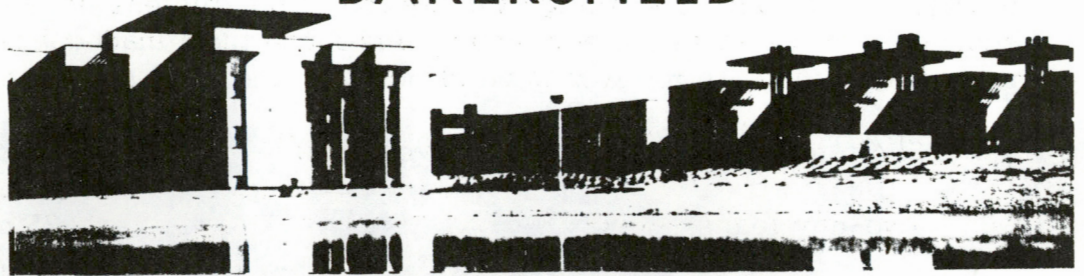

ANNOUNCEMENTS

CHANGE IN DEADLINE FOR BULLETIN INFORMATION - All information for the Bulletin must be submitted to the President's Office by 5:00 p.m. Wednesday to be included in the Bulletin on the following Monday.

Academic Calendar - The academic calendar for the winter quarter as listed in the college catalog, which shows no holidays during the quarter, is correct. College will be in session on Lincoln's and Washington's birthdays.

TAXCO - IMPORTANT - Any students who responded to the information that was disseminated by the tax service organization called "TAXCO" should contact the Better Business Bureau at their earliest convenience since apparently this company has not met its obligations.

STUDENT INSURANCE - The voluntary insurance policy is still available. Students may apply at any time during the year and may be insured the second quarter only, if desired. There is insurance coverage regardless of whether, during the course of the quarter, the student drops below the minimum number of units for full-time status or drops out of school entirely. In addition, any insured student may change his application from partial to full year coverage if, for example, he wishes second, third, or summer quarter coverage. For information concerning how to obtain coverage, contact the Student Health Service in room 113 of the Student Services Building.

USED BOOKS - A collection box has been placed in the cafeteria for used books. Anyone having any paperback or hardback books to donate may drop them in the box. The books will be sold at the Valley Plaza on February 5th and 6th by the Kern County High School District Faculty Wives. The proceeds will be used for scholarships for local high school students. The collection box is sponsored here on campus by the Student California Teachers Association. Don't forget, not only can you donate books, but you may take advantage of the sale when the books are for sale (at very reasonable prices).

LIBRARY FINES - Inflation affects library charges for overdue loans and lost library property as it does other things we pay for. The Trustees have reviewed the fine schedules of the state college system and found them inadequate because, on today's price level, they are too low to be effective. The 1971 schedule of charges follows:

Short-term loans (2 hours and overnight)	25 cents per hour \$10.00 maximum
Two-day loans	25 cents per day \$10.00 maximum
Two-week loans	15 cents per day \$10.00 maximum
Lost books and other library items	List price + service charge
Damage or mutilation of library items	50 cents to list price + service charge
Service Charge	\$3.25

On lost items, fines continue to accumulate until item is returned or paid for, subject to the maximum.

The charges apply to each item lost or overdue.

WINTER QUARTER LIBRARY HOURS - The library hours have been extended for winter quarter such that the library will be open at 8:00 a.m. Monday through Friday. Also, the library will be open from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturday afternoon but not in the morning. The complete schedule is as follows:
