

more; (b) if he is on probation and earns a grade-point average of less than 2.0* for three consecutive semesters; (c) if he fails to earn at least a 1.0 grade-point average during any one semester.

A student admitted on probation must earn a 2.0 average or above during the first semester of his attendance. He will thereafter be held to the standards listed above.

REINSTATEMENT AND READMISSION

A student disqualified from the college may be reinstated only by special action and if the facts in the case seem to warrant such action. Ordinarily, consideration for readmission will not be given unless a semester has elapsed since the disqualification. Students who have been disqualified more than once may not be readmitted except under the most unusual circumstances.

A student returning after an absence and who has been disqualified after his last term of attendance must file an application with the Admissions Office at least four weeks before the beginning of the session to which he seeks readmission.

TRANSCRIPTS AND REPORTS

Transcript of Record. One complete transcript of record is furnished each student free of charge. Each additional copy requires a fee of \$1.

Transcripts of record submitted to this institution will be retained except in cases where the student fails to register.

Reports to Students. Grade reports are given students at the close of each semester. At mid-term a warning report is given to those doing unsatisfactory work in any subject.

CREDIT BY EXAMINATION

Credit by examination may be earned in some cases in appropriate courses. For further information consult the department concerned.

INDEPENDENT STUDY

The college has established a plan of independent study for capable upper division and graduate students in order to provide opportunity for a greater degree of originality than is possible in regular courses, to enable students to pursue interests not covered by established courses, and to encourage them to develop their special abilities and interests. Each department has an independent study upper division course, "190," and certain departments have "290" courses on the graduate level. Students may take this work in their major or a closely related field. To be eligible for independent study, a student must have a grade average of "B" or higher (or in exceptional cases consent of department chairman) in the major field of study. He must also have the approval and advice of a faculty member closely identified with the special interest, who will be his supervising instructor in the project. Maximum credit of 6 units is allowed in independent study "190" toward the bachelor's degree, and maximum credit of 6 units in "190" and "290" is allowed toward the master's degree. A student will not be permitted to register during Summer Session for independent study exclusively.

Students register for independent study by enrolling both with the instructor under whom the work will be directed and with the Committee on Independent Study. Within the first three weeks the student will be assigned a faculty committee of three members. This committee will meet early in the semester to make suggestions and to approve the general nature of the project. Again near the end of the semester the committee will examine the completed work which will include a final written report. If the study is judged satisfactory, the supervising instructor will then grade the work.
