

Although there is no way to compare the relative strengths of the Aztecs of San Diego State and the Mustangs of Cal Poly on the basis of past performance, there are several interesting parallels between the two teams.

Both teams are guided by new coaches. Aztec strategy is guided by John F. Eubank, Washington State, who replaced Coach Leo Calland who left Montezuma land to enter the Navy. Poly's new grid mentor is, of course, Bob Dakan, one of the Stanford "Vow" boys who coached the San Luis Obispo J. C. teams last year. Dakan replaced Howard O'Daniels, who is now a lieutenant (j.g.) at Corpus Christi.

Both teams had record breaking turn-outs for football this year, due probably in both cases to added emphasis given physical education by the Army and Navy. Poly had 65 men out in suit at the beginning of the season, and still has almost that many. Because of the large squad, Dakan formed a junior varsity to play junior colleges in order to give all the men more chance at competitive football. A 55 man turn-out for the Aztecs caused S.D. State coaches to form the first bantam squad in Aztec history—playing all the lightweights in six games as preliminary to the varsity tilts.

Although the Aztecs have the edge as far as experienced players are concerned, with 11 returning lettermen to Poly's seven, both teams are made up mostly of inexperienced freshmen.

Both teams have been beaten on at least one occasion apiece by rather large scores, but at other times have turned in rather spectacular performances. The odds favor San Diego slightly today, based mostly on the Aztec's strong records of previous years rather than their performance this season.



The San Diego Aztecs

This is the first season in which San Diego State reshmen have been eligible for varsity competition. About 24 men with no experience or with just high school experience are on the varsity squad this year, but 12 men came up from last year's Frosh squad and five are junior college transfers—which adds experience to the squad. Ten men are one-year varsity lettermen and Captain Joe Seminario, two-year letterman, was all-conference (CCAA) guard last year. Among the veterans are those shown below.
