Cal State Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing. Classes were offered for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement, for five students, took place in 1960.

Cal State Fullerton Campus

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

Classes were offered for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement (for five students) was in 1960.

The University's 24,500 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Many students commute each day to and from classes; some come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 775-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 85 degree programs -41 of them at the graduate level plus several credential programs and five certificate programs.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study

tours without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally-known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups. Another is Continuing Learning Experience, which has spearheaded the fund-raising campaign to build a gerontology center on campus.

Further examples of community outreach are joint ventures with the City of Fullerton. One resulted in the Fullerton Arboretum, which opened on campus in 1979. Another produced lighting for the baseball field and adjoining soccer fields, while a third yielded lighted softball fields.

The long awaited reality of an on campus football/ soccer complex and baseball and softball stadium in conjunction with an on-campus Marriott Hotel. The Hotel is open and ground breaking for the athletic facilities will begin later this year.

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great university.



SEASON PREVIEW

For the first time in her career, 11th-year Cal State Fullerton Head Coach Judi Garman has two All-Americans returning to her line-up. Missy Coombes returns to first base and Carey Hess to right field. Both are seniors and their experience will be an added plus to the team's depth this season.

"I have better depth on this year's squad than I've had in 10 years. Everyone is a good ballplayer so it should be a great year for the Titan softball program," said Garman.

Both Coombes and Hess were First Team All-Conference and First Team All-West Region last season.
Coombes also was honored as the Conference's Co-Field Player of the Year and was a Honda- Broderick Award nominee. Coombes had a batting average of .359, second to Hess' .409. Coombes led the team in RBI's (29), doubles (14), game-winning hits (8) and was 9 for 9 in stolen bases. Hess led the squad in runs (52), hits (85), triples (3), slugging percentage (.486), on base percentage (.466), and was also 9 for 9 in stolen bases. Coombes and Hess will function as the team's co-captains in 1990.

"It's great to have two All-Americans back for the 1990 season. I'll be looking for leadership from them this year. It's great to have outstanding returning experience in the infield and outfield," said Garman.

The Titans return 10 starters and lost only two from last year's successful squad that finished ranked 4th in the nation with a 47-15 overall record and 28-8 Big West Conference record. The Titans finished second in the conference behind Fresno State. In the 1989 NCAA Post-Season Tournament the Titans were outplayed by the Broncos of Cal Poly Pomona. The Broncos won in two straight, 1-0 and 4-1, at CSF's Titan Softball Complex.

"I was surprised how well we did last season. The team exceeded all my expectations. We battled to the end. This season should be different in the fact we have more depth and experience," added Garman.

The only area the Titans are lacking experience is in the pitching area. Returning for the Titans is 1989 Second Team All-Big West pitcher Ann Van Dortrecht. A sophomore, Van Dortrecht had a record of 19-8 last season with an ERA of 0.90. The Titans' leading pitcher from last season, Anjie Bryant, is out for this season because of academic ineligibility. Bryant was First Team All-Conference last year, Second Team All-West Region and was twice named Conference Pitcher of the Week. Her talent will be missed as she posted a 25-6 record and 0.66 ERA last season.

Returning for the Titans with Hess, Coombes and Van Dortrecht is catcher Debbie Hartwig, infielders Jill Matyuch and Nikki Lewis and outfielders Mich DeBree, Kristine Glomboske, Malia Ouzts and Buffy Sanchez. Ouzts was the team's leading base stealer as she was 10 for 11 in 1989. Glomboske and Coombes were the home run leaders with two a piece.

The top newcomers for Cal State Fullerton are all

transfers: sophomore shortstop Charlotte Wiley, junior infielder Joy Tiner and junior infielder Diana Forman. All will see plenty of playing time this season.

"There will be quite a few line-up changes in 1990. Tiner will replace Yehling at third base and alternate with Debbie Hartwig in the catcher position. These changes will help us be stronger both offensively and defensively. Tiner and Wiley both hit hard and add strength as power hitters," said Garman.

"Diana Forman is a real plus to our system. She is an outstanding infielder and she will help our depth."

Wiley is a transfer from Diablo Valley College and Contra Costa College. She played softball at DVC and played two years of baseball at Richmond High School. Tiner sat out last season after transferring from Saddleback College where she was selected to the Junior College All-State Team. Forman is a transfer from Butte Junior College where she was named Women's Athlete of the Year in 1989.

Coach Garman is optimistic about the upcoming Big West Conference season based on a decade of experience.

"Fresno State is the team to beat again. They have two strong pitchers back. The conference is getting tougher and tougher each year and more exciting to watch!" said Garman.

## Head Coach Judi Garman, 11th Year

Beginning her eleventh season at Cal State Fullerton, Judi Garman has led the Titans to no less than a ninth place national finish, an NCAA National Championship (1986) and 515 victories in her ten-year tenure. Garman is the only coach in the program's history and has accumulated 726 career victories.

Garman established the program in 1980 and finished third in the conference, second in the region and ninth nationally. Since then, Garman's teams have won eight conference titles, and six out of nine regional championships while finishing second in the College World Series in 1981, 1983 and 1985 and third in 1982 and 1987 and winning the 1986 NCAA Championship.

Garman's tremendous success at Fullerton is only the latest in a remarkable string of accomplishments which stretch across the continent from Canada to Santa Barbara to Golden West College in Huntington Beach to Cal State Fullerton.

Garman earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Saskatchewan in 1966 and immediately moved to California where she began working on her master's degree at UCSB. While at Santa Barbara, she started club softball and soon had a varsity team. Upon completion of her studies, she took the women's athletic director position at Westmont College in Santa Barbara and coached the volleyball, basketball and tennis programs in addition to softball.

Garman then moved to Golden West College where, along with softball, she coached basketball (1973-76) and cross-country (1977-79). Garman coached the Rustlers softball team to an unprecedented four consecutive national championships (1975-78) while compiling a record of 211 - 40. Twenty-one of her softball players received scholarships to four-year institutions.

Very involved professionally, Garman is in her second year as president of the National Softball Coaches Association. Each year, she hosts clinics which bring over 200 coaches and 1,500 players to the campus. Additionally, she has produced highly successful pitching video tapes with acclaimed pitching coach Don Sarno.

A popular speaker at clinics around the country, Garman recently made four trips abroad to Holland, Italy, Czechoslovakia and Japan. Many Titans have had the opportunity to play overseas because of these contacts.

Fishing and snow skiing occupy Garman's time away from the softball field. She also has numerous business interests and is actually involved in running a family business in Canada that manufactures moccasins.







Assistant Coach Marty Rubinoff

Third-year Assistant Coach Marty Rubinoff continues to bring experience and knowledge to the softball program at Cal State Fullerton. Formerly a coach of the six-time senior national champion California Raiders of the ASA, Rubinoff is a very positive addition to the Titan program.

Rubinoff grew up with a baseball/ softball background. He started playing fastpitch softball as a child in Toronto, Ontario until he moved to southern California when he was 13, playing in men's fastpitch leagues until he was 18. He signed a professional contract with the San Francisco Giants, playing for their Class A Decatur affiliate for three seasons (1972-74). In 1974, he left baseball and picked softball back up as a player in the Western Softball Congress (ISC) men's open division and played for 10 years while participating in five national championships and winning two ISC World Titles. In 1985, he captained the USA National team at the Maccabiah Games in Israel and was named MVP of the fastpitch competition.

While coaching the Raiders, Rubinoff was involved in the development of Titan outfielder Tiny Glomboske and a number of present collegiate stars. He has also been involved in hitting clinics throughout the United States and New Zealand.



Assistant Coach Linda Shafor

An integral part of the Titan coaching staff, Linda Shafor returns to the Titans for her sixth season as a parttime assistant coach with a direct responsibility in overseeing Fullerton's outfield. Shafor had worked with Garman in the latter's rookie season and returned to the program in 1986 in time to help the Titans win the NCAA Championship.

Coach Shafor possesses a wide and varied softball background from her playing days with the Sun City Saints (1966-67) to serving as the player-coach for the Huntington Park Blues in 1970. Shafor was head coach at LA Harbor College from 1971 until 1979. She was an assistant coach at the University of Arizona for one season prior to joining the Titans in 1980.

She returned to Harbor College and is currently a physical education and math professor.

Shafor is a 1966 graduate of the Ohio State University with a degree in physical education. She received her master's degree in PE at California State University, Long Beach.



Head Women's Trainer
Julie Max

Now entering her eleventh year with her alma mater, women's trainer Julie Max plays a major role in the Fullerton women's softball program as well as all eight of the university's women's sports programs.

Recently, Julie was elected to the Office of District Director - representing California, Nevada and Hawaii in the National Athletics Trainers Association. She will be serving on the Executive Board for the national organization.

Max has been recognized in the past on the local and national level for her outstanding abilities including serving as the administrative coordinator for volleyball and fencing at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles.

She earned her Bachelors of Science degree from Cal State Fullerton in 1978 and received a Masters of Education with an emphasis in PE at Azusa Pacific University. Max became a Certified Athletic Trainer following graduation in 1979 and is also a Certified Emergency Medical Technician.





#### UCLA'S TIFFANY BOYD INTENDS TO TRANSFER TO CAL STATE FULLERTON AND PLAY SOFTBALL

One of the nation's top collegiate softball pitchers, Tiffany Boyd, of Orange, CA (Woodbridge H.S.) has withdrawn from UCLA and is planning to enroll at Cal State Fullerton and play softball for the Titans under eleventh-year Head Coach Judi Garman. Pending enrollment approval, Boyd hopes to begin classes this January and will be eligible to participate in softball during the 1991 season.

Last season, as only a freshman at UCLA, Boyd had a record-setting season. Her honors included: All PAC-10 Team, All North-Region, All-World Series Team, DAILY BRUIN Athlete of the Year and she is a candidate for the U.S. Sports Academy Athlete of the Year which will be announced at a banquet in February.

The Bruins won the NCAA Softball Championship last season due to Boyd's pitching efforts. She pitched three of the five World Series games for the Bruins, including a no-hitter (two batters shy of a perfect game), in opener versus South Carolina (3-0), 2-1 come from behind victory over Oklahoma State and 1-0 win over Fresno State for the title. Her final record last season was 19-2 and she was the NCAA ERA leader with an average of 0.24. Boyd finished the season with several team-high's: most wins (19), strikeouts (172), innings pitched (146), shutouts (15) and completed games (19). She has a streak of nine consecutive scoreless innings.

"Obviously I am pleasantly surprised that Tiffany wants to play for the Titans. I wanted her on our team out of high school but instead much to my disappointment she selected UCLA. But to have her now is great and for three years, really solves our pitching depth problem," said an excited Garman.

Boyd is a 1988 graduate of Woodbridge High School in Irvine. She was one of the nation's top high school recruits, being actively pursued by over 30 schools. Some of Boyd's high school honors include: LA TIMES Player of the Year and Irvine Female Athlete of the Year in 1988, four-time all-league and three-time all-county selection and 1987 and 1988 CIF Player of the Year. She also set five CIF records her senior year: 1) most singles in a season, 2) most strikeouts in a game (21 and 20 in 7 inning games), 3) most strikeouts in a season (363), 4) most consecutive no-hitters (4 games) and 5) most number of no-hitters (9). She ranks in several categories in the historical CIF record book as well.

## ALL-BIG TEN PLAYER KIM POWERS TRANSFERS FROM INDIANA TO CAL STATE FULLERTON

Last season at Indiana University, Kim Powers was named to the Big Ten Softball First Team and as a freshman, was the Big Ten batting champion.

This past summer, Powers played for the Burbank Hilton Sure-shots, a national "B" class women's softball team. She was honored as an All-American and MVP of the National Tournament as she hit the game winning homerun in the championship game.

Powers will be eligible to play for the Titans in 1991.




## 1989 SEASON IN REVIEW

Beginning her tenth season at Cal State Fullerton back in February, Softball Head Coach Judi Garman had led the Titans to no less than a ninth place national finish, an NCAA national championship in 1986 and 468 victories in her nine-year tenure. The 1989 season was supposed to be a rebuilding year for the Titans with no seniors or returning experience on the squad. However, the Titans finished 47-15 overall, 28-8 in the Big West Conference (2nd place) and ranked 4th in the nation at the end of the regular season.

Highlights for the 1989 season included a 7-6, 15-inning win over top-ranked and two-time national champion UCLA at the Titan Softball Complex, a 2-2 series record with Conference Champion Fresno State and a national ranking as high as 3rd place.

Individually, pitcher Anjie Bryant was honored as Big West Conference Pitcher of the Week twice and shortstop Jill Matyuch was a nominee for GTE's Academic All-American Softball Team. Matyuch was also honored as Cal State Fullerton's Female Scholar Athlete of the Year. Four players were selected to the All-Conference team, three to the All-West Region team and outfielder Carey Hess and first baseman Missy Coombes were selected First Team All-Americans. Coombes was also honored as Big West Co-Field Player of the Year and was a Honda-Broderick Award nominee.

With the team's success in 1989, Garman reached a milestone with her 500th victory in a 2-0 win over UC Santa Barbara on April 7. She has an impressive career record of 515 wins, 138 losses and three ties. Assisting Garman were Marty Rubinoff and Linda Shafor, who both return for 1990.



The rapid climb of Ed Carroll through the ranks of the Cal State Fullerton athletics department culminated in his appointment as Director of Athletics on July 1, 1985.

University President Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb made the announcement on May 28, 1985, after a nationwide

search and Carroll, now 39. immediately ushered in an era of "positive thinking" for Titan athletics.

"One of my priorities is to enhance the image of our athletic program by stressing positives," says Carroll. "We must use the power of positive thinking to overcome our limitations and build our program to greater heights."

In his first year as athletic director, Carroll immediately upgraded the football sched-

ule. LSU, Florida, West Virginia and Tulsa have signed on to host the Titans over the next few years with several other major universities currently in negotiations to play Fullerton.

Carroll began his Fullerton athletic career as a wrestler. In 1972 he served as team captain and was selected the "Most Outstanding Wrestler" in the California Collegiate Athletic Association championship meet. He later served as an assistant to former head coach Don Matson.

Carroll earned bachelor's degrees in history and physical education from Fullerton as well as a secondary teaching credential. He taught physical education classes at Fullerton and earned a master's degree in recreation administration from CSU Long Beach.

After serving in various capacities in the Fullerton recreation department, Carroll left briefly in mid-1980 to serve as a recreational sports programmer and doctoral intern at Indiana University.

He returned to Fullerton in November, 1980 as an assistant athletic director. From October, 1981 to April, 1982 he was acting athletic director and also acting director of the Titan Athletic Foundation.

He then served under athletic director Lynn Eilefson, who left in January, 1985 for a similar post at San Jose State.




