

Whereas, there exists within the city of San Luis Obispo, without law or authority, a wide open red light district which is within three-fourths mile of the School, and,

Whereas, the rooming places of many of our students are within from one to five blocks of said district, and many other students pass within less than two blocks of the district each day on the main thorofare between the city and School; and,

Whereas, these conditions have prevailed for several years with little or no improvement, said conditions having been on various occasions in the past six years called to the attention of the city and country officers by the School authorities, therefore be it

Resolved, by the Faculty of the California Polytechnic School that the attention of our School Trustees be called to the above stated conditions, and that they be requested to demand of the proper authorities that the inmates of said district be driven from the city and that the property owners be prosecuted and enjoined from further lease of said property for immoral purposes.
