Minutes Approved.

Reports:

Chair Report: Target enrollment up to 5%. Provost at 8,008 FTE (Exec Comm).

Revision to CA Ed Code - add members of armed services to priority and foster youth and former foster youth to priority's list. Bring it in line with CA Education Code.

Draft MOU - APC will take on Draft MOU and policy for online education. (approved by ExComm) Request for liaison from ExEd. No word on who it will be.

New Business:

1) GE Unit Policy (Mike Smith, Chr, GE Subcommittee)

GE has been charged with creating a unit policy.

3 unit %, of all the offered seats, the # of courses that were 3 units

- avg value for last 7 semesters, 85% are 3 unit courses
- a cap and trade system, 83.3% in a student getting one extra unit.
- monitor it, if it rises above prescribed amount, then prohibit anymore 4 unit courses being added.
- no trends at present.
- has presented to curriculum comms in S&T and chairs and they approve.
- Unit creep appears in Areas D&E only, not A, B, or C.
- Overall unit policy was approved unanimously by GE subcommittee

Cap: these rules would be enforced internally rather than from the GE Committee.

Trade = faculty in the schools figure out the issue around offering courses of 3 as opposed to 4 unit.

Currently can't get more than previous semester data out of Peoplesoft. Calculations will all be looking backward. If courses make requests to change from 3-4 units, approvals will go to pedagogically appropriate courses. The policy does not affect Area B. Unit policy was passed GE unanimously.

PR: Changes in units have created challenges. What is a good number divided by 3 & 4? 12. Is there a long term plan to make it more consistent across the board? Students constantly coming up with challenges. Spring will see a 16 unit cap. Students could have a problem when getting stuck @ 14. MD: incredible impact to PT students.

ES: GE comm did extensive analysis around program review. The complicated factors are pretty significant. Students take courses that double count for their GE and their major. This may solve the issue for the next few years.

2) ES - SB 1440 (system level) and Early Start

SB 1440

- In good shape, responded to 12 transfer model curriculum
- Provosts have been asked where depts say no, to consult with the departments, attempt to get them to say yes.. what would it take to get to a yes. would there be changes to curr.
- Only two depts to have said no. Provost has ask ES to meet with Dean and dept chr to review options. Certifying back to make sure all procedures were followed through.
- Another 12 TMCs to be released, different disciplines coming forward. ES has notified Deans and department chairs of what is coming.

Early Start

- Chancellor's Office continues to move full speed ahead with new students who are underprepared in Math and English.
- ES has met with Athletic department and early assessment program, with CMS people, Communications group (how to notify students), working with faculty in Extended Ed 1 uni course in Math (online using "Alex" online tool, "Alex" is not ATI accessible [notified Math dept],), 1 unit course in English (F2F),
- To finish Early Start by Aug 7 (has to run through the first week of August)
- · No issue with academic calendar

3) New Academic Calendar - Elaine Sundberg

- 5 year calendar now through 2016-2017.
- Required to have 147 days of instruction
- additional 23 work days
- 170 work days for classroom faculty
- Must have a min of 46+ calendar days between pay periods for state
- Payroll conflicts between athletics calendar and spring finals schedule

Suggestions:

- moving spring break earlier
- retaining Cesar Chavez as a holiday
- adding an extra day of instruction to fall
