titled "Who Cares?" is the product of the nonprofit 501(e)(3) multimedia production company, Impact PSA Inc., whose mission is to bring awareness to elder abuse via broadcast and broadband media. The dates and times this PSA will air are random and unknown at this time.

In addition to the PSA, Ernie and his wife, Ali, both play important roles in another project produced by Impact PSA. This motivational video,

produced for the National Association of Area Agencies on Aging, is intended to encourage America's communities to get ready for the needs and expectations of the "about to retire" baby boomers.

As a means to complete its own mission, Impact PSA produces projects for other charitable organizations, and this production, funded by the MetLife Foundation, was a very rewarding and enlightening project.



What's the prognosis for real estate?

How is the real estate market? .

This is a common question that is asked by many homeowners in Leisure Village. It seems we read conflicting information in the news. So what are we supposed to believe?

There are indicators of what the market will likely do in the future. Several of them are:

• Days on the Market (DOM). These represent the number of days that a property is on the market before it sells. When you compare the sales for the six-month period from June to November of 2008 versus 2009, the results are encouraging. According to the Multiple Listing Service data for Leisure Village, the average DOM in 2008 was 110 days, compared with 2009, which was 89 days. This represents a 20 percent decrease in the number of days a home was on the market.

• Inventory. Inventory simply represents the number of homes for sale.

We know that the inventory in Leisure Village is much lower compared with the past few years. The real question here is: Will there be buyers for the current inventory?

• Sales. Unlike many communities outside Leisure Village, most of the sales in the Village have been normal sales — not short sales or bank owned — which have helped keep the sales in the Village much more stable than outside the gates. According to MLS data, there were 39 homes sold from June to November 2008 versus 52 homes sold during the same period in 2009. This represents a 33 percent increase in the number of homes sold.

So, what will the market do in the future? We do know what has happened in the last six months compared to last year, and the trend is promising!

Halloween Festival's first-place chili recipe

What a wonderful event the Halloween Party was! I was "chilied" out! Here is the chili that won first prize. It's not an easy recipe, but then nothing this good ever is!

Prize-winning Tri-County Tri-Tip Chili By Jerry Spector

- 1 3-pound tri tip roast
- 2 15.25-oz. cans of S&W red kidney beans
- 1 14.5-oz. can of Del Monte stewed tomatoes
- 1 14.5-oz. can of Del Monte plain tomato sauce (optional if chili is too thick)
- 1 24-oz. jar of Barilla roasted garlic spicy tomato sauce with imported olive oil

- 1 teaspoon cumin *
- 1 teaspoon red pepper *
- 1 teaspoon black pepper *
- 2 teaspoons of chili powder *
- 3 1.5-oz packages of McCormick regular chili seasoning mix*
- 1 teaspoon white pepper*
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder*

In a pot, add the 2 cans of red kidney beans with the fluid to 1 can stewed tomato and all the seasonings. The spices* should be added to your liking, so taste the sauce as you make the chili! Simmer for 30 to 45 minutes. Grill the 3-pound tri tip with no seasoning on a barbecue with a low flame until done medium.

After the tri-tip is grilled, remove any burnt or tough parts. Cut the balance of the tri-tip into small thin cubes (chewable size) and add to the sauce in the pot that has been simmering. Simmer for another 1 hour until the tri-tip has absorbed the spicy flavor of the sauce. Refrigerate overnight. This is important so that the spices will blend in completely and add the flavor to your chili.

Remove chili from refrigerator and place in a pot and add the 1 jar of Barilla spicy tomato sauce and simmer for 45 minutes or until complete mixture is hot. Place mixture in a crockpot, set temperature to high, covered with lid and serve when ready to eat.

NOTE: The chili can be made all in one day by adding the 1 jar of spicy tomato sauce after the tri-tip has been added and heated for 45 minutes to give it time to absorb the spices. Heat until the chili is hot and transfer to crockpot for serving if necessary.

Clifton's Cafeteria, Bullock's Wilshire were hot spots

It's been awhile since I've written a strolling story, but here goes again.

I'm sure those of you who spent your early years in the Los Angeles area will remember good times at Clifton's Cafeteria, and those who missed it will appreciate hearing about this wonderful landmark.

At present there is only one Clifton's Cafeteria still operating. It is located at 648 S. Broadway. Clifton's has been serving Los Angeles patrons since 1935, serving "good food at good prices."

Robert Clifton, grandson of Clifford Clifton, the founder of the Clifton's Cafeteria chain, announced recently that the family finally had bought the building at 648 S. Broadway after seven decades of leasing. This will protect the restaurant from rent increases and leasing disputes

that contributed to the demise of so many other cafeterias.

In a region catering to sushi bars and pizza parlors, nostalgia plays a big part at such a surviving institution. People come back after 30 years and say, "I remember this macaroni and cheese or the carrot and raisin salad or the apple pie or the service" and best of all, they remember the prices. They like the fact that some things are familiar and never change in such a changing world. Some of the other familiar foods were pear-lime Jello for \$1.49, strawberry shortcake for \$2.39, a plate of beef noodles for \$3.99 or roast turkey with dressing for \$6.54. Sounds good, eh?

Another institution in the Southland was Bullock's Wilshire. Always elegant, and what woman could forget the beautiful tearoom? White-gloved clerks wrote sales checks by hand

so no one heard the clatter of cash registers. Customers were "patrons." Women were ladies, and ladies wore hats and gloves. The beautiful tea room was elegant, and clothes were modeled there for the patrons. It was the epitome of gracious living, and I remember it well.

Many well-known patrons graced the store, and some didn't even come in. Mae West would sit in her limo while salesclerks brought designer dresses for review. Marlene Dietrich bought all men's trousers there. She also was known to drive up late Saturday afternoon and load her car with store employees, whom she took to her Malibu house for the weekend. Actress Greta Garbo once asked a clerk to help her choose a swimsuit. When they went into the fitting room, Garbo removed her coat, which was all she was wearing.

Several movies were filmed at the store, including Cary Grant's comedy "Topper" in 1937, "Bugsy" in 1991 and "The Aviator" in 2004.

The store was built in the 1920s by John Gillespie Bullock and Percy Glen Winnett, Canadian immigrants and owners of the original Bullock's in downtown Los Angeles. The store opened on September 26, 1929, and with its distinctive terra-cotta and copper facade, it was dubbed "The Cathedral of Commerce."

When the store opened, it was one of only three commercial buildings in the mid-Wilshire area, along with the Brown Derby and the Ambassador Hotel. And then it grew. Something like "Topsy."
