

As the brush fires have burned in the county, we have seen helicopters flying overhead with hoses attached. We know they are involved in a firefight somewhere, but how do they know where to go? Where do they get the water? How do they know where to drop? Do they operate at night?

The advent of a fire, be it somewhere in the county or close by, makes for anxious hours or maybe days as we wonder if it will be contained. We wonder how the fire is being fought and what resources are being used to bring it under control and eventually extinguished. The Ventura County Fire Depart-

Villager Billie Thibodeau describes her service during World War II in such a low-key way that it could be easy to miss its impact. As one of the first women to serve as a U.S. Army nurse, she dodged bombs and bullets for nearly four years in North Africa and Europe to save the lives of American soldiers on the front lines. "We never worried about surviving. We had a job to do," she says. "And we were proud to do it."

Billie, who is a healthy 99-year-old, smiles as she recalls being recruited. She was finishing up at nursing school in Iowa as the fighting grew in Europe. "Our instructors chose fifteen of us, and away we went – first to Army camps in the U.S. (we were the first women to be there), then on to a military ship that landed in Casablanca." She became a part of the 95th Evacua-

## A Salute to Our Veterans

The Annual Celebration of LV's veterans recognized eighty residents who served in the U.S. military from World War II on. Nearly 300 people filled the AR last month for a ceremony of patriotism, entertainment, and gratitude for service sponsored by the Women's Club. Beginning with the Presentation of Colors and concluding with military anthems and Taps, the veterans and their families were praised by local city and Veterans Affairs leaders, as well as introduced to "Schatsy," one of 117 highly trained dogs that serve veterans who return home with disabilities like PTSD. In honor of LV's veterans, a \$900 donation was made by the Women's Club to "Paws for Purple Hearts," the group that trains the dogs. The highlight of the program was the Roll Call in which each Village veteran was introduced by name.


tion Hospital, a mobile surgical center that moved from one battleground to the next throughout the war. For Billie, that meant from North Africa to Sicily and Anzio in Italy, to France, then Germany.

"We moved all the time. One tent for surgery, one tent for medical. We could tear down the evac hospital and put it up in another location in thirteen hours, usually a few miles behind the lines. But we could always hear the bombs and guns," she says. "We'd operate on the wounded – sometimes we'd use a board for the surgical table – and then ship them out. Sometimes we had to lay patients on the ground or use tree branches for IV poles." She's proud of the unit's success rate; 95% of their patients survived.

The "95th Evac" set up amid horrendous scenes. When they landed at Anzio Beach, "There were piles of bodies, piles of weapons, and countless wounded to be retrieved." But the nurses weren't frightened, Billie recalls, "We always had hope."

After the war, Billie went back to the Mid-West and became a school nurse, which became her career until 1985. She got married and raised four daughters. For years, she attended 95th Evac reunions, where the nurses and doctors renewed friendships and remembered their wartime experiences, with an occasional question about why the Army never gave awards or pensions to the nurses. However, Billie points to the reward of the nickname the nurses earned: "Angels of Mercy."

#### Fire fighters—From Page 1

The VCFD has five helicopters in its inventory, three of which are configured for fighting fires with air drops of water. They have internal tanks that hold 370 gallons of water, which can be filled in 60 seconds, either by snorkel from a pond or by refilling from a ground fire engine. The helos have designated dip sights, which includes agricultural ponds, golf course ponds and reservoirs (not swimming pools, so ours is safe!)

Each fire has an incident commander who directs the firefighting efforts. Small fires are directed by a Fire Captain, while larger fires are controlled by a Division Chief. The helicopters fly at a specific altitude of 500 feet above-ground-level (AGL) and are directed by an airborne helicopter coordinator. The the equipment to eradicate the coordinator ensures adequate menace to our lives.

separation from helos operating in the fire region and directs where to drop. The helicopters have multiple radios and are in communication with units on the ground, as well as other airborne units. If fixed wing aircraft are brought in to assist the fire-fighting, they maintain an altitude of 1000 feet AGL to ensure adequate separation from the helicopters.

Fires burn 24 hours a day and require the same level of fighting to contain the spread. The airborne firefighting crews wear night-vision goggles to enable them to continue their participation in the fire containment.

As we see the smoke in the distance, or the flames first hand, it is a comfort to know that the Ventura County Fire Department ground and airborne teams have a plan and

Only shop at reputable online vendors. Flee from online merchants you have never heard of. What they really want from you is your credit card number or other financial information. If you are going to order from a littleknown company, do your research.

Don't be snookered by promises In contrast, using a computer to of discounted items. I have witnessed do your shopping is easier than driv- innumerable occasions when people purchase an item that is sent in the mail. Yet the next month another package arrives from the same company with accompanying charges. The purchaser was unaware they signed up for monthly mailings. Read the fine print before you order.

Search for secure websites when doing online shopping. Look at the address bar of any merchant's website. You should see an https in the address bar. The "s" stands for secure. If you only see http without the "s," it is not a safe site.

Use your credit or debit cards to make transactions. It is best to use a credit card. Why? If there is a dispute, the credit card company can stop the charge or refund the money. With other payment sources, these options are not always available.

Double check all transactions before confirming them. Unfortunately, on the internet you cannot always undo every transaction you make. You might book a flight or make a hotel reservation that is nonrefundable. If you do make an error, contact the company right away to see if they will refund your money.

(the fourth Wednesday) would fall on Christmas, and we wouldn't fit under a decorated tree. Please join us.



## It's Usually the Strangest Things That Get My Attention

It wasn't long after I got a garden patch that I planted some arugula... my favorite leafy green. I was not prepared for how explosive it would get. It grew really fast and soon I had more than I could use. I offered some to a fellow named Al who always seemed to hang out in the garden. He accepted but it was what he said he was going to do with that really caught my attention. "Ever make Arugula pesto?" Al asked. Well, I never made it but I sure ate it once in Italy and it was killer.

I decided it was time to get to know Al a little better. He is a man of few words but the few are quite often gems. "What kinds of dishes do you like to cook? I asked. "Usually things you can't catch on fire" he said. "I live alone and occasionally get carried away.'

What carried you away last week that you'd like to share with ILV readers? "Brisket!" he exclaimed. I know that tri-tip is a popular selection in California, but in my house it was always Brisket and whether it was my mom's baked in the oven or my dad's smoked on the BBQ, it was always fabulous. Turns out Al's Brisket is baked and seared and pretty fabulous

#### Al's Baked Brisket

One 6-8 lb. flat cut brisket One lb. fresh mushrooms Two medium sweet onions One package dry mushroom soup mix Salt/pepper Olive oil for browning 1-2 cups water for baking Wine for drinking while you're cooking

Salt & pepper the brisket on both sides and rub in. Add approximately 1/8 cup of olive oil to a hot heavy sauce pan, then add the brisket. Brown on both sides. Meanwhile, grate the mushrooms and onions on medium in a food chopper.

Carefully remove the brisket to a large glass casserole dish. Add veggies, soup mix and water; cover with foil and cook at 325 for 2-3 hours or until fork tender. Do a taste test after 2 hours and adjust cooking accordingly.

Remove brisket from oven to a cutting board and let cool for about 20-30 minutes. Slice against the grain with an electric knife, ½" thick pieces. Put onto a serving platter, pour the mushrooms, onions and drippings over the brisket and cover

with foil till ready to serve. Yummy!


