GOPs Predict Truman Plan To Wreck U.S.

WASHINGTON — (UP) — Congressional Republicans, eagerly awaiting a glimpse of President Truman's federal budget, stood pat yesterday on their claim that the country would go bankrupt trying to live up to his 10-year prosperity program.

The budget for the fiscal 12 months beginning July 1 will be delivered to the Senate and House on Monday. Some experts believed it would call for expenditures of \$40,000,000,000, including initial costs of the European recovery program. Last year's original estimates were \$37,500,000,000.

CABINET MEETING

Mr. Truman called his cabinet to the White House yesterday for a preview of the figures — wrapped up in a volume that would make a New York telephone directory look small in comparison. He will go over them with newspapermen at an annual budget seminar today.

Department chiefs refused to talk about the 1948-49 spending plans, but Postmaster General Jesse M. Donaldson told newsmen he was "amazed" by the cuts that had been made since the President and his fiscal advisers went to work on them before the election-year Congress convened. Mr. Truman is expected to tell the lawmakers that the results represent rock-bottom estimates.

But the Republicans, taking their cue from Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio, argued that the 10-year prosperity blueprints would be too expensive even if handled on a year-to-year basis.

TERRIFIC COSTS

"These programs will run the cost of government above \$50,000,000,000 a year, will create more inflation, will increase prices beyond all control, and will make a tax reduction impossible," said Chairman John Taber, R., N. Y., of the House Appropriations Committee.

John H. Graves, Noted California Doctor, Succumbs

SAN FRANCISCO—(AP)—Dr. John H. Graves, who practiced medicine in San Francisco's Mission District more than 50 years and helped found the St. Francis Hospital, died at his home yesterday. He was 80.

A native of Sacramento, he was graduated from the Cooper Medical College, now the Stanford Medical School, in 1896, and took post-graduate training in Vienna.

He had served as President of the California State and the San Francisco Medical Associations, president of the State Board of Health and medical director of the California State Industrial Accident Commission.
