Solano To Share State Building

Solano and Napa counties are scheduled to share heavily in a proposed \$921 million state building program for 1959-64 unveiled by the State Department of Finance in Sacramento.

The California Maritime Academy in Vallejo is slated to receive a total of \$1,420,250 under a proposed five-year building program for state colleges to which the Finance Department has allocated \$246,177,250.

Another \$1,316,300 is set aside for the California Medical Facility at Vacaville as part of a \$45,039,646 allocated to the Department of Corrections for proposed construction work.

ALSO LISTED in the Finance Department's \$921 million building program is \$3,055,700 for the construction of 28 new armories and site purchases, including a Type A, one-unit armory in Benicia and another in Fairfield.

According to the department's schedule, the Fairfield armory would be built during fiscal 1959-60 while the Benicia armory would be erected during the 1960-61 fiscal year.

The State Hospital at Imola in Napa County has been allocated a total of \$4,244,700, part of a \$107,509,737 building program proposed for the Department of Mental Hygiene under the Finance Department's five-year construction plan.

IN ADDITION, Napa is slated to get a new Department of Employment office building which is included in a list of projects totaling \$5,670,000 proposed by this state agency.
