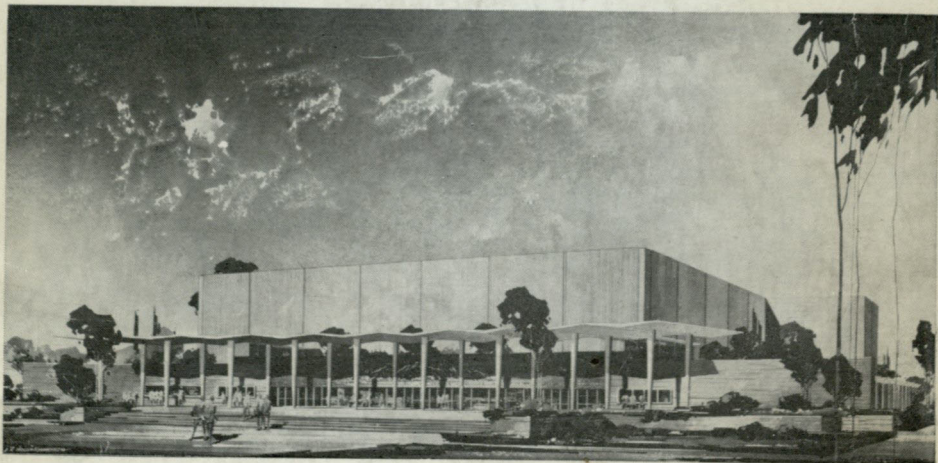

General History: One of 18 California State Colleges, OSC was authorized in 1957 and established in 1959. The College is accredited by the Western College Association and the California State Department of Education. Since September 1960, Orange State College has been situated on a 235-acre campus in northeast Fullerton.

Approximately 3700 students are enrolled. Enrollments are expected to grow to 6,750 students in 1966, and 11,930 students in 1971. The College is master planned to house 30,00 full and part-time students.

OSC is authorized to grant bachelor's degrees in 22 major fields, and master's degrees in four fields. It also has several credential programs. Seventy-five percent of the faculty have their doctoral degrees, nearly twice the national average for four-year colleges and universities.

The Letters and Science Building is the first permanent structure at Orange State. Encompassing over seven acres of floor space, this is one of the largest college or university buildings in America. It was designed and built to house a maximum of 10,000 students. The building is unusual in certain of its construction features, such as complete air-conditioning, elevators and escalators. The Music-Speech-Drama Building is now under construction. A new Physical Education Building is scheduled for construction in the near future and occupancy for the 1965 season. It is designed for a seating capacity of 5,000.

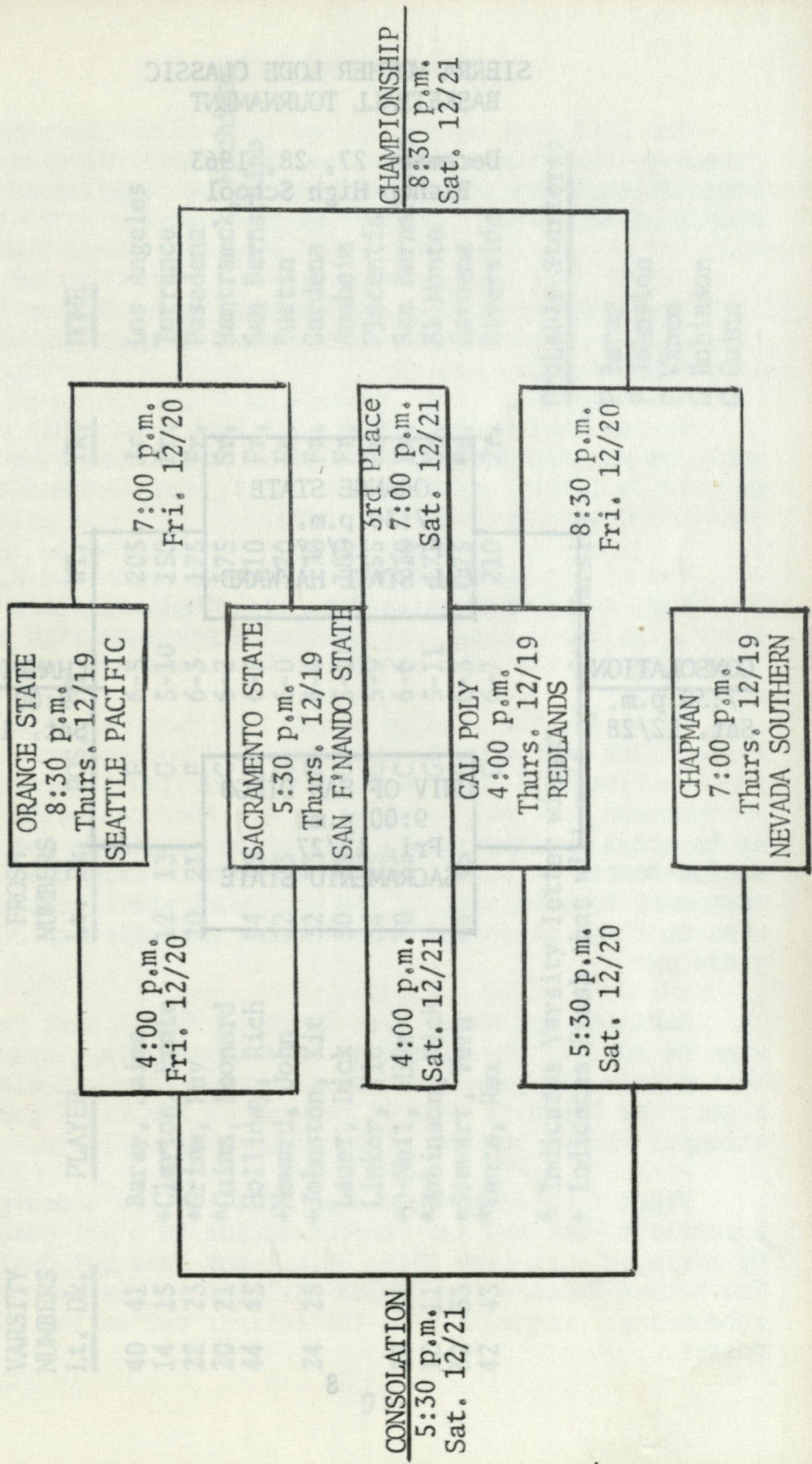

SEASON'S PROSPECTS

The 1963-1964 season is one that coach Alex Omalev likens to the Titans' first-ever in interscholastic competition three seasons ago when they compiled an overall record of 16-14.

"We'll just have to wait and see," says Omalev "but it looks like our success will depend upon how our freshmen that are elevated to the varsity come through and whether or not we can stay healthy."

To say that Orange State will lack depth this year would be an understatement. Omalev reports that he will go with just three varsity returnees, one JC transfer, and six freshmen on the varsity squad.

Two of the three starters, Leonard Guinn and Rich Robinson, are proved collegiate basketballers while the third, Rex Vance, had just limited experience with the Titans during the late stages of last season.

Guinn was the leading scorer and Most Valuable Player last year when he averaged 20.5 points per game and led the Titans in just about every individual department. He received honorable mention in All-American balloting and if he stays healthy should be a prime candidate for post season honors in 1964. Guinn will switch from his customary forward spot to the backcourt where he played when he first performed under Omalev at Fullerton JC five years ago.

Robinson was named Most Improved Player last year when he sparked the Titans in late season play, averaged 10.6 points per game and became a real "star" in his own right. He hit more than 44 percent of his field goal attempts and 77 percent of his free throw efforts.

Vance transferred to Orange State at the semester break last year and saw limited action in eight games. He averaged just over three points per game but Omalev feels that Vance's real value will lie in his improved rebounding. Vance is 6-7, the tallest man on the OSC roster.

MORE PROSPECTS

Among the freshman crop, Omalev is perhaps highest on Kit Johnston, 6-4, from Gardena. "Kit will probably be our fifth starter," opines Omalev, "he's got a lot to learn but appears to have the making of a fine ball player."

Other freshmen expected to see action with the Varsity are Mike O'Neil, 6-6, from San Bernardino; Ray Grimm, 6-3, Pasadena; Rich Holliday, 6-5, San Bernardino; Ernie Clayton, 5-10, Torrance; and Vern Stewart, 6-3, Gardena.

The 63-64 schedule will be comparable to any in the previous three years. Four tournaments are on the docket: The Redlands Invitational, Kris Kringle Klassic, Sierra Classic, and University of San Diego Invitational.

Home and away games are set with Chapman, Cal Poly of Pomona, U.S.D., San Diego State, Long Beach State and San Fernando State.

TITAN THUMBNAILS

BARAY, JAIME F 6-5 205 Jr....Baray could be the key man between a fair season and a good season for Orange State. He comes to the Titans after having played at Los Angeles Tech where he made all-conference honors last season, averaging in high double figures. At 6-5 he'll be counted on to carry a heavy load in the rebounding department. His first name is pronounced "Hi-me."

CLAYTON, ERNIE G 5-10 150 Fr....One of six freshmen that will see varsity action, Clayton comes to Orange State from Torrance High.

GRIMM, RAY F 6-3 175 Fr....A starter with Pasadena Muir High last year in the tough Foothill League, Grimm figures to join the varsity and could be as high as the number six man, filling in for another frosh, Kit Johnston, at a forward slot.

GUINN, LEONARD G 6-2 175 Sr....Guinn received several honorable mentions among All-American selections last season and is expected to be the Titans' "big gun" in 1963-1964. Leonard averaged 20.5 points per game last year, led in rebounding and several other individual departments. He's being switched from his customary forward spot to a guard slot by Coach Alex Omalev.

HOLLIDAY, RICH F 6-5 210 Fr....Rich will be counted upon by freshman coach Terry Hermann to do a large portion of the rebounding for the Titan frosh. Holliday played at Pacific High in San Bernardino last year.

HOWARD, JOHN G 6-0 170 Fr....A guard from nearby Tustin High, Howard is one of many freshmen that will suit up with the varsity as well as freshmen units. He will be called on to back up the Titans' experienced pair of guards, Rich Robinson, and Leonard Guinn.

STEWART, VERN F 6-3 175 Fr....A teammate of Johnston's at Gardena, Stewart is another freshman front-liner that will play with the varsity.

MORE THUMBNAILS

JOHNSTON, KIT F 6-4 170 Fr....At Gardena High last year, Johnston made All-League honors and was his club's leading scorer. Johnston, at 6-4, is Alex Omalev's choice as a starter on the Varsity. Johnston will team with Jaime Baray and Rex Vance in the front line and will be asked to mature to the ways of collegiate ball without benefit of watching from the sidelines for any length of time. He's a southpaw and likes to drive.

LAUER, DICK G 5-11 180 Fr....Dick played at Western High in Anaheim last season and was instrumental in the Pioneer's third place finish in the tough Sunset League. He will probably start for Terry Herman's Titan Freshmen.

LINKER, VIC G 5-9 155 Fr....The smallest man on either the Varsity or frosh roster, Linker comes to Orange State from neighboring Placentia where he started for coach Bob Hamblin at Valencia High.

O'NEIL, MIKE C 6-6 210 Fr....This is the boy that Alex Omalev is hoping will develop rapidly into a top flight front liner. The Titans have always been "small" up front and if O'Neil can make the transition from prep ball to college ball, he'll see lots of action for the blue and white. Mike played for Pacific High in San Bernardino.

ROBINSON, RICH G 5-11 175 Sr....Robinson was the Titan's Most Improved Player last year when he averaged more than 10 points per game and became a favorite of the fans with his clutch efforts both offensively and defensively. He possesses a good set shot and is a real hustler on defense. This will be Robinson's third year of Varsity competition at OSC.

VANCE, REX C 6-7 210 Jr....Vance joined the Titans at mid-season last year and saw action in the final eight games, improving with each outing. He'll be counted upon heavily to furnish the Titans with rebounding strength at both ends of the court. At 6-7, he is the tallest Titan since Garry Dougan, at 6-8, played in 1960-1961.

OMALEV'S COACHING RECORD
ON THE CLIMB: NOW 320-105

Coach Alex Omalev has compiled a lifetime coaching record that just about any coach in the nation would be envious of, except perhaps Adolph Rupp of Kentucky.

Omalev's clubs have accrued an amazing record of 320 wins against just 105 losses for a .753 percentage over a period of 14 years of coaching the sport in which he starred in college.

In 11 seasons at Fullerton Junior College, prior to his coming to Orange State, Omalev's Hornets compiled a 261-77 won-loss record while winning eight Eastern Conference titles and one State JC Championship.

Then in 1960, after his club was runner-up in the state JC tourney, Omalev took the step that brought him to Orange State and perhaps the biggest challenge of his career.

He was asked to organize an intercollegiate basketball program, and organize he did.

In three seasons at Orange State the Titans, under Omalev have won 59 and lost 28 for a .678 percentage. Now comes 1963.

The Titans have lost the stars of Jon Brettman, Terry Hermann and Edgar Clark, and Omalev will be asked to build a ball club around just three returning lettermen---Leonard Guinn, Rich Robinson and Rex Vance.

"We'll just have to wait and see," says Omalev when pressed about prospects.

And while on paper prospects do not look too bright, you can bet your bottom dollar that Alex Omalev will field a highly representative team...a man with his habit of winning usually finds ways of doing so.

Omalev was born in Hamtramck, Michigan and attended high school in Detroit. He attended the University of Southern California where, as a senior, he was named to the Clair Bee All-American basketball team in 1943.

After graduation from USC Omalev served in the U. S. Navy at Los Alamitos Air Station and on the Aircraft Carrier U. S. Gilbert Islands as a flight-deck photographer. Returning from World War II, Omalev played two seasons with the Twentieth-Century Fox AAU Basketball team.

He joined the staff at Fullerton JC in 1949 as basketball coach and a member of the English Department. He came to Orange State in September of 1960 as basketball coach and Associate Professor of Physical Education.

INTRODUCING . . .

COACH TERRY HERMANN

Terry Hermann, a basketball student of Alex Omalev at Fullerton JC for two seasons and at Orange State for three years, was named at the end of last season to coach Orange State College's first-ever freshman basketball team this year.

The announcement was made at the Titans' Athletic Awards Banquet by Director of Athletics, Ernest A. Becker.

A 20-game schedule that includes a game with the University of Southern California frosh, in addition to home and home games with San Fernando State, Chapman College, Whittier, Long Beach State, and San Diego State, has been lined up for Hermann's first effort in the coaching ranks.

Hermann was also honored last season as the Titans' Most Inspirational Player for the third successive season. In his three years at OSC, Hermann averaged 14.4, 11.5, 8.8 points per game. Terry was also a star at Fullerton JC where he played for Omalev and was a member of the Hornet squad that went to the finals of the California State JC tournament in 1960.

Prior to his outstanding collegiate career, Hermann was All-CIF Player of the Year selection at Orange High where he led the Panthers to a CIF championship.
