- IV. No public comment.
- V. Financial Report Karen Flock
 As of April 22, with 84% of the fiscal year elapsed, 52% of level
 1000 funds (salaries & benefits) have been expended and 59% of
 level 2000 funds (services & supplies) have been expended.
- VI. Correspondence Report

In response to an invitation to do so, the commission voted to:

- co-sponsor the annual Governor's Conference on Women in Business, October 12, Los Angeles Bonaventure Hotel;
- (2) submit the name of Ruth Hogan, the Commission's 1987 "Salute To Women" awardee in Business, for a Governor's Outstanding Businesswoman Award,
- (3) propose workshops on the following topics: Employer-Assisted Child Care, Pay Equity, Legal Rights (Divorce, Credit, Consumer), Affirmative Action, (Higher Education)
- (4) Authorize Zora Kirby to represent the VCCW if a regional planning meeting is held.

VII. Staff Report - Martha Baskerville

- (1) Administrative Aide Martha Baskerville has announced her resignation effective June 24. County personnel has not yet opened recruitment for a replacement.
- (2) Commissioners were asked to submit their Annual Reports prior to the deadline.
- (3) The Commissioner's requested budget for FY '88-'89 will be at the same level as FY '87-'88.
- VIII. Friends of the Commission
 Commissioners expressed concern at a statement in the Friends March 22
 Minutes regarding future projects. There has been no communication from the Friends regarding the type of proposed project.
 - IX. Task Force Reports
 A. Education
 - Women in Agriculture Karen Flock
 Several members of this committee worked with the Clinicas del
 Camino Real to put on the Women's Health Education Conference in
 Saticoy. This conference was in Spanish only and targeted hispanic
 women in the area, many of whom are farmworkers. Commissioner Kirby
 assisted with media coverage.
 - 2. The new Pay Equity Project will meet on Tuesday, May 24, at 7 p.m. in the Camarillo Daily News building.
 - 3. The "Salute To Women" nomination forms will be mailed out next week. The awards selection committee will be commissioners Lauren Anderson, Dot Engel, Zora Kirby, Sandy Ryder and Karen Flock. The awards banquet is scheduled for Thursday, Oct. 27 at the Doubletree Hotel in Ventura. The Friends have not released any money for seed money. Several Commissioners together, donated money for the deposit at the hotel.

 A Salute To Women account will be opened to facilitate the flow of money for the banquet.

 Commissioners Kirby, Ryder and Goldman will refine the budget for the banquet.
 - B. Child Care Dot Engel

Commissioner Engel is a member of the City of Ventura's ad hoc Child Care Task Force. They have recently released a summary report and conclusions for the city's child care needs:

- 1. There is an immediate need for 2600 licensed child care spaces in Ventura.
- 2. Child care needs to be made more affordable.

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- 3. There needs to be a broader distribution of child care services.
- 4. Information and referral services for the Ventura area needs to be expanded.
- 5. There should be training and continuing education for licensed and unlicensed providers.
- Parent education as consumers of child care services should be available.
- 7. Employers should be educated about options for their involvement.
- 8. A local network of professional care givers should be developed.

Carol Green, Assistant City Manager of Ventura, was commended for her leadership in developing the work of the task force.

Commissioner Engel presented information from a Mervyn's company-wide employee newsletter re: Mervyn's attention to the child care issue. Commissioners Engel and Ryder will seek information on how the local stores are responding to the Dayton-Hudson Foundation's large grant for child care programs.

Child Development Resources is spearheading the establishment of a Children's Services Council. Four committees have been established: Legislative, Provider Training, Public Relations and Resource Development.

- C. Family Law Zora Kirby reported that she is in contact with a newspaper to do a consumer-directed article on how to choose and work with an attorney, and what to do if you have complaints about your attorney.
- D. Housing Karen Flock Commissioner Flock reported that their committee members toured Cabrillo Village in April.
- E. Counseling Domestic Violence Services There was a discussion of the situation faced by CAHV since the address of their shelter for battered women was printed in the phone directory.

- B. Legislative Roundtable Dot Engel Commissioner Engel announced that future meetings of the Roundtable would be placed on hold due to low attendance for previous programs.
- C. Communications (See IX. C. Family Law) Commissioner Kirby reported that the videotapes of the Family Law Forum are not suitable for reproduction/distribution.

XI. Unfinished Business

- A. Bylaws The Commission approved the changes as proposed by the Bylaws Committee.
- B. Policy for Hiring Personnel

The following policy statement was adopted, with 1 no vote (Warrington) and 1 abstention (Kirby).

1. The Ventura County Commission for Women falls under the guidelines and procedures of the County of Ventura personnel office as it relates to the hiring, promotion, pay wages and benefits of personnel employed in the Commission office. The County is responsible for advertising, notifying county employees and the public of available openings, posting announcements, testing, reviewing and recommending applicants, and retaining possible applicants on a list for future consideration per established guidelines.

County personnel will test applicants for the Administrative Aide position and will conduct initial interviews for those meeting the requirements.

A list of the top rated applicants, a minimum of 3, will be forwarded to the Commission for final interviews. The Commission will notify PSSA's personnel officer when they have selected their top candidate. PSSA personnel will notify County Personnel. County Personnel will notify the applicant.

2. The panel for the final interview of applicants for the Administrative Aide position will include all Commissioners who want to be on the panel. The incumbent Administrative Aide will be asked to participate. The final selection of a candidate will be made by the Commission.

The ad hoc committee for drafting additional policy statements consists of: Sandy Ryder, Dot Engel, Bonnie Warrington, Miriam Albert.
