

MEDIA INFORMATION

This guide is published by the Sports Information office at Cal State Fullerton for your convenience in coverage of 1982 Titan football. Should you require additional information or materials, please contact:

PRESS CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only. Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. When time permits, credentials will be mailed. If not, press will call is located at the most southern ticket booth on the west side of Titan Stadium.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only and must be worn in plain sight at all times. NCAA rules limit shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the field and the team areas and these rules will be strictly enforced. Lighting is totally solar powered.

PRESS BOX: Located on the west side of Titan Stadium, the press box is an "open air" facility - cooled, heated, ventilated and lit by Mother Nature. A limited number of working spots are available with table and chair. Ample seating on adjacent bleachers is available.

TELEPHONES: There is only one telephone — (714) 773-3970 — available in the press box and it must be kept free for messages, other scores, etc. Ample phones are available in the sports information office after games. Additional phones should be ordered through the Cal State Fullerton business office and Mr. Joe Dusbabek (714) 773-2421 and well in advance.

TELECOPIERS: One is available on a page by page basis but only in the sports information office after games.

INTERVIEW ROOMS: After the game, coach Gene Murphy will be available to media in the equipment manager's office in the Fullerton varsity locker room in the gymnasium. Visiting coaches are provided a special dressing room on the west side of the hall at the north entrance to the gymnasium. The gymnasium is located approximately 300 yards south of Titan Stadium.

RADIO: A telephone will be provided the designated commercial station for each visiting PCAA school at no charge. Other opponents will be provided a phone for a fee of \$25 payable at least one week in advance to: Associated Students, Inc. and mailed in care of the Sports Information Office. Please make all line charges collect calls or have the station call you. There are no enclosed booths.

COMPUTER TERMINALS: At press time, installation of additional telephones in the pressbox was impossible. Because all games at Titan Stadium are day games, there should be no deadline problems. Telephones with ample working space will be available after games in Room 162 of the Gymnasium.

OFFICIAL GAME SUMMARIES: Will be collated and distributed in Room 162 of the Gymnasium after the game. Pre-game notes, lineup and roster changes, other scores and half-time statistics will be distributed in the press box during the game.

SCOUTS: Seating is available in the top rows on the west side of the stadium immediately in front of the press box. Requests should be made at least one week in advance.

PARKING: Is FREE. By request, preferred location passes will be mailed.

CAL STATE FULLERTON CAMPUS

California State University, Fullerton, is a relatively young institution, having opened only 23 years ago. However, it already has grown to more than 23,000 students and achieved national distinction.

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes; many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, communications, music, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 81 degree programs — 39 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is the largest university level internship and cooperative education program on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain onthe-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Still another strong point is the university's cultural events program, including a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

A more recent development is formation of a professional caliber symphony orchestra to provide the university community and area residents with high-quality music.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the 7,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

Further examples of community outreach are the Fullerton Arboretum and Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary. Opened in 1979, the Arboretum is a 25-acre on-campus preserve that was established jointly by the university and the City of Fullerton. Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary is a half-hour from campus in a canyon of the Santa Ana Mountains.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Partners in Excellence." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make the university the foremost bachelor's master's degree institution in the nation.

ADMINISTRATION

Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, President



Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb was appointed the third president of Cal State Fullerton on July 8, 1981. Her selection was the culmination of a nationwide search begun in November, 1980 to replace Dr. L. Donald Shields, who had resigned after a ten-year term to accept the presidency of Southern Methodist University.

Dr. Cobb had served as Dean of Douglass College at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, since 1976. There she also held the rank of Professor of Biological Sciences. Prior to her Douglass appointment she was Dean of Connecticut College and Professor of Zoology for seven years. Previously, she was Professor of Biology at Sarah Lawrence College in New York.

Born in January, 1924, Dr. Cobb is known for her work in cell physiology, her promotion of the advancement of women in scientific fields and her activities on behalf of minorities. She is the first black woman to head a major public university on the west coast.

Cobb earned her bachelor's degree in 1944 from Talladega College in Alabama and her M.S. and Ph.D. in cell physiology from New York University in 1947 and 1950, respectively. She is the mother of a son, Jonathan, who is a student in the Cornell University Medical School.

TITAN ATHLETIC FOUNDATION

The Titan Athletic Foundation is a non-profit organization that exists solely to aid the athletic program at Cal State Fullerton. It is a group of individuals with a genuine interest in athletics, the University and the community.

The foundation supports athletics by providing funds for scholarships that insure an effective recruiting program which attracts the best student-athletes available. The 1982 drive totaled nearly \$300,000.

The TAF was founded in January, 1973 and the initial 150 members raised approximately \$30,000. Membership today totals more than 800.

Fullerton businessman Pierre Nicolas was the TAF's first president. He was succeeded by Don Karcher, president of Carl Karcher Enterprises; Buck Johns, president of Home Works; Larry Slagle, vice president of Yellow Cab of North Orange County; and current president Jim Woods, president and chairman of the board of Baker Oil Tools.

The always progressive Pacific Coast Athletic Association takes another step forward in 1982 with the addition of a seventh football playing member — the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

Now spanning three states — California, Nevada and Utah — the PCAA enters its 14th year as one of the eight Division I alignments in the nation after last winter's revisions which dropped several conferences into the Division I-AA category. Schedules which include more and more Division I powers are indicative of the growth patterns continuing at member schools.

The PCAA has flourished under the dynamic leadership of Commissioners Jesse T. Hill and Lewis A. Cryer, who

begins his fifth year at the league's helm.

Hill, the highly-esteemed director of athletics at USC for 26 years, was instrumental in obtaining automatic qualification for NCAA championships in several sports and in 1976 played a key role in the inauguration of the highly-successful post-season basketball tournament. Formation of the Northern and Southern California Baseball Associations intermingling members of the PCAA and WCAC was a Hill project hailed as a major money saver by both leagues.

Cryer replaced Hill in June of 1978 and has overseen the continued flourishing of the post-season basketball tournament (which moves into The Forum this season) while orchestrating the additions of Utah State and UNLV to the conference along with the origination of the California Bowl in 1981. It matches the PCAA champion against the champion of the Mid-American Conference in Fresno in the only bowl game other than the Rose Bowl which pits "closed-end" opponents - those representing pre-determined conferences.

Although the Mid-American Conference champion Toledo Rockets spoiled the party slightly with a last-minute 27-25 victory over San Jose State, all the hopes and speculations finally had become reality.

Sponsoring the California Bowl is the Greater San Joaquin Valley Sports Association. The Valley Children's Hospital and Guidance Clinic has been designated the game's official charitable beneficiary and will receive profits derived from the game. Seating capacity in Bulldog Stadium is 30,000.

Head Coach Gene Murphy



In a little more than two years, Eugene Vincent Murphy has rebuilt the Cal State Fullerton football program and established a foundation from which success on the playing field seems imminent.

He has assembled a young, enthusiastic and talented staff, brought home games to an "instant" campus stadium, helped spur fund-raising in the community to record levels and instituted a freshman-oriented recruiting plan that is beginning to bear fruit.

"We're still two seasons away from reaching that ideal balance of classes on the squad, but we certainly aren't looking past this year," said Murphy, who also served as Fullerton's interim athletic director for four months in 1981. "Physically, we are just now about on a par with

the Pacific Coast Athletic Association and we won't have the drastic turnover in personnel every two years."

Murphy, 43, came to Fullerton following a two-year stint as head coach at his alma mater, the University of North Dakota, where he complied a 15-7 record and climbed as high as No. 3 in the Division II national rankings. His Titan teams have reversed that record in two seasons while "prostituting" themselves with 15 road games (3-12) to upgrade the budget via gate guarantees. The Titans played 10 road games in a row—six to end the 1980 campaign and four more to open up the 1981 season.

"I've had more fun coahing at Fullerton than ever before," said Murphy, who spent 11 seasons as offensive coordinator at North Dakota. "I was very comfortable at North Dakota. Too comfortable. I needed a challenge. I came to California to throw the football."

Murphy initiated his "squirrel derby" offense in 1980 when the Titans' attack often featured fake punts, false huddles, naked reverses and passes to every receiver. Last year it was truly an aerial circus with 425 pass attempts or an average of more than 38 per game.

The fourth head coach in the 12-year history of Titan football, Murphy spent a total of 16 years at North Dakota including a three-year playing career. He was an all-conference quarterback in 1962 after transferring from the University of Minnesota, where he found himself sitting on the bench behind Gopher star Sandy Stephens.

Upon graduation, Murphy served as a graduate assistant for the Sioux and then coached football, baseball and swimming at North St. Paul High School before returning to his alma mater.

During Murphy's 11-seasons as offensive coordinator, the Sioux won six conference championships and participated in three post-season bowl games (1966, 1972 and 1975). As head coach, he won the North Central Conference title in 1979 and advanced to the Division II playoffs to earn conference coach of the year honors.

Murphy also spent five summers (1967-71) as an assistant coach with the Saskatchewan Rough Riders of the Canadian Football League.

Born Aug. 6, 1939 in Jersey City, NJ, Murphy was an all-sports star at St. Peter's High in New Brunswick and earned all-state honors in football and basebal (shortstop). He was recruited by current Los Angeles Rams' coach Ray Malavasi to Minnesota under coach Murray Warmath.

He has two master's degrees from North Dakota — in physical education (1963) and secondary administration (1977).

Murphy married the former Kathy Fischer on Sept. 25, 1964. They honeymooned at a Minnesota Vikings game. They have two sons — Tim (16) and Michael (12) — and live in Anaheim.




BOB BURT

SEASON PREVIEW

The first winning season in nine years appeared to be within the grasp of Cal State Fullerton as preparations for the 1982 campaign moved into their final stages.

Coach Gene Murphy and his staff have put two years into a resurrection program and the fruits of their labor should begin to show up in the won-lost column. Last season the Titans came within a "touchdown" of a winning log as they finished 3-8 with the last three defeats coming by one, one and two points.

"We will have a better football team than last year." said Murphy, who guided his first Titan team to a 4-7 mark in 1980. "We know we have made great strides and progress but it will have to show up in the record book before most people realize it.

"We still are a young team and it will be two more years before we have the proper balance of seniors, juniors, sophomores and freshmen but we feel we can be competitive with most people now."

Fullerton returns nine starters on defense and five on offense among 35 lettermen. Standouts on defense are All-PCAA performers Mike Kennedy at tackle and Lee Miller at cornerback. Safety Rod Weber and linebackers Rick Senteno and Terry Hubbard also rate special attention. Offensively, part-time starter Bob Caffrey returns at quarterback and he has a pair of two-year starters to throw to in wide receiver Jeff York and tight end Ed Wooster. Up front, All-PCAA guard Larry Baker and Al Krueger, a 1980 starter at tackle, clear the way.

Although still predominantly a traveling team with eight road games and only four home contests in 1982, Fullerton faces a schedule less forboding than in 1981 when the Titans opened up 0-4 after visits to Wyoming, Utah State, Hawaii and Arizona.

OFFENSE

QUARTERBACK — Part-time starter Bob Caffrey is the heir apparent to record-breaking Tom St. Jacques but sophomore Damon Allen is pushing the junior from Anaheim, Caffrey was the mid-season starter after St. Jacques was injured at Hawaii. He led the team to a 16-16 fourth-quarter tie at Arizona before losing but then directed consecutive wins over Cal Poly SLO and Fresno State before St. Jacques regained the job with a second-half rally at Pacific. Allen was the No. 1 QB in spring while Caffrey played baseball. He is an exceptional runner and thrower but needs experience. All-American Alex Espinoza from CIF champion St. Paul High School waits in the wings.

RUNNING BACK — Plenty of talent but it's mostly untested. Only Roy Lewis (59 carries) and Todd Gerhart (10 carries) have Division I experience with 1980 star Bob Reynolds still sidelined by a mid-1981 knee injury. Fast and muscular Van Campfield and quick Terry Whaley are the prime challengers to Lewis at the "halfback" spot while "fullback" Gerhart is being pushed by Todd Tolefree and Jimmy Render.

LINE — Most impressive physical array in the Gene Murphy era. Big shoes to fill with graduation of three-time All-PCAA center Harris Burnett and Golden West transfer Bill Smith is the likely starter. All-PCAA tackle Larry Baker moves back to guard with Todd Nelson, Mike Gnesda and Darryl Titsworth. Al Krueger, a 1980 starter back from a knee injury, will probably be at one tackle opposite sophomore Daren Gilbert or converted defender Ray Carlos. Three lettermen tight end candidates in a stronger Ed Wooster, John Carpenter and Dan Monteverde.

WIDE RECEIVERS — Excellent starters in Jeff York and Terry Smoot but then it's a dogfight. Senior Brian Allen is back from a shoulder injury to battle redshirt Aaron Blackmon, squad member Vince Gamache and a handful of impressive freshmen.

DEFENSE

LINE — Returns virtually intact from 1981 with only captain Greg Gary at end graduated. Eric Emery, who backed up Al Clark on the other side last year, moves to Gary's spot with part-time players Micah Sims and Wayne Mitchell in relief as well as freshman Sean Foy. Triumvirate of tackles is back in All-PCAA second-teamer Mike Kennedy, Andre Pinesett and Jed Henning. Joe Aguilar won the starting job at nose guard last year but Craig Mitchell and strongman Al Williams will push him.

LINEBACKERS — Deepest position on the team. Rick Senteno and Terry Hubbard return as the starters with impressive sophomore John Nevens and Washington State transfer John West pushing them. Sophomore Mark Bennett and freshman Russ Maybury, back from a knee injury, have starting potential.

SECONDARY — "Playing coach" Doug Boswell has graduated but there is great depth and versatility returning. All-PCAA pick Lee Miller and walk-on Steve Belardi were the regular cornerbacks with Pat Riley in relief. Graduate student Rod Weber and letterman Duane Henson, Dale Thompson and Mark Pembrook head up a strong corps of safeties.

SPECIAL TEAMS — Roy Lewis picked up where Bob Reynolds left off in kick-off returns and was among the nation's leaders, but now he emerges as the No. 1 running back so a replacement must be found. Brian Allen handled all the punt return duties and is back. The nation's No. 4 punter, Scott Vernoy, has graduated but Illinois JC transfer Brian Fordon looked impressive in alumni game. Greg Steinke showed range and consistency as a freshman placekicker and should be a fixture for three more years.

SUMMARY — The defense should be more dominating with nine starters back and be able to give a less experienced offensive unit time to mature. Quarterbacks Bob Caffrey and Damon Allen bring more mobility to an inexperienced backfield and they have veteran receivers as targets. The offensive line is bigger and stronger. Half of the first eight games are at home and it will be a battle-tested squad that ends the season with a four-game road trip.







The Titans were gracious guests in their first trip to Wyoming, handing their hosts three first-quarter fumbles which sealed their fate in a deceiving 38-13 loss in the season

The tenor was set when Bob Reynolds fumbled away the opening kickoff at the Fullerton 15-yard line. Five running plays produced the first score for Wyoming, which rushed its offense back onto the field when Ed Wooster fumbled at the Fullerton 45 after catching a Tom St. Jacques pass on the Titans' first play after the touchdown.

Fullerton's defense held thanks to a Rod Weber fumble recovery, but it then cost itself four points when the Titans were guilty of roughing the kicker on a 45-yard field goal by Steve Tobin. The Cowboys traded the three points for a first down which led to a Phil Davis to James Williams four-yard touchdown pass with 4:10 to play in the first quarter.

Wyoming scored again less than a minute later after Tony Bushala couldn't handle a lateral and the Cowboys recovered at the Fullerton one.

When it held onto the ball, the Titan offense chewed up big yardage but failed to dent the scoreboard in the second quarter. A 56-yard drive ended in a missed field goal, a 75-yard drive was halted by an interception and a 60-yard advance was stopped on downs at the Wyoming seven-yard line.

Fullerton made a game of it in the third guarter as St. Jacques sneaked in from the one to climax an 82-yard march. Wyoming countered with a quick touchdown, but the Titans made it 28-13 later in the guarter as St. Jacques sauntered 20 yards up the middle on a quarterback sneak at the end of a 69-yard march.

The final Fullerton play of the Titans' game at Utah State was a capsule summary of the entire afternoon. Quarterback Bob Caffrey's pass intended for tight end Ed Wooster was slightly overthrown and Thomas Bates intercepted in the end zone with 13 seconds to play to preserve the Aggies' 14-9 victory.

The Titans' offense stopped itself with a school record six interceptions while the defense played a near perfect game only to be foiled by two freak plays.

Utah State made only eight first downs in the game and none until the second quarter when the Aggies launched what turned out to be an 80-yard march. The big play was Guy Mc-Clure's punt, which was partially blocked by linebacker Terry Hubbard. The ball was touched beyond the line of scrimmage by defensive end Wayne Mitchell and the Aggies recovered to retain possession. They ran off four consecutive first downs before Maurice Turner ran in for a two-yard touchdown.

The Titans got on the scoreboard with 4:43 to play as Tom St. Jacques threw a 39-yard scoring pass to Norman Brown. On the next Fullerton possession the Titans marched downfield and saw St. Jacques scramble inside the Aggies' five-yard line. However, the play not only was nullified by a penalty but St. Jacques had to be helped off the field. Caffrey's desparation fourth-down pass from the Utah State 37 was intercepted in the end zone by Bates with 1:23 to go.

Utah State took an intentional safety with 51 seconds to play and it looked like a bad move when a short kick, 16-yard runback by Brian Allen and an Aggie personal foul penalty set up the Titans at the Utah State 40-yard line. Caffrey passed 14 yards to Ken Jackson but then threw two incompletions before Bates ended the game with his third interception of the

The Titans made their sixth trip to Honolulu and the scenery and hospitality were more memorable than the football game. Fullerton ran into a quick group of Warriors that were on their way to a contending role in the Western Athletic Conference. Hawaii won, 38-12, in the most lopsided game of the year.

With converted split end Tim Lyons handling the quarterback chores for Hawaii, the hosts were expected to rely on their punishing ground game featuring starters Gary Allen and David Toloumu and reserves Danny Lei and Anthony Edgar. But Lyons came out throwing and ended up hitting 13 of 23 passes for 162 yards.

Toloumu scored from the one with 4:26 to go in the first quarter to cap a 65-yard drive. The Rainbows made it 14-0 in the second quarter when they blocked a Fullerton punt and recovered for a touchdown for the second year in a row.

Fullerton closed the gap to 14-6 at the half on a pair of Greg Steinke field goals. The first was from 33 yards after Terry Hubbard recovered a fumble and the second was a 40-varder after the Titans had driven from their own 36-yard line to the Hawaii 23.

Any hopes of a Fullerton upset were quickly blunted in the third quarter as Hawaii marched 78 yards with the second-half kickoff, scoring on Lyons' one-yard dive. George Griffin's fumble at the Fullerton seven set up a one-yard dive by Edgar with 4:21 to go in the period.

Cal State Fullerton's first venture into Pac-10 football almost produced a stunning upset as the Titans extended an Arizona team that two weeks later would upset the University of Southern California. The host Wildcats broke a 16-16 fourth-quarter tie with three late touchdowns for a deceiving 37-16 decision.

Mistakes and penalties plagued Arizona early and the Titans struck quickly. Tony Bushala went 40 yards with a Bob Caffrey pass to set up a three-yard run over the left side for a 7-0 Fullerton lead. And when Arizona fumbled on its first play following the kickoff, Fullerton capitalized in one play as Caffrey threw a 12-yard scoring strike to Jeff York. A bad snap ruined the conversion try but the Titans held a surprising 13-0 lead with 7:22 to go in the opening period.

Scott Vernov and Sergio Vega staged a long distance punting battle before the Wildcats broke into the scoring column on a 26-yard field goal by Brett Weber

Two big plays put Arizona in the lead. The first was a 50-yard return of the second-half kickoff by Vance Johnson which helped set up a 10-yard touchdown run by Brian Holland that left the score 13-9 when Weber missed the PAT.

The second was a pass interception by Greg Turner which was returned to the Fullerton two-yard line. Tom Tunnicliffe sneaked over for a 16-13 Arizona lead.

Greg Steinke, who missed a 29-yard field goal attempt midway through the third quarter, got the Titans even with a 52-varder, his personal best and second longest in school history with 13:05 to play.

After four consecutive weeks on the road to open the season, the Titans had trouble adjusting to the friendly confines of Titan Stadium. Cal Poly San Luis Obispo's defending Division II national champions fought to a 10-10 halftime tie before the Titans got rolling for a 34-10 win.

The Titans, who completed only three of 10 first-half passes for minus one yard, took advantage of a pair of Rod Weber pass interceptions to turn the tide in the third quarter. The first stopped Cal Poly's initial second-half possession and set up a 61-yard scoring drive. Bob Caffrey threw 20 yards to Jeff York to set up a 29-yard scoring toss to Norman Brown. Weber's second theft set up Fullerton at the SLO 19 and six plays later Caffrey sneaked into the end zone for a 24-10 lead.

Mark Pembrook partially blocked a punt later in the period to set up a 47-yard scoring dash by York on a reverse play on

the first play of the fourth quarter.

A fumble recovery by Weber had positioned Fullerton for the game's first score. Bob Reynolds swept 17 yards to culminate a 44-yard scoring march. Reynolds and George Griffin would later suffer knee injuries which knocked out the Nos. 1 and 2 tailbacks for the remainder of the season.

Coach Gene Murphy picked up his first PCAA road victory when the Titans made it two in a row over Fresno State by dishing out a 13-10 defeat. Although it was primarily a defensive victory, the Fullerton offense did its part by holding onto the ball for the final 3:52 of the game.

The Bulldogs came out roaring and seemed on their way to a rout. A methodical 13-play drive ate up 77 yards and 5:15 of the clock with quarterback Jack Tedford running in for a two-yard touchdown.

An interception and a missed 34-yard field goal attempt ruined the Titans' first two possessions and it wasn't until midway through the second quarter that they scored as Greg Steinke kicked a 41-yard field goal. That was offset moments later, however, as Scott Darrow kicked a 52-yarder for Fresno.

Fresno got only one first down in the third quarter but the Titans couldn't sustain a drive. Bob Caffrey fumbled away the best opportunity at the Fresno State 13 but the Bulldogs shortly returned the favor with Mike Kennedy picking up a loose ball at the Bulldogs' 28. The Titans scored in 11 seconds on a 27-yard pass interference penalty and a one-yard run by Roy Lewis to tie the game with 12:45 to play.

The defense stopped Fresno and the offensive unit responded by moving 45 yards in nine plays to set up Steinke's 37-yard field goal with 5:20 to play. The Bulldogs ran three plays and punted and never saw the ball again.

Fullerton went into the San Jose State game with eyes on an upset and a possible California Bowl bid and well into the third quarter that dream seemed within reach as the Titans held a 23-21 lead. But Steve Clarkson connected with Tim Kearse for a 23-yard touchdown pass with 9:19 to go in the period and the Spartans took advantage of a Fullerton fumble at the Titan 12-yard line and a pair of 37-yard scoring bombs by Clarkson to win going away, 45-23.

In a game reminiscent of the Spartans' come from behind victory in 1980, the Titans jumped to an early lead in the contest televised nationally by ESPN. Mike Kennedy intercepted Clarkson in the Spartans' backfield and set up the offensive unit at the San Jose 40-yard line. Bob Caffrey threw short passes to Jeff York and Norman Brown to set up his one-yard plunge for a 7-0 lead.

San Jose State appeared to put the game away with three touchdowns in a span of eight minutes of the second quarter for a 21-7 lead but Fullerton didn't fold. Greg Steinke kicked a 45-yard field goal with 2:53 to go to make it 21-10 and Caffrey engineered a 48-yard drive in the final 1:37 which produced a touchdown on a 13-yard pass to Norman Brown.

Roy Lewis dashed 53 yards on the first possession of the second half to push the Titans back into the lead but then it was too much Clarkson as the eventual PCAA champions showed their offensive firepower to a national audience.

The first of what would become three narrow late-season defeats was the toughest to swallow as the Titans let a victory over rival Long Beach State slip away on a fumbled punt return. The 49ers overcame an early 9-0 Fullerton lead to rally for a 10-9 victory.

Bob Caffrey drove the Titans to a touchdown on their second possession. For the second year in a row, the Fullerton-Pacific game in Stockton came down to the final play of the game — a pass into the southern end zone. Where the Tigers were successful with a last-second touchdown catch for a 32-26 win in 1980, the Titans fell short on a two-point conversion try and suffered a heartbreaking 17-16 defeat.

A trick play backfield on Boise State and Fullerton pulled out a last-second 20-17 win over the defending Division 1-AA national champion Broncos.

Faced with a fourth-and-19 situation with less than a minute to play at the Fullerton 47, Boise State went into punt formation. Instead of kicking, the "punter" lobbed a long pass downfield, trying to lure a Titan defender into interfering with an eligible receiver. Instead, Boise State was called for offensive interference and that gave Fullerton the ball at the Boise State 39 after the walkoff.

Tom St. Jacques' 19-yard completion to Norman Brown and two runs by Todd Gerhart positioned Greg Steinke for a 31-yard field goal that won what had been a defensive struggle for three quarters.

Fullerton scored on its first possession with Ken Jackson's eight-yard run climaxing a 56-yard march. Boise State got on the scoreboard four seconds before halftime only after Fullerton was cited for being offsides on Kenrick Camerud's errant 42-yard field goal try. Given a reprieve, he was successful from 37 yards for a 7-3 halftime score.

Steinke's 32-yard field goal set the stage for a wild fourth quarter. Gerald DesPres passed to John Broadous for a gametying 56-yard touchdown on the first play of the quarter. Fullerton came right back with St. Jacques hitting four passes in a row including a 28-yard scoring strike to Brown for a 17-10 advantage.

Boise State tied it with a one-play scoring drive as DesPres threw a 50-yard bomb to Bedard with 9:00 to go.

Fullerton retaliated with a grinding, time-consuming drive that carried to the Boise 18 where St. Jacques fumbled, setting the stage for the Broncos' ill-fated final possession.

Reno took the second-half kickoff and the lead for good with John Vicari diving in. Reno led 26-20 after Tony Zendejas' 28-yard field goal and appeared to lock things up with Zendejas' 41-yarder with only 2:52 to play.

But Bob Caffrey fired a 30-yard touchdown pass to Jeff York with 1:57 to go to make it 29-27. Reno's Otto Kelly bounced around left end for a 40-yard touchdown to apparently seal things at 36-27 with 1:33 to go.

But Fullerton came back again with Caffrey throwing 30 yards to Roy Lewis with 30 seconds to play and then Wendell Penny recovered an onsides kick to give the Titans the ball at midfield with 28 seconds but no timeouts left.
