

WHAT about O C R G and its support of K A T O , T O L M A C H ,

WHY IS OCRG (Oxnard Citizens for Responsible Government) supporting Dr. Tsujio Kato for mayor and Jane Tolmach and Tom Wolf for City Council?

OCRG finds these three candidates to be the most representative of our goals. We believe them to be willing to listen and able to respond to the concerns of the average citizen, and to Neighborhood Councils. All are interested in giving a wider representation to every area of the community and in listening to citizens of all backgrounds. None have obligations to special monied interests.

We of OCRG, like many other citizens, are increasingly concerned and dismayed at the rapidity with which our rich agricultural land, our open space and our potential park sites are covered over by development. We like the stand of these candidates that growth must be better planned and contained. We like their insistence that industry brought to Oxnard actually bring jobs to residents, and have strong pollution restrictions. We also like their stand on holding the line against a large jet airport, either in the center of our city or at the former Oxnard Air Force Base in Camarillo.

We like Jane Tolmach's repeated insistence that taxes which Oxnard pays into the County be used in Oxnard for better flood control, an Oxnard college and regional parks.

We find all three to be well qualified. Mayor Tolmach and Dr. Kato have shown during their council service that they can take courageous and constructive action. Tom Wolf will add the valuable input of a biologist.

WHAT IS OCRG?

Oxnard Citizens for Responsible Government is an on-going politically active citizen group that has been working openly in the community for over 2 years.

Goals: to achieve a better informed citizenry, a more open and responsible government, preservation of environmental quality and social justice.


Policies: open and honest operation. We sponsor fund-raisers for campaign expenses and accept no more than \$10 from non-members.

Political Activities: Candidates for local elections are all invited to participate in public coffees. Questionnaires are submitted. After a study of issues and candidates' attitudes, support is given to those judged to be most aware and responsible to the public.

Education: The attached graph is an example of an educational project.

Other Activities (Partial List): Support for the preservation of Plaza Park and the Pagoda; contributing to a recreational center in the Colonia; opposing establishment of a large jet port at Ventura Co. Airport or the former Oxnard Air Force Base; opposition to expansion of Oxnard Shores, where homes have suffered tidal damage.
