The School of Education utilizes the resources of the university in the preparation of teachers, administrative officers, and special service personnel for elementary and secondary schools. Teacher education curricula are developed on the assumption that a teacher or administrative officer needs a broad and liberal education, should be master of the subject or subjects he or she teaches, and must be well trained in the teaching/learning processes, including psychological and cultural factors influencing learning and achievement.

The School of Education provides general preparation for the single and multiple subject credentials. Specialist credential programs are offered in early childhood education, special education, pupil personnel services, administration and supervision, in reading, and in bilingual education. (The latter program is pending approval in the Commission for Teacher Preparation and Licensing.)

Supporting services included in the school organization are the Curriculum Library, Children's Library in the University Library, Instructional Materials Center for Special Education, Learning Laboratory, and Reading Center.

COOPERATING PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS

The professional preparation programs of the School of Education utilize the services and facilities of a number of cooperating public school districts in the area for assignments in observation, student teaching, and internship. Teachers, administrators, consultants, and other personnel provide excellent opportunities for students to gain practical experience in the field.
