

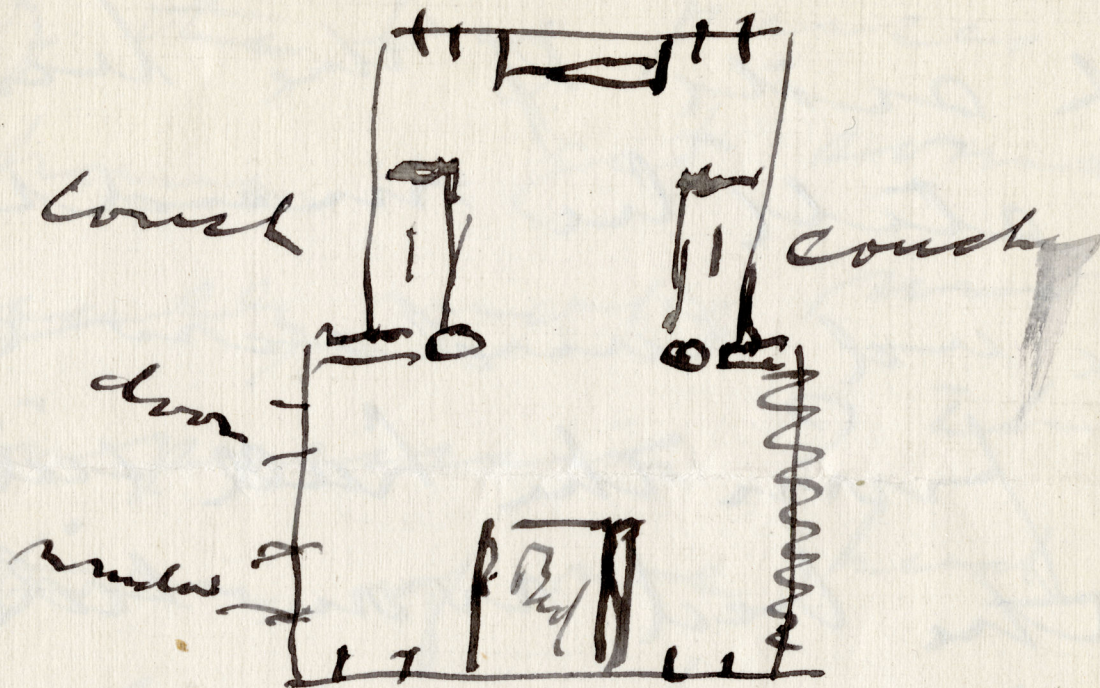

I am enclosing another plan which is much better in these respects although it loses a little

of the hull treatment
that we have considered
here is the plan.



It sacrifices the big central
door at the entrance and
puts the bed in its place.
This allows the Taperly
to be heavy. It makes
the alcove a fireplace alcove
with big couches on either

side which is nice
and comfortable.

I think the doors on
each side of the bed
can still be made
large and handsome
both from the hall side
and the bed room side

We can use the
fine big beds and
get good effects all
around.

In the hall or lobby
we will have to have

effective furnishings
between the doors but
we can use some
of the big pieces we
have or get some and
really make more
impression I think
than if we had left
only one door in the
middle.

I hope you will like
this. I think it the
best solution - the most
comfortable and the most decorative
