As I telegraphed, the little houses are very satisfactory. We prefer the front terraces without the side terraces and we like the perforated railings like on the upper terrace of the big assembly house.

We also like the more decorative entrance front of plan B.

I am sending a wall fountain that I think will be available. I

also hope to get a blue
and white faience fire
place to go outside and
a della Robbia (imitation)
to go over it.

I have suggested on the
drawings that the cross
vista from one recess
to the other in my house
would be improved if we
had book cases where
the east and west windows
are with windows on each
side of the book cases.

I am enclosing an ad
of Hampton shops which
gives a kind of an idea

of what I mean,

We thought that steps might go down from the sides of the front terraces in our house to the store room below.

These steps would relieve the side bare spaces and would have some practical value of course.

I have bought some stuff at sales - columns wrought iron gilt and polychrome figures &c which I think you can use.

Am waiting the final word on the location of the house, I think they will be about right as I wanted them. WTRH
