THE MAIN SCHOOL BUILDING.—Laboratories for general chemistry, soils, physics. Freehand and mechanical drawing. Surveying instruments and equipment.

HOUSEHOLD ARTS BUILDING.—Fully equipped for teaching cooking, sewing, dress-making, millinery and applied design. Botanical laboratory has quarters in this building.

CREAMERY.—Completely equipped for manufacture of butter and cheese. Apparatus for running various tests of milk and milk products.

GREENHOUSES AND WORKROOMS.—Propagation of plants, trees and shrubs from seeds and cuttings.

CARPENTER SHOP.—Benchwork and woodworking machinery. See cabinet work in progress for the Panama-Pacific Exposition.

MACHINE SHOP.—Lathes, drill presses, shapers, milling machine, heavy planer, and small equipment. Some work in progress for Exposition.

FORGE SHOP.—A shop completely equipped for practical blacksmithing.

ELECTRIC POWER PLANT.—A completely equipped plant, supplying shop and school buildings with power, heat and light. Steam engines, gas engines, dynamos, motors, a variety of electric lamps, and testing apparatus. Demonstrations during the afternoon.

DAIRY BARN.—Sanitary and convenient. Silo in connection.

PURE BRED LIVE STOCK.—Percheron and Clydesdale horses; Holstein and Jersey cattle; Berkshire and Poland China swine. Many of the animals are prize winners. Be sure to see Marquis' Foxy Belle, the highest producing Jersey in California. For the year ending March 16, 1914, she produced 756 lbs., 11 ozs., of butter.

The School carries on three main lines of work—*Agriculture, Mechanics, and Household Arts*. The regular course is four years in length. Pupils fifteen years of age are admitted upon completion of the eighth grade of the grammar schools. No tuition fees are charged; moderate laboratory fees only are required. Catalogue will be sent upon request. The new school year will open September 14, 1914.

The annual class day program, including a pageant play, will be given at the School Thursday evening, June 11, 1914.

The graduation exercises will be held in Elmo Theatre, San Luis Obispo, Friday evening, June 12, 1914.

Both programs will be open to the public.
