

Cal State Fulleton Campus Profile

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies, such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

Classes were offered for the first time in 1959, and the first commencement (for five students) was in 1960.

The University's 22,500 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Many students commute each day to and from classes; some come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 700-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing and theater. All told there are 94 degree programs — 44 of them at the graduate level — plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours



without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationallyknown professional artists to Cal State Fullerton for residencies and public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups. Another is Continuing Learning Experience, which spear-

headed the fund-raising campaign to build a gerontology center on campus.

The Ruby Gerontology Center serves as an educational and research facility for the study of aging and a meeting place for the Continuing Learning Experience.

Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing with the opening of a Marriott hotel on campus in 1989, the University and the city of Fullerton opened the Titan Sports Complex in 1992. A 10,000-seat multipurpose stadium, an adjoining baseball stadium and a separate track facility are newly completed features of the complex.

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State Fullerton has embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great institution.



Long regarded as one of the top softball coaches in the nation, Judi Garman saw that reputation permanently acknowledged last December when she was elected to the National Softball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

The nation's winningest collegiate coach with 905 victories -- 211 at Golden West Junior College in Huntington Beach and 694 at Cal State Fullerton -- was enshrined at a banquet in Atlantic City, New Jersey on Dec. 4. Her career record is 694-218-4 (.760) at the Division I level and 905-258-4 (.777) including eight seasons at Golden West.

The induction is only the latest in a seemingly endless stream of honors and accomplishments for Garman, who established the CSUF softball program in 1980 and never has placed lower than ninth in the nation in her 14 seasons. Her

inaugural team finished third in the conference, second in the region and ninth in the AIAW Tournament. Since then, Garman's teams have won or shared eight conference titles and six regional championships while finishing second in the College World Series in 1981, 1983 and 1985; third in 1982 and 1987 and winning the 1986 NCAA Championship.

Garman's accomplishments stretch across the continent from Canada to Santa Barbara to Golden West College to Cal State Fullerton. She earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Saskatchewan in 1966 and moved to California where she began working on her master's degree at UCSB. While

at Santa Barbara, she started club softball and soon had a varsity team. Upon completion of her studies, she took the women's athletic director position at Westmont College in Santa Barbara and coached the volleyball, basketball and tennis programs in addition to softball.

Garman moved to Golden West College where, along with softball, she coached basketball (1973-76) and cross country (1977-79). Garman coached the Rustlers' softball team to an unprecedented four consecutive national championships (1975-78) while compiling a record of 211-40 (1972-79). Twenty-one of her softball players received scholarships to four-year institutions. Due to those outstanding feats at GWC she was named to the California Community College

Hall of Fame in 1992.

When she came to Fullerton there was no on-campus diamond. Her first five teams called a municipal facility at Lions Field their home diamond until an outstanding two-diamond complex with lights was constructed as part of a joint venture with the city of Fullerton.

Very involved professionally, Garman served a two-year reign as president of the National Softball Coaches Association from 1990-1991. Each year she hosts clinics which bring over 200 coaches and 1,500 players to the campus. Additionally, she has produced highly successful pitching video tapes with acclaimed pitching coach Don Sarno.

In February, 1991, Garman was honored at the Fifth Annual National Girls and Women in Sports Luncheon sponsored by the Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles for her contribution to collegiate athletics in Southern California.

A popular speaker at clinics around the country, Garman has also made numerous trips abroad to Holland, Italy, Czechoslovakia and Japan. She runs a camp each summer in Italy. Many Titans have had the opportunity to play overseas because of these contacts and this past Fall pitcher Tiffany Boyd played professionally in the Italian championships.

Fishing and snow skiing in Aspen, Colorado, occupy Garman's time away from the softball field. She also has numerous business interests and is actually involved in running a family business in Canada that manufactures moccasins.

Coaching at Cal State Fullerton for her ninth season is Kathy Van Wyk, a former standout pitcher at Fullerton.

Van Wyk, 33, was a CSUF assistant coach from 1983 to 1987 and a part of the 1986 national championship team. After leaving Fullerton, Van Wyk became a pitching instructor at Rod Carew's Baseball School in Anaheim from 1987 to 1989. She then went to Azzano Decimo, Italy, to coach the Azzanase Softball Club. From January to March, 1990, she was the pitching coach for the Walkerville Softball Club in Adelaide, South Australia.

She returned to Cal State Fullerton as an assistant coach for the 1991 season. She has produced five instructional video tapes on pitching and catching.

Pitching for the Titans in 1982, Van Wyk posted a 35-1 record with a 0.18 earned run average. The victories remain a school single-season record and the .972 winning percentage is an NCAA record. She earned AIAW/NCAA All-America honors and won the Broderick Award, which honors the outstanding collegiate softball player in the nation. She also was named WCAA All-Confer-

ence, Orange County Athlete of the Month, PONY All-Tournament pitcher and won an NCAA post-graduate scholarship with a 3.43 grade point average.





Her 1982 stats included four no-hitters, back-to-back perfect games, 27 shutouts, 278 innings pitched, 270 strikeouts and six one-hitters.

Van Wyk began her college softball career at Texas Women's University. At TWU, she was named 1979 Texas AIAW Player of the Year, along with many other honors. She transferred to CSUF in 1981 after TWU dropped softball.

A 1983 graduate of Fullerton with a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education, Van Wyk completed her master's degree in PE in 1993 at Azusa Pacific. She lives in Corona.

Assistant Coach Chenita Rogers

Returning for her second year as an assistant coach is former Titan outfielder Chenita Rogers. She spends most of her time working with the outfielders and base runners.

As an outfielder for the Titans, Rogers won first-team All-America honors in 1986 in 1987. She is one of only five Cal State Fullerton players to have won that honor twice. In 1990, she was named to the NCAA All-Decade team.

Rogers holds the school records for stolen bases with 23 in a season (1987) and 37 in her career. She likely will see her career record broken this year by Jstone Vines.

Rogers was named a first-team ASA All-American in 1990 as a member of the Invasion and has competed for USA national teams in China and New Zealand. After leaving Cal State Fullerton, Rogers was an assistant coach at Sacramento City College and head softball and girls junior varsity basketball coach at Valencia High in Placentia.

Rogers is currently completing work on a bachelor's degree in sociology at Cal State Fullerton.



1994 Season Preview

Cal State Fullerton must replace only four regulars from last year's Big West Conference co-championship softball team, but that quartet represented 84 per cent of the pitching victories and 46 per cent of the run production.

"We are not expecting anyone to fill the shoes of All-Americans Denise DeWalt nor Tiffany Boyd," said Coach Judi Garman on the eve of the program's and her 14th season at Fullerton. "We have some excellent newcomers for those positions, but it will be up to the rest of the lineup to build on their experience from last year and shoulder more of the burden."

Letterwinner Traci Fischer and Golden West College transfer Marcy Rainwater will vie for DeWalt's spot at short-stop. Freshman Trinity Johnson from Temecula Valley High School is the heir apparent to Boyd. She joins returning starter Jennifer Mortensen in comprising the heart of a pitching staff that also lost two-year letterwinner Cheryl Longeway, who transferred to Southwestern Louisiana.

DeWalt was the Field Player of the Year in the Big West and led the conference in hitting with a robust .418 average. She earned All-America honors in both 1992 and 1993.

Boyd was a three-year performer who won All-America honors in 1991 and 1992. In her Titan career she posted an 82-28 record while hitting 7 home runs.

The Titans also lost two-year starting third baseman Marci White to academic ineligibility. She batted .308 last year with 17 RBI.

Three second-team all-conference selections do return in first baseman Rose Garces and outfielders Heidi Robertson and Jstone Vines.

Garces,a two-year starter who will be a junior, batted .324 last season with 3 home runs and 24 runs batted in. Robertson, another junior with two years of experience, batted .301. Vines, a three-year letterwinner, batted .277 and led the team with 12 stolen bases in 14 tries. She is only five steals away from Chenita Rogers' school career record of 37.

Other starters returning include second baseman Laurie LoForti, catcher Shannon Dolan and outfielders Melissa Hadfield and Tracie Noggle.

LoForti batted .179 while committing only 10 errors in 278 chances. Dolan was a part-time starter as a freshman and the regular catcher last season. She batted .258 with 2 home runs. Hadfield played in 43 game sand batted .239 with 10 RBI. Noggle started more than half the games and batted .236.

Competition for several spots should be heated.

At shortstop, Fischer is a sophomore with parts of two seasons of Div. I experience, the result of a medical hardship year in 1992 when she injured an elbow that required surgery. She batted .429 in very limited duty in 1993 after hitting .182 in 1992. She will be challenged by Rainwater, the Most Valuable Player each of the past two seasons for the Rustlers and a two-time second-team all-conference selection. She has only one year of eligibility remaining. She batted .292 for her career.

Infielder Laurie LoForti

LoForti is expected to move over to third base to fill the void caused by White's departure. That will leave the second base job for Delta JC transfer Monica Bagalayos. She batted a mind-boggling .719 last year.

"Laurie is an excellent third baseman," said Garman of the infield switch. "We will lose a little bit offensively there, but hopefully we can gain that back and more with Bagalayos' bat in the lineup."

Another candidate to break into the lineup somewhere, possibly as a designated player, is Fullerton College transfer Angie Guerrero. The Corona High School product was a two-time all-state selection for the Hornets. She batted .312 last year while posting a 16-8 pitching record and was the Co-MVP of the Orange Empire Conference. As a freshman she batted .370 and had a 26-17 pitching record to earn third-team All-America honors.

Another JC transfer trying to make an immediate impact will be Christina Wagy from Riverside City College.

A quintent of freshmen also will try to gain some playing time. Teresa Stippey from Santana High in Santee and Raquel Medina from Mt. Whitney High in Visalia will vie for the backup role to Doland behind the plate. Kristen Stone from Etiwanda HS and Melissa Wong from Central Union HS in El Centro are outfield possibilities. Another good-hitting newcomer is University of Washington transfer Beth Queypo, an outfielder and pitcher who batted .239 and posted a 2-2 pitching record.

Boyd and Longeway combined for 31 of the Titans' 37 wins in 1993 and pitched 339 of the 412 innings. Boyd was 19-13 and Longeway was 12-5 in her sophomore season. But the Titans have the potential to replace them.

Mortensen posted a 6-3 record in 15 appearances last year for the Titans after transferring from Texas A&M. Johnson is an overpowering youngster who could become the ace. She had a 17-3 record last year with an ERA of 0.29 and logged eight no-hitters including five in a row and three in the CIF playoffs. As a junior she was 11-7 with an 0.35 ERA. In her career, she struck out 646 in 510 innings.

The Titans also lost power in DeWalt and Boyd, who led last year's team with 18 and 13 doubles, respectively. They hope to overcome that loss with a new emphasis on speed.

Review of 1993 Season

A late-season drive to a share of the Big West Conference co-championship highlighted the 1993 Cal State Fullerton softball season, which fell short of the goal of reaching the College World Series with another regional tournament loss.

Fullerton overcame a slow start in the Big West with a 15-game conference winning streak and forced the makeup of two rained out games at Pacific. The Titans, 6-5 at one stage of the conference race, completed a doubleheader sweep of the Tigers to finish 25-7 in BWC play and share the championship with Utah State. Fullerton got the automatic NCAA berth by virtue of a tie-breaker over the Aggies but was beaten twice by All-American Lisa Fernandes in the regionals at UCLA to finish with a 37-21 record.

The post-season berth was Fullerton's 14th in 14 seasons of softball. Only the Titans and the Fresno State Bulldogs have participated in all 12 NCAA softball championship tournaments.

Two individuals dominated play for the Titans and received the bulk of post-season honors.

Senior shortstop Denise DeWalt was selected the Big West Player of the Year after leading the league with a .418 batting average. She later earned third-team All-America honors from the coaches association as well as first-team All-West Region and first-team Academic All-America status from CoSIDA and GTE. She led Fullerton with 18 doubles, 3 triples and 40 runs scored. In 178 at bats, she struck out only eight times.

Sharing the spotlight was senior pitcher Tiffany Boyd. She won first-team All-Big West and All-West Regional honors for her pitching and hitting. She compiled a 19-11 record with an 0.93 earned run average. Offensively, she led the Titans with 35 runs batted in while batting .333.



Other post-season honors went to second-team All-Big West selections Rose Garces (first base), Heidi Robertson (outfield), Cheryl Longeway (pitcher) and Jstone Vines (outfield). Third baseman Marci White did not make the Big West team but was selected to the All-West region squad.

Fullerton began the season slowly, winning only three of the first 10 non-conference games. Boyd was limited in off-season workouts due to knee surgery and she lost three of her first five decisions. Fullerton won only one of five games in its own PONY tournament and came out of an early April 4-game series at Utah State with a split and a 7-5 conference mark. But with Boyd healthy and Jennifer Mortensen bolstering the pitching staff after a late transfer from Texas A & M, the Titans got rolling. They swept four in a row from both San Jose State -- two by scores of 10-0 and 16-1 -- and Hawaii and controlled their own destiny at 21-5 after a doubleheader sweep of UNLV. But they lost a home doubleheader to Long Beach State and had to win twinbills at UCSB and Pacific to earn a share of the league title.

Inthe regional tournament at UCLA, the Titans couldn't handle eventual Honda-Broderick Award winner Lisa Fernandes. The Bruins' All-American not only pitched both victories but went 5-for-7 at the plate. In the first game, Garces singled home DeWalt in the top of the first inning and Tiffany Boyd made the run stand up until the sixth inning when Fernandes drove in Kathi Evans. The game went into extra innings and the Bruins won it in the bottom of the ninth when Fernandes scored on a sacrifice fly by Jennifer Brundage, 2-1.

In game No. 2, Boyd and Fernandes matched 4-hitters but Brundage again provided the game-winning RBI with pinch runner Nicole Anderson bringing home a 1-0 win.

PONY-Louisville Slugger Mid-Season Tournament

The Cal State Fullerton women's softball team annually hosts what is generally considered the premiere midseason collegiate tourney in the PONY-Louisville Slugger Invitational Tournament to be held in 1994 from March 23 thru March 27.

Sixteen teams, most of them in the pre-season Top 20 national poll, will collide in a pool-play format consisting of four pools of four teams. Results from pool play will seed a 16-team single-elimination bracket. The champion will be decided on Sunday, March 27.

Cal State Fullerton has won eight of the previous PONY-Louisville events. The now defunct Cal Poly Pomona program is the only other multiple winner, capturing titles in 1983 and 1984. Arizona (1988), Fresno State (1990), Oklahoma State (1989) and Cal State Northridge (1993) each have won a title and are in this year's field, looking to repeat. Pool play schedule:



Titan Softball Complex

The Titan Softball Complex encompasses two lighted and fenced softbal fields which are utilized at capacity during the annual 16-team PONY-Louisville Slugger Tournament as well as year-round by the City of Fullerton. The primary diamond features elevated grandstand seating, individual chair backs on the third-base side, an electronic scoreboard and multiple cages and warm-up mounds.

Improvements constantly are being made. This year's addition is concrete pavement around both backstops for added fan comfort and safety. The bullpens and batting cages also have been spruced up.




